## Kosovo Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's Center for Insights in Survey Research by Ipsos Strategic Marketing.
- Data was collected between November 18 to November 30, 2018 through face-to-face interviews.
- The total number of interviews consisted of 1,019 Kosovo residents.
- The margin of error does not exceed plus or minus 3.4 percent at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95 percent. The sample was made up of Kosovo residents, aged 18 and older.
- In order to align this sample with population statistics as per the 2011 census, data in this presentation was weighted according to parameters gathered from official census data including region, urbanization, age, gender, nationality and education.
- Regions included in the sample: Pristina, Northwest, Southeast, North and Southwest. Areas of the population excluded from the sample: none.
- This sample was designed using a three stage, random probability sampling; strata allocation based on region and type of settlement; primary sampling units: polling station; within each settlement, households were visited by using an appropriate skip interval; within each visited household, interviews were conducted using random selection of eligible household members.
- Figures in charts and tables may not add to 100 percent due to rounding error and/or multiple selection options.


## Serbia Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's Center for Insights in Survey Research by Ipsos Strategic Marketing.
- Data was collected between November 18 to November 26, 2018 through face-to-face interviews.
- The total number of interviews consisted of 1,027 Serbia residents.
- The margin of error does not exceed plus or minus 3.21 percent at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95 percent. The sample was made up of Serbia residents, aged 18 and older.
- In order to align this sample with population statistics as per the 2011 census, data in this presentation was weighted according to parameters gathered from official census data including region, urbanization, age, gender, and education.
- Regions included in the sample: Belgrade, Vojvodina, Central, East and West Serbia. Areas of the population excluded from the sample: none.
- This sample was designed using a three stage, random probability sampling; strata allocation based on region and type of settlement; primary sampling units: polling station; within each settlement, households were visited by using an appropriate skip interval; within each visited household, interviews were conducted using random selection of eligible household members.
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## Bosnia and Herzegovina Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's Center for Insights in Survey Research by Ipsos Strategic Marketing.
- Data was collected between November 16 to November 28, 2018 through face-to-face interviews.
- The total number of interviews consisted of $1,019 \mathrm{BiH}$ residents.
- The margin of error does not exceed plus or minus 3.22 percent at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95 percent. The sample was made up of BiH residents, aged 18 and older.
- In order to align this sample with population statistics as per the 2011 census, data in this presentation was weighted according to parameters gathered from official census data including region, urbanization, age, gender, nationality and education.
- Regions included in the sample: Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Republic of Srpska and Brcko District. Areas of the population excluded from the sample: none.
- This sample was designed using a three stage, random probability sampling; strata allocation based on region and type of settlement; primary sampling units: polling station; within each settlement, households were visited by using an appropriate skip interval; within each visited household, interviews were conducted using random selection of eligible household members
- Figures in charts and tables may not add to 100 percent due to rounding error and/or multiple selection options.


## North Macedonia Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's Center for Insights in Survey Research by Ipsos Strategic Marketing.
- Data was collected between November 17 to November 26, 2018 through face-to-face interviews.
- The total number of interviews consisted of 1,026 North Macedonia residents.
- The margin of error does not exceed plus or minus 3.21 percent at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95 percent. The sample was made up of North Macedonia residents, aged 18 and older.
- In order to align this sample with population statistics as per the 2002 census, data in this presentation was weighted according to parameters gathered from official census data including region, urbanization, age, gender, nationality and education.
- Regions included in the sample: Skopje, North-West, South-West and East. Areas of the population excluded from the sample: none.
- This sample was designed using a three stage, random probability sampling; strata allocation based on region and type of settlement; primary sampling units: polling station; within each settlement, households were visited by using an appropriate skip interval; within each visited household, interviews were conducted using random selection of eligible household members.
