






# Overall, would you say that the country is headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?




# Do you approve or disapprove of the job the government has done running the country since the 2002 election?




## Has the government done well or done poorly in fulfilling its election promises from 2002?




## Would you say the condition of Kenya's economy is good or bad?




# Would you say that your personal economic condition has gotten better, stayed the same or gotten worse over the past five years?




## What is the most important issue the Kenyan government should address?






# Are you likely or unlikely to vote in the 2007 general election?




# Which one of the following methods do you think political parties should use to nominate their presidential candidates?




# Would the people you know be likely or unlikely to vote for a female candidate for president?




# Would voters in your constituency be likely or unlikely to vote for a female candidate for parliament?




# What is the single most important quality a parliamentary candidate should have?






# Do you approve or disapprove of the current parliament's performance since the 2002 election?




# Do you approve or disapprove of your own member of parliament's performance since the 2002 election?




## Do you think your member of parliament deserves to be re-elected?








# Would you say that corruption has increased, decreased or remained the same since the 2002 election?




## Do you think that the government is committed to the fight against corruption in Kenya?








## Overall, would you say that the Kenyan media is free or not free to accurately report news?




## Overall, would you say that Kenyans are free or not free to openly express their political opinions?




# Would you say that Kenyans' freedom of expression has increased, decreased or remained the same since the 2002 elections?




### Which of the following statements do most you agree with?



#### Where do you get most of your news?






## VIEWS ON THE CONSTITUENCY DEVELOPMENT FUND (CDF)


In 2003, the Kenyan Parliament established the CDF. It seeks to decentralize development planning by devoting a percentage of the national budget to constituency-level development projects, to be directed by local committees. However, critics have pointed out that the member of parliament representing each constituency wields a great deal of influence over the makeup and decisions of the committee, and some members have been accused of using the CDF as a tool for political and financial advancement.

#### Have you ever heard or read about the CDF?




### Would you say that the CDF program in your constituency is managed in an open way?


### Has the impact of CDF programme in your constituency been large or small?
