


Methodology Overview

- Oversight and execution of poll was performed by international opinion research firm, Opinion Research Business (ORB). A total of 3,030 face-to-face interviews were conducted throughout Nigeria from November 29 – December 7, 2010, by ORB's local partner, Practical Sampling International (PSI).
- The population studied was all Nigerian adults of legal voting age (18+). A nationally representative two-stage random-stratified sample was utilized based on Nigeria's 2006 census, extrapolated to 2010. The sample was first stratified by zone (region) and state, then by urban/rural population.
- Enumeration areas within each region were randomly selected (see map on next slide for locations); households within each sampling point were then identified using a random walk method and a skip pattern; household members were randomly chosen using a Kish grid. A 1:1 ratio of male-tofemales was maintained during data collection phase and weighted for analysis.
- In addition to voting age, potential respondents were also filtered to exclude non-Nigerians or those who were not in their state of residence. The questionnaire was offered in English, as well as Hausa, Yoruba and Ibo. The overall response rate was 82 percent.
- The margin of error at the national level is 1.7 percent. For region-to-national comparisons and region-to-region comparisons the margin of error is 7.8 and 9.4 percent, respectively.
 Demographic comparisons between the achieved sample and Nigerian population data on gender, age, education, settlement size and zone are available at the end of this presentation.
- All figures are in percentages unless otherwise noted. Due to rounding, multiple response questions, and selective exclusion of "DK" (Don't Know/Can't Say) responses, not all percentages add up to 100. All "N" values appearing in presentation are unweighted.






GENERAL MOOD AND PERFORMANCE OF GOVERNMENT



Overall, do you think that things in Nigeria are headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?



What is the most important issue/problem facing Nigeria at the present time?


Top 5 Responses + Other Select Responses






What is the most important local issue/problem facing your community at the present time?




Thinking back to this time last year, has the economic situation for you and your family...?






After the upcoming 2011 elections, do you expect the economic situation for you and your family to...?






When thinking about the future of Nigeria, which of the following do you fear most? And which of these is the second thing you fear most for the future of Nigeria?






What should be the main thing government should prioritize in terms of investing revenue obtained from the oil sector?





How much confidence do you have in the following institutions?








Please tell me which of the following previous national elections you voted in, if any.




Have you ever been unable to vote in past elections, even though you wanted to, for any of the following reasons? (N=1,949)

And thinking specifically about the last elections in 2007, were you unable to vote for any of the following reasons? (N=968)




Do you know if people who are already registered to vote (from previous elections) need to register again for the upcoming 2011 elections?






Can you tell me in which month INEC is planning to conduct voters' registration?






How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Nigeria will be ready for elections by April 2011?






How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: The national elections in 2011 will be mostly free, fair and credible?

And how confident are you that the upcoming 2011 elections will be more credible than the elections held in 2003?










In your opinion, which election results will be more credible: The presidential election and national assembly results, or the local election results in your state?



Thinking of where you will be voting on election day, how confident are you that <u>your</u> vote will be counted freely and fairly?










How confident are you that your vote is kept secret?





In a few words, what is the greatest challenge, or obstacle, to conducting freer and fairer elections in Nigeria?








And what do you think the government needs to do to ensure more free and fair elections in the future?






In comparison to previous election years. Do you think there will be more violence or less violence in Nigeria during the 2011 elections?



What is your main source of information for news and political updates?








How much confidence do you have in each of these information sources?




How often, if at all, do you access the Internet?






In terms of determining voting for political leaders, which of the following characteristics is most important?






Do you believe that the practice of zoning* is good for Nigeria?




According to your own definition, does democracy exist in Nigeria?






Which is more important to you in deciding who to vote for, the candidate or the political party?








Are you a member of a political party and if so do you plan to vote in your party's primary?






How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: In Nigeria, political parties discuss issues and priorities that closely match those of the people.






How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Women are equally represented in the political decision making positions in Nigeria.


















