A NATIONWIDE PUBLIC OPINION POLL

May 14 - June 15, 2020



Detailed methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's <u>Center for Insights</u> in <u>Survey Research</u> (CISR) by the <u>Independent Research Institute of Mongolia</u> (IRIM).
- Data collection was conducted between May 14 June 15, 2020 through interviews administered face-to-face in respondents' homes.
- The sample consisted of n=2,494 residents of Mongolia, aged 18 to 40.
- A multi-stage probability sampling method was used to design a nationally representative sample
 according to population estimates from the National Statistical Office. The sample was stratified
 by region and by urban/rural residency, followed by random selection of primary sampling units
 (PSUs) within each stratum. Households were selected by randomly walking in each of the 250
 PSUs, and respondents were selected by the last birthday method.
- The data was weighted by gender and age groups according to 2019 estimates from the National Statistical Office.
- The response rate was 20 percent.
- The margin of error at the mid-range of the full sample does not exceed ±2.0 points at the 95% confidence level.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.






In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?




How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way democracy is developing in our country?




To what extent do civil society organizations (CSOs) impact government policy in our country?




Do you think that today's generation of young people has a good future in our country or not?




What is the most important problem facing our country today?


What is the most important problem facing our country today?
















How important or unimportant is it that all members of our country's adult population are included in political decision-making? How important is it that the following are included?




Why are there not more youth aged 40 and younger politically engaged in our country? For each potential reason I read you, please tell me if it plays a major role or not.



Why are there not more women running for office in our country? For each potential reason I read you, please tell me if it plays a major role or not.





Did you vote in the most recent elections?*




What is the primary reason you did not vote in the most recent elections?*




Have you or your family encountered any of the following during the election campaign or on election day?



Should the upcoming elections be postponed due to COVID-19?




How likely or unlikely are you to vote in the upcoming elections?







Why are you very unlikely to vote in the upcoming elections?

Do you agree or disagree that political parties are doing enough to address the needs of young people like you?






Do you believe that democracy is the best possible form of government for our country or not?




Thinking about our country's current political system, do you believe it is a democracy?




How important or unimportant are each of these elements in making any country a democracy?



Do people in our country feel free to openly express their opinions or are they afraid?




Is the media in our country free to independently cover any issue or not?






Why have you never engaged in any of these activities?






In the past 12 months, how often, if at all, have you had to do a favor, give a gift or pay a bribe?





To whom did you have to pay a bribe, make a gift or do a favor?




To whom did you have to pay a bribe, make a gift or do a favor?



How often, if ever, do you use the internet or social media?




How frequently do you encounter information in the media, including social media, that you believe is misleading or false?






Where do you encounter disinformation or false news most frequently?




Which statement comes closest to your personal opinion regarding news and reporting from <u>Chinese media outlets</u>?




Which statement comes closest to your personal opinion regarding news and reporting from <u>Russian media outlets</u>?


Do you regularly take action to verify information you receive?









Which of the following is the biggest threat to a free and open information space in Mongolia?


