
Methodology in Brief

- Face-to-face interviews conducted October 9 11, 2005
- All field work was conducted by an Iraqi polling firm employing more than 120 trained interviewers across the country
- Interviews occurred in 17 of 18 governorates. For security reasons, Al Anbar/Ramadi was not included in this survey
- A total sample of 2,746 valid interviews were obtained from a total sample of 3,000 rendering a response rate of 92 percent
- The overall margin of error for this survey is +/- 3 percent


Demographics in Brief

- Representative of 17 of Iraq's 18 provinces—percentage of sample ranging from 4 percent in Wasit to 26 percent in Baghdad
- Ethnic distribution: Arabic (82%), Kurdish (15%), Turkmen (2%), Chaldo-Assyrian (less than 1%), Other (less than 1%)
- Urban sample accounts for 66 percent of respondents and rural respondents made up the remaining 34 percent
- Male to female ratio is 47 percent to 53 percent, respectively
- Age distribution: 18-24 (20%), 25-34 (28%), 35-44 (23%), 45-54 (17%), 55 and over (12%)
- Religious Distribution: Sunni Muslim (10%), Shia Muslim (24%), Only Muslim (64%), Christian and other sects (2%)

Do you think that Iraq today is generally heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?








TREND: Thinking about the future, do you feel that things will be better, the same or worse in six months?




TREND: Thinking about the future, do you feel that things will be better, the same or worse in one year?




TREND: Thinking about the future, do you feel that things will be better, the same or worse in five years?




TREND: In the referendum, the draft permanent constitution will be presented to the Iraqi people for approval. Do you intend to vote?




REGIONAL BREAKDOWN: In the referendum, the draft permanent constitution will be presented to the Iraqi people for approval. Do you intend to vote?




Irrespective of your intention to vote, which of the following represents your thoughts of the security situation on Referendum Day?




Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of the Iraqi National Assembly?




If you somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of the Iraqi National Assembly, what is your reason?




Do you strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree or strongly disagree that the constitution drafted by the Iraqi National Assembly satisfactorily:
