Detailed Methodology

- Face-to-face interviews were conducted October 22 – November 25, 2008, by the Center for Advanced Studies (CAS) based in Phnom Penh, Cambodia.
- The sample size of 2,000 is representative for Cambodian population older than 18 by gender, age, education and province. (Demographics are detailed on following slides)
- Respondents were disqualified if they or any member of their family was employed as a journalist or editor in one of the media outlets; an employee of a political party; a member of municipal or town council, provincial assembly or national parliament; a member of municipal, town or provincial government; an employee of one of the ministries, the government or the parliament; an employee of a public relations agency or marketing agency; or an employee of an agency or institute for marketing and public opinion research.
- The poll surveyed a nationwide random, three-stage stratified Simple Random Sampling Without Replacement sample. In the first stage, the sample was stratified by 24 provinces. In the second stage, the sample was further stratified by household. In the third stage, the sample was stratified by gender.
- Additionally, respondents within each settlement were identified by a random selection of street addresses and the random walk method for households.
- Upon random household selection, respondents in each household were chosen based on the next birthday method.
- The margin of error is +/- 2.8 percent with a response rate of 96 percent.
- The nationwide poll included all provinces and municipalities.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies. Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding.

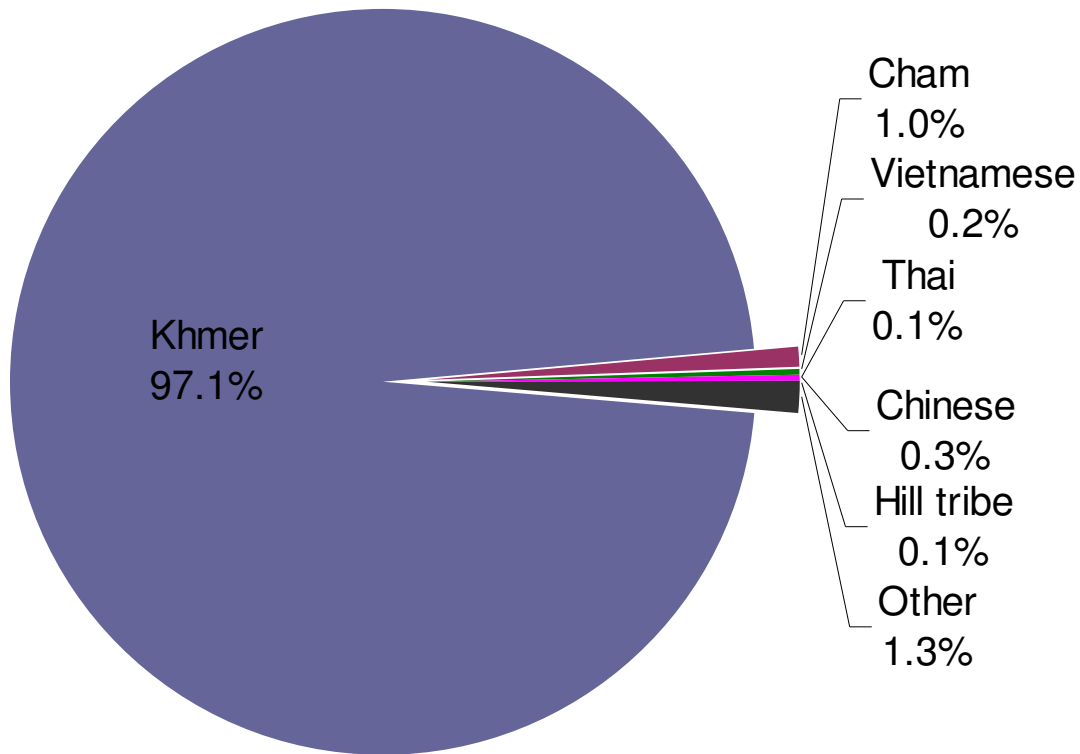

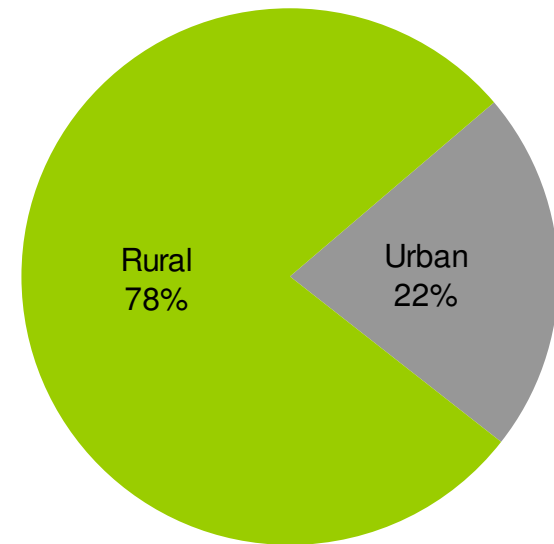

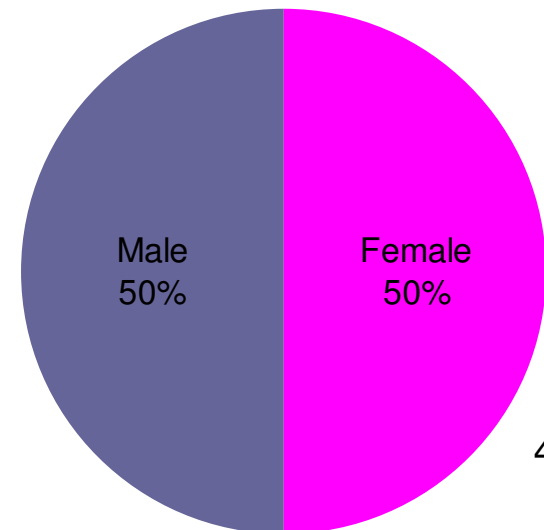
Ethnic Distribution



Rural – Urban

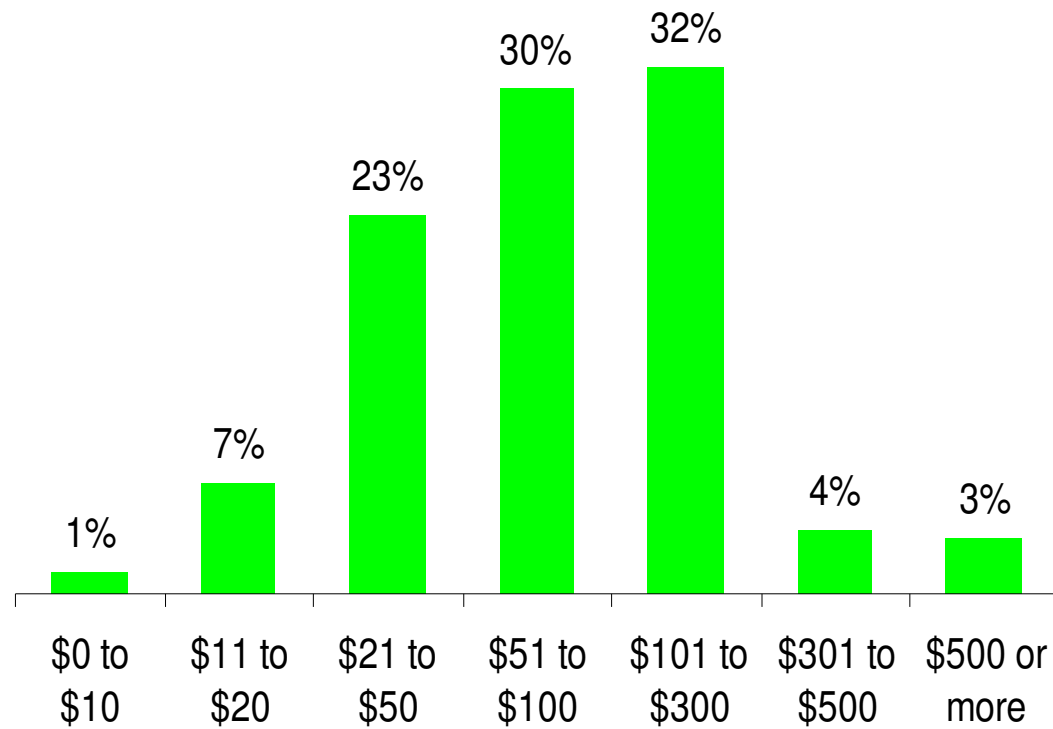


Male – Female

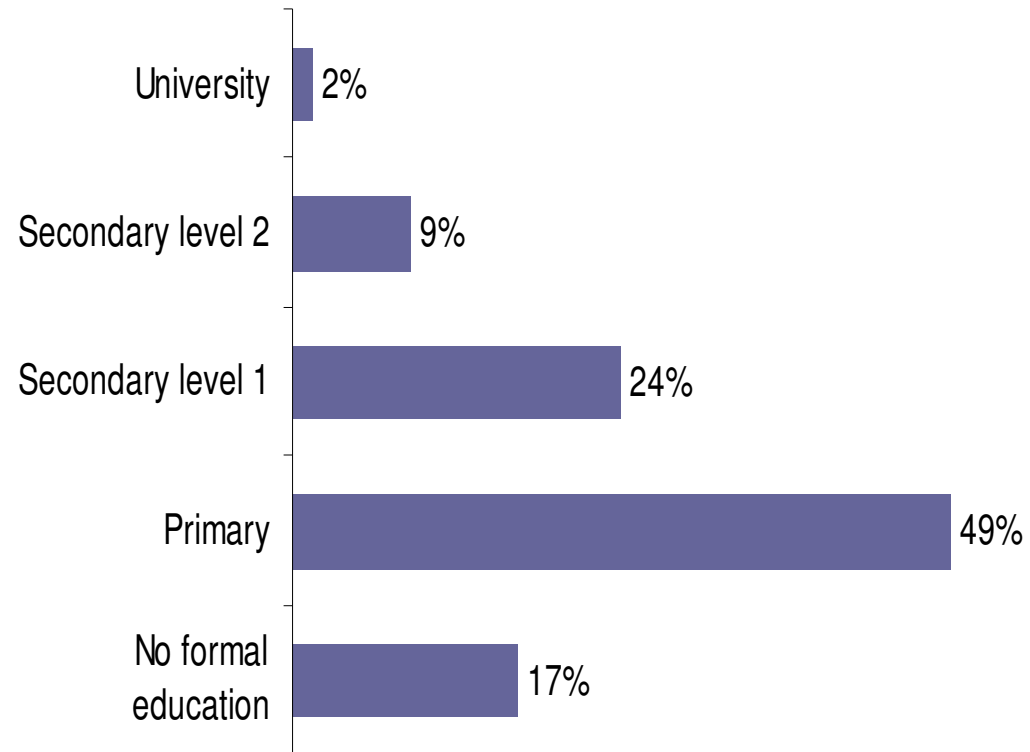

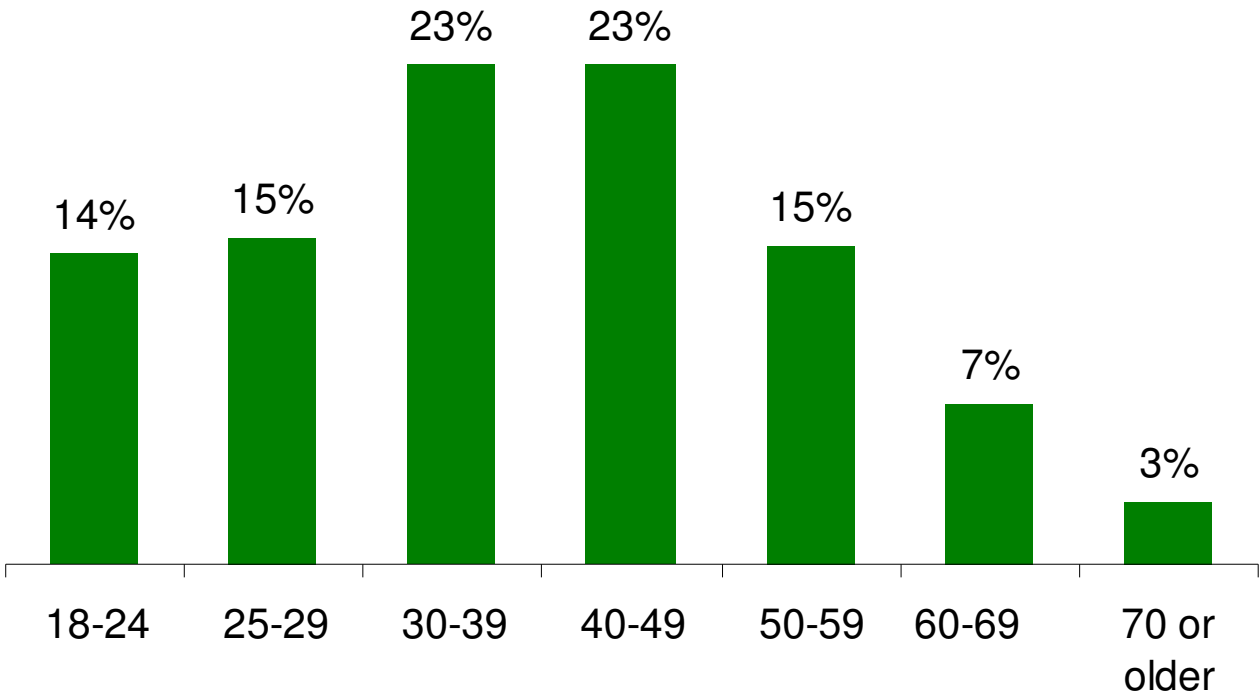
Monthly family income

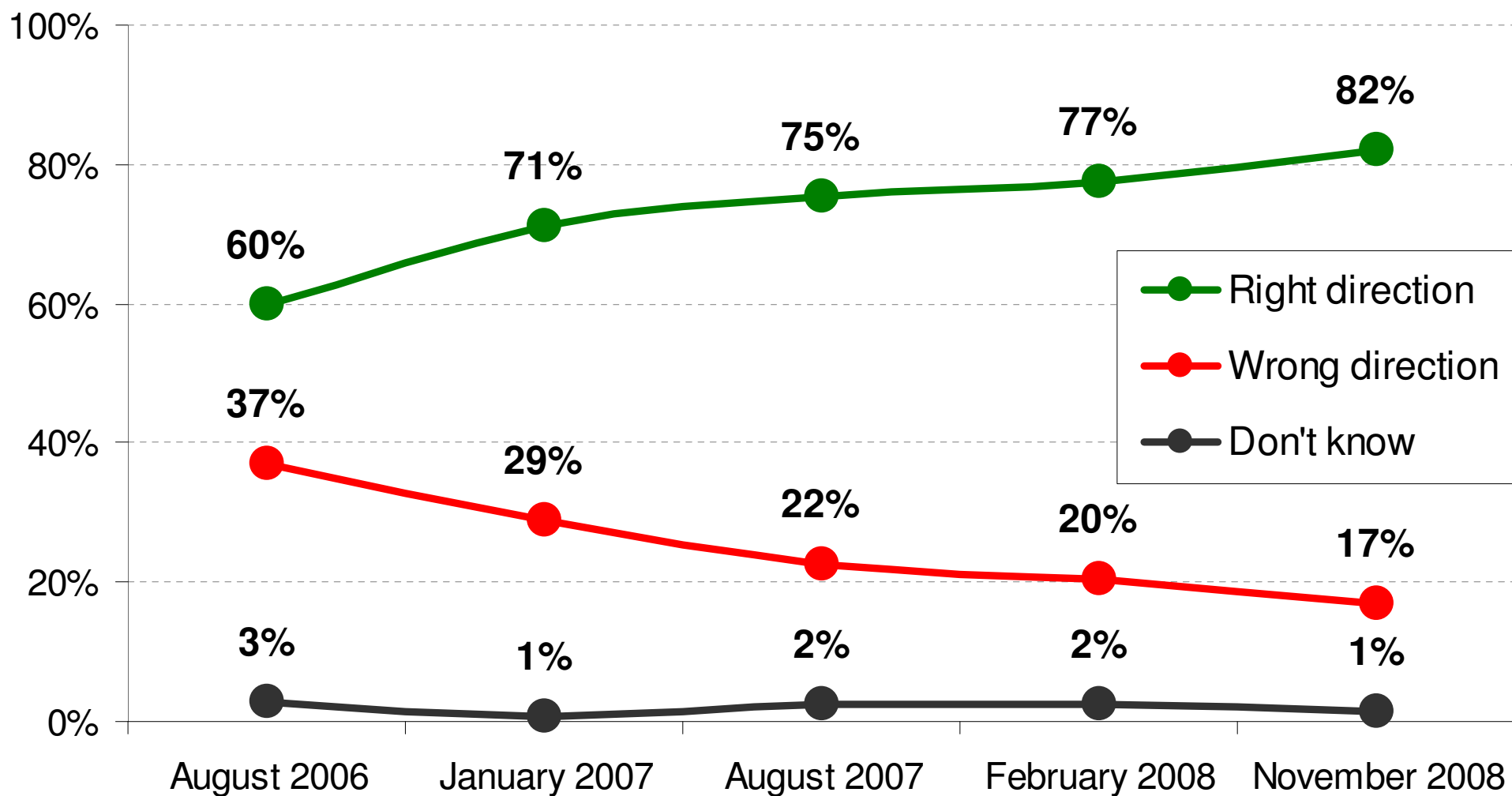

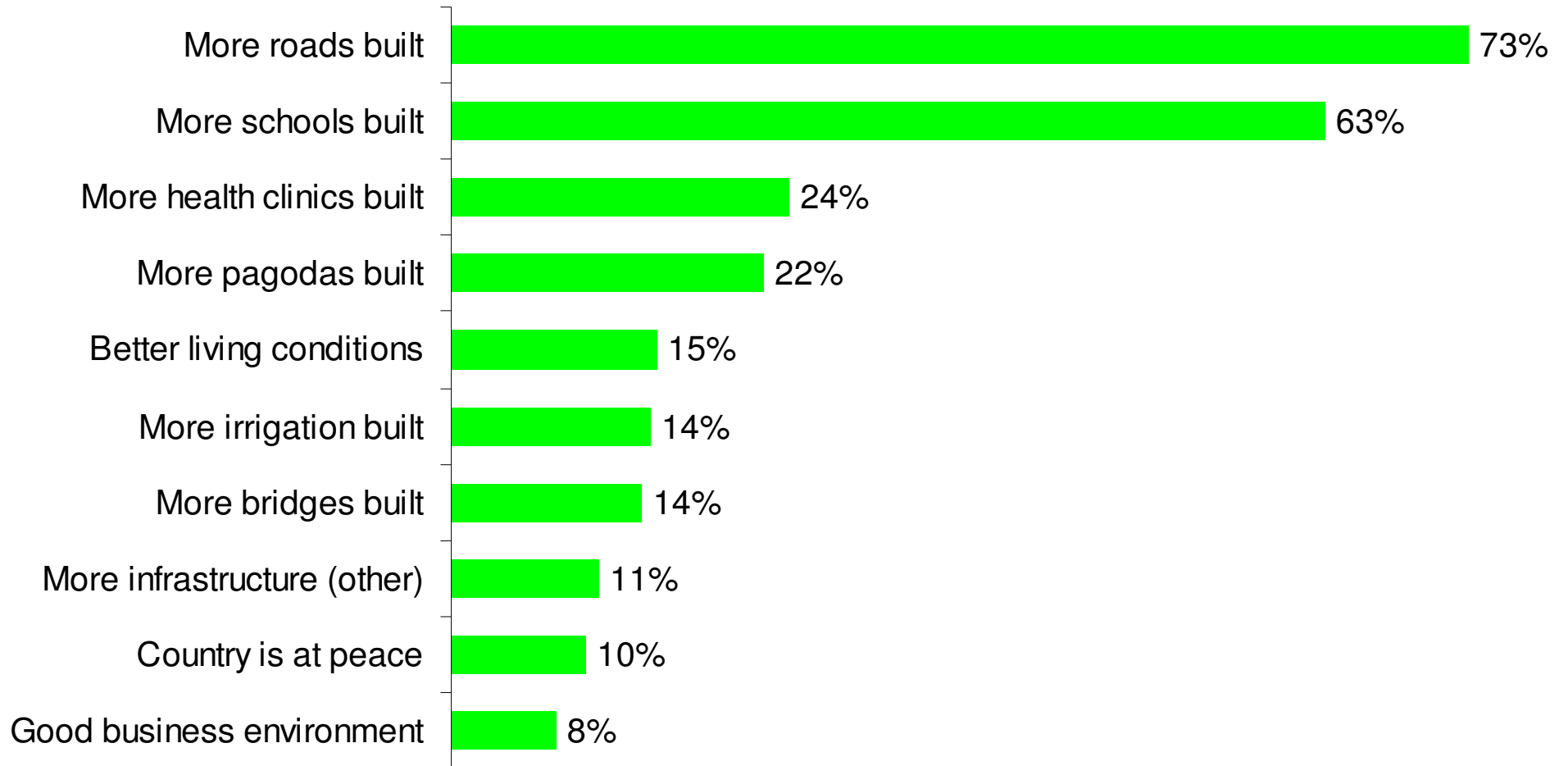

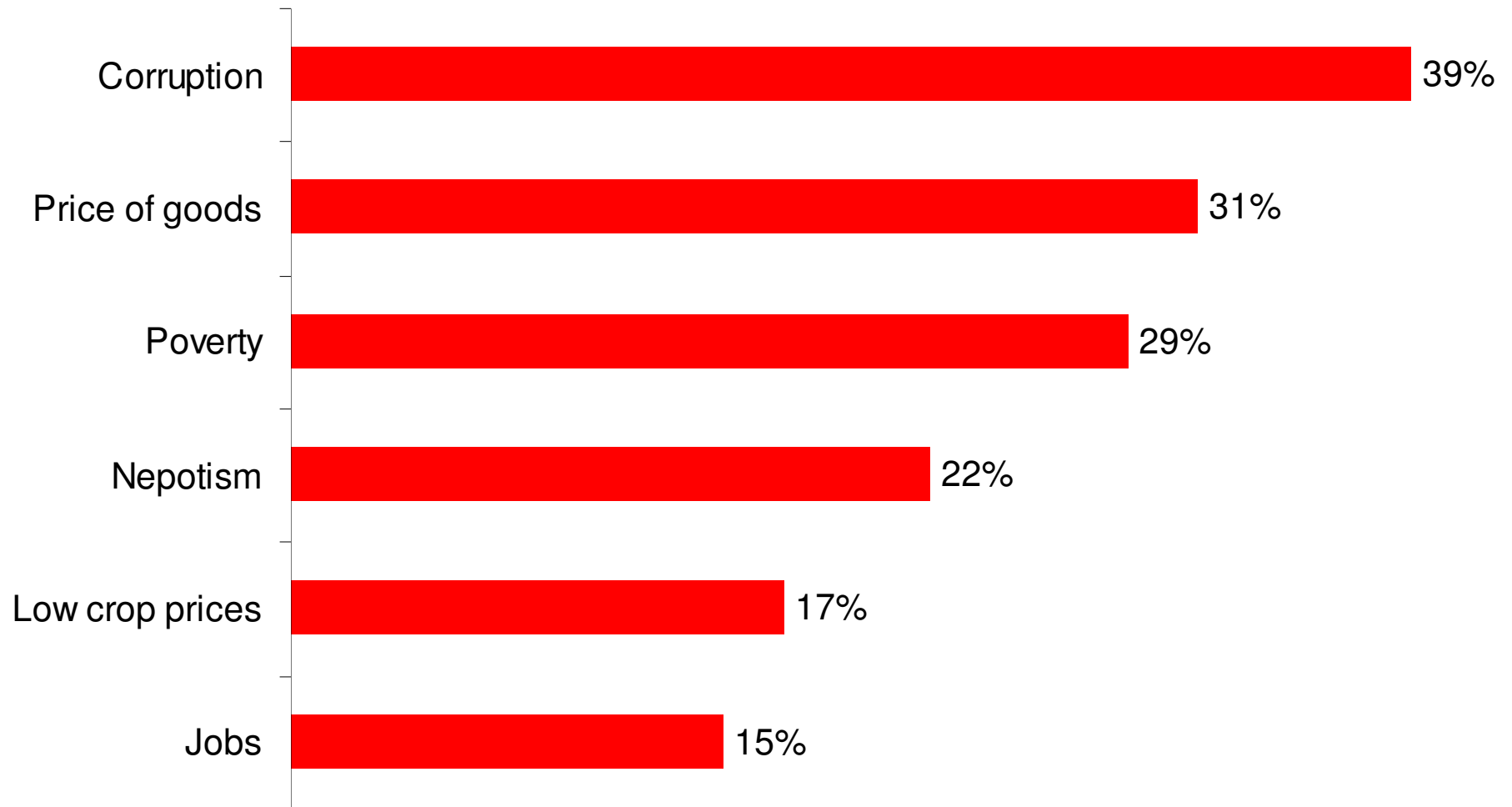
Is Cambodia generally headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?

(N = 1,638, open ended, three responses given)



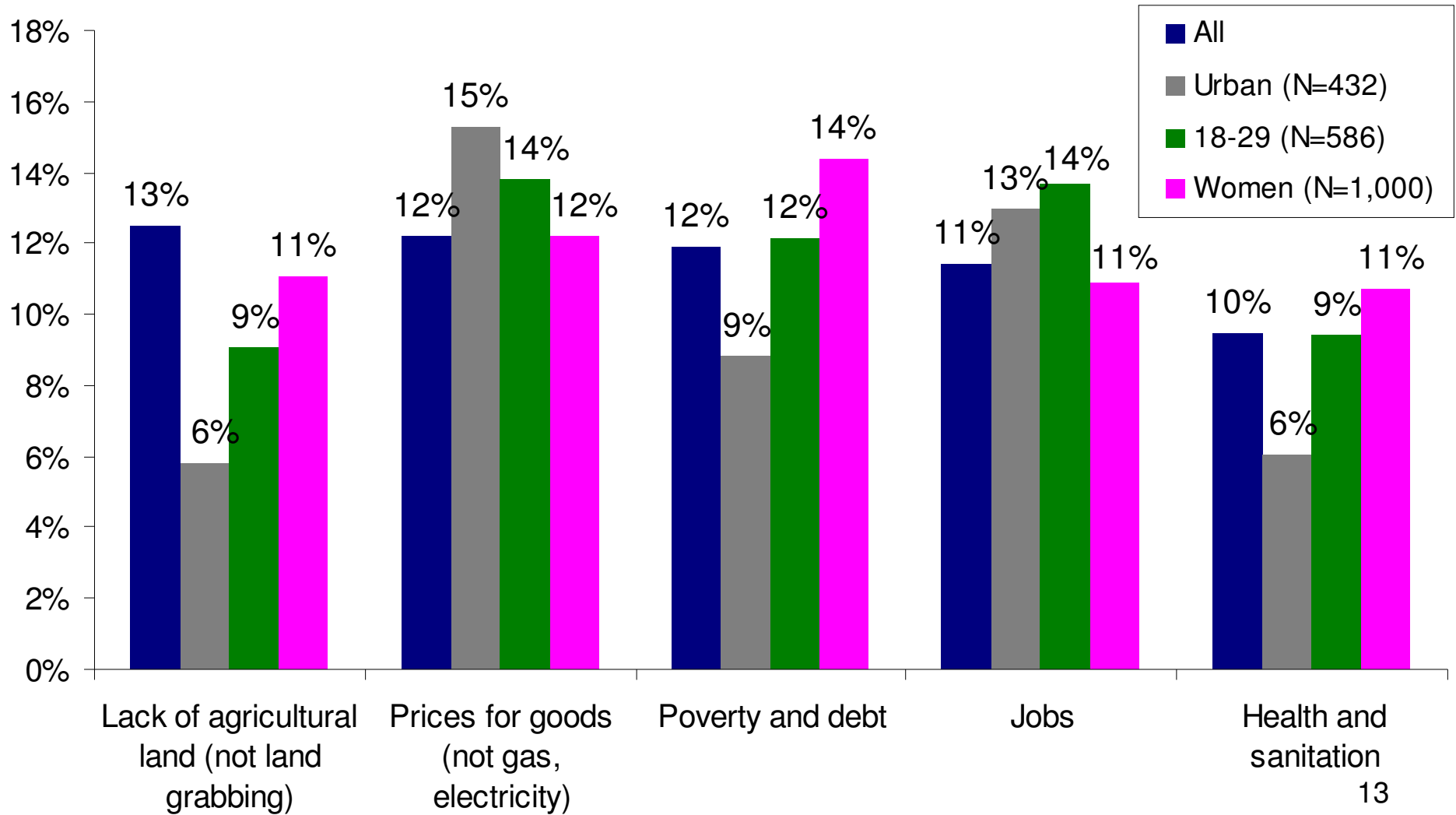
Why is Cambodia moving in the wrong direction?
(N = 335, open ended, three responses given)



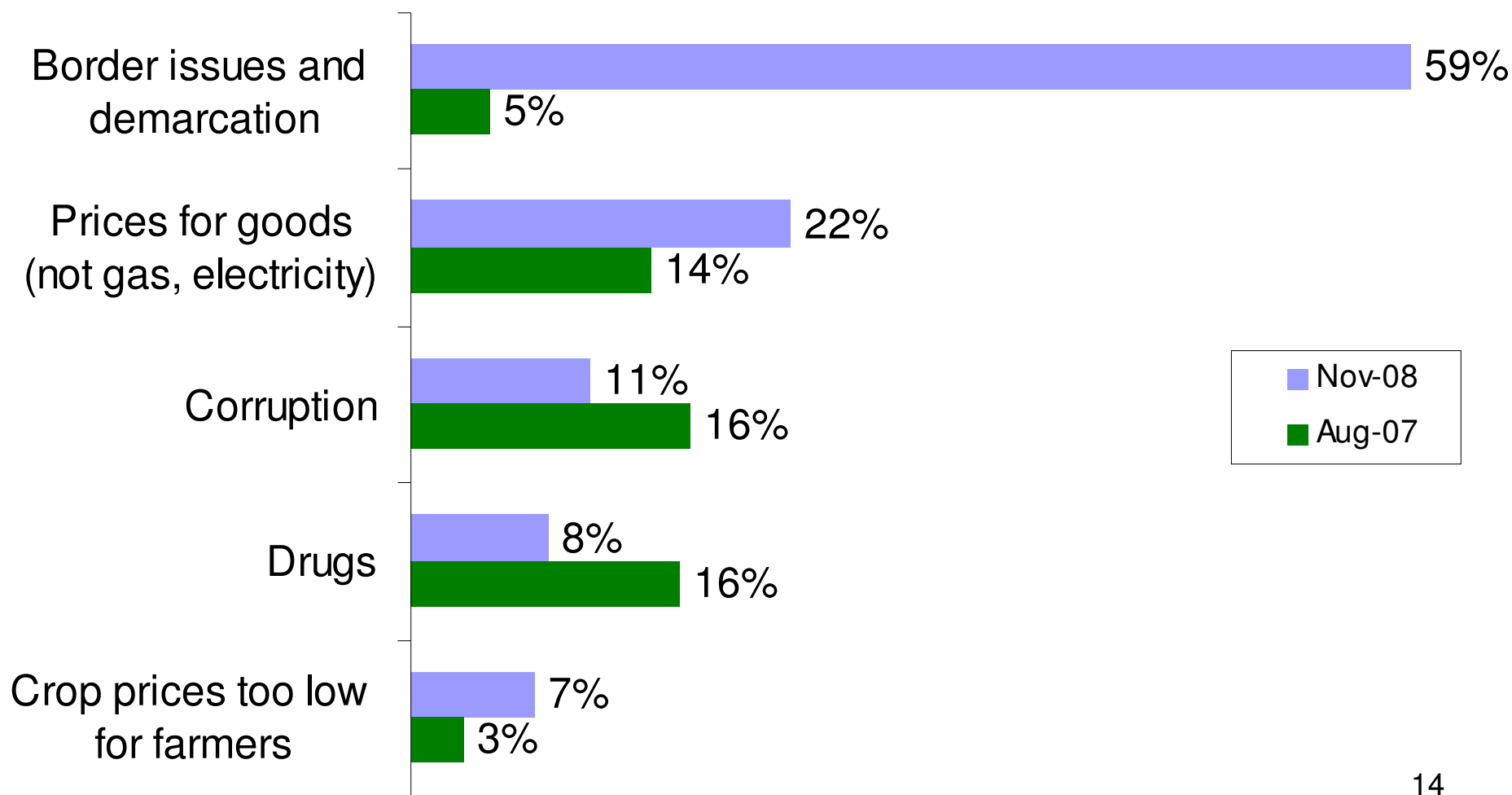
What single issue or concern do you feel most impacts your daily life or family? (open ended, top five responses)



What single issue or concern do you feel most impacts your daily life or family? (By select demographic group)



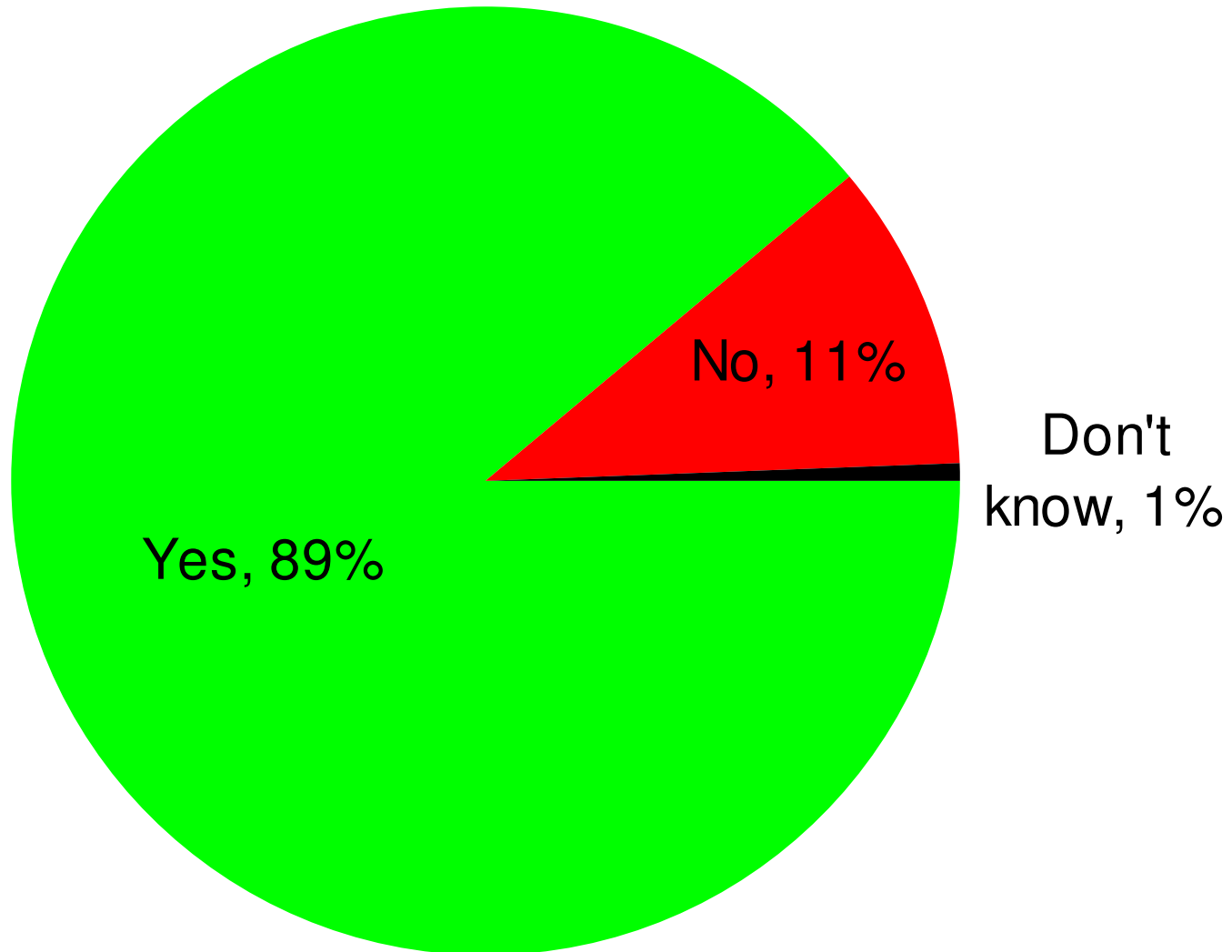
What three issues or concerns do you feel most impact Cambodia as a country? (open ended, top five responses)



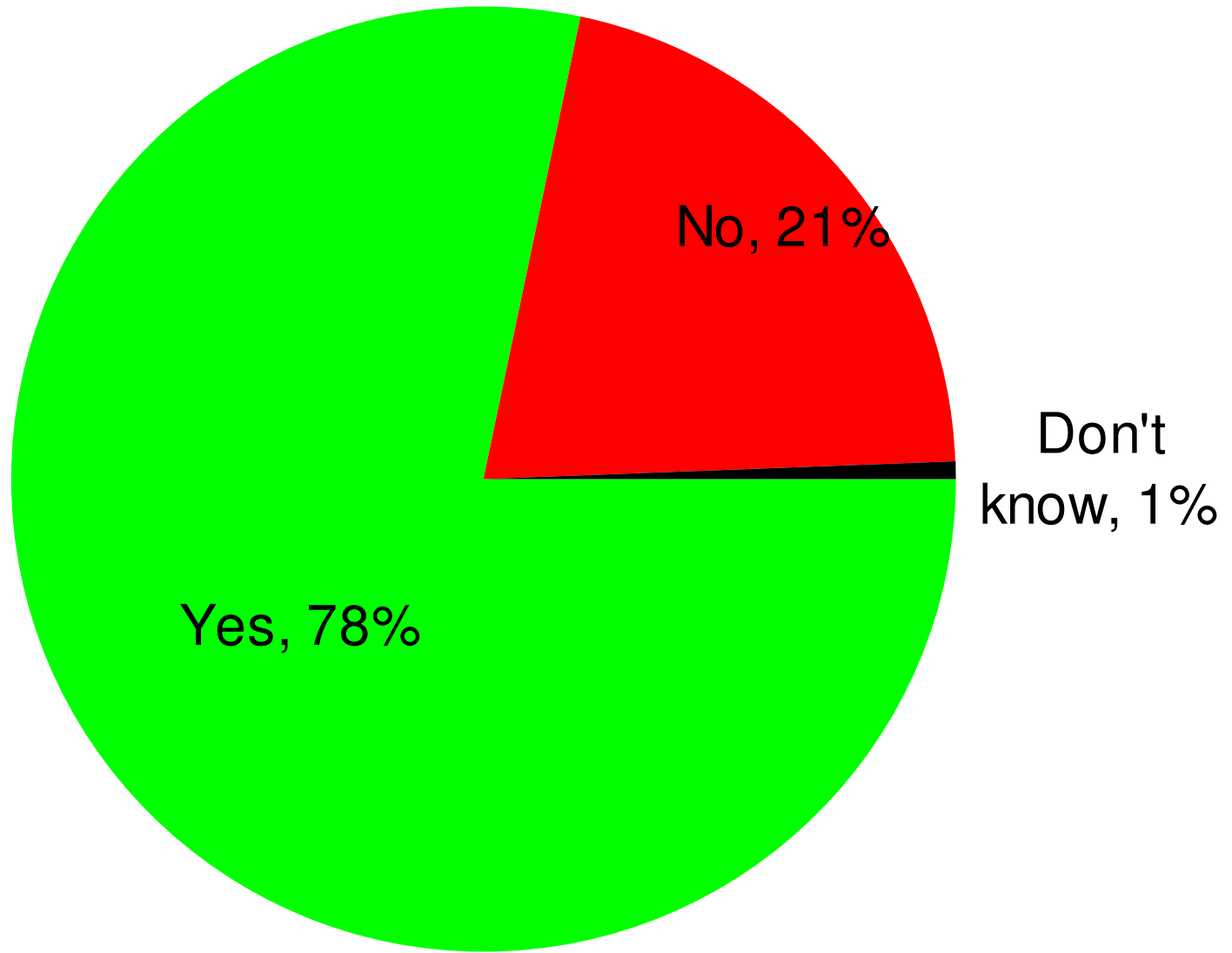

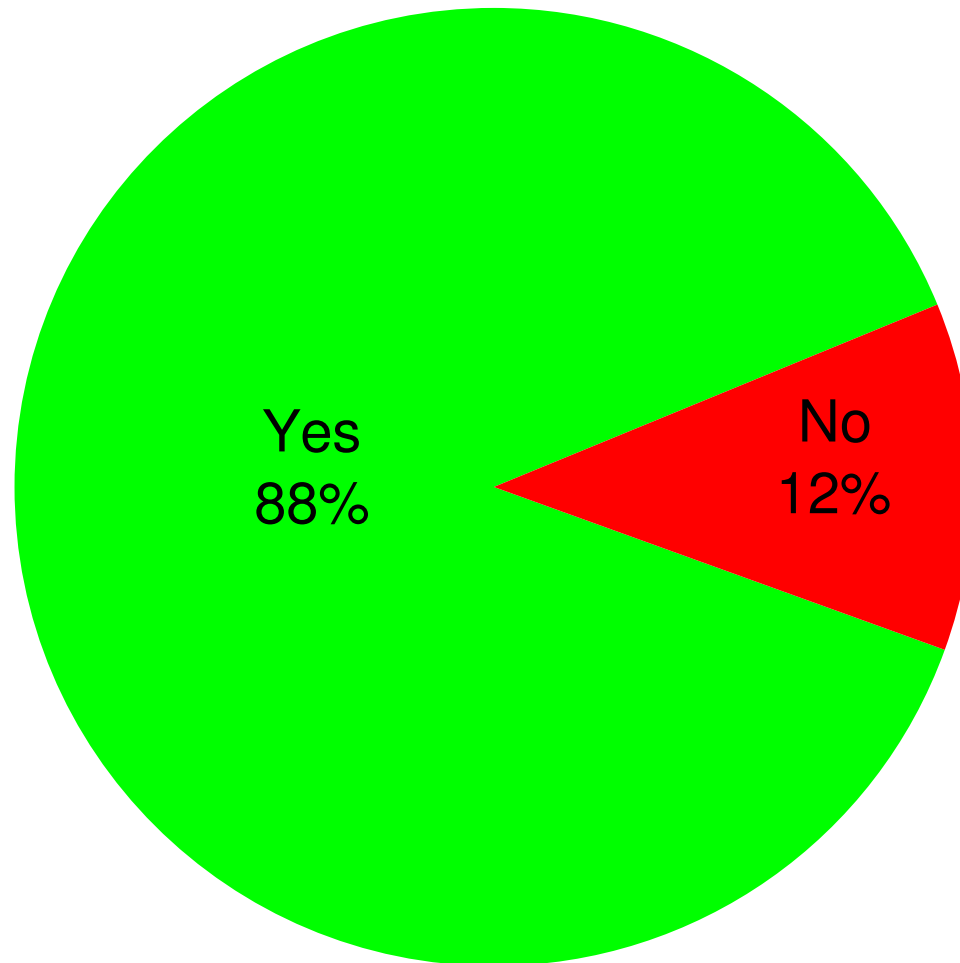
Did you register to vote any time during the period from the first 2002 commune council elections until the July 2008 national assembly elections?



Did you verify your voter registration status or newly register to vote during September-October 2007?

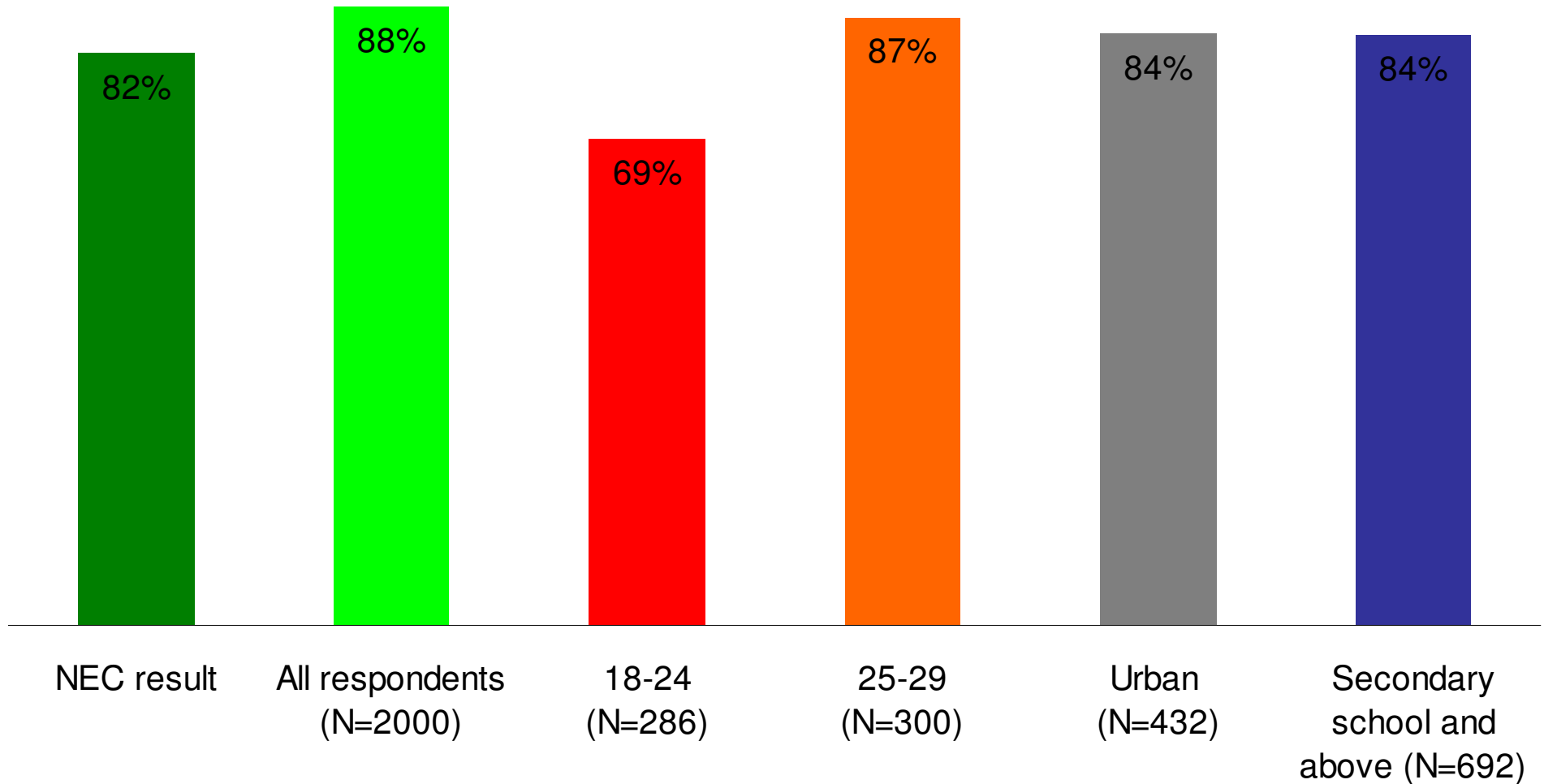


Did you vote during national assembly elections in July?



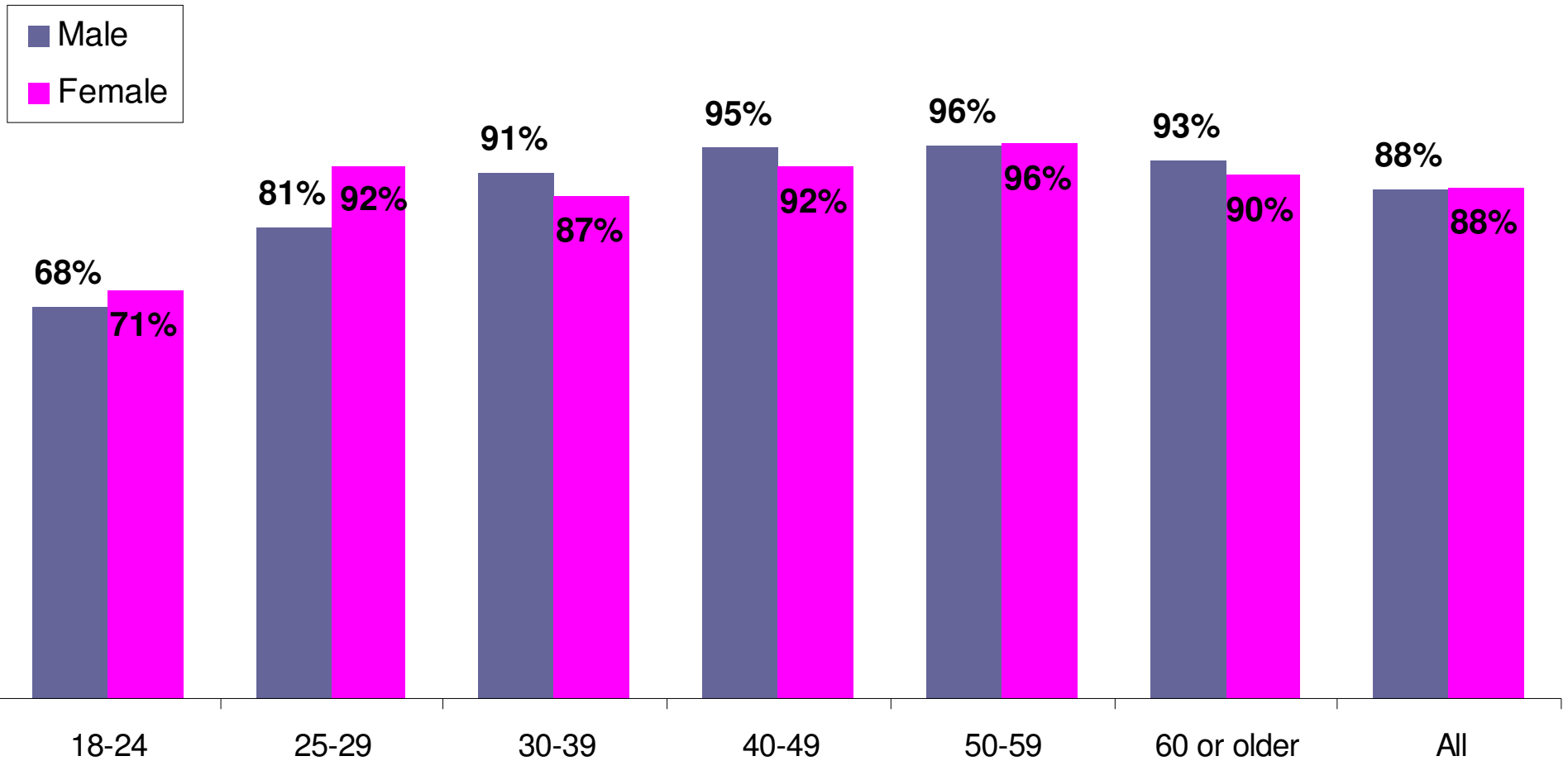
Did you vote during national assembly elections in July?

Proportion of Groups that Voted

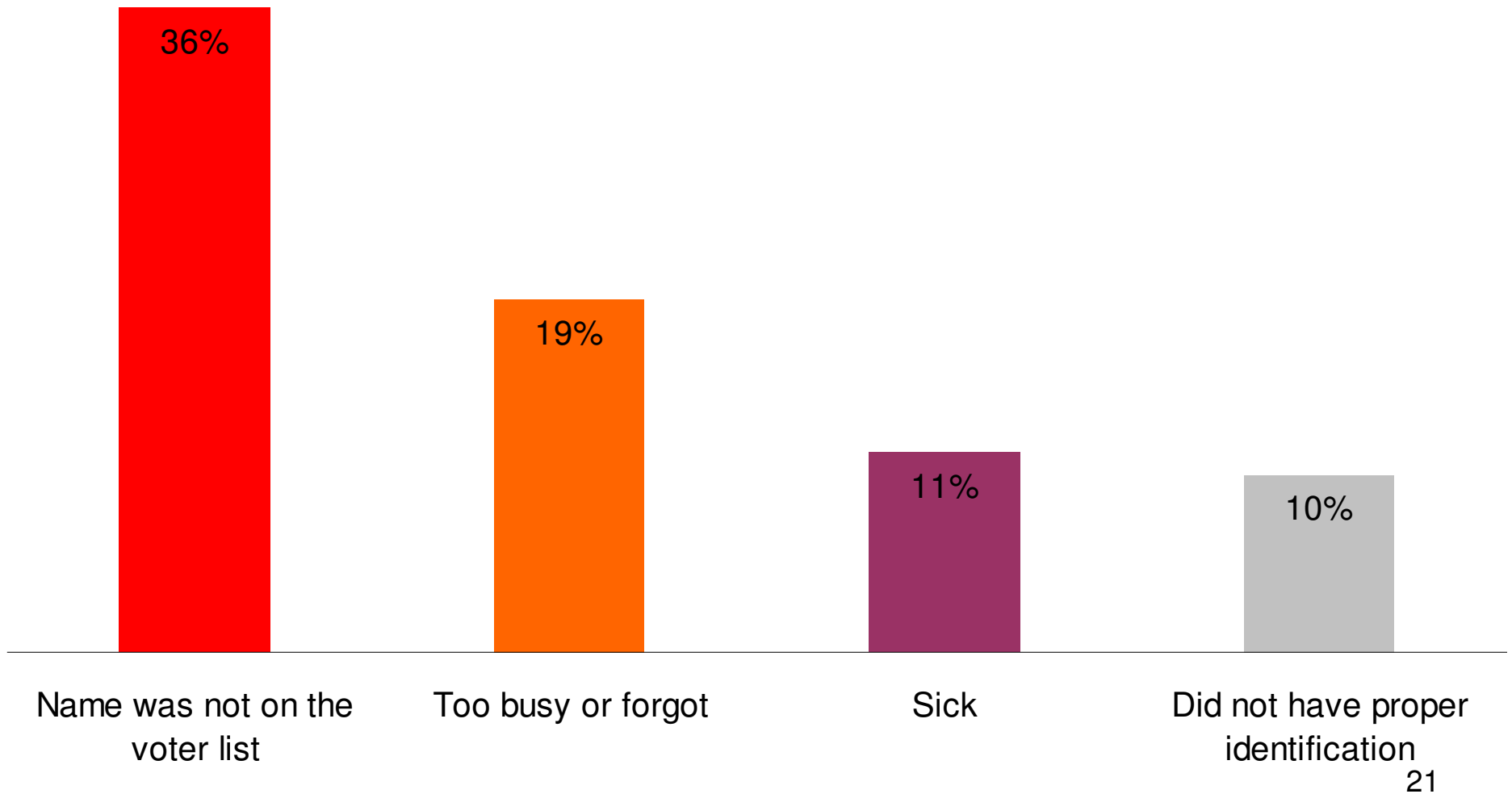


Did you vote during national assembly elections in July?

Proportion of Men and Women by Age that Voted

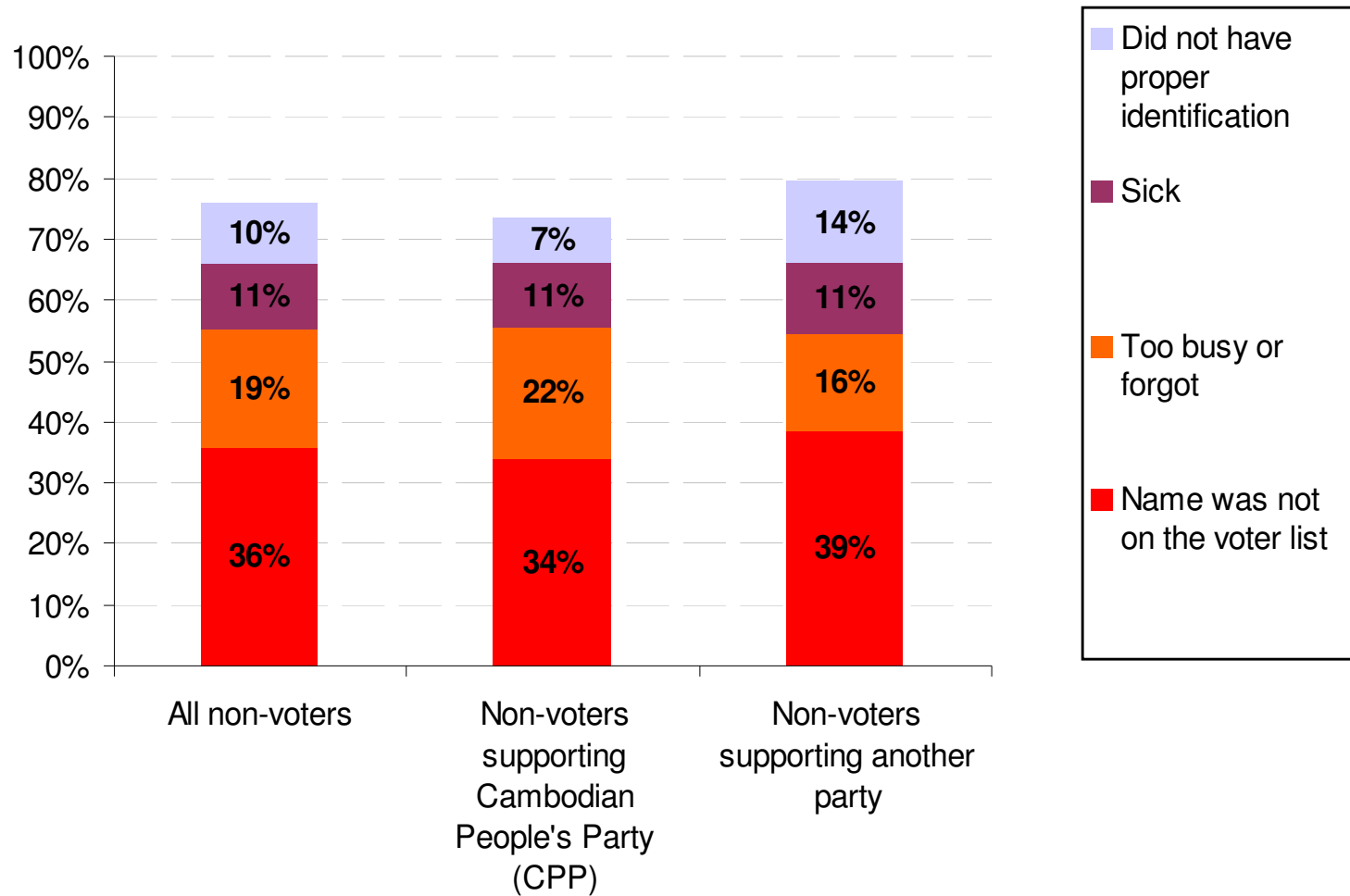

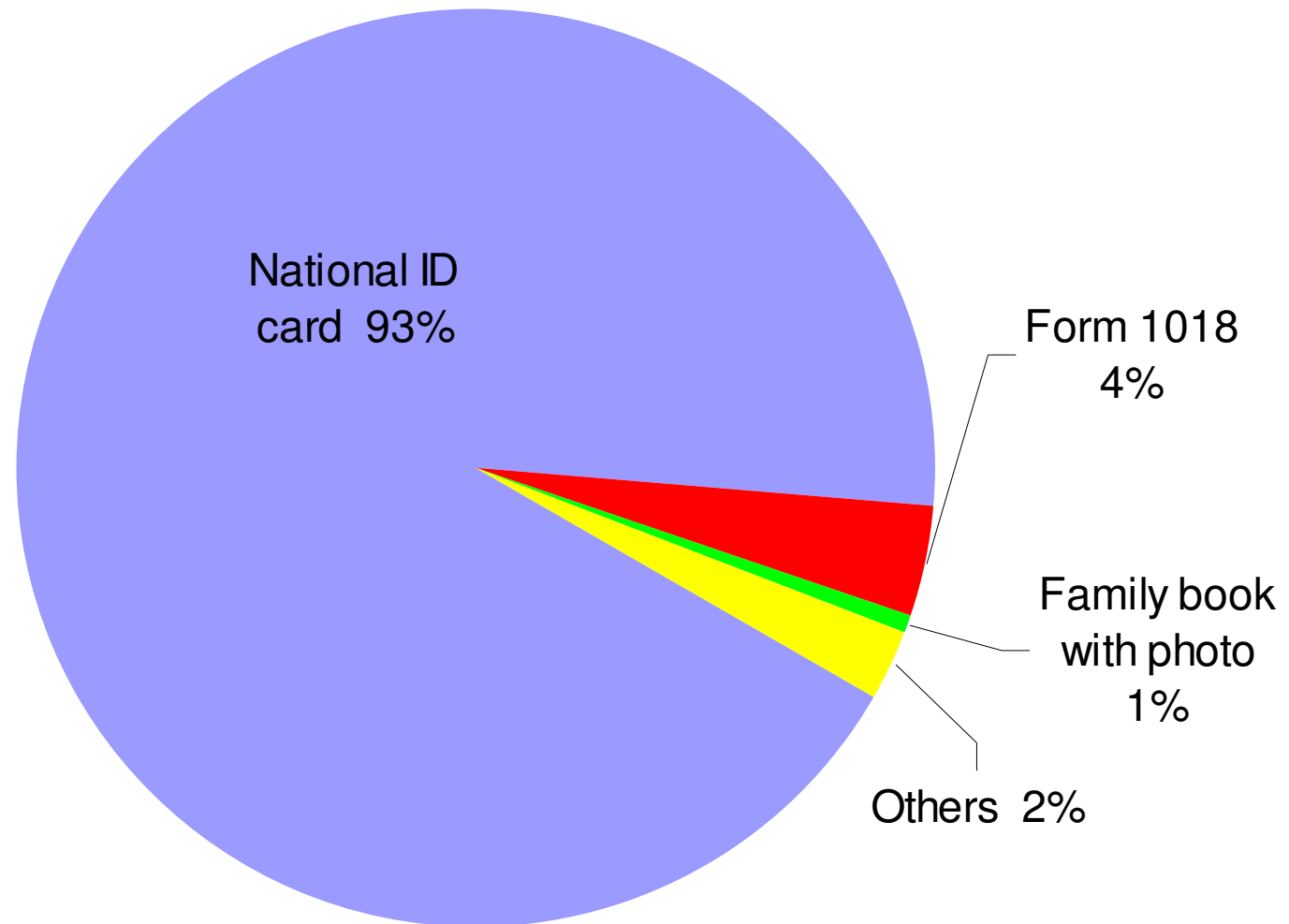

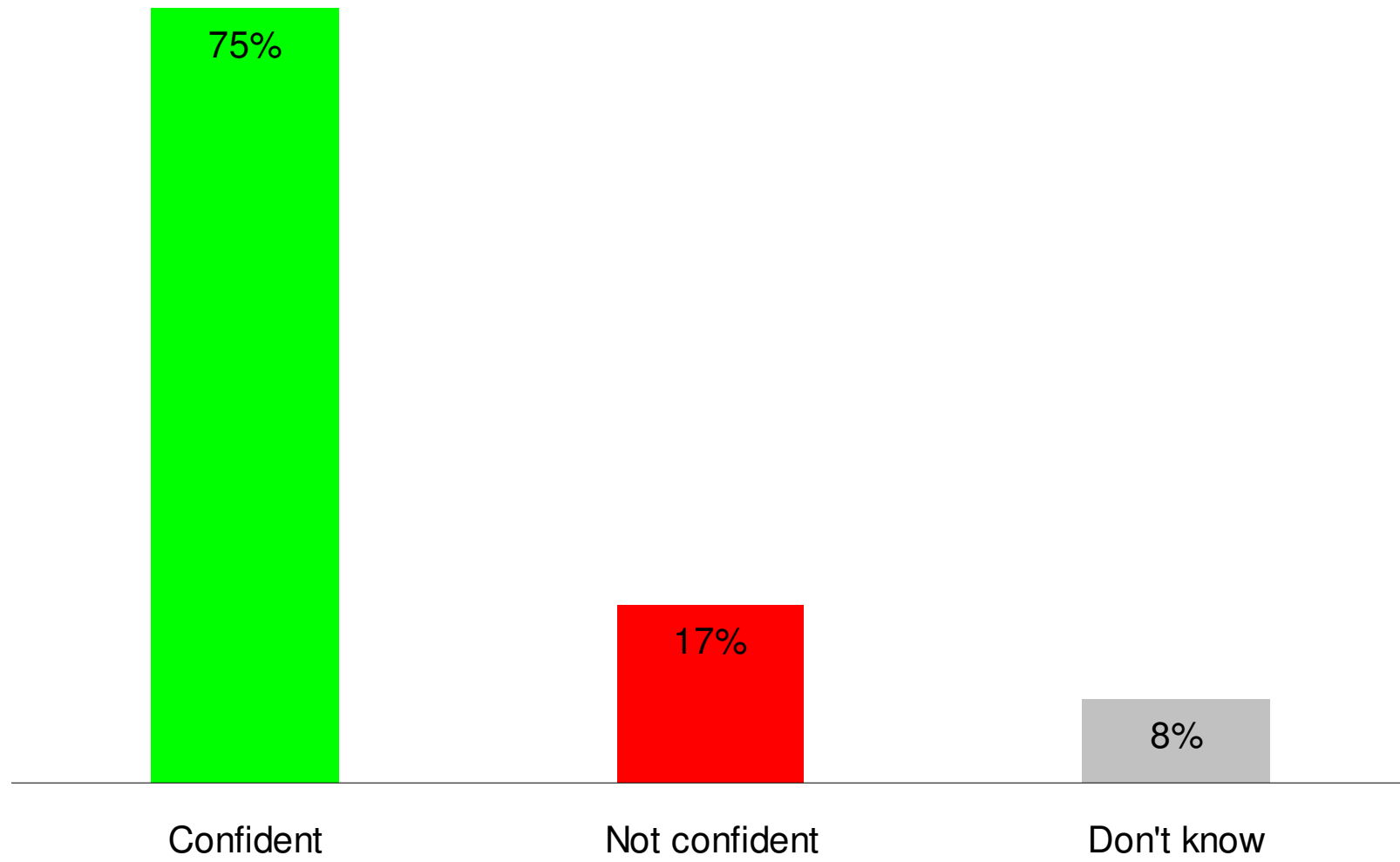

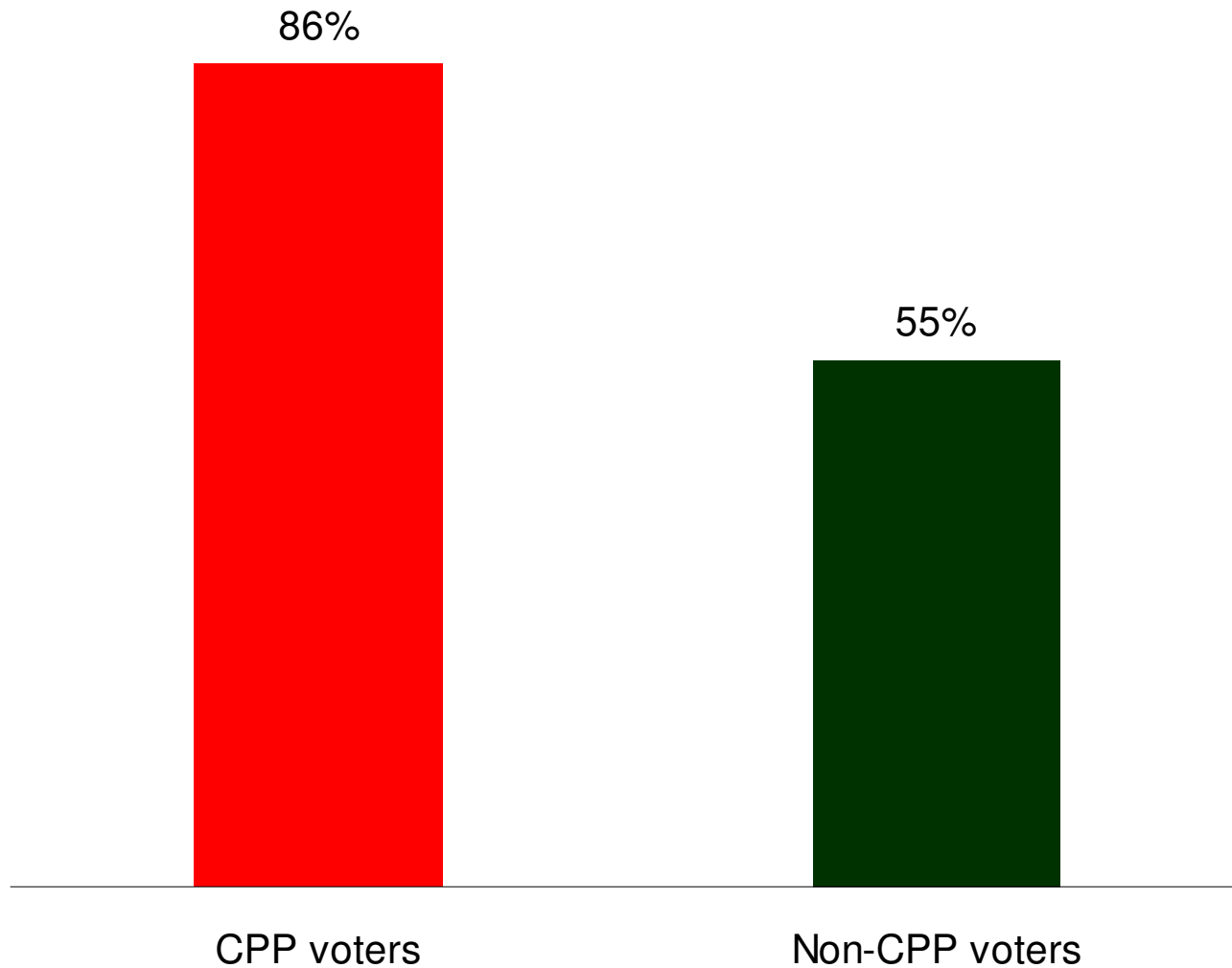
How confident are you that the July election process treated all parties fairly and equally?



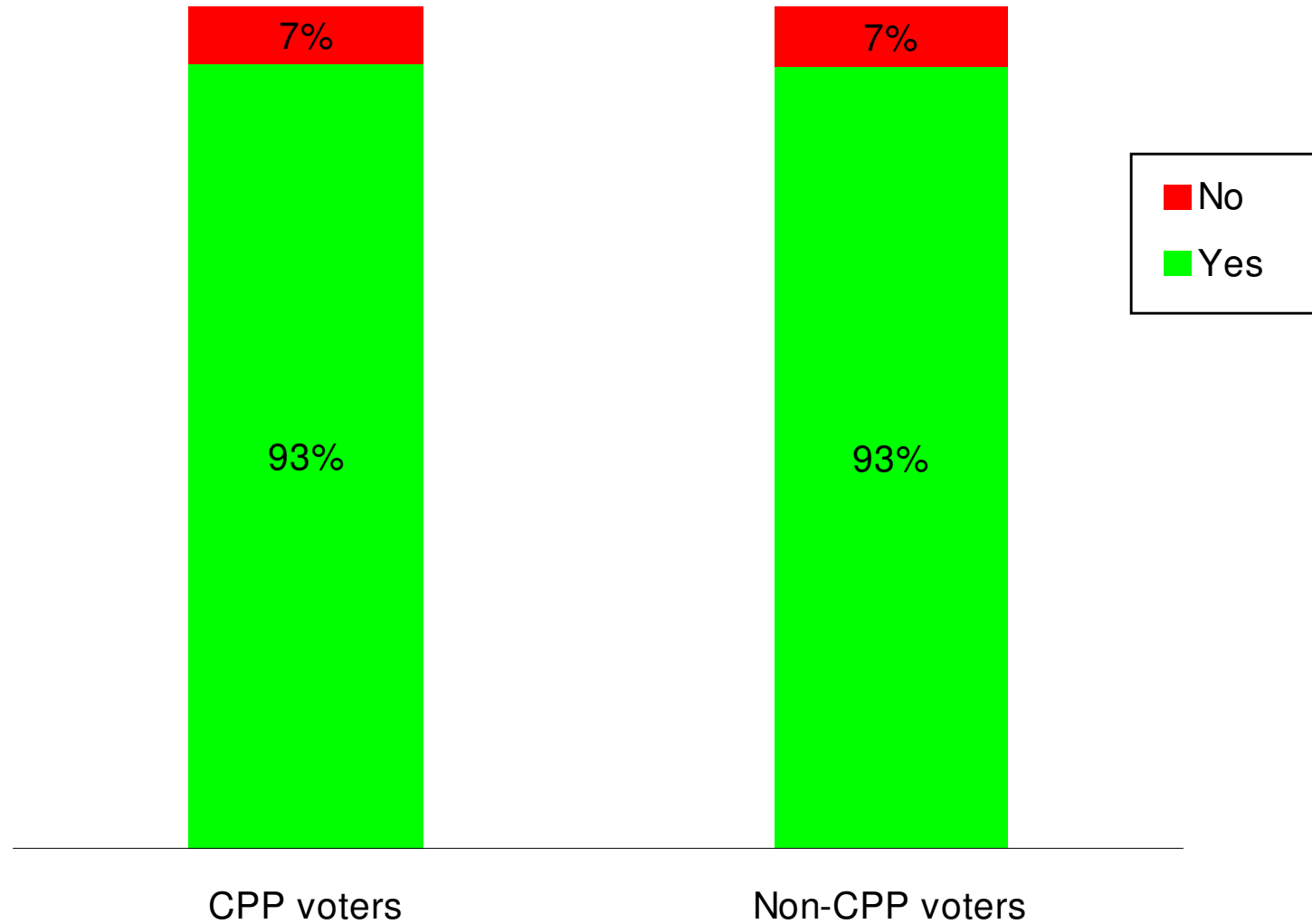
How confident are you that the July election process treated all parties fairly and equally?

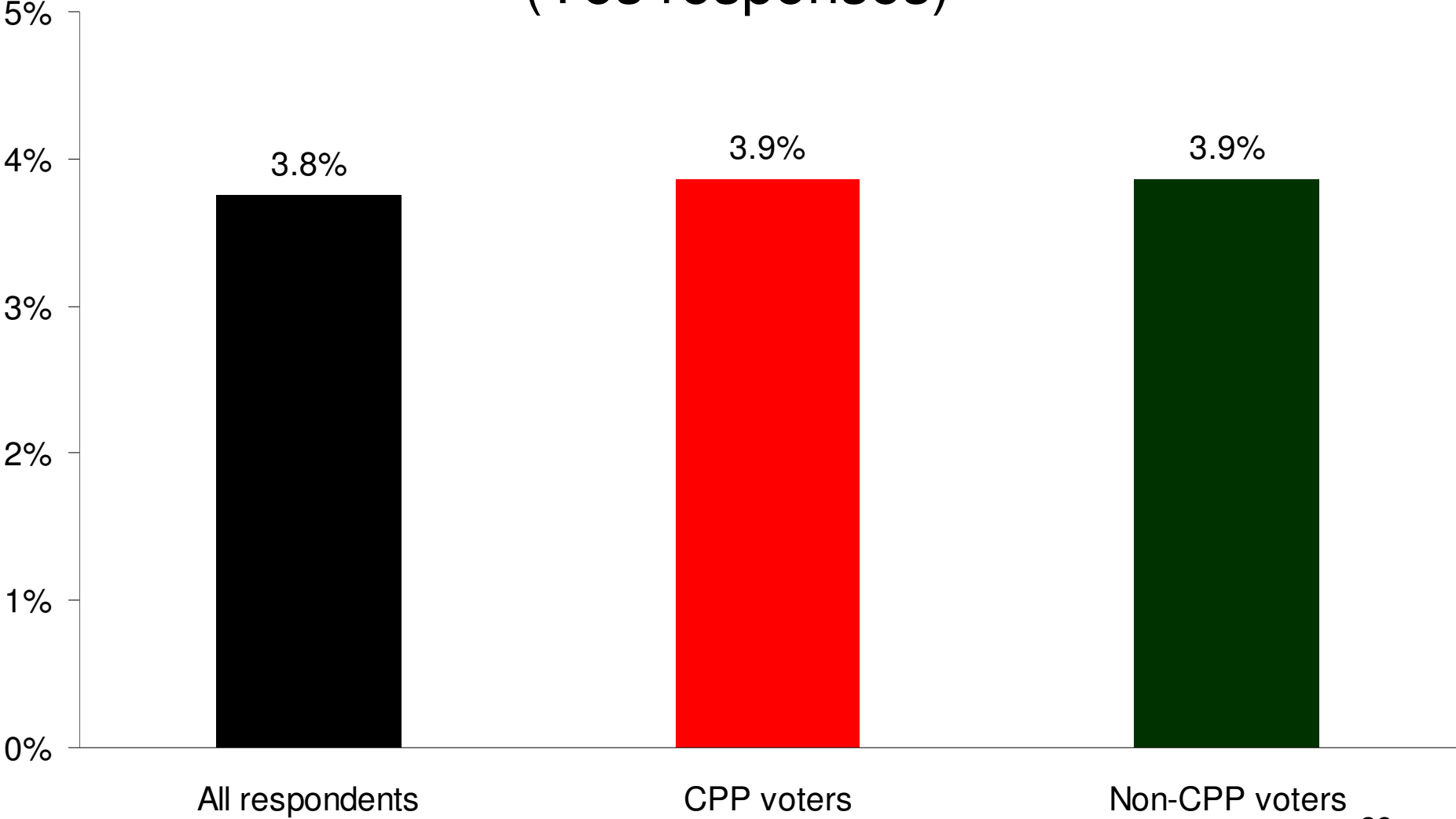

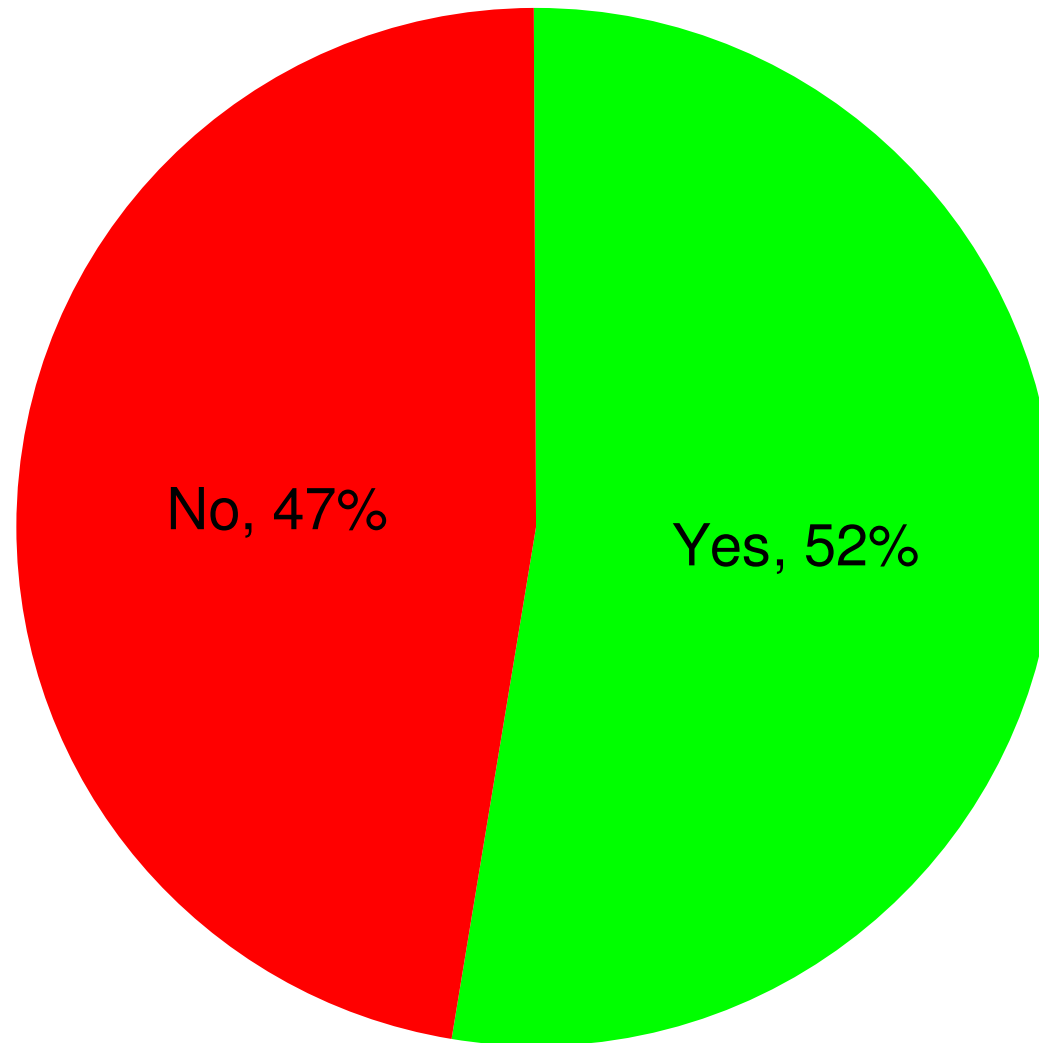
Did you receive a voter information notice before the election telling you where and when to vote?
(Voters, N = 1,764)



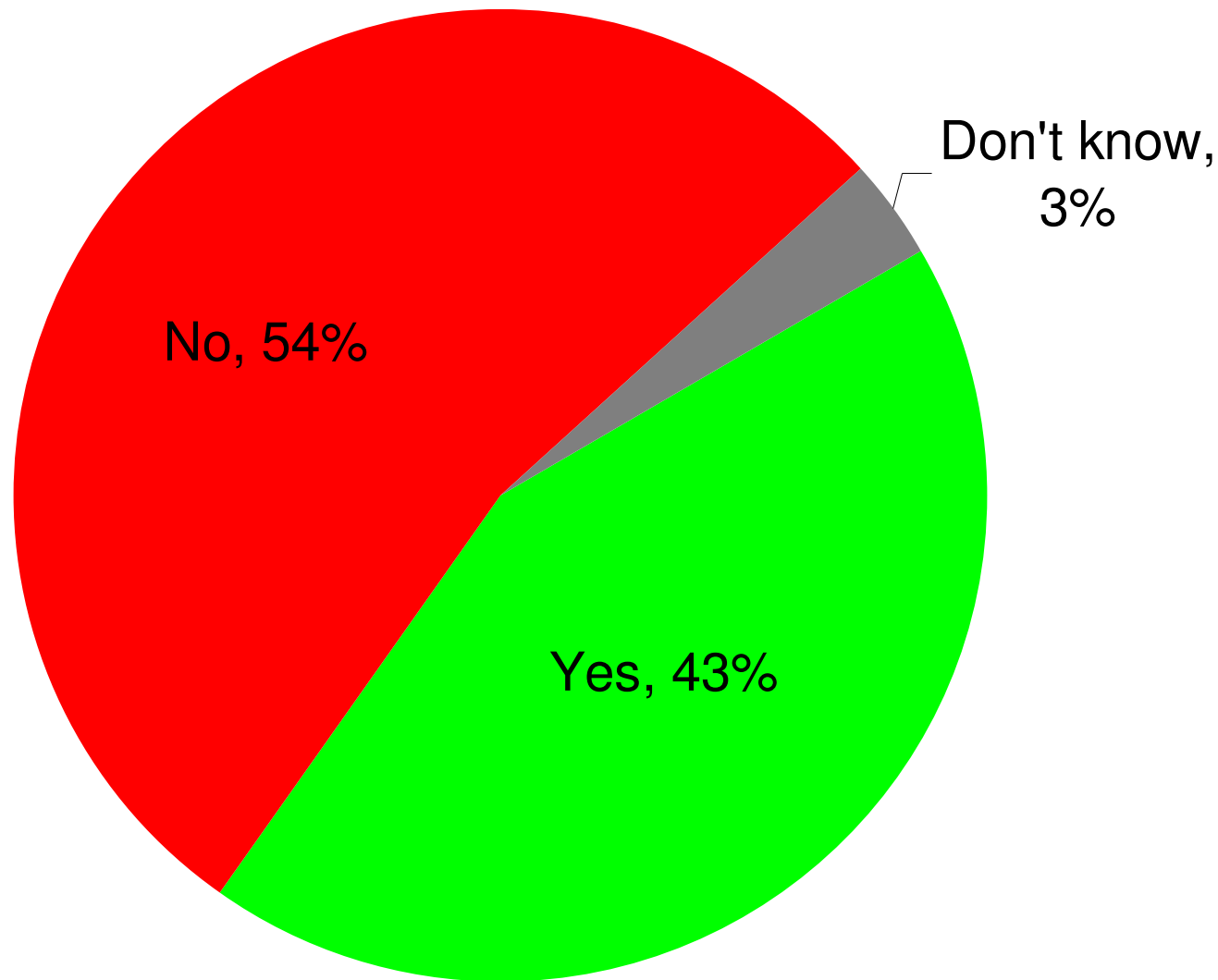
Did somebody else vote, using your name, before you arrived at the polling station on Election Day?

Did any political party or candidate offer you a gift in the national assembly elections?



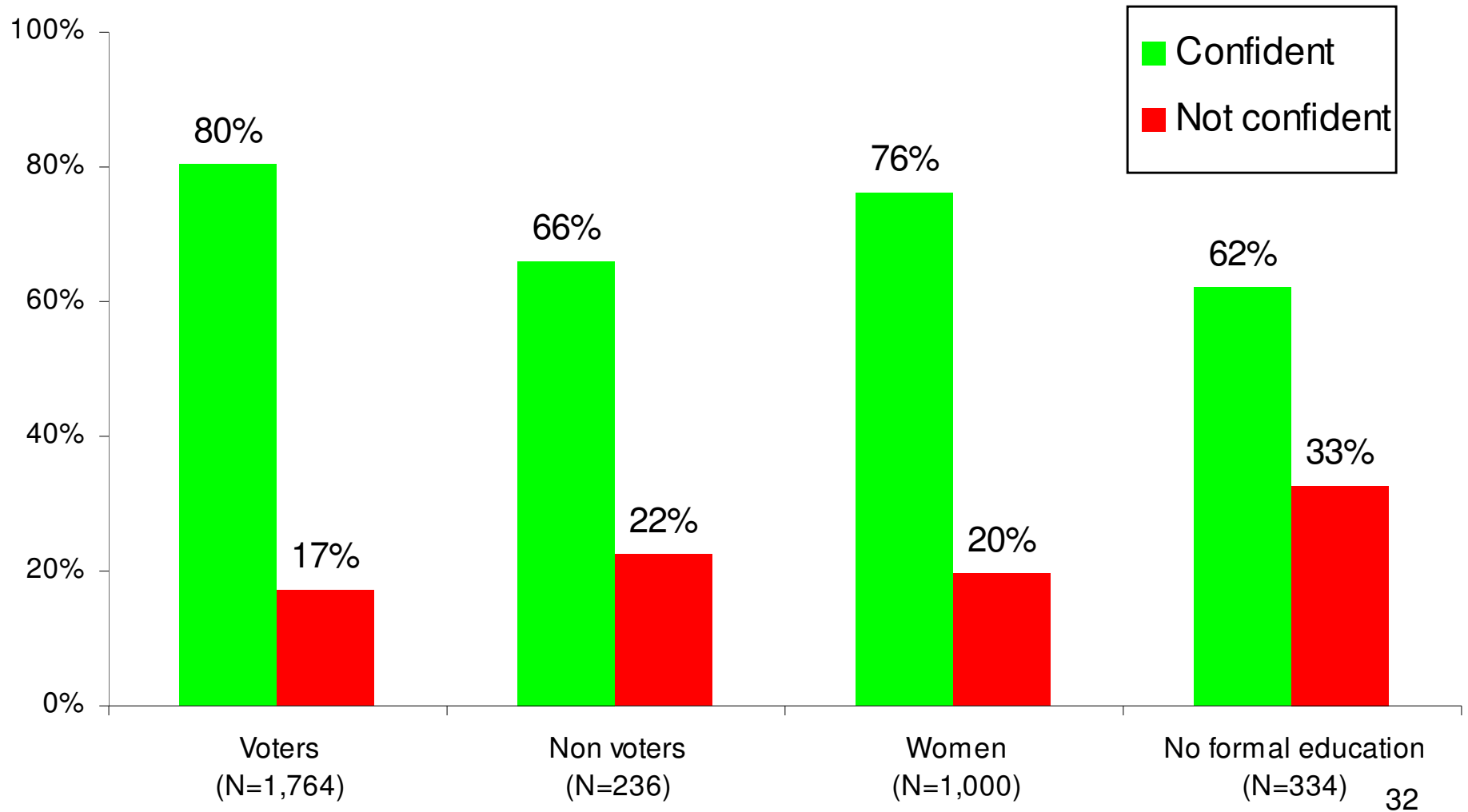
Do you think that a gift offered by any political party or candidate is an exchange for voting for that party in the national assembly elections?



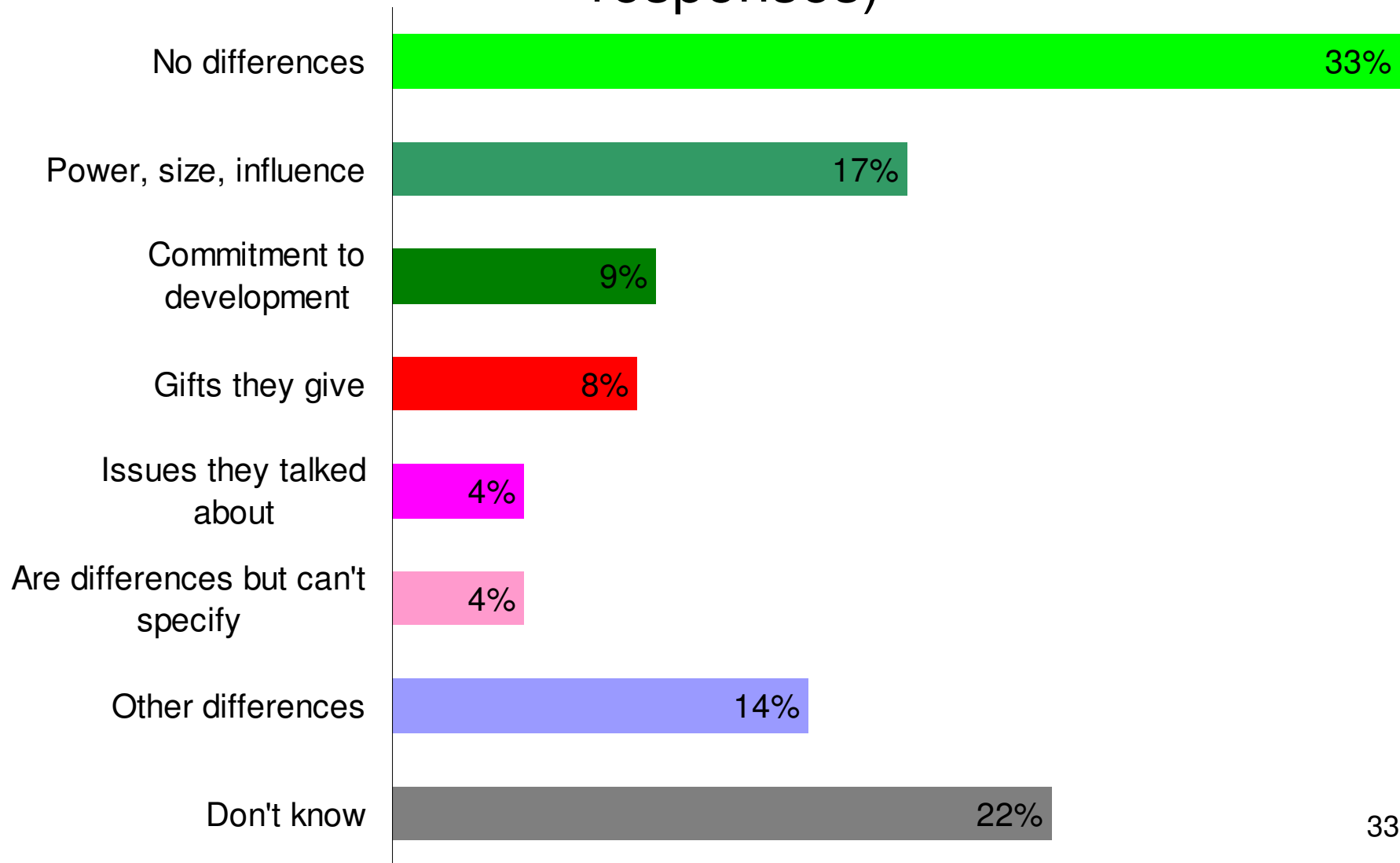

How confident are you that you received enough information about political parties to make a good decision about which to vote for? (By select groups)

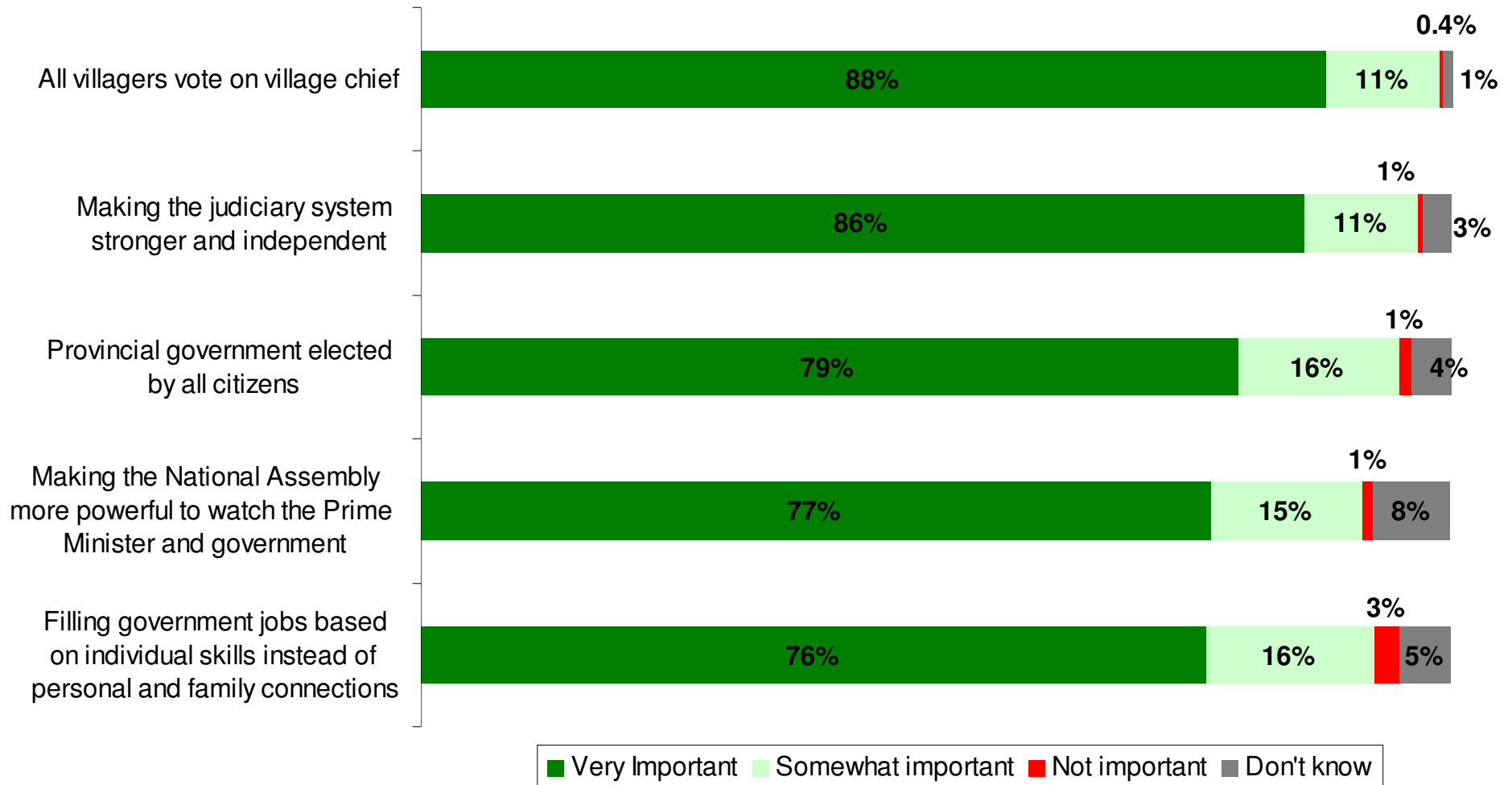


What differences do you see between the major parties that competed in national assembly elections? (Multiple responses)

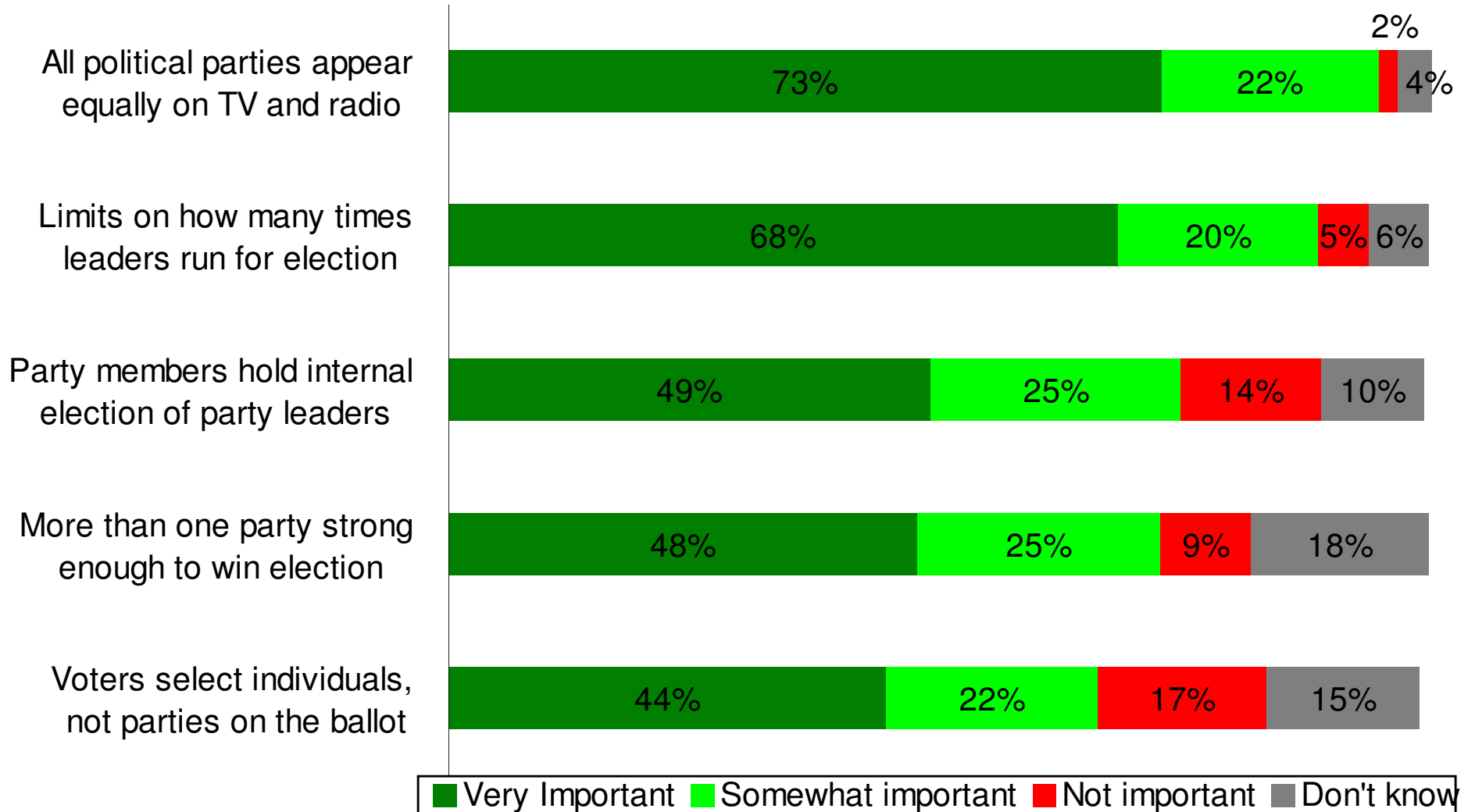

How important are each of these to making Cambodia a democracy?



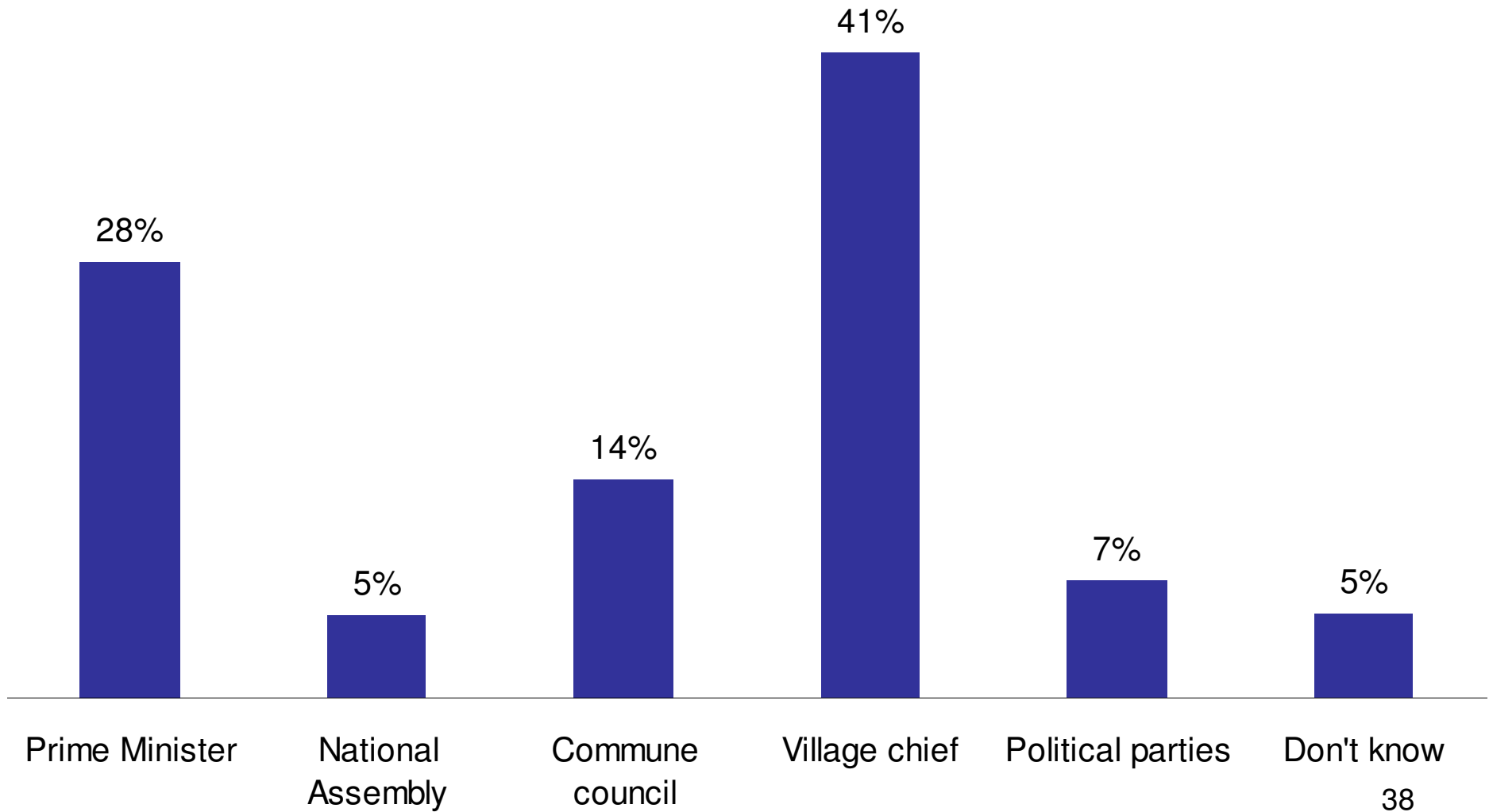

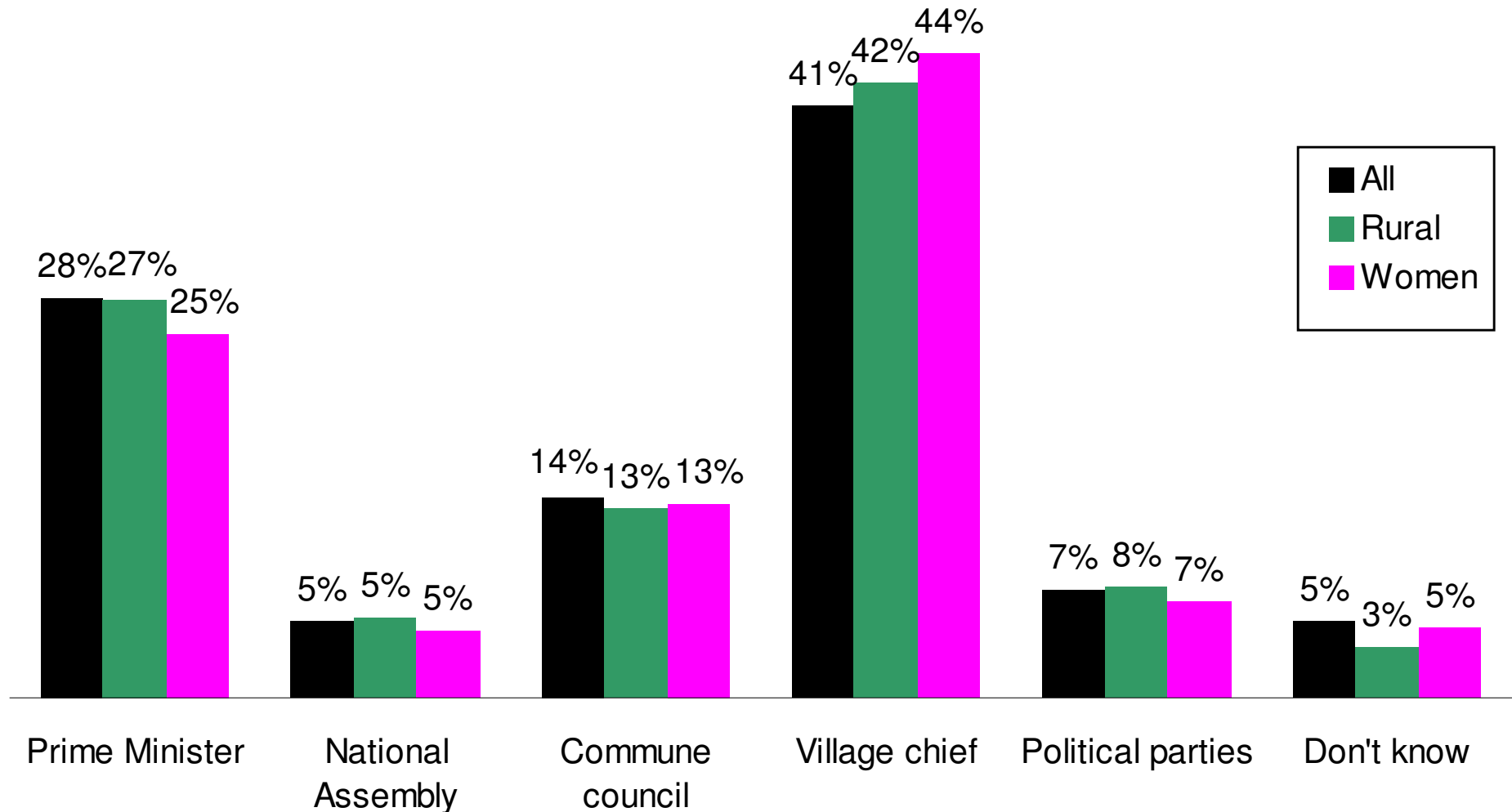

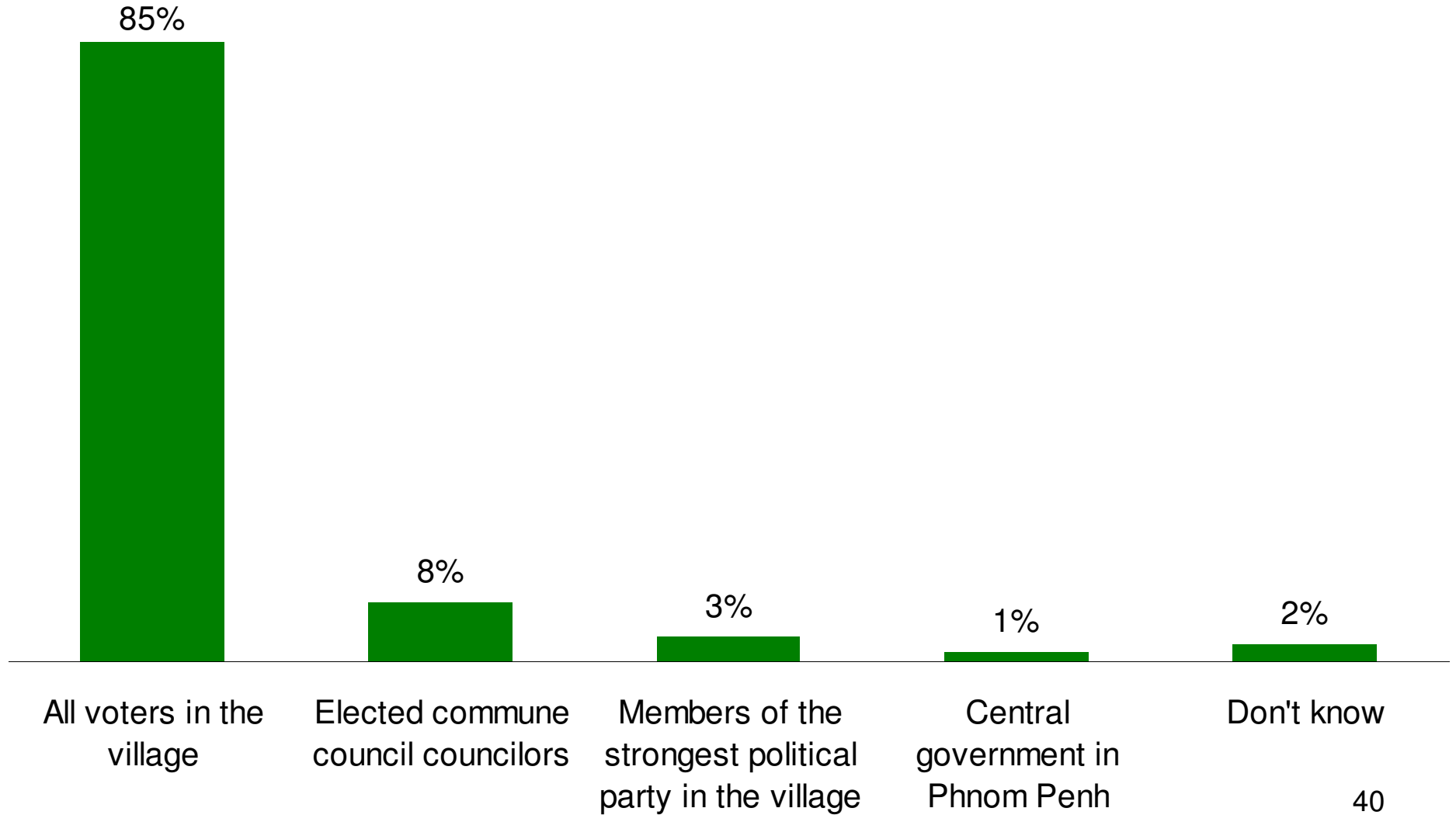
Which one of these has the stronger influence in your daily life?



Which one of these has the stronger influence in your daily life? (By demographic groups)

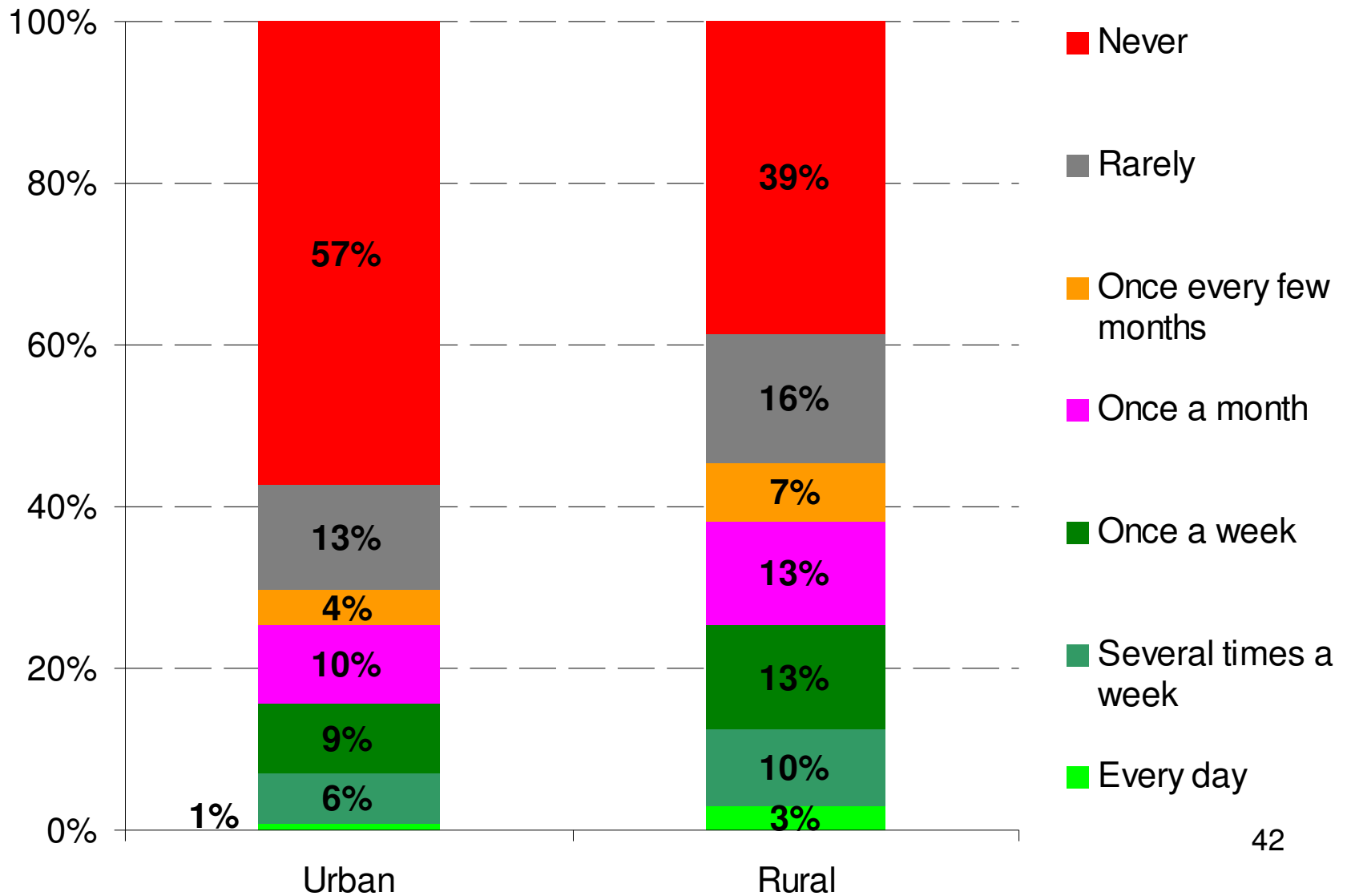


Who should select the government village chief?
