Background

The International Republican Institute (IRI) is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, organization dedicated to advancing freedom and democracy worldwide. Since 1983, IRI has worked to develop democratic institutions and ideals, carrying out a variety of international programs to promote freedom, self-government and the rule of law worldwide. IRI provides technical assistance in the areas of political party strengthening, developing civic institutions and open elections, promoting democratic governance and advancing the rule of law.

In Niger, IRI works with the domestic Unit to Counter Radicalization and Prevent Violent Extremism (CELLRAD). As part of this work, IRI needs to better understand youth perceptions of citizenship, peace, and social cohesion in Niger, and learn how this affects certain communities in Niger that are vulnerable to violent extremism. The FGDs will focus on youth perceptions of the topics mentioned above and will probe the participants' assessment of the current status of Niger's intergroup social cohesion at the national and subnational levels while also inviting respondents to articulate opportunities for growth and interventions in their respective communities. We seek to understand the culture behind violence in the region, the presence of extremist and political speech, proximity to extremist regions, and the political dimensions of individual vulnerability to participation in extremist violent conflict.

Period of Performance

One year from the date of signature.

Statement of Work OBJECTIVES OF THE RESEARCH

The FGDs will focus on youth perceptions of citizenship, peace, and social cohesion: it will probe respondents' assessment of the current status of Niger's intergroup social cohesion at the national and subnational levels while also inviting participants to articulate opportunities for growth and interventions in their respective communities.

IRI'S INFORMATIONAL NEEDS

IRI needs to better understand youth perceptions of citizenship, peace, and social cohesion in Niger, and learn how this affects certain communities in Niger that are vulnerable to violent extremism. The FGDs will focus on youth perceptions of the topics mentioned above and will probe the participants' assessment of the current status of Niger's intergroup social cohesion at the national and subnational levels while also inviting respondents to articulate opportunities for growth and interventions in their respective communities. We seek to understand the culture behind violence in the region, the presence of extremist and political speech, proximity to extremist regions, and the political dimensions of individual vulnerability to participation in extremist violent conflict.

Through additional KIIs, the firm will follow-up with local government and non-government authorities in each target locality to validate the findings of the FGDs. Our questions are as follows:

- 1. How do we explain violence amongst youth? How does violence amongst youth manifest itself?
- 2. What is the description of youth who engage in violence?
- 3. Who are the beneficiaries (direct or indirect) and victims of youth violence?
- 4. How do we eradicate youth violence?

METHODOLOGY

The questions above are best addressed by a focus group study. Twelve groups, each lasting approximately 90-120 minutes and attended by 8-10 participants, should take place, one in each target community. The following target communities are:

- Six FGDs in Niamey:
- o Three FGDs with residents of the 5th Arrondissement
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are currently enrolled in school or have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are neither currently enrolled in school nor have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years regardless of school enrollment or matriculation status
- o Three FGDs with residents of the 2nd Arrondissement
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are currently enrolled in school or have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are neither currently enrolled in school nor have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years regardless of school enrollment or matriculation status
- Six FGDs in Zinder
- o Three FGDs with residents of the 4th Arrondissement
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are currently enrolled in school or have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program

- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are neither currently enrolled in school nor have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years regardless of school enrollment or matriculation status
- o Three FGDs with residents of the 1st Arrondissement
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are currently enrolled in school or have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years who are neither currently enrolled in school nor have successfully matriculated from a secondary education program
- One FGD with 8-10 males and females aged 16-25 years regardless of school enrollment or matriculation status

The questions above will also be addressed by an in-depth interview study. Twelve in-depth Key Informant Interviews (KII), each lasting approximately 60-90 minutes should take place, with 3 in each target community. These KIIs will occur after the FGDs so data collected therein can be used to shape the final interview guide for the KIIS. The Key Informants in each target community will be chosen according to the following criteria:

- Government/non-government status (1 each per community)
- o One local government authority
- o One civil society leader
- One traditional or religious leader
- Gender
- o At least one female in each community

IRI will recruit these KII participants, but the bidder will be responsible for the scheduling, logistical management and execution of the interviews.

The KIIs are to take place in the following communities:

- Three KIIs in: Niamey, 5th Arrondissement
- Three KIIs in: Niamey, 2nd Arrondissement
- Three KIIs in: Zinder, 4th Arrondissement
- Three KIIs in: Zinder, 1st Arrondissement

All participants for the FGD sessions should be:

- Must be recruited from the specified neighborhoods within the research location cities
- Participants in the same focus group session may not know one another.
- No participants may have participated in a focus group or in-depth interview study in the past 12 months.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFEROR

Offeror will be responsible for managing all logistical aspects of the project above and should engage local support staff as necessary to complete the following:

• **Screener.** IRI will provide a draft screening questionnaire within two weeks of contract award based on the specifications above. The Offeror will review offer edits within three working days of receipt. Following IRI approval, the Offeror will

translate the screener into French. IRI reserves the right to review the translation prior to recruitment launch.

- **Recruiting participants.** Offeror will recruit all participants according to the screening criteria listed above. At least one week prior to the start of the first focus group session and in-depth interview, the Offeror will provide a brief description of the composition of the groups and the interviewees in terms of age, gender, occupation, etc. Offeror should recruit 8-10 participants for each group as well as 2-3 alternates in case any of the original participants are unable to participate. All participants will be required to give written informed consent to participate in this study. IRI will provide draft informed consent language which may be adjusted by the bidder in order to conform to any specific legal requirements in the research country.
- **Discussion guide.** IRI will provide the draft discussion guide and a draft KII guide within two weeks of contract award, with the KII to be finalized after the FGDs. Offeror will be welcome to offer suggestions for improvement and is expected to format and translate the discussion guide into Hausa and/or Zarma. IRI reserves the right to review the translation(s.) At least one week prior to the first planned session, the discussion guide will be piloted with a group of 8-10 pilot participants. This pilot will be moderated by the same moderator who will moderate the actual groups. The pilot session will be video (preferred) or audio recorded, and the recording will be provided to IRI. The Offeror will prepare a 1-2-page pilot report, based on a template provided by IRI. Once IRI has reviewed the template, some modification of the discussion guide may be required.
- **Focus group moderator.** Offeror will provide a trained and experienced moderator for groups and KIIs in each city. The moderators should familiarize him/herself with the topic of discussion prior to the groups.
- **Observation.** The Offeror will provide for all groups a facility from which [language]-speaking IRI staff may unobtrusively observe.
- **Recording of focus group discussions and KIIs.** Audio and/or video record all aspects of research necessary for full and accurate data collection, transcript generation and inclusion of illustrative samples in the final analytical report. Offeror will film focus groups and film should be high quality with clear sound. If participants do not consent to videotaping, audio recordings are acceptable.
- **Written summary of** focus group discussions and KIIs. Offeror will provide a 2-3-page written summary of the focus group discussions and KIIs in idiomatic French within one week after the final focus group session and interview. A template will be provided by IRI.
- **Transcripts.** The Offeror will provide IRI with full verbatim transcripts in French of each group and interview that will identify each participant speaker by number or first name to link each comment to the participant's gender, exact age, education level, city and occupation.

TIMING

The focus group discussions and in-depth interviews should be held in February 2020; the exact timing needs to be determined in close consultation with IRI.

Technical Proposals

All proposals submitted to IRI must include:

- Information addressing Bidder's experience in providing each of the services identified in the above Statement of Work and Bidder's proposed specific approach for providing those services to IRI under this contract, including sufficient information to determine a clear definition of services as it relates to other providers that may be involved.
- 2. The name, address, and telephone and facsimile numbers of the Bidder (and electronic address if available). If the Bidder is a firm, name(s) should be provided for individuals authorized to conduct business on behalf of the firm.
- 3. Bidders may provide a list of up to three references for work performed of a similar nature during the last three years, along with contact details. IRI may contact the references to evaluate past performance.
- 4. If the Bidder is a U.S. organization/resident, or a foreign organization/resident which has income effectively connected with the conduct of activities in the U.S. or has an office or a place of business or a fiscal paying agent in the U.S., the information submitted must contain Bidder's Taxpayer Identification Number.
- 5. Proposals will not exceed ten (10) pages (not including cover page) in 12-point Times New Roman font.
- 6. Proposals should address the following points:
 - a. List qualitative projects you conducted with similar specifications in this market
 - b. Name and explain the role of subcontractors (if any)
 - c. State if you are to comply with all requirements listed on this SOW without alterations. If any proposed alterations, explain.
 - d. Describe recruitment plan
 - e. Describe fieldwork quality assurance measures (if any)
 - f. Describe analysis plan
 - g. Provide proposed moderator(s) and qualitative interviewer(s) CV/Resume
 - h. Describe anticipated challenges if any

Price Proposals

Bidders must propose a firm-fixed Unit Price for each of the deliverables identified below and in the format of the table below. The Bidder's pricing must be valid for at least 60 (sixty) calendar days after the due date for proposal submission. The proposed Unit Price should be fixed and inclusive of all costs to perform, including inspection services, transportation, taxes, import duties (if any), and other levies. To the extent that a Bidder proposed to include any pricing not reflected in the table below, such pricing must be fully described in the proposal. Proposals must be submitted in United States Dollars, payments under any resulting contract will be made in this currency.

Evaluation and Award Process

- IRI may contact any Bidder for clarification or additional information, but Bidders are
 advised that IRI intends to evaluate the offers based on the written proposals, without
 discussions, and reserves the right to make decisions based solely on the information
 provided with the initial proposals. IRI may but is not obligated to conduct additional
 negotiations with the most highly rated Bidders prior to award of a contract, and may
 at its sole discretion elect to issue contracts to one or more Bidders.
- 2. Mathematical errors will be corrected in the following manner: If a discrepancy exists between the total price proposed and the total price resulting from multiplying the unit price by the corresponding amounts, then the unit price will prevail and the total price will be corrected. If there is a discrepancy between the numbers written out in words and the amounts in numbers, then the amount expressed in words will prevail. If the Bidder does not accept the correction, the offer will be rejected.
- 3. IRI may determine that a proposal is unacceptable if the prices proposed are materially unbalanced between line items or sub-line items. Unbalanced pricing exists when, despite an acceptable total evaluated price, the price of one or more contract line items is significantly overstated or understated as indicated by the application of cost or price analysis techniques. A proposal may be rejected if IRI determines that the lack of balance poses an unacceptable risk.
- 4. IRI will conduct a source selection based as follows:

IRI intends to evaluate Bidders' proposals in accordance with these factors and make an award to the responsible Bidder whose proposal is most advantageous to the program.

5. If a cost realism analysis is performed, cost realism may be considered in evaluating performance or price.

RFP Terms and Conditions

- 1. Prospective Bidders are requested to review clauses incorporated by reference in the section "Notice Listing Contract Clauses Incorporated by Reference".
- 2. IRI may reject any or all proposals if such is within IRI's interest.
- 3. Proof of costs incurred, such as but not limited to receipts, pictures and financial documents, may be requested during and for up to three years after the end of the contract period.
- 4. The Bidder's initial proposal should contain the Bidder's best offer.
- 5. Payment will be made upon receipt of invoices and deliverables/services.
- 6. Discussions with Bidders following the receipt of a proposal do not constitute a rejection or counteroffer by IRI.
- 7. IRI will hold all submissions as confidential and submissions shall not be disclosed to third parties. IRI reserves the right to share proposals internally, across divisions, for the purposes of evaluating the proposals.
- 8. For any currency conversion, the exchange rate to US Dollars listed on oanda.com on the closing date of this solicitation shall be used.
- 9. Every contract will contain provisions governing termination for cause and termination for convenience.
- 10. By submitting a proposal, offeror agrees to comply with all terms, conditions, and provisions included in the solicitation and agreement to the services identified above, and will specifically identify any disagreement with or exceptions to the terms, conditions, and provisions.
- 11. Offerors confirm that the prices in the proposal/proposal/application/quote have been arrived at independently, without any consultation, communication, or agreement with any other Bidder or competitor for the purpose of restricting competition.
- 12. If IRI continues to require the goods and services and the price remains reasonable and within market norms, resulting contract may be renewed each year for up to 5 years with 30 days' notice to the Contractor. Bidder must establish any price increase for each renewal year in the initial bid.
- 13. Bidders agree to disclose as part of the proposal submission:
 - Any close, familial, or financial relationships with IRI staff and agents. For example, the Bidder must disclose if a Bidder's mother conducts volunteer trainings for IRI.
 - Any family or financial relationship with other Bidders submitting proposals.
 For example, if the Bidder's father owns a company that is submitting another proposal, the Bidder must state this.
 - o Any other action that might be interpreted as potential conflict of interest.

Notice Listing Contract Clauses Incorporated by Reference

IRI is required to make the contractor subject to certain flowdown clauses of the prime award. This awarded contract will incorporate one or more clauses by reference, with the same force and effect as if they were given in full text.
