
Republic of Liberia Public Opinion Poll

Methodology

- □ The surveys were conducted on July 13 & 14 in Margibi county; on July 15 & 16 in Grand Bassa county; and on July 17 & 18 in Nimba County.
- The study was designed, coordinated and analyzed by American Viewpoint, Inc. in consultation with IRI's Monrovia and Washington, D.C. offices.
- A total of 395 interviews were conducted in Margibi county, 406 interviews in Grand Bassa county, and 505 interviews in Nimba county.
- □ The margin of error for this study is +/- five percent in Grand Bassa and Margibi and +/- four percent in Nimba. All margins of error are based on a 95 percent confidence interval.
- The results presented in the following slides have been rounded to the nearest whole number.

Methodology

- □ A total of 15 interviewers were recruited with social science backgrounds. Prior to conducting the poll, all interviewers were given extensive training on the survey instrument and participated in a mock administration of the poll.
- □ The interviewers were randomly dropped off in various parts of the county and each interviewer was given a specific number of interviews to complete based on the number of votes cast in that particular area in the 2005 presidential election.
- Only respondents with a valid voter registration card were included in the survey. No other factors were used to exclude respondents.
- □ All interviews were conducted face-to-face on a household basis.
- ☐ The interviewers alternated between men and women and interviewed a range of ages.
- ☐ There were no quotas based on gender, age, marital status or region.
- ☐ Slight errors may result due to rounding.












Based on what you see in your community, is Liberia improving or going back toward unrest?




Would you say that Liberia is more democratic than it was 5 years ago, less democractic or about the same?




Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the job that President Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf is doing?



Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the job that the National Legislature is doing?




Aggregated awareness and favorability ratings for six political parties.



In your opinion what is the biggest problem facing Liberia today?






In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about education?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about unemployment/jobs?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about food/hunger?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about clean and safe water?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about providing electricity?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about providing healthcare?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about eliminating corruption?




In general, do you think political parties spend too much, too little or the right amount of time talking about reconciliation and healing of the country?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of unemployment/creating jobs?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of food and hunger?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of education?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of providing clean and safe water?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of providing electricity?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of providing healthcare?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of reducing or eliminating corruption?




Would you say the government has done a good job, a fair job or a poor job solving the problem of reconciliation and healing of the country?




Would you vote for a female candidate?




Do you think being a female candidate helps or hurts a candidate for the National Legislature?
