IRI-Jordan: National Poll #7 **IRI** Methodology

- Sample size is 1,000 individuals, 18 years of age or older, 50 percent men and 50 ٠ percent women.
- A stratified two stage cluster sample based on the 2004 Housing and Population Census ٠ for the selection of 100 clusters across the Kingdom. The Nyman allocation approach was used to distribute the sample of clusters among governorates.
- Ten households were drawn (with replacement allowing for non-contacts) from each ٠ cluster using a random start and a systematic procedure of selection to ensure representation of different parts of the cluster in sample and to reduce intra-class correlation.
- Researchers conducted one in-person interview per household, selected using the Kish ٠ method.
- Interviewers were provided with building maps identifying households selected for ٠ interview.
- The margin of error is ± 2.5 percent at 95 percent confidence level. ٠
- Number of field researchers: 50 ٠
- The poll was conducted August 8-11, 2009. ٠
- All data shown is from this August survey and a survey conducted <u>August 9-13, 2008</u>, ٠ as indicated.
- Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding error. ٠



Q: In general, are things in Jordan going in the right or the wrong direction?






Q: Why do you think Jordan is going in the right/wrong direction? (n=583 for right direction; n=288 for wrong direction)





Q: Taking all things into consideration, what is the most important problem facing Jordan today?




*This is the first time water shortage appeared in the top three most important issues facing Jordan today.




Government's Approval Ratings

Q: To what extent are you satisfied with the performance of the current government?














Government's Approval Ratings

Q: Did the current government accomplish anything worthy of recognition? (Top five responses from total sample, n=1,000)




Q: To what extent are you satisfied with the performance of the current parliament?


Q: Did the current parliament accomplish anything worthy of recognition?


Q: To what extent is the current parliament representative of all Jordanians?

Q : *Did* you vote in the last parliamentary elections that were held in November 2007?




According to the Jordanian government, official numbers show 55% turnout in the 2007 elections.












Q: Does the number of parliamentary seats allocated to your electoral district ensure a true representation of your district in parliament?

Q: Does the number of deputies in parliament (110) ensure a true representation of all Jordanians?



Q: Could you please rank in order of importance each of the following items in a parliamentary electoral law that would ensure a better representation in Parliament of all Jordanians?




Q: Are you in favor of keeping as is, increasing, reducing or abolishing the following quotas in Parliament?


Q: Which of the two statements do you agree with most?










Q: Are you in favor of allocating a quota for registered political parties in a new parliamentary elections law?


Q: Do you think that there is a good chance for Jordanians to get fair and just treatment in following situations?


Q: To what degree do you think that the freedom to publicly criticize the government's decisions and policies is guaranteed in Jordan?




Q: Why, in your opinion, is the current economic situation in Jordan bad/very bad? (n=350, respondents who said economy was bad or very bad)


Q: Is the general economic situation in Jordan over the next 12 months likely to get...?








Q: Thinking now about your own household economic situation and comparing it with one year ago, do you think it is now...?




Q: Over the past 12 months what have you had to do in order to meet family expenses?


Q: Over the past 12 months, did you ask for help from [...] in order to meet family expenses?
