
Survey Specifications


- International Republican Institute conducted.
- Supervision of fieldwork, oversight, and analysis provided by Lapis, Ltd., Kabul, Afghanistan and Williams & Associates of Salem, Massachusetts.
- The national survey was conducted from November 16-25, 2009.
- The sample was 2,380 adult Afghans (18+).
- The overall margin of error is ± 2.0 percent at the midrange of the 95 percent confidence level.
- Interviews collected using in-person, face-to-face methodology by trained professional interviewers using a multistage stratification proportionate to population sample distribution, with random selection of households and respondents in 34 provinces of Afghanistan.
- Men interviewed men and women interviewed women.
- All 34 provinces were selected at the first level of stratification, and approximately five districts within each province were selected, including the provincial capital district and four other randomly selected districts. The clusters, which were the primary sampling unit, each contain between six and 10 villages exhibiting similar characteristics.
- Kish method was used to select respondents 18 years and older within the randomly selected household. The right hand method was used to select every third household in localities selected through area probability sample.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies.
- All data shown is from this November survey, unless otherwise noted as a <u>July 16-26, 2009</u> national survey or a <u>May 3-16, 2009</u> national survey.
- Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding.






Do you think Afghanistan is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?






How is your family's economic situation compared to five years ago?








Is Afghanistan more or less stable than it was one year ago?







In the next year, do you think the economy in Afghanistan will get better, get worse or stay the same?












In your opinion which of the following countries have good relations with Afghanistan?








Do you have more personal freedom during or after Taliban rule?










Would you be willing to vote for someone for president who is not from your ethnic group?






What is your opinion of national parties?








Do you think the government should hold talks and reconcile with the Taliban?








Do you think the number of elected women in Afghanistan is adequate, or should Afghanistan have more women in elected office?








Would you vote for a woman for...? (November 2009)








Would you vote for a woman for...? (May 2009)








Did you vote for a woman in the 2009 presidential and provincial council elections?








What about young people: do you think that young people are adequately represented in elected government in Afghanistan?






In your opinion how serious is corruption in Afghanistan?






In general, how has the current government performed in controlling corruption compared to the previous government?






Have you or a friend or relative had to pay a bribe or offer a gift to a government employee or official in the following situations?








Using a scale from one to five where one is worst and five is best, what grade would you give the overall performance of...?






Do you think your CDC Shura member should be responsible for your local village security?







Do you think your CDC Shura should represent your voice at the national government in Kabul?








Are you registered to vote?








Did you vote in the August 20, 2009 presidential election?








What was your personal motivation to vote in the presidential election? (open-ended question)






Who did you vote for in the presidential election? (n = 809)








Do you feel there should be a voter registration for the 2010 parliamentary and district council elections?







If parliamentary and district council elections (scheduled for 2010) were held today, would you vote?












Do you think Hamid Karzai is the legitimate President of Afghanistan?








Do you believe there was corruption during the presidential election?








How do you feel about the IEC's sharing of information during the audit period of the presidential election?








Do you think that the IEC organized the election well?








Do you think the IEC is independent and credible?




Do you believe the United States and the international community had a favored candidate in this election?








How would you rate Hamid Karzai's performance as president?








Did you vote in the 2004 presidential election?








Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the following individuals leadership qualities? (November 2009)








Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the following individuals leadership qualities? (July 2009)








Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the following individuals leadership qualities? (May 2009)






What is your primary source of political news?






Which television station do you watch most often for political news?








What radio station do you listen to most often for political news?







What newspaper do you read most often for political news?













Are you satisfied with the rehabilitation/development projects that are being implemented by the international community?












How important to you are each of the following uses of foreign assistance?
