

Ugandan Public Opinion on the 2006 Elections, Preliminary Results





Methodology in Brief

- Face-to-face interviews were conducted with Ugandan citizens of voting age between Jan 20-24, 2006.
- All field work was conducted by Wilsken Agencies, a research and development consulting firm.
- Interviews were conducted at 150 sites in 46 of Uganda's functional 69 districts.
- A total sample of 1,200 interviews were conducted.
- The overall margin of error for the survey is +/- three percent.
- Both urban and rural areas were visited however, urban areas were over-sampled to 30 percent of the total interviews conducted.
- Urban areas were over-sampled to generate enough data to conduct a separate urban analysis.
- The survey field returns generated a sample of respondents slightly more educated than shown in the Uganda Bureau of Statistics 2002 census.
- To ensure that demographic distribution of the survey matches that of the Uganda Bureau of Statistics 2002 census, the data generated has been weighted to correct for the unmatched urban-rural and education distributions. The results herein presented are based on a weighted dataset.









Percentage of the population that can correctly identify the date of the following elections:




Is a voters' card required for voting?




Can a voter whose photograph does not appear in the register be allowed to vote?




Will the Movement System continue to operate after the 2006 elections?

How much do you trust each of the following to report accurate political information and news? Percentage reporting "somewhat" or "a lot"











How much do you trust each of the following to do what is right in the 2006 elections?




Freeness and Fairness

Have you recently been offered money or a gift in exchange for votes, or have you heard of someone who has?






Key Issues of the Electorate
