
## **Methodology Overview**

- Analysis, oversight and execution of poll was performed by international opinion research firm, Opinion Research Business.
- The population studied was all Nigerian adults of legal voting age (18+). A nationally representative two-stage random-stratified sample was utilized based on Nigeria's 2006 census, extrapolated to 2011. The sample was first stratified by zone (region) and state, then by urban/rural population.
- Enumeration areas within each region were randomly selected; households within each sampling point were then identified using a random walk method and a skip pattern; respondents were randomly chosen using a Kish grid. A 1:1 ratio of male-to-females was maintained during data collection phase and weighted for analysis.
- Sample size was 3,078. In addition to voting age, potential respondents were also filtered to exclude non-Nigerians or those who were not in their state of residence. The questionnaire was offered in English, as well as Hausa, Yoruba and Igbo. The overall response rate was 87 percent.
- The margin of error at the national level is +/- 1.8 percent. For region-to-national comparisons and region-to-region comparisons the margin of error is +/- 7.8 percent and +/- 9.4 percent, respectively.
- Data was collected via face-to-face interviews between October 20 and November 3 using a local Nigerian firm, Practical Sampling International.
- Due to rounding, and multiple response questions, not all percentages add up to 100. An asterisk represents a figure greater than 0.0% and less than 0.5%
  - Where appropriate data has been compared to <u>IRI's pre-election national poll</u> of 3,030 respondents conducted by ORB from between November 29 and December 12, 2010



Overall, do you think that things in Nigeria are headed in the right direction or the wrong direction? (%)








What is the most important issue/problem facing Nigeria at the present time? (%)



What is the most important local issue/problem facing your community at the present time? (%)



When thinking about the future of Nigeria, which of the following do you fear most? (%)








A. When thinking about the future of Nigeria, which of the following do you fear most?


B. And which of these is the second thing you fear the most for the future of Nigeria? (%)








What should be the main thing government should prioritize in terms of investing revenue obtained from the oil sector? (%)





How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: In Nigeria each state should be allowed to create and maintain its own state police force. (%)








# VOTER REGISTRATION / VOTER TURNOUT








Why didn't you register (to vote)? (%)





Did you vote in any of the previous national elections, e.g. in 1999, 2003 or 2007? (%)








How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Nigeria was well prepared for the general elections in April 2011. (%)











Overall, how confident are you that the ballots cast in your state were collated without error, interference or tampering by INEC, parties or politicians? (%)












In comparison to previous elections, do you think election officials were more competent or less competent during the April 2011 general elections? (%)








Based on your experience during the past April 2011 elections, what will be the greatest challenge, or obstacle, in the future to conducting freer and fairer elections in Nigeria? (%)






#### What is your main source of information for news and political updates? (%)








How much confidence do you have in each of these information sources? For each one please tell me whether you have a lot of confidence, some, not very much or no confidence at all? (%)




#### Do you own or have regular access to a GSM/mobile phone? (%)







#### Do you believe that the practice of zoning\* is dead in Nigeria? (%)





According to your own definition, does democracy exist in Nigeria? (%)












If elections were held (again) tomorrow, which political party would you vote for? (%)








Thinking about the April 2011 presidential election, which was more important to you in deciding who to vote for, the candidate or the political party? (%)










Thinking about the April 2011 election for governor in your state, which was more important to you in deciding who to vote for, the candidate or the political party? (%)









In the recent April 2011 elections, less women candidates were elected to the national assembly than in the 2007 elections. Why do you think less women were elected this time? (%)












### How safe do you feel here in the community? (%)
