

International Republican Institute: Turkish Public Opinion Survey

The International Republican Institute

Methodology

The survey was conducted through in-person, in-home interviews by Infakto Research Workshop.

Target population of the survey was Turks aged 18 and older.

Sampling framework of the poll is designed to represent Turkish voters through a multi-stage stratified random sampling. In the first stage, the sample has been stratified to 11 NUTS (the Nomenclature of Territorial Units for Statistics) of Turkey and three metropolitan cities (as Self-Representing Units). In the second stage, a province has been selected from each NUTS through the probability proportionate to size (PPS) methodology. In the third stage, the sample has been stratified according to central-other sub-provinces and the urban-rural distribution of the province. Final sampling units were households selected according to the Kish method. In order to represent three major metropolitan cities, a boosted sample with a size of 800 interviews is applied.

The sample size is 2005 with a response rate of 18 percent and a cooperation rate of 32 percent according to American Association for Public Opinion Research calculation standards. Estimated sampling error under the simple random sampling assumption is \pm 2.18 percent at the 95 percent level of confidence.

The fieldwork was completed between September 18 – September 30, 2010.

Infakto created the guestionnaire with input from Sarah Simmons at Harris Interactive.

Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding error, omission of "Don't know/No answer" responses to make chart more readable, highlighting only the top responses, or as specifically explained in individual slides.

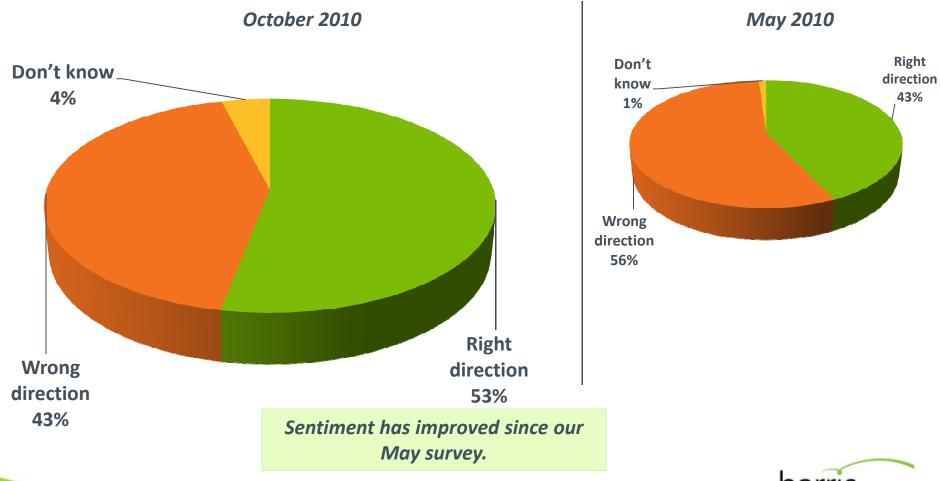

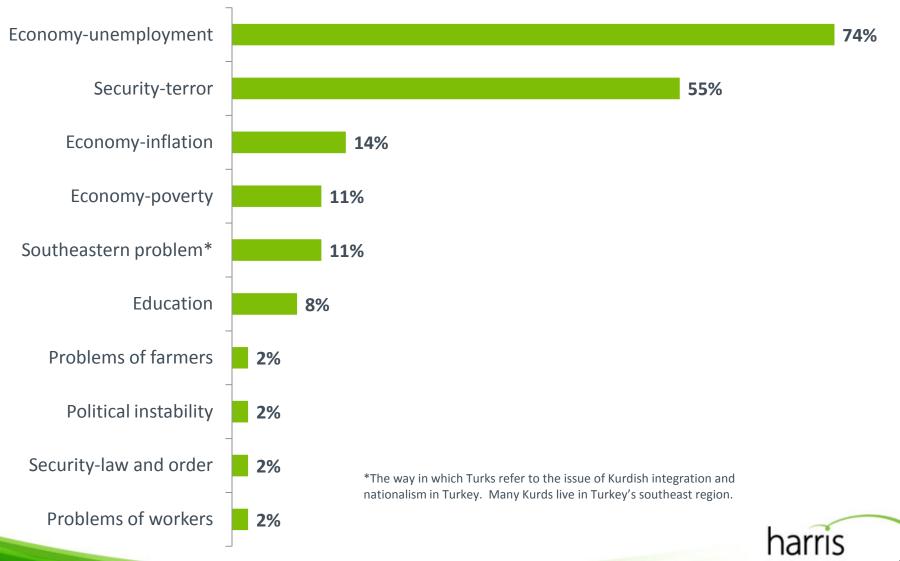

Overall, do you think Turkey is headed in the right direction or in the wrong direction?



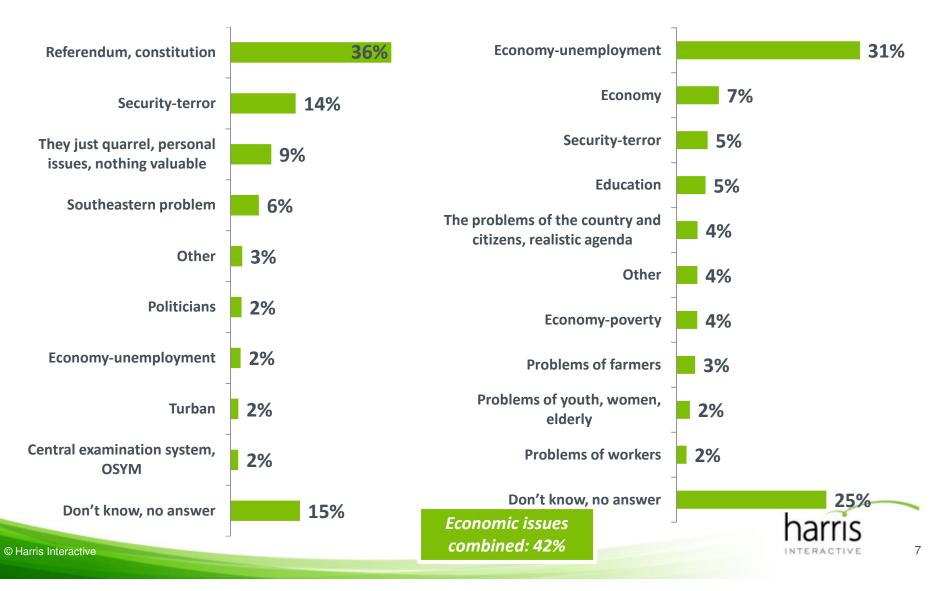
What is the most urgent problem our country is facing today? (Top two issues combined)



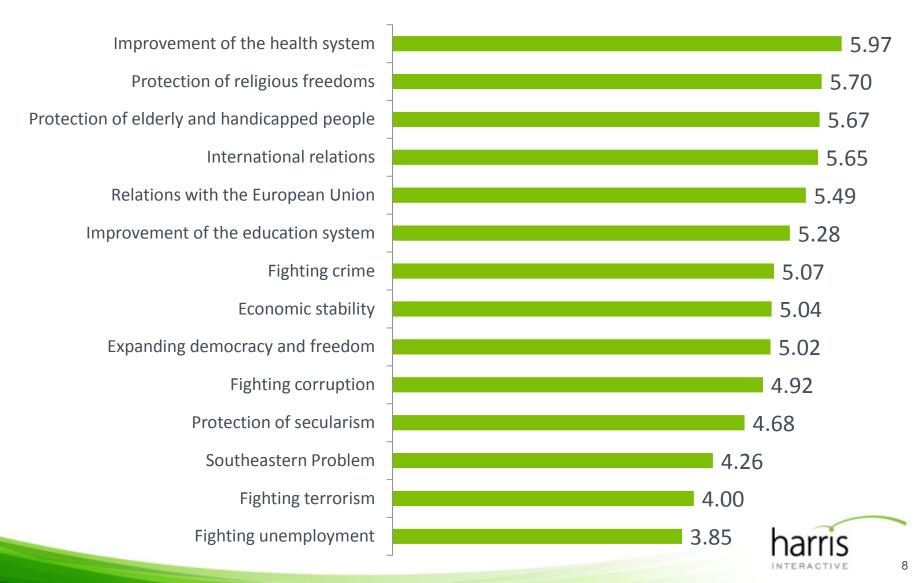
Voters would like to hear more from politicians about the economy

What do politicians talk about too much?

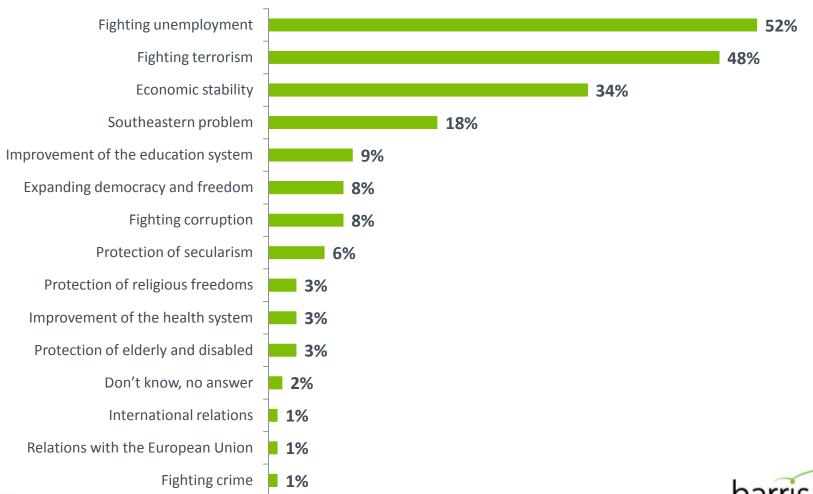
What do politicians not talk about enough?

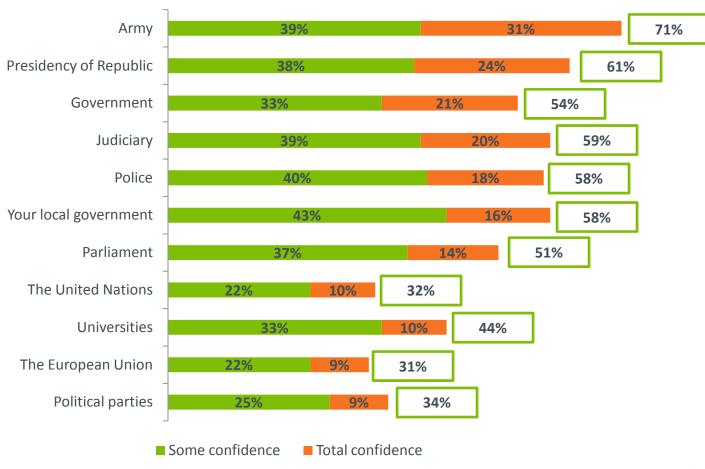


Which of these issues will be the most important for you when you vote in the next general elections? (Top Two Answers)

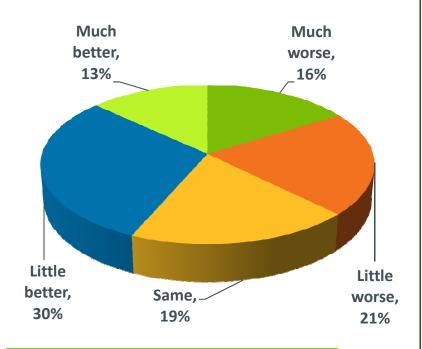

Compared to five years ago, do you think the economic situation is better or worse?

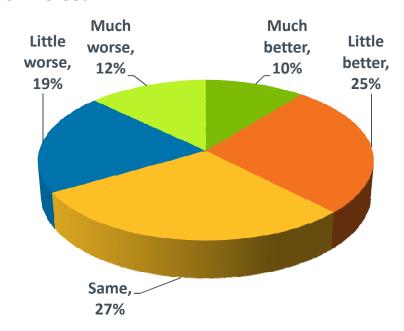

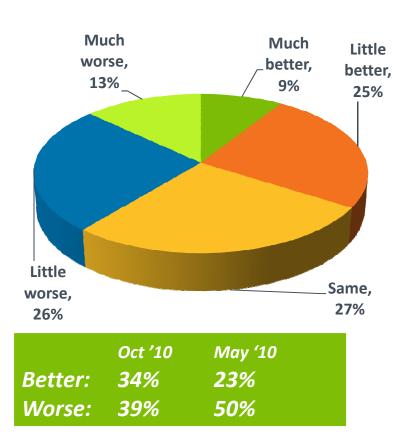

When you think about the next 12 months, do you expect the economic situation will be better or worse?

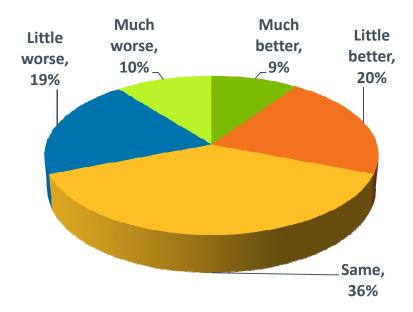

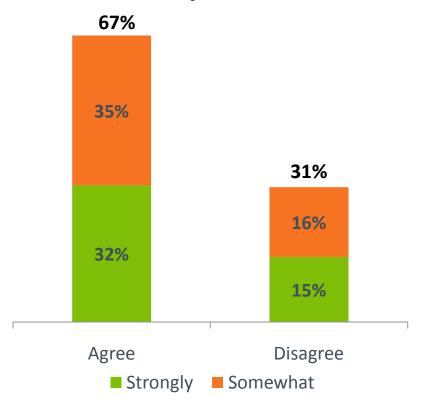

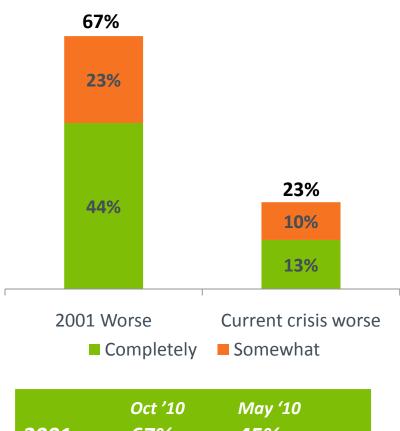

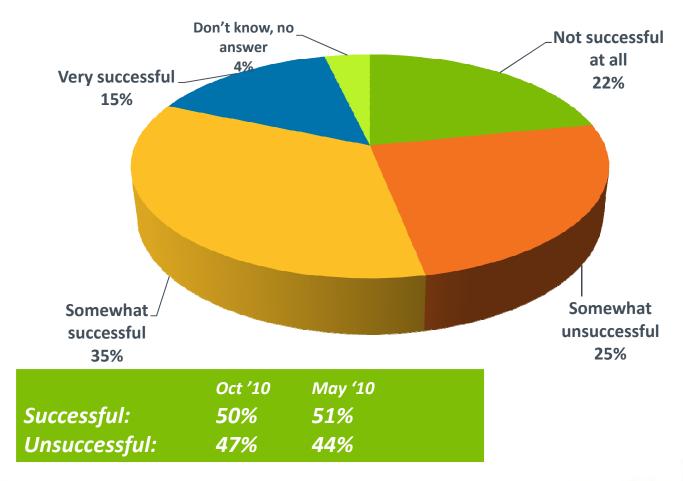

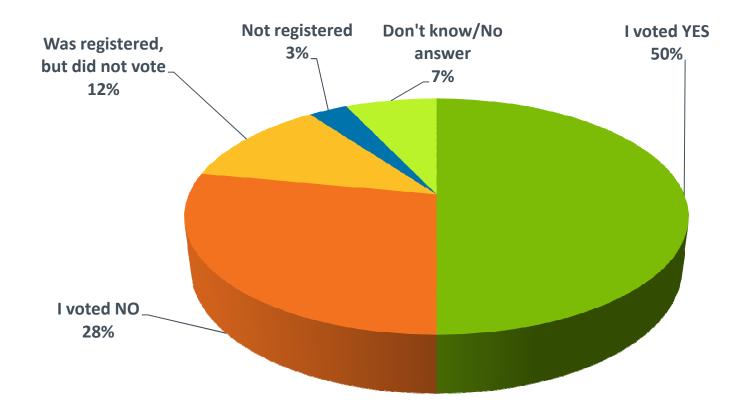
How successful has the government been dealing with the crisis?



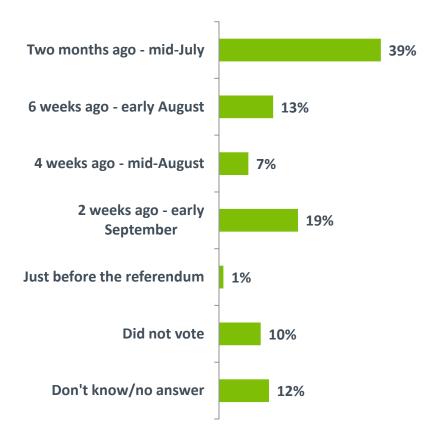

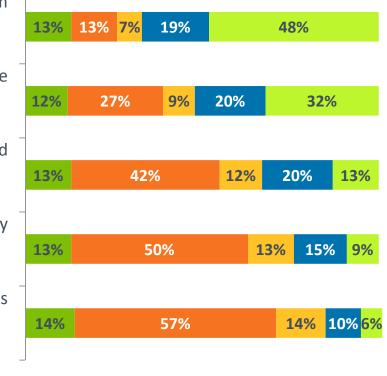

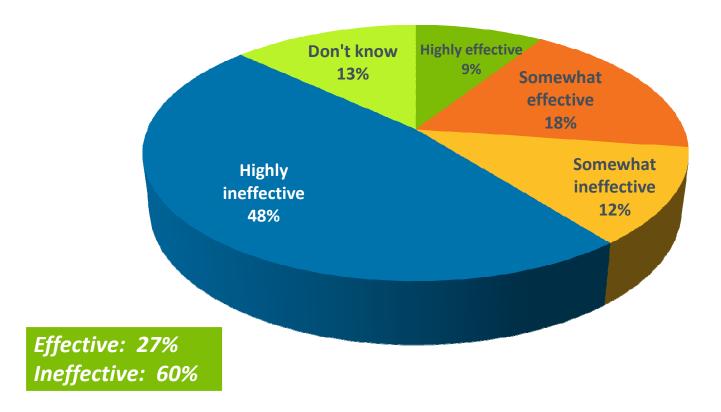

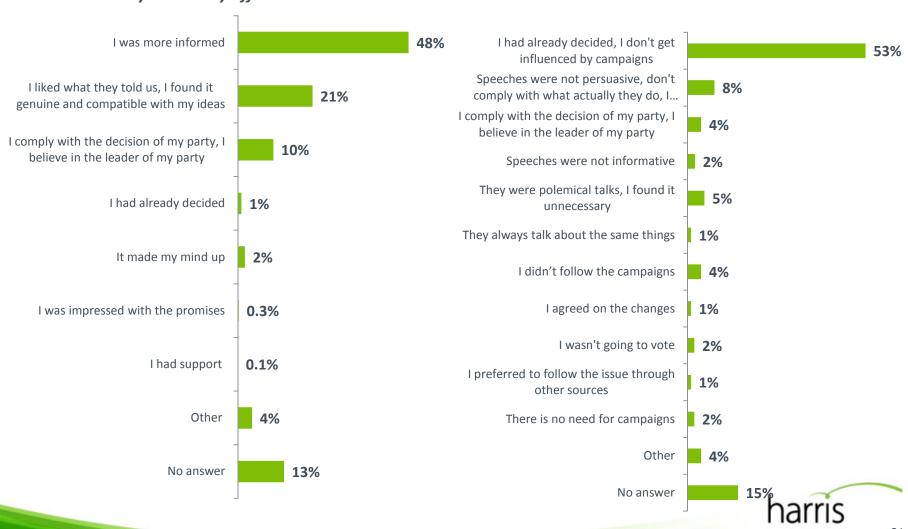

Why were they effective?

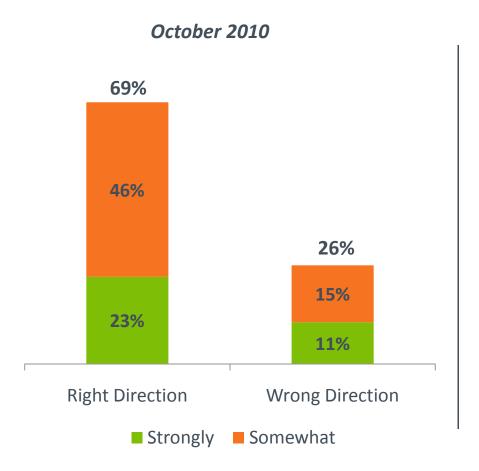

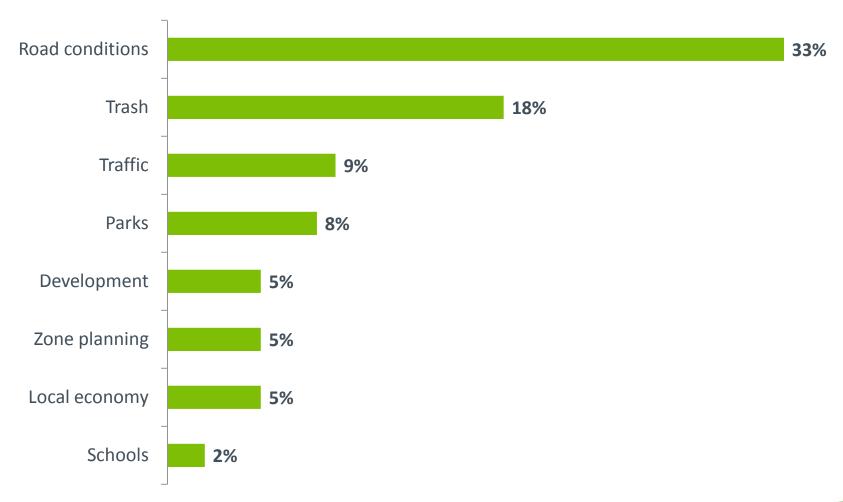


Generally speaking, are things in your municipality heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?

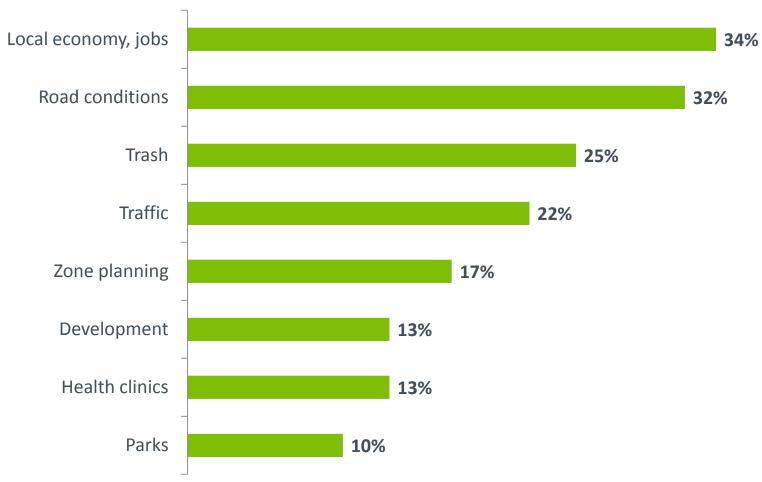




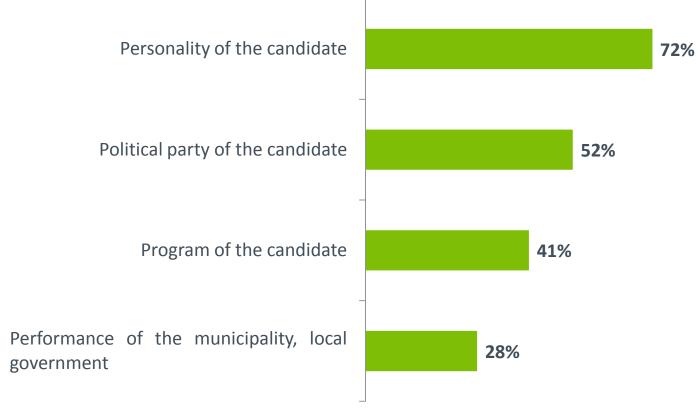
What is the main reason for your answer?



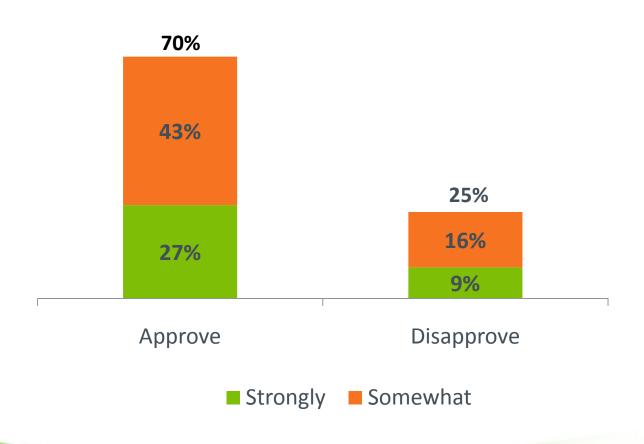
What is the most pressing issue for local government to address? (Top Two Answers)



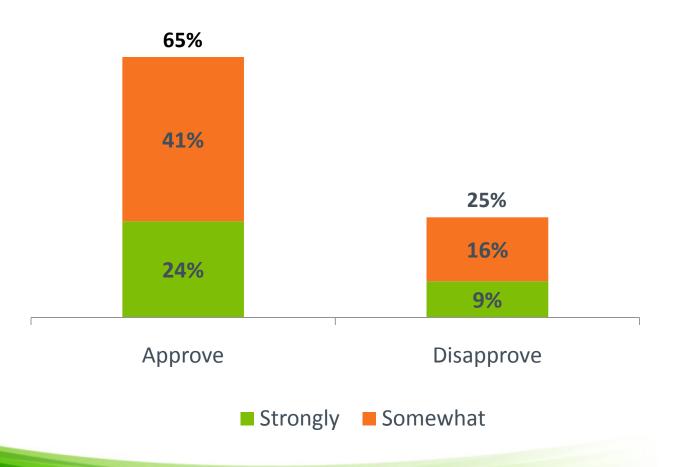

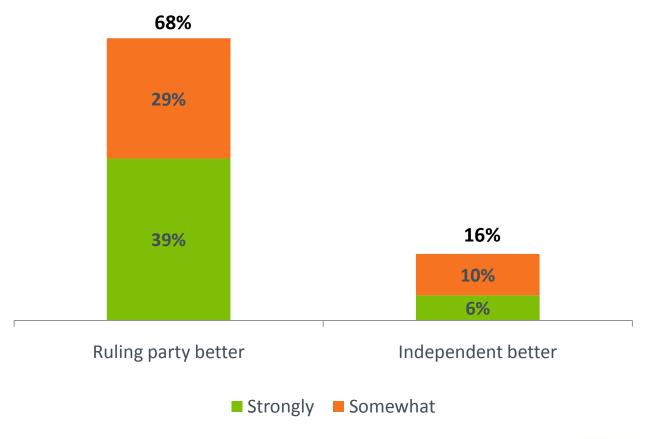
Do you approve or disapprove of the way your local mayor has been handling his or her job?

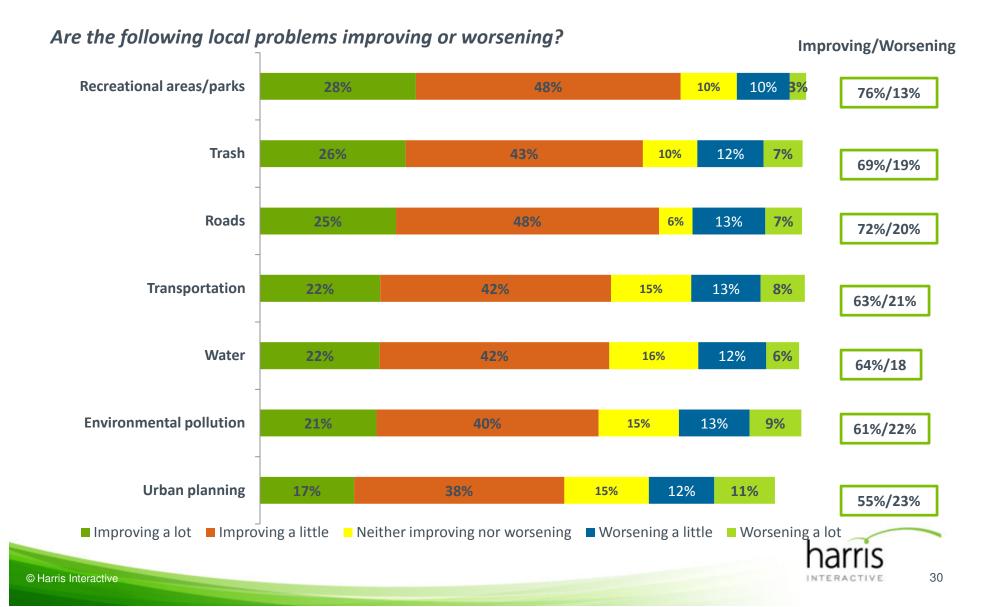


Do you approve or disapprove of the way your local municipal council has been handling its job?

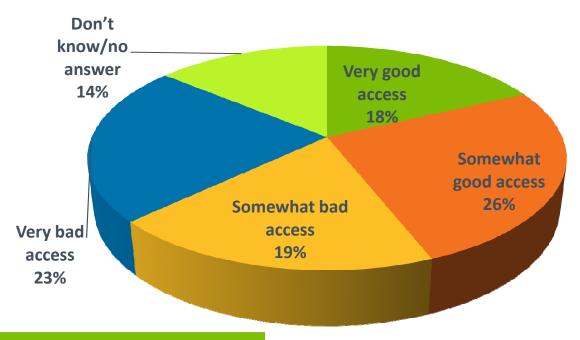

As a citizen, do you have good or bad access to your local government elected officials?

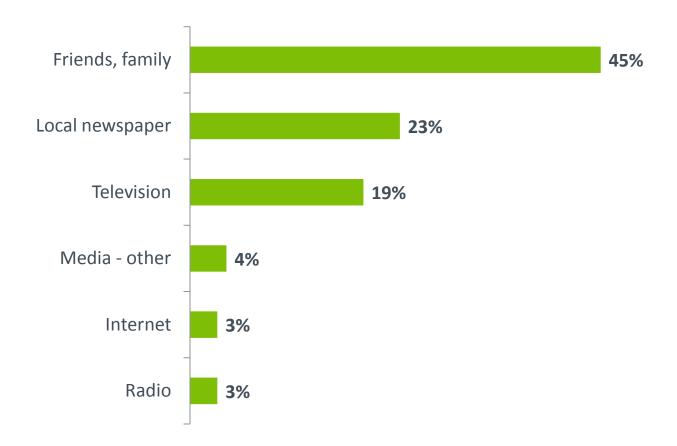

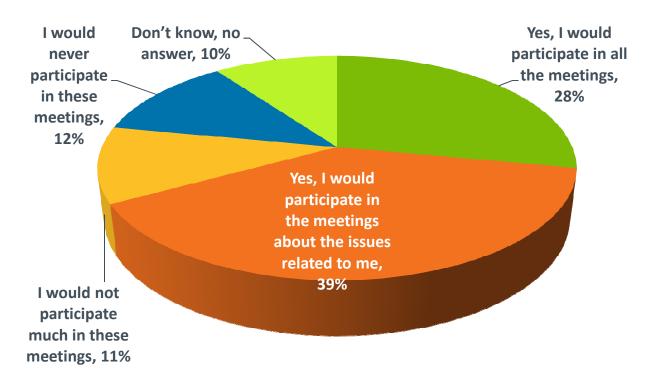

Where do you receive information about what is happening in your municipality?



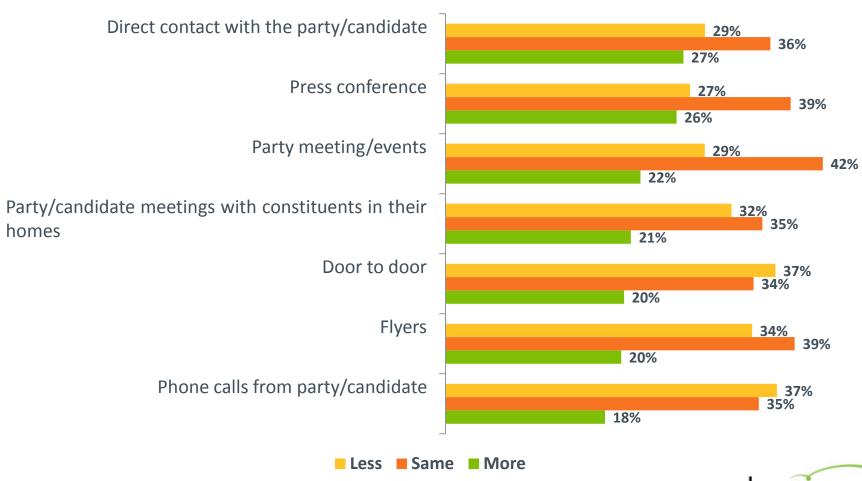
If there was a citizen council auditing the decisions and practices of your municipality, would you participate in its meetings?

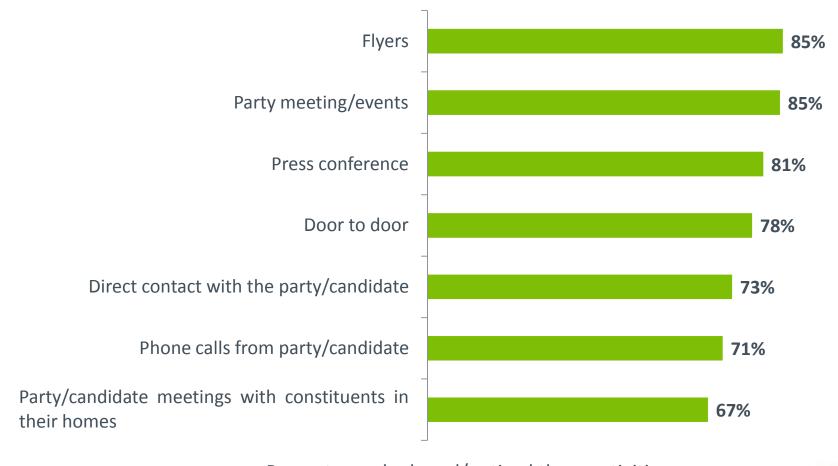

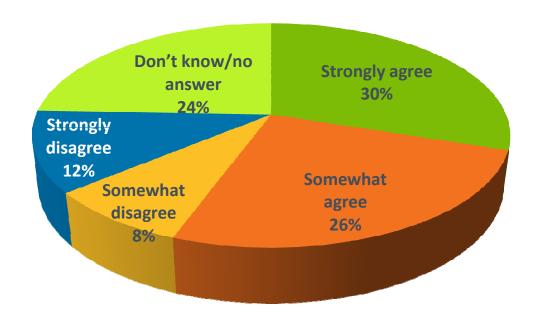

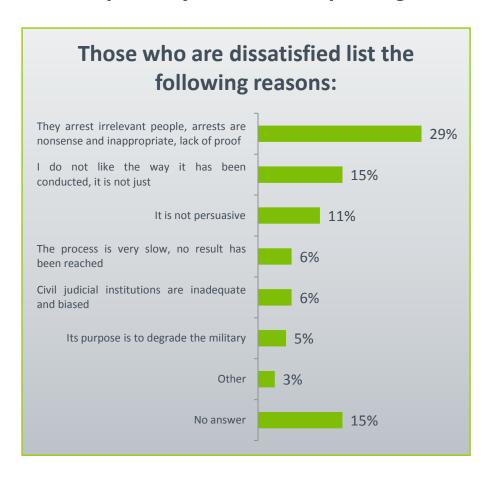
Some argue that certain groups have sought to take control of the government through a plan called Ergenekon*. Do you agree or disagree with them?

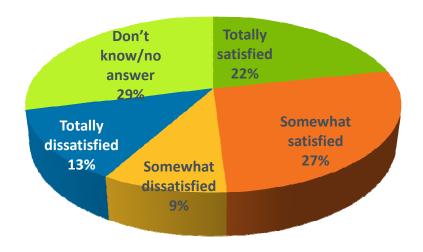

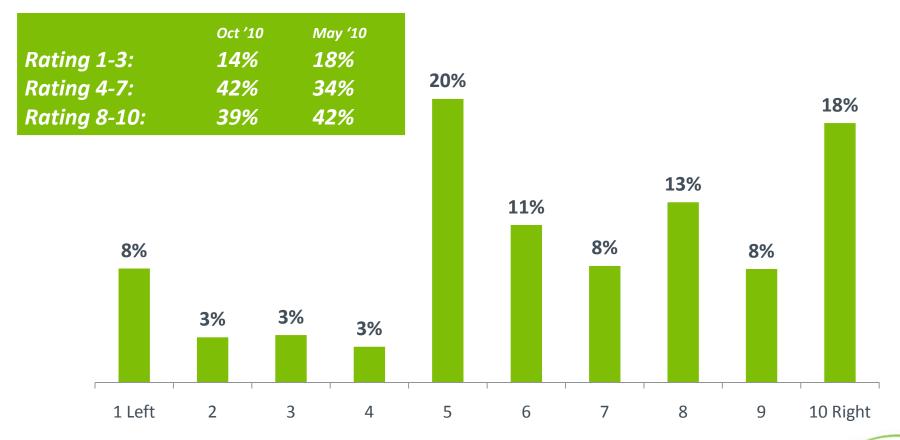


Generally speaking, how nationalist do you feel? (With one being not nationalist at all and 10 being entirely)

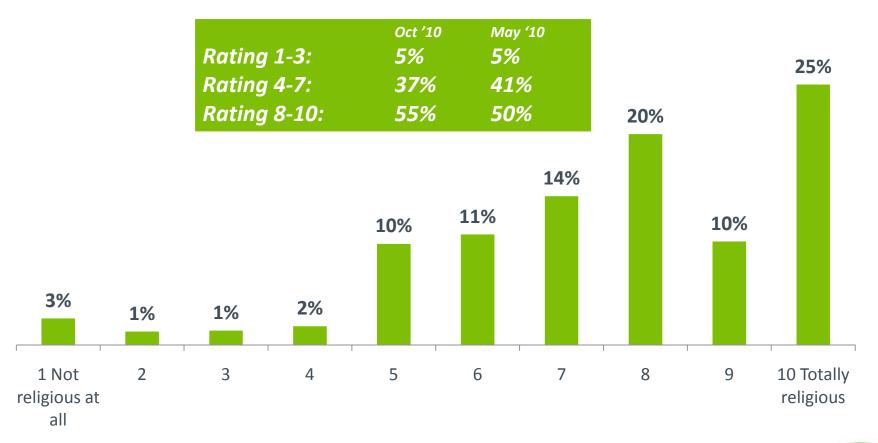




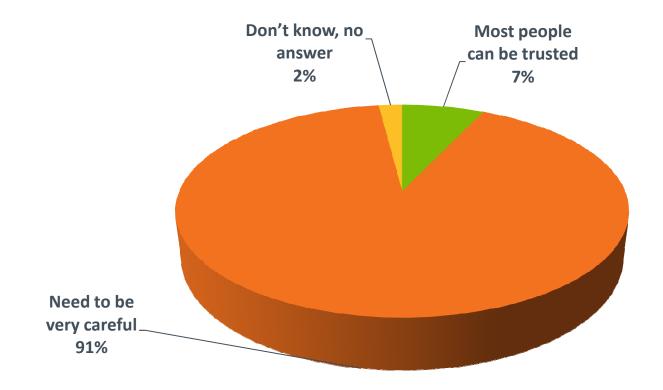
In political matters, people speak of the left and the right. How would you place your views on this scale? (With one being the far left and 10 being the far right)



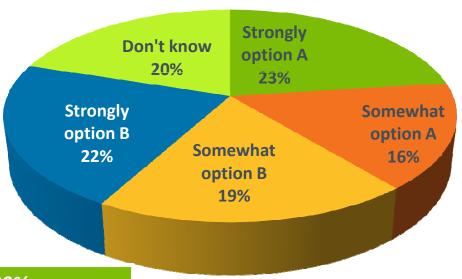
Generally speaking, how religious are you? (With one being not religious at all and 10 being totally religious)



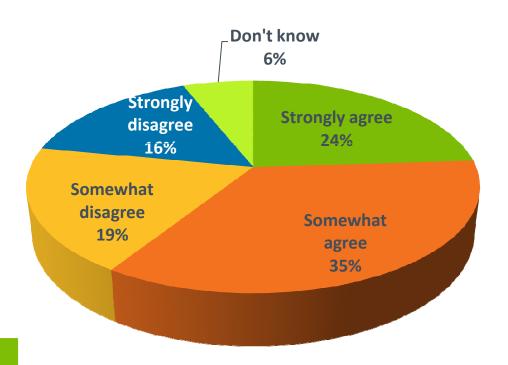
Generally speaking, would you say that most people can be trusted or that you need to be very careful in dealing with people?

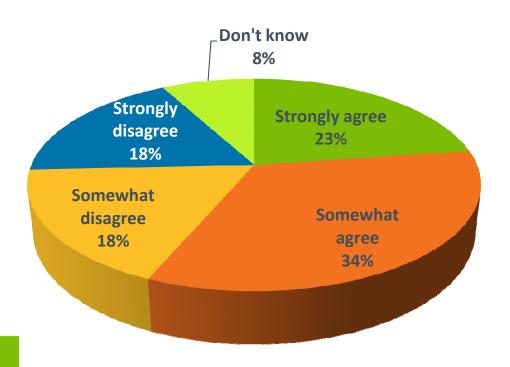

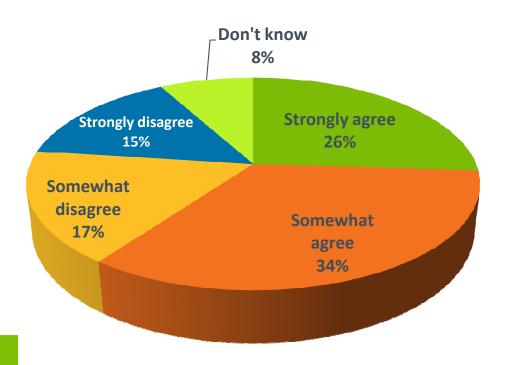
If you compare the situation of the country with 10 years ago, do you believe Turkey has become a more secular country?

Considering the political and economic situation of the country 10 years ago, do you believe that Turkey has become a more stable country?

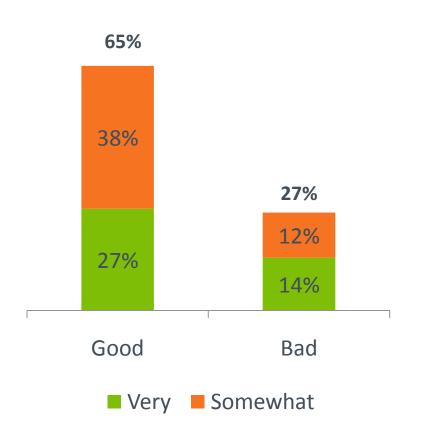

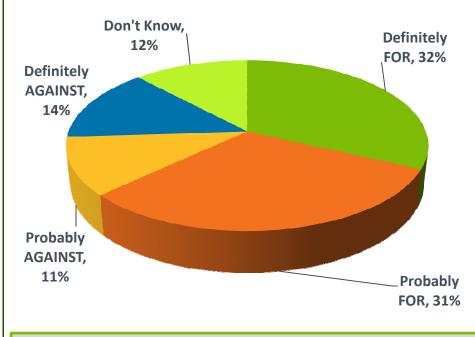

If a referendum were held this Sunday for Turkey's full membership in the European Union, would you vote for or against it?

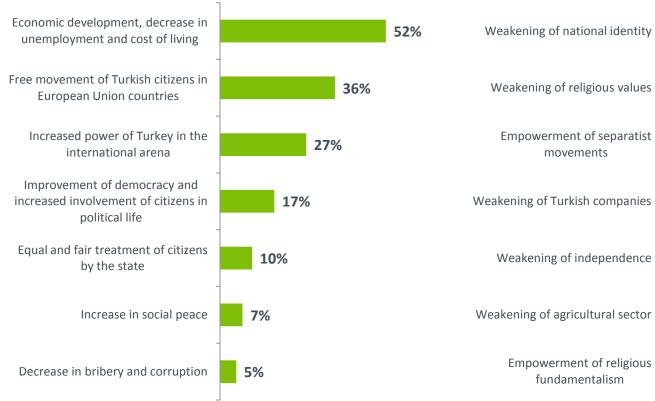


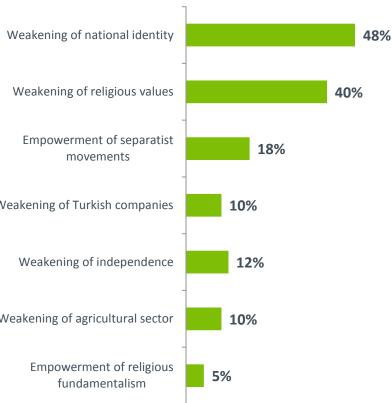

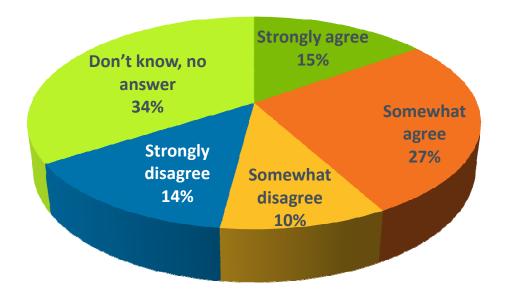
What is the most important benefit of EU membership? (Top Two Responses)
