
Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute and the Center for Insights in Survey Research by Tunisian-owned and operated marketing research firm ELKA Consulting under the supervision of Chesapeake Beach Consulting.
- Data was collected from April 19 to 26, 2017, through face-to-face interviews in Arabic by trained professionals. All data was collected on CAPI Solution tablets.
- The sample consisted of 1,229 Tunisians aged 18 and older.
- Interviews were selected using a multi-stage stratification method proportionate to population sample distribution.
- Stratification was based on three stages: proportional division among Tunisia's 24 governorates; proportional division of urban and rural categories; and proportional division by gender and age according to the most recent data from Tunisia's National Statistics Institute (collected in 2014). The sample was then post-weighted to make it proportionate to national representation by province.
- Each governorate was divided into territorial sections or districts. In every territorial section, at least one point of survey was selected with the overall number of points determined by population density. No more than 10 interviews were conducted in each point of survey. Points of survey were distributed proportionally between rural and urban areas in every governorate and in every geographical section of the governorate.
- The Kish Method was used to select respondents 18 years and older within randomly selected households. The left-hand method was used to select every third household in localities chosen through an area probability sample.
- The overall margin of error is plus or minus 2.85 percent at the midrange of the 95 percent confidence level.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies.
- Figures in charts and tables may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.



How would you say things are going for Tunisia overall these days?







How would you describe the current economic situation in Tunisia: very good, somewhat good, somewhat bad or very bad?






What, in your opinion, is the biggest problem in your community?




What should be the top priority for the government?






How would you rate the performance of the government: very good, somewhat good, somewhat bad, or very bad?






In your experience, what type of corruption is most common in Tunisia?












Why do you feel that way?


Would you say that your local government does a very good job, a good job, a fair job, a poor job or a very poor job delivering services to you and your community?




In general, are members of parliament/ministries doing a lot, enough, a little, or nothing to address the needs of people like you?







What types of media do you rely on for news about government?




Which of the following methods of communication would you most prefer members of the government to use to communicate with you?




Decentralization and Local Elections








Tunisia will hold municipal elections in the next year. How likely, if at all, are you to vote in those elections?







If municipal elections were held tomorrow, for whom would you vote? (Open-ended)




If municipal elections were held tomorrow, for whom would you vote? (Open-ended)










What is the main challenge facing women's political participation in Tunisia today?



Do you believe that the government is promoting policies and programs to support the rights of women?




What is the main challenge facing young people's political participation in Tunisia today?




Do you believe that the government is promoting policies and programs that help youth succeed?




What should be the government's first priority regarding Tunisian youth?




