Methodology

- This survey was designed, coordinated and analyzed by Baltic Surveys/The Gallup Organization on behalf of the International Republican Institute. Field work was carried out by the Institute for Comparative Social Research Kazakhstan.
- The national representative survey was carried out from February 17-28, 2011. The eligibility criteria was based on age (18 years and older). A sample of 1,521 Kazakh participants were interviewed faceto-face in their homes.
- The sample design was a multi-stage probability sample.
 - Stage one: the sample was stratified into 16 regions.
 - Stage two: the sample was further stratified into rural, urban and metropolitan sampling units.
 - Stage three: primary sampling units (PSUs) were described.
- The closest birthday rule was used for selection of the respondent. The households were selected using the random route method.
- The sample was distributed at the regional level, in rural and urban areas, in all 16 regions of Kazakhstan.
- The response rate was 68 percent.
- The margin of error for the survey does not exceed plus or minus 2.5 percent with a confidence level of 95 percent.
- One hundred thirty-two interviewers worked on the study, on average completing 8-13 interviews in one PSU. The interviews were conducted in Kazakh, Russian and Uzbek languages.
- Due to rounding, charts may not add to 100 percent.








Are you currently employed?




If you are not employed, what is your status?

If you are not employed, what is your status?


Respondents indicating that they are not working (responses in percentage)






Generally speaking, would you say that things in Kazakhstan are headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?




In the past year, has your personal financial situation improved, worsened or stayed the same?



In the next year, do you expect the economic situation in Kazakhstan to get better, worse or stay the same?




How would you evaluate the income of your household?




Which one of the following issues is of greatest concern to you? Responses two percent and greater




On the issue most important to you, how has the government performed?



What is your opinion regarding high prices? Would you say you are very concerned, somewhat concerned, not very concerned or not at all concerned?




In your view, which of the following is mostly to blame for high prices?




Are you satisfied or unsatisfied with the government's efforts to fight corruption?



Are you satisfied or unsatisfied with the government's efforts to protect citizens' political rights?




In your opinion, does democracy exist in Kazakhstan?




How much have you heard about the presidential election scheduled for April 3, 2011?




How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement? Kazakhstan will be ready for the April 3, 2011 election.




Do you support or oppose the government's decision to enact amendments to the constitution to allow them to call for an early presidential election, moving up the vote from 2012?




How has the decision to hold an early presidential election affected your opinion of the government?




Some people have called for the resignation of President Nazarbaev. Do you think that he should resign or not?




Thinking about where you will be voting on election day, how confident are you that your vote will be counted freely and fairly?







Breakdown by gender




Breakdown by ethnicity




Breakdown by age



Breakdown by population density






Why wouldn't you vote in the April 3 election?




If opposition groups decided to support a single opposition candidate, would you support this candidate or not?





Now that you have more information about the upcoming presidential election, do you support or oppose President Nazarbaev's re-election to another term as president?






Some people have raised questions about the methods used by the initiative group to collect signatures. Which of the following statements describes your experience?




In your opinion, are people in Kazakhstan afraid to openly express their political views or not?



Thinking about the next few years, do you think that it will be a risk to the country's stability if President Nazarbaev does not identify a potential successor?




What is your primary source of information about the upcoming presidential election?
