



Public Opinion Survey: Residents of Tunisia

January 25 - February 11, 2019



Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted by a Tunisian-owned and operated marketing research firm, ELKA Consulting, on behalf of the International Republican Institute's [Center for Insights in Survey Research](#).
- Data was collected from January 25 - February 11, 2019 through face-to-face interviews at respondents' homes by trained interviewers in Arabic. All data was collected on CAPI Solution tablets.
- The national sample consisted of n=1,226 respondents and is representative of the population of Tunisia aged 18 and older.
- Interviews were selected using a multi-stage stratification proportionate to population sample distribution. Stratification was based on three stages: a proportional division among Tunisia's 24 governorates; proportional division of urban and rural categories; and proportional division by gender and age group according to the most up-to-date data from Tunisia's National Statistics Institute collected in 2014. The sample was then post-weighted to make it proportionate to national representation by governorate, as well as adjusted for gender and age.
- Each governorate was divided into territorial sections or districts. In each territorial section, at least one point of survey was selected with the overall number of points determined by population density. In each point of survey, interviewers conducted no more than 10 interviews. Points of survey were distributed proportionally between rural and urban areas in every governorate and in every geographical section of the governorate.
- The Kish method was used to select respondents 18 years and older within randomly selected households. The left-hand method was used to select every third household in localities selected through an area probability sample.
- The overall margin of error is plus or minus 2.0 percent at the midrange of the 95 percent confidence level.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies.
- The response rate was 61 percent.
- Figures in charts and tables may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding. Cited bases are unweighted.

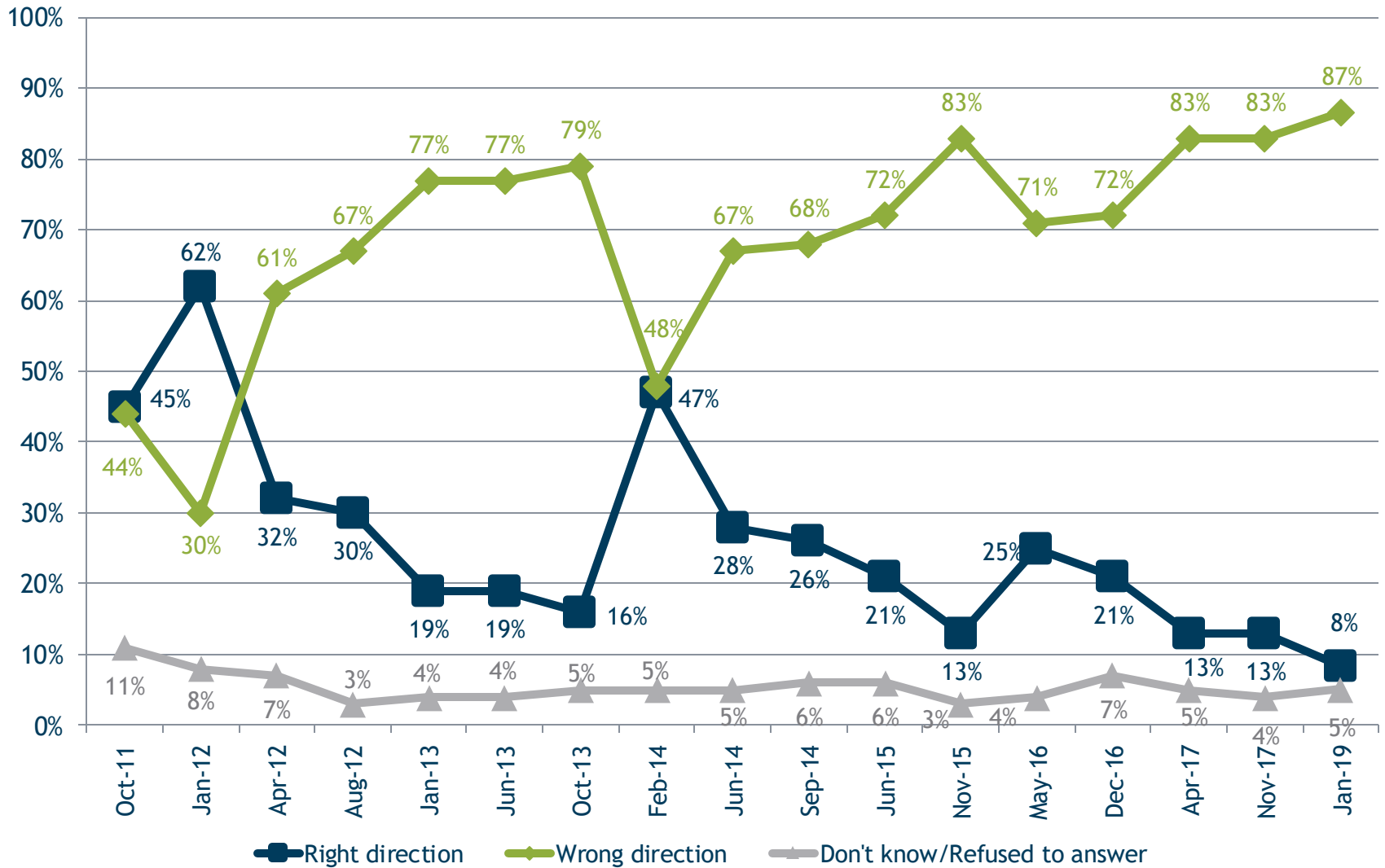

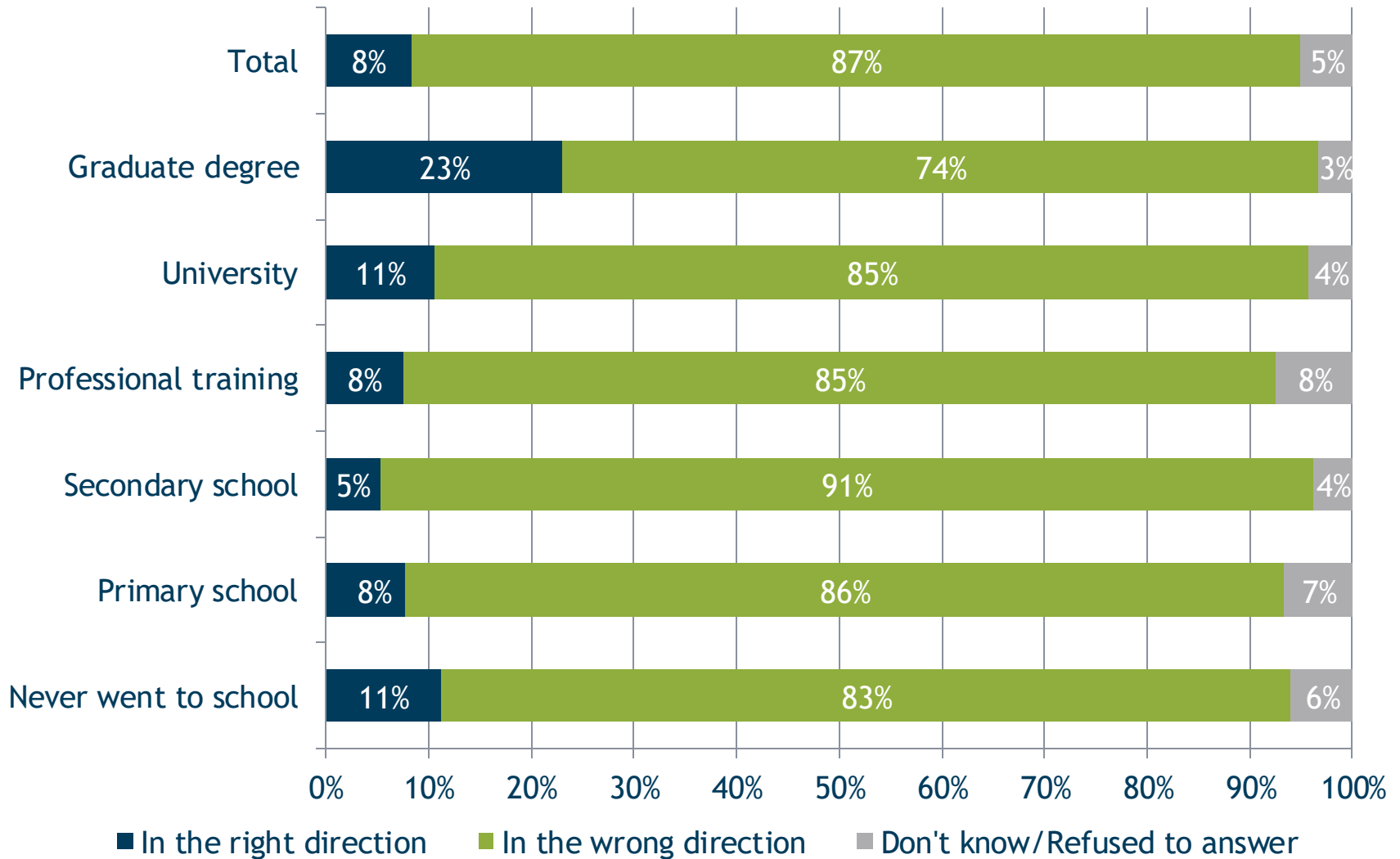

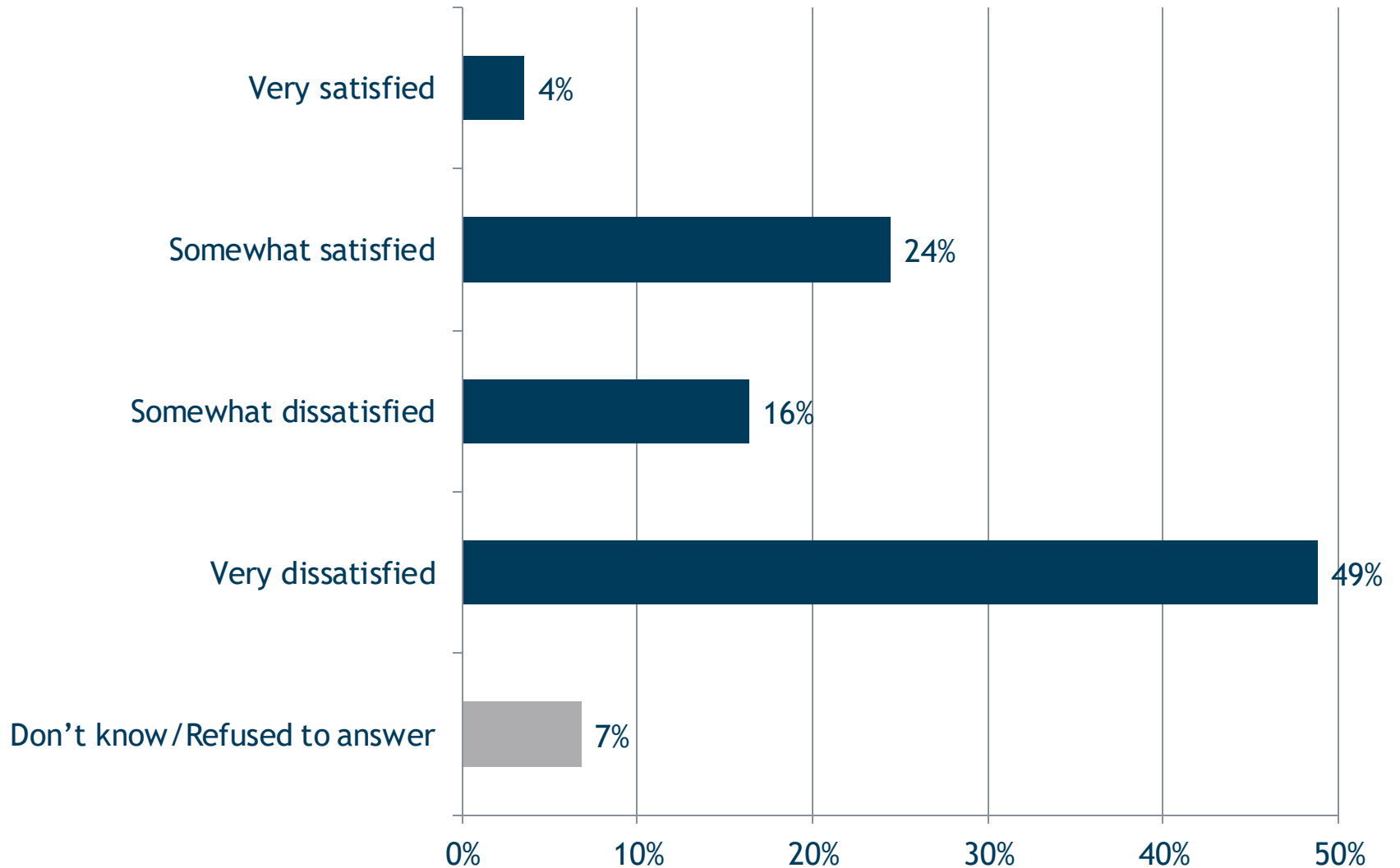
In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or in the wrong direction?

How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way democracy is developing in our country?



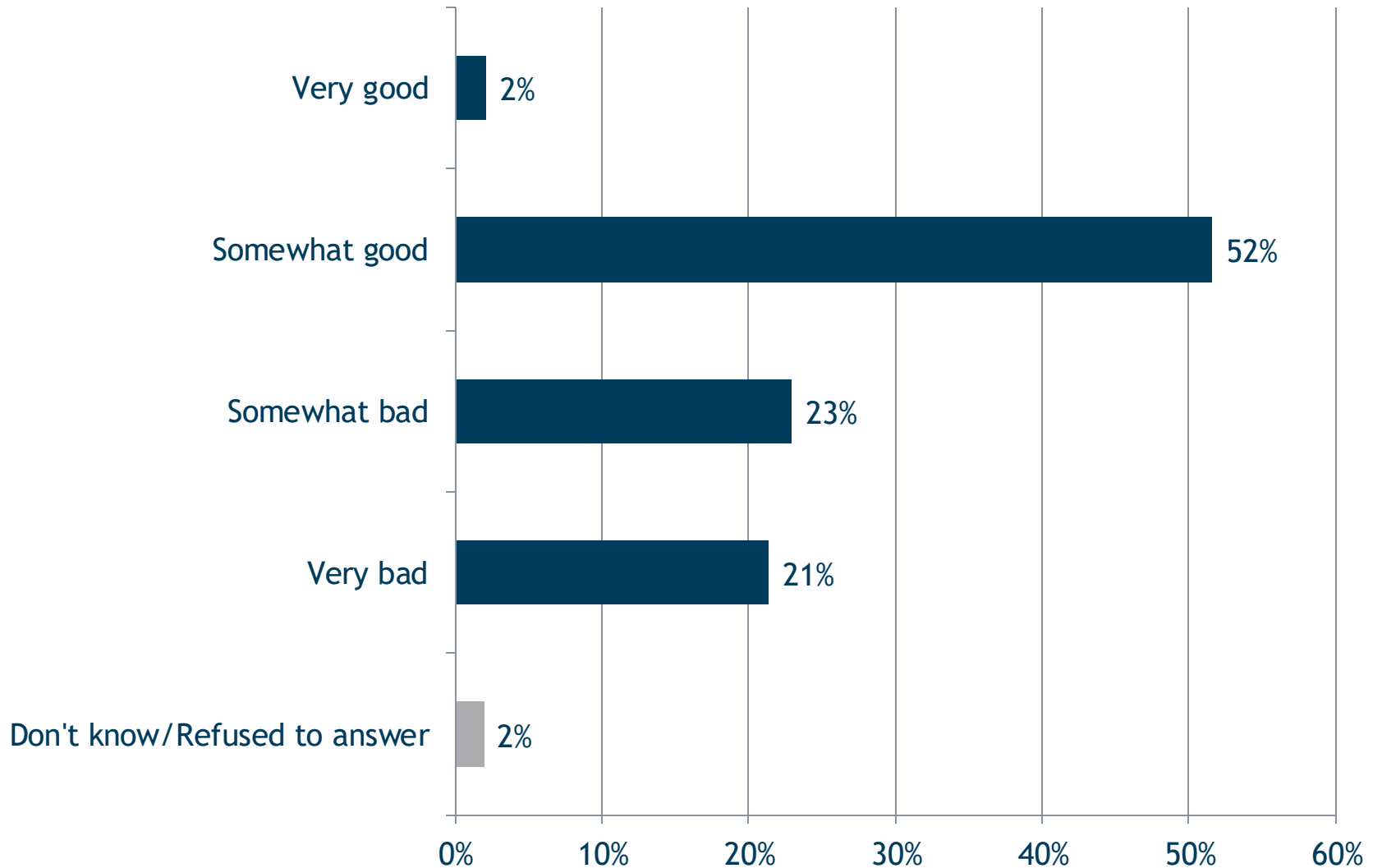

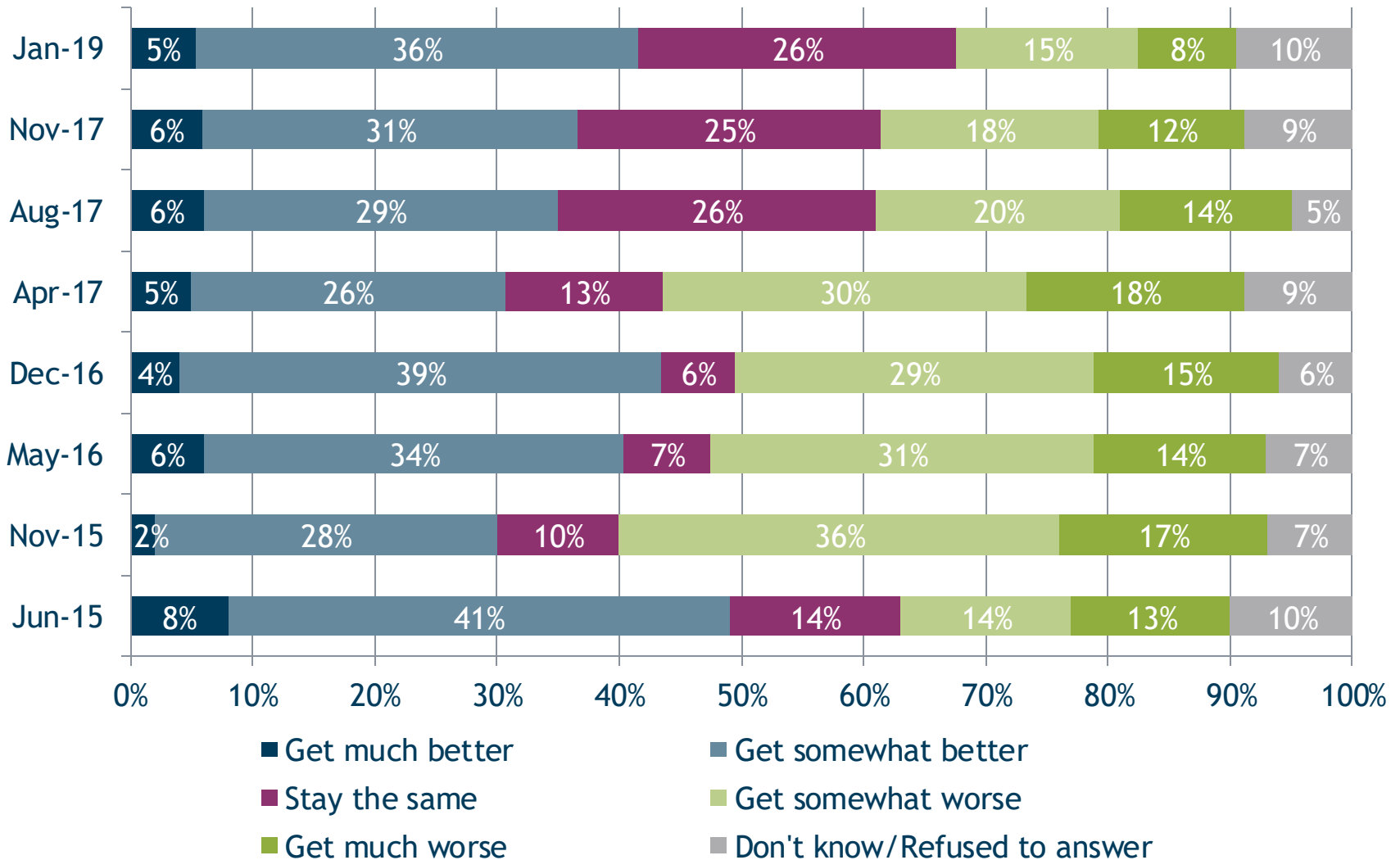

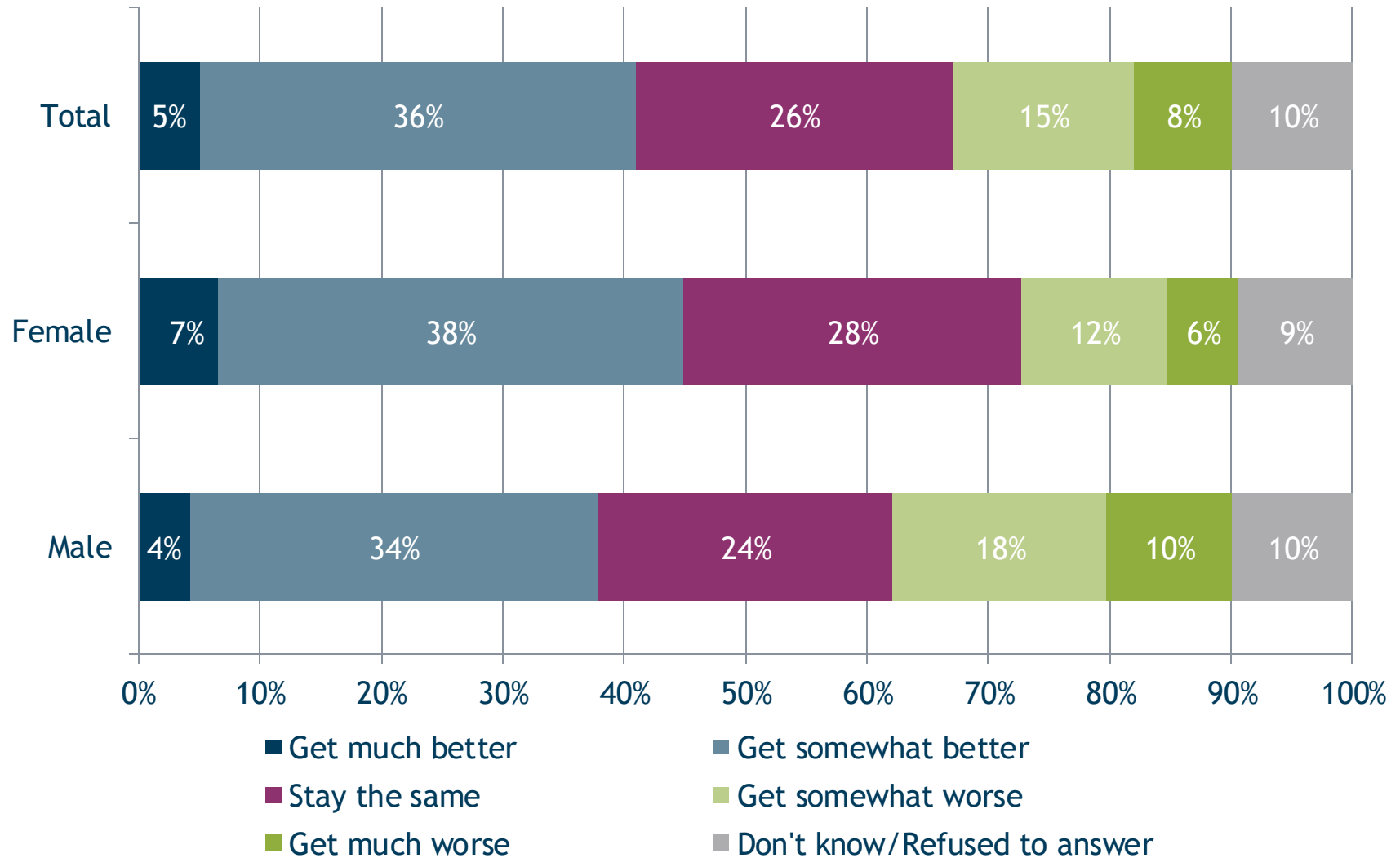
How would you describe the current economic situation of your household?



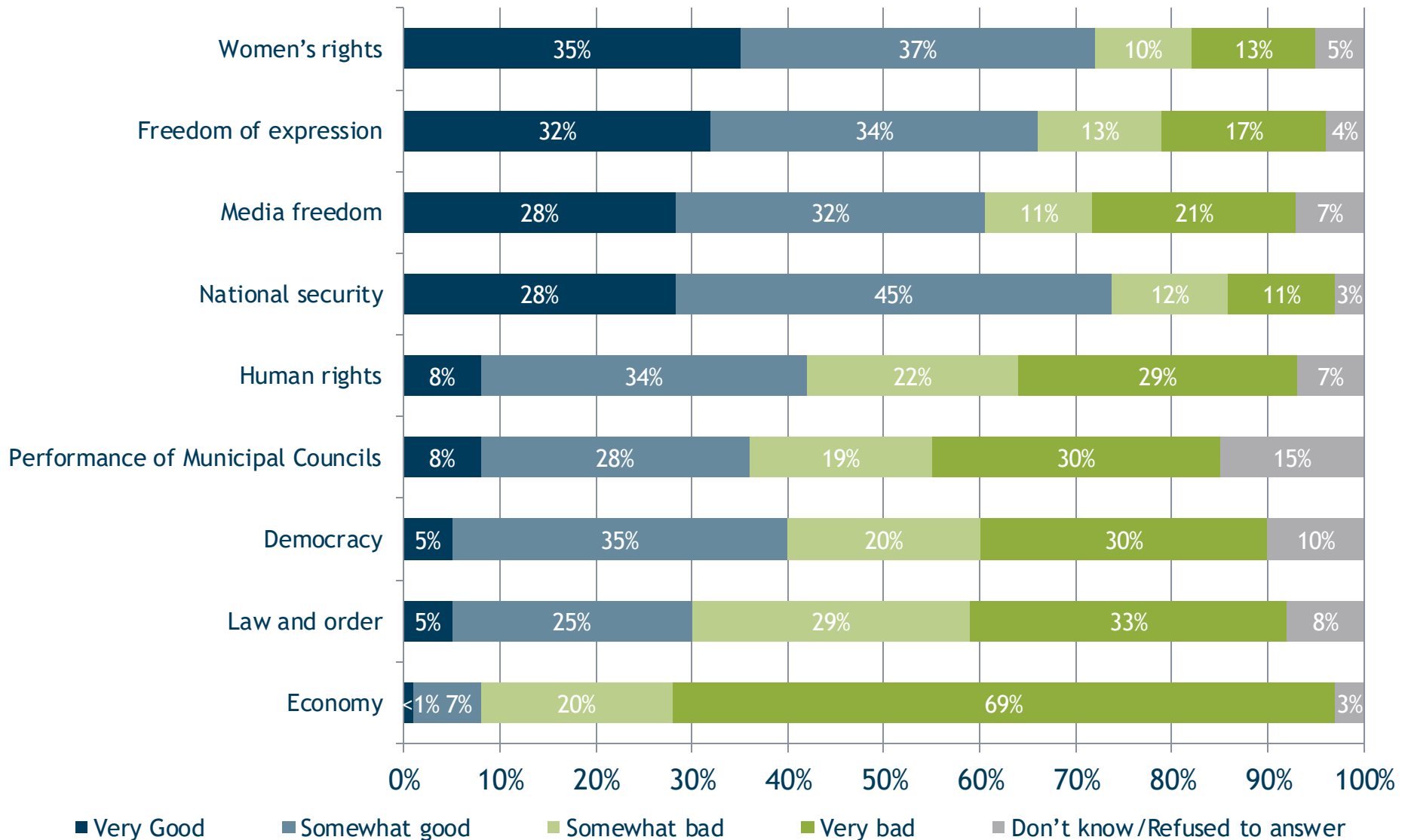
In the coming 12 months, how do you expect the economic situation of your household to change?

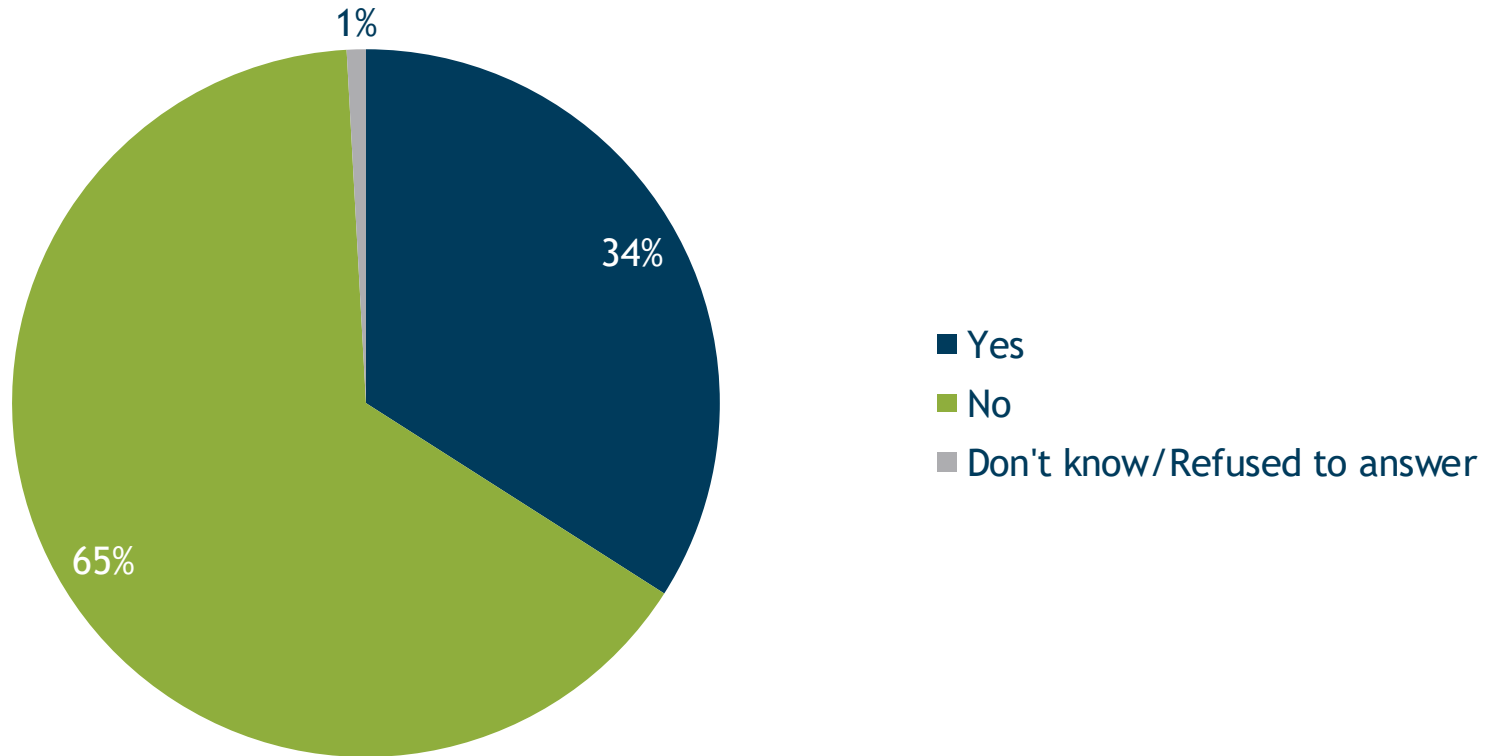

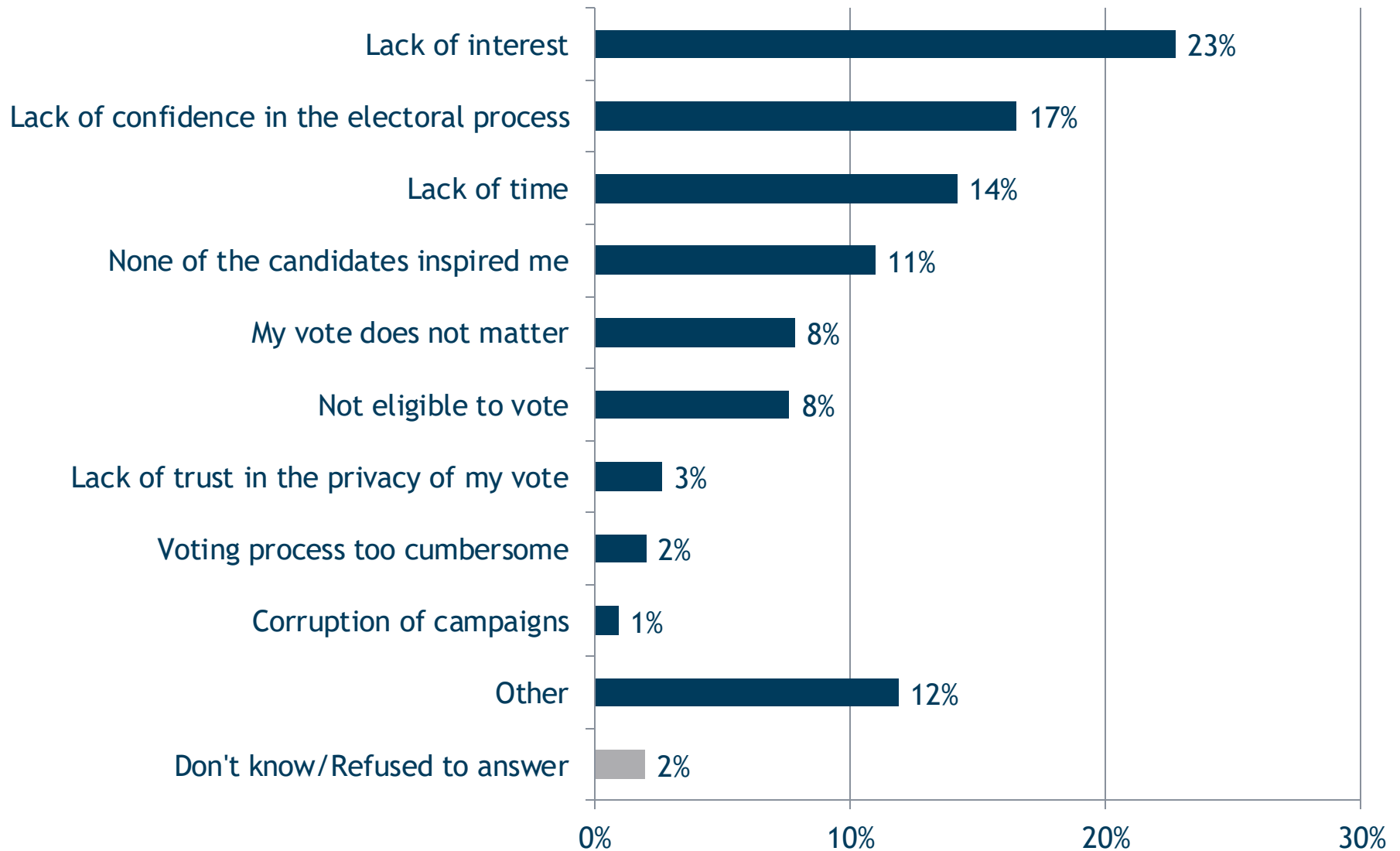

Were you registered to vote in the May 6 municipal elections?

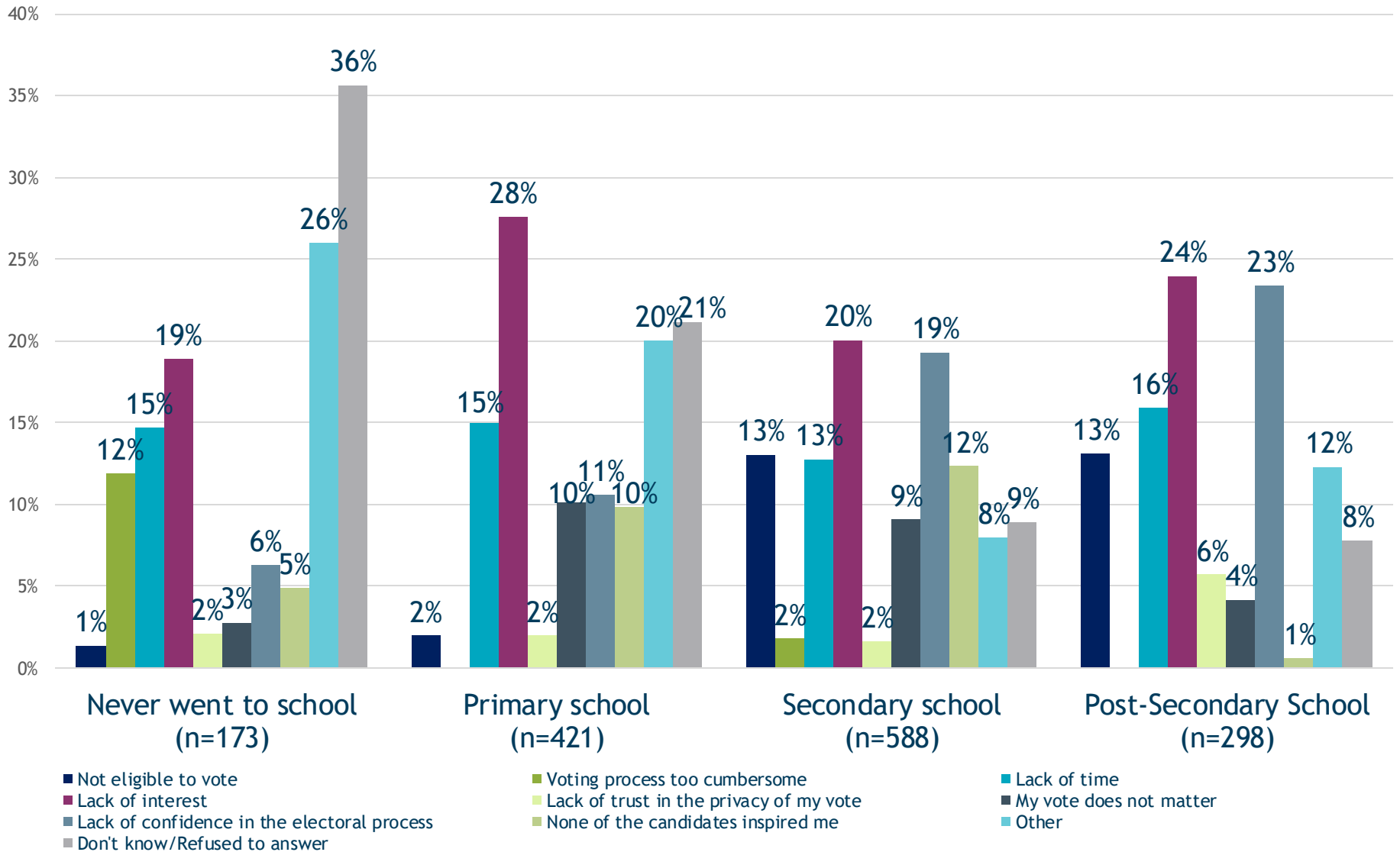


What is the primary reason you were not registered to vote in the May 6 municipal elections?

(Respondents not registered to vote in the May 6 municipal elections: n=1,482)



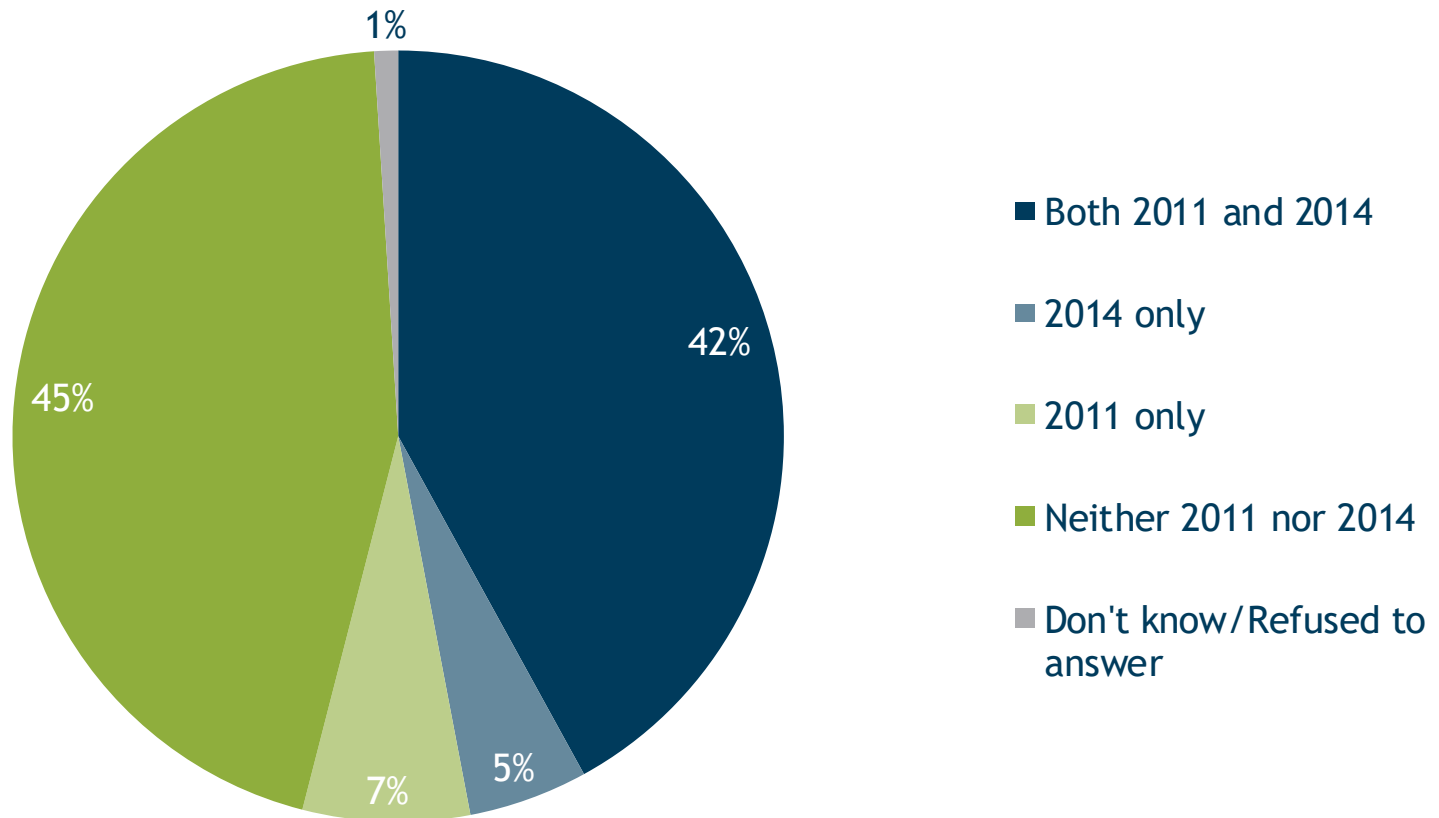

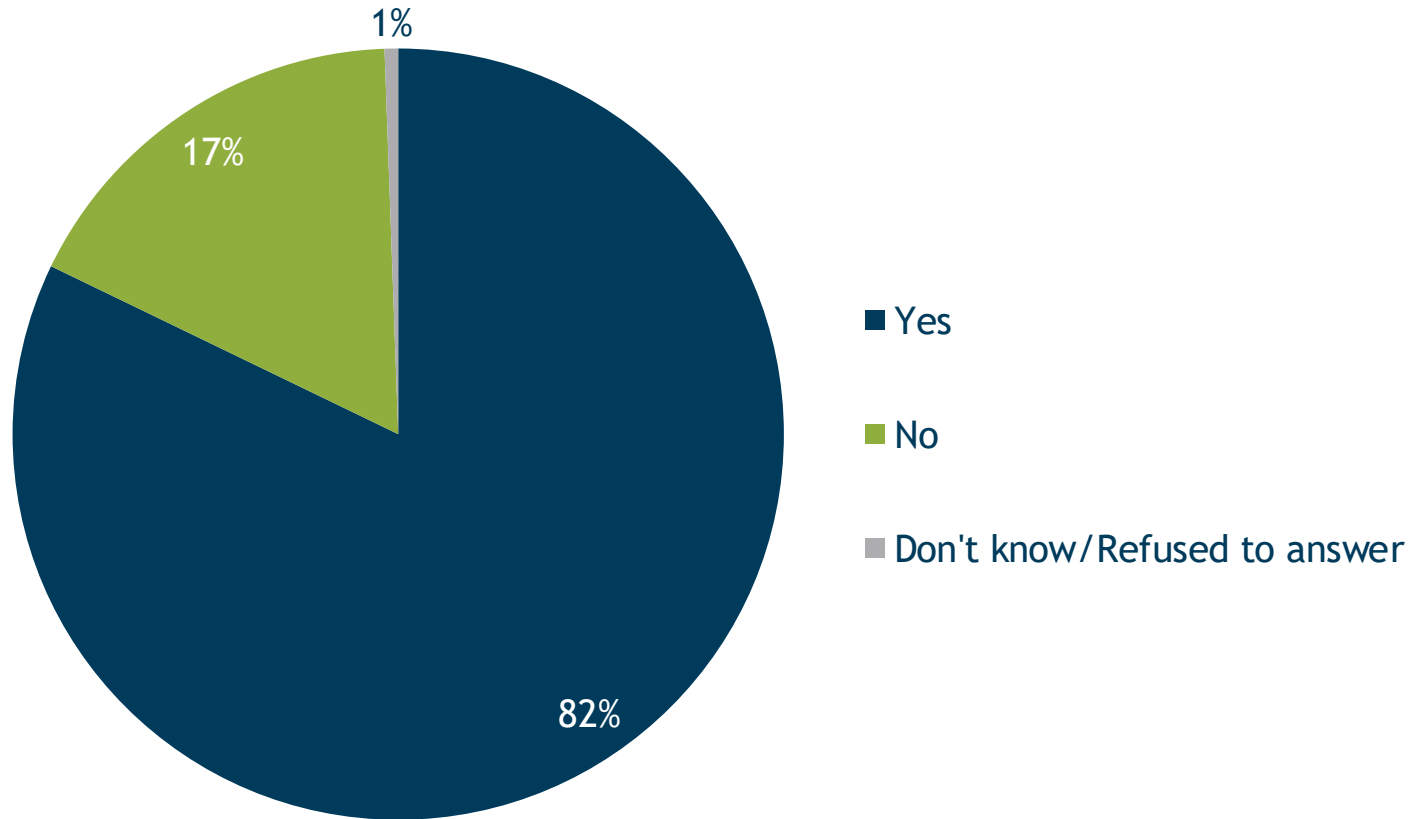

Did you vote in the 2011 or 2014 elections?

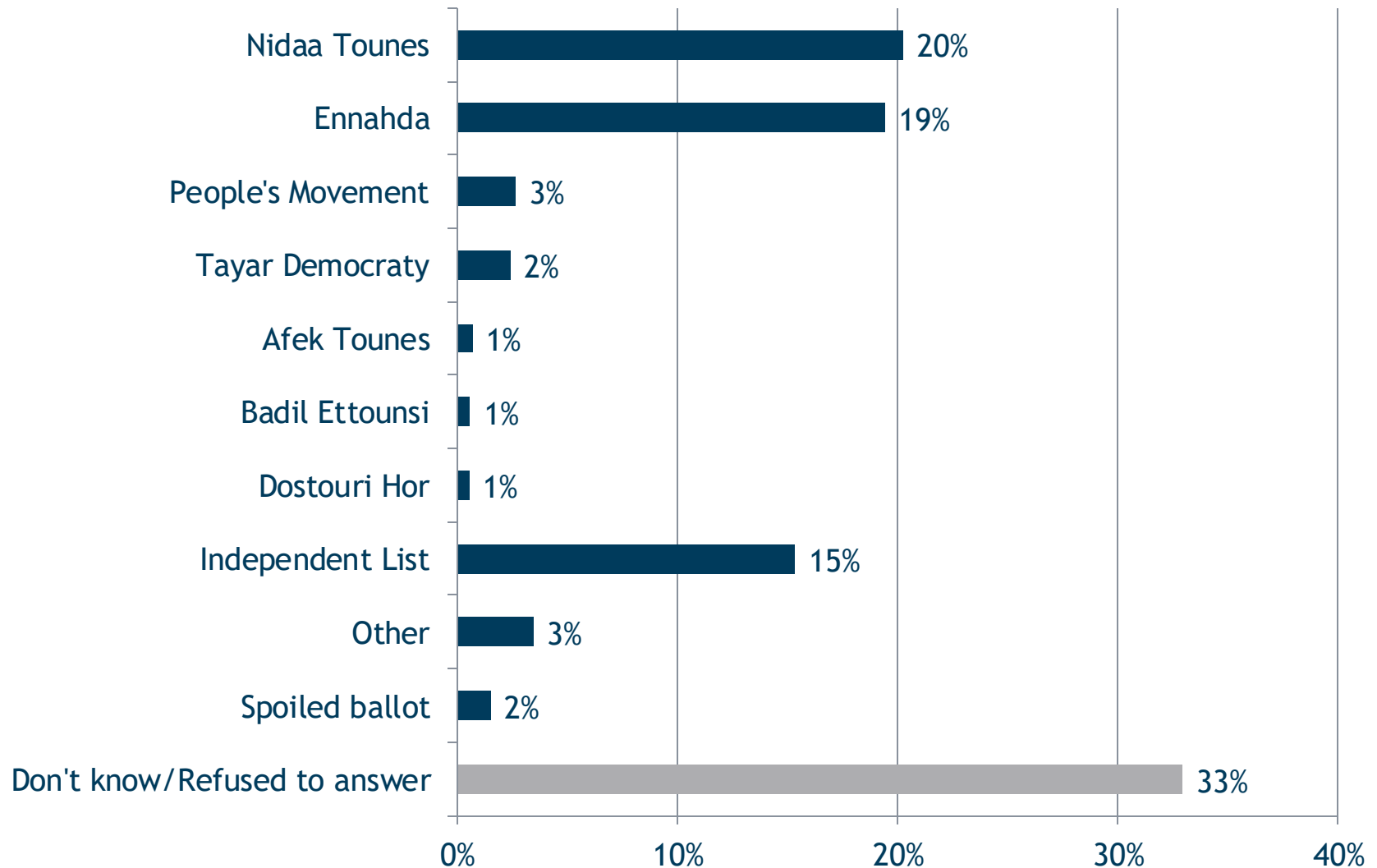


Did you vote in the May 6 municipal elections?

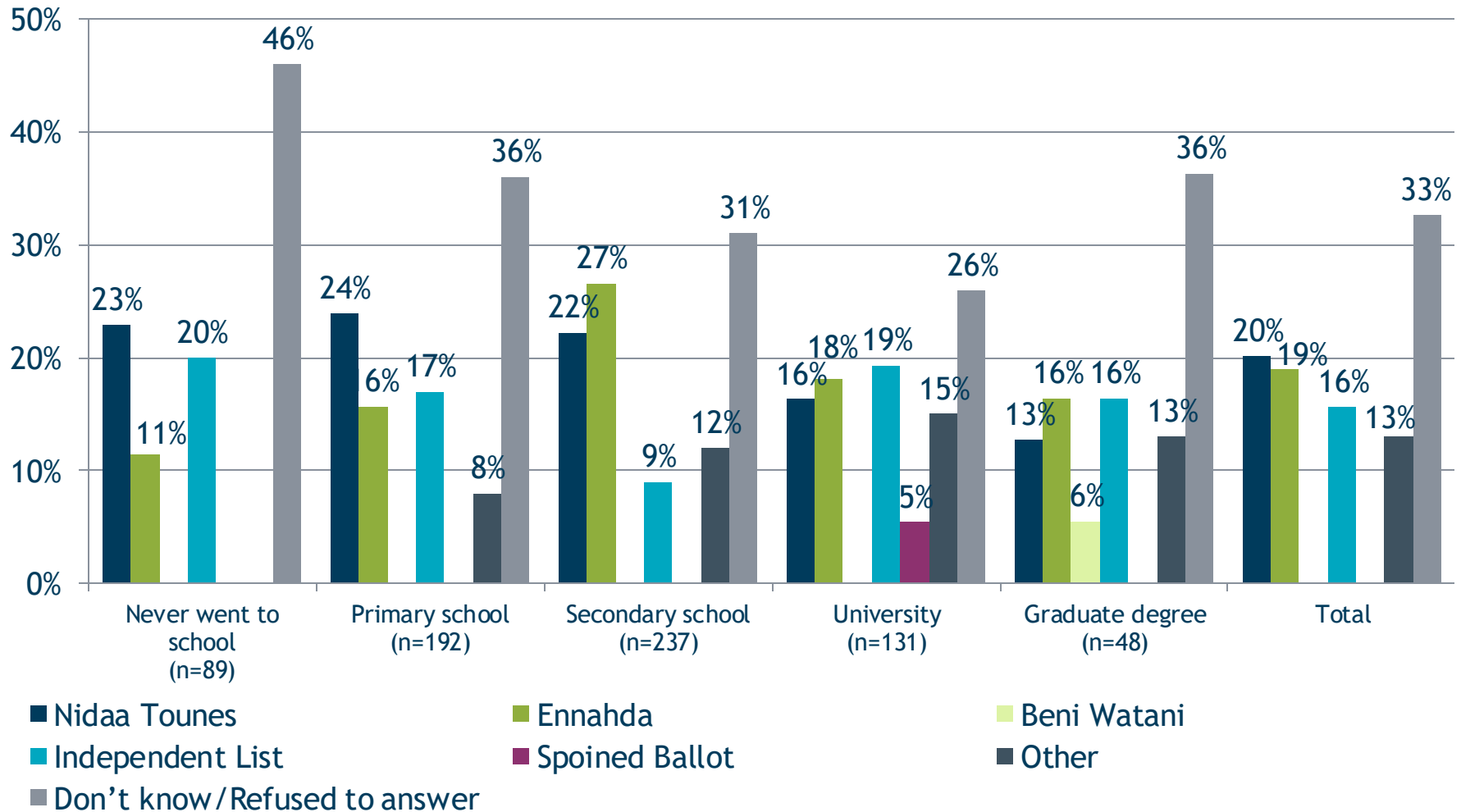

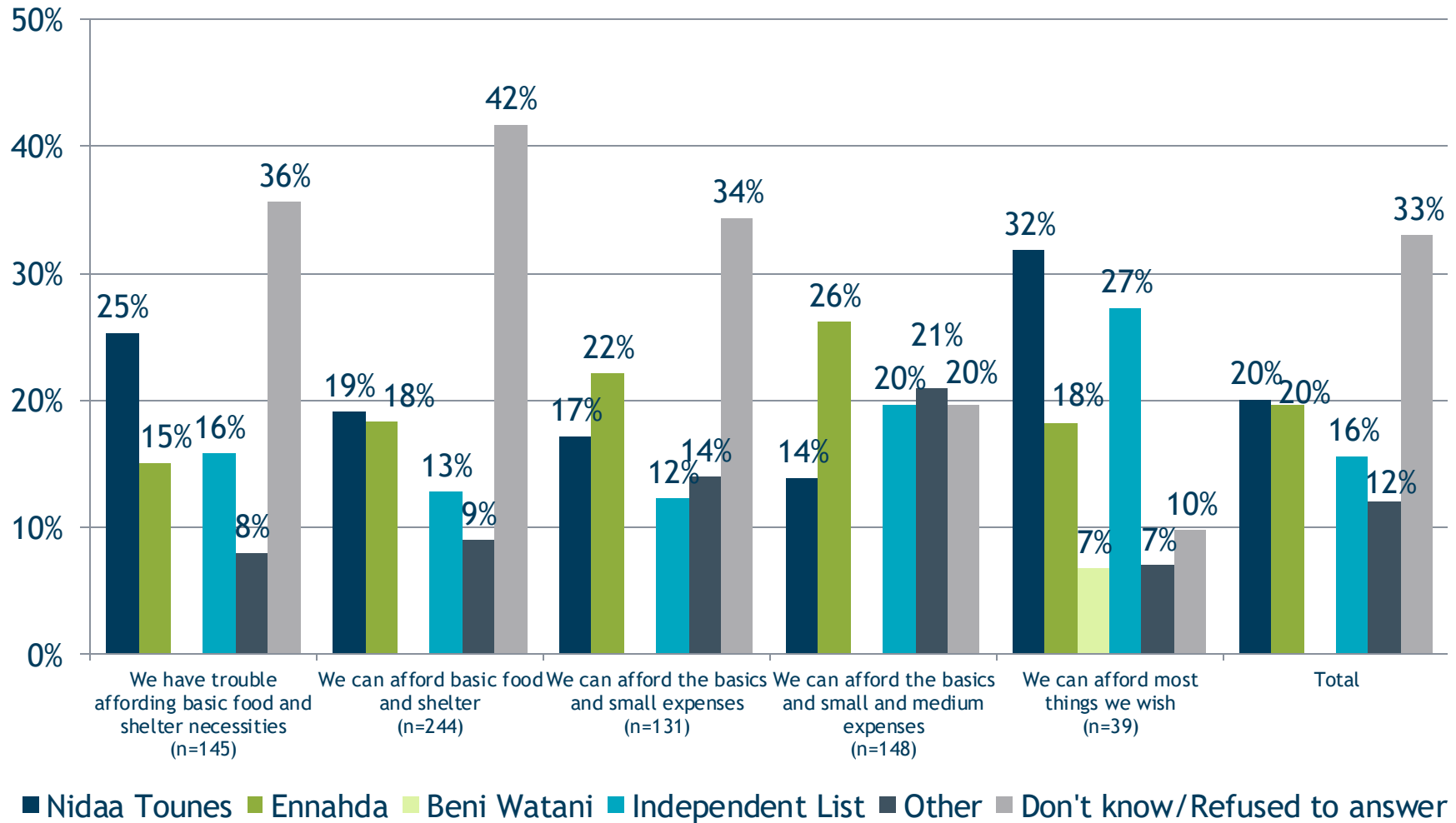

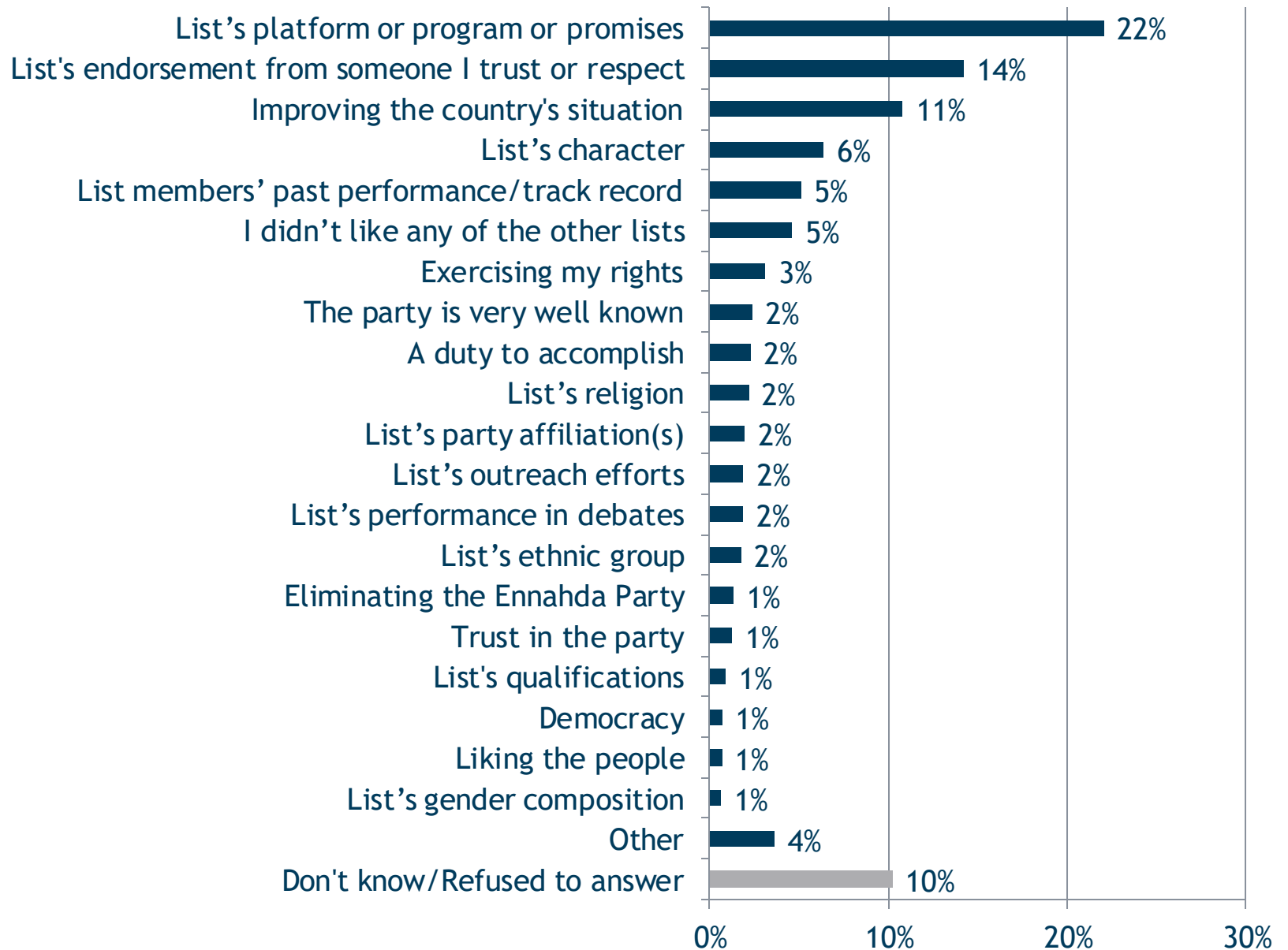

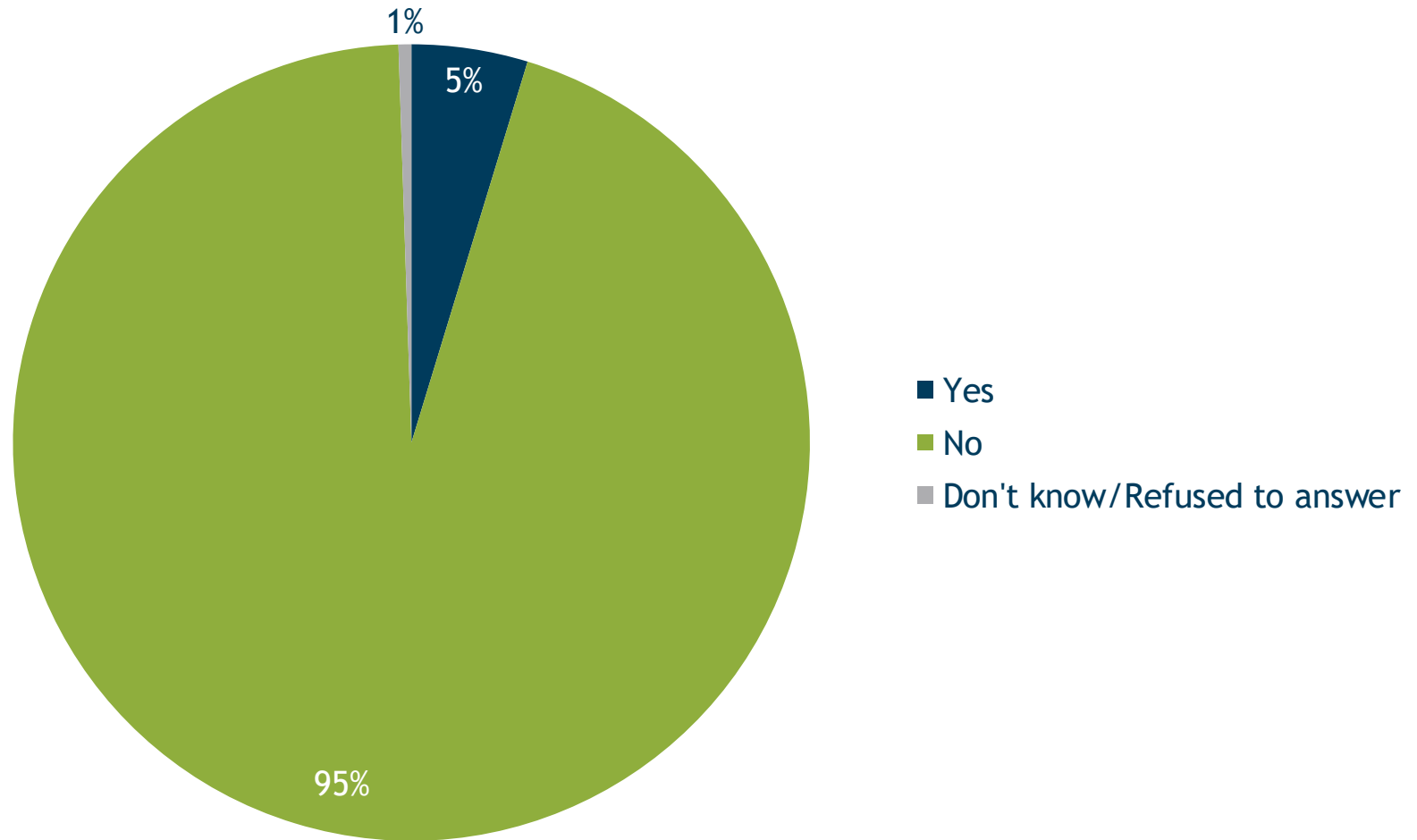

What was the most important factor for determining your vote? (Respondents who voted in the May 6 municipal elections: n=712)



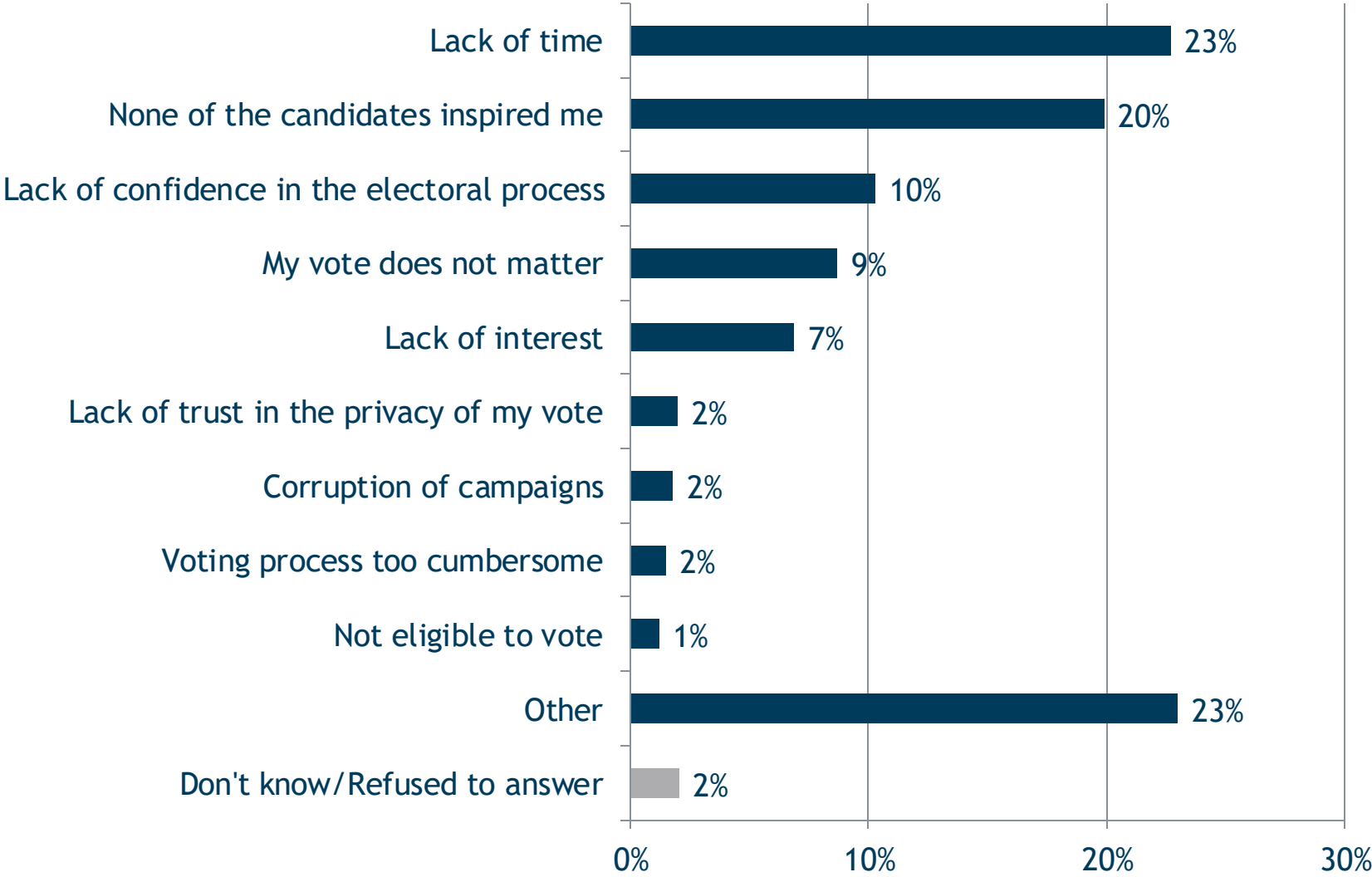
Did you experience or witness any difficulties while voting at your polling center?

(Respondents who voted in the May 6 municipal elections: n=712)

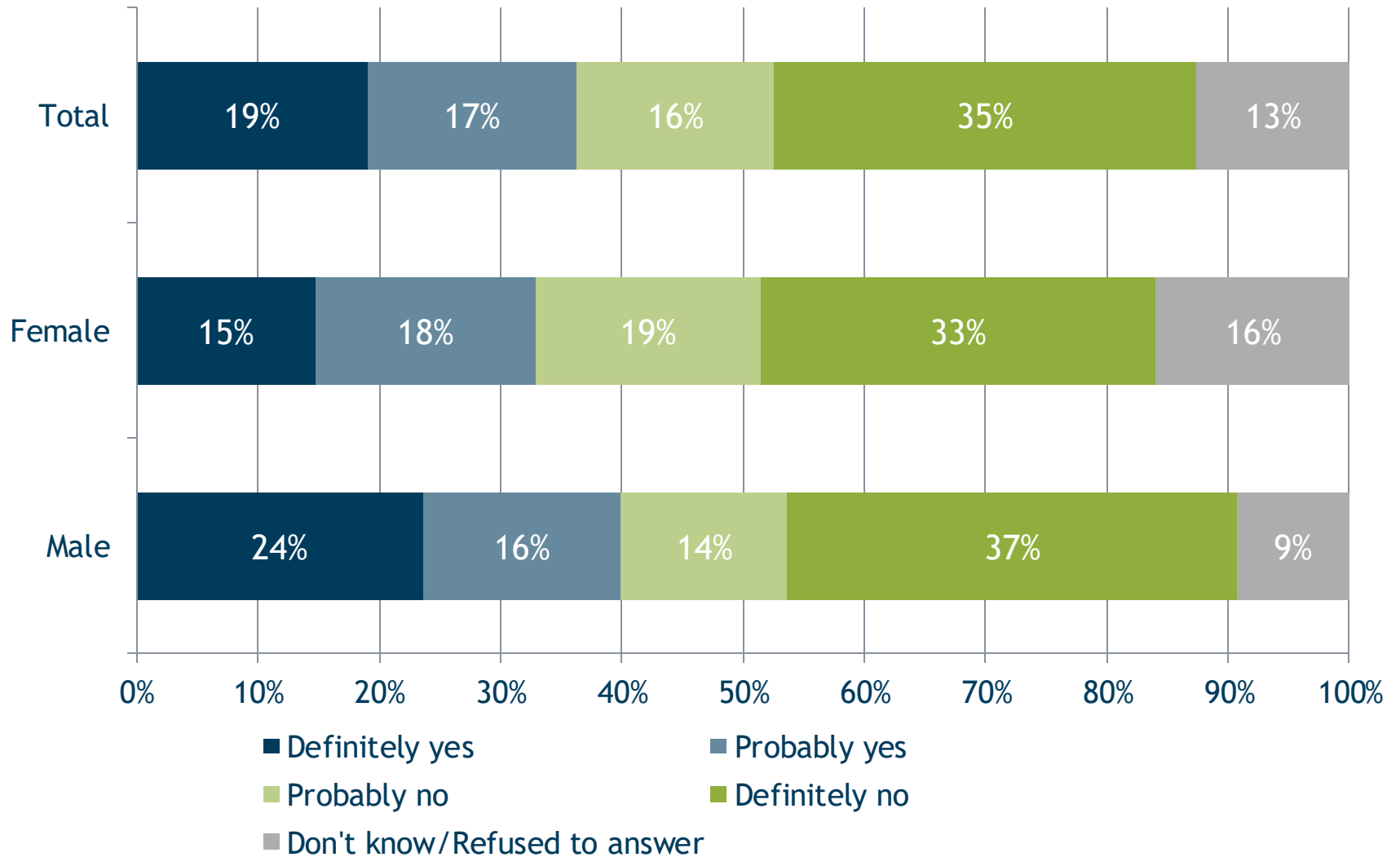


What is the primary reason you did not vote in the May 6 municipal elections?

In your opinion, do the declared official election results reflect the will of the people? (Disaggregated by gender)



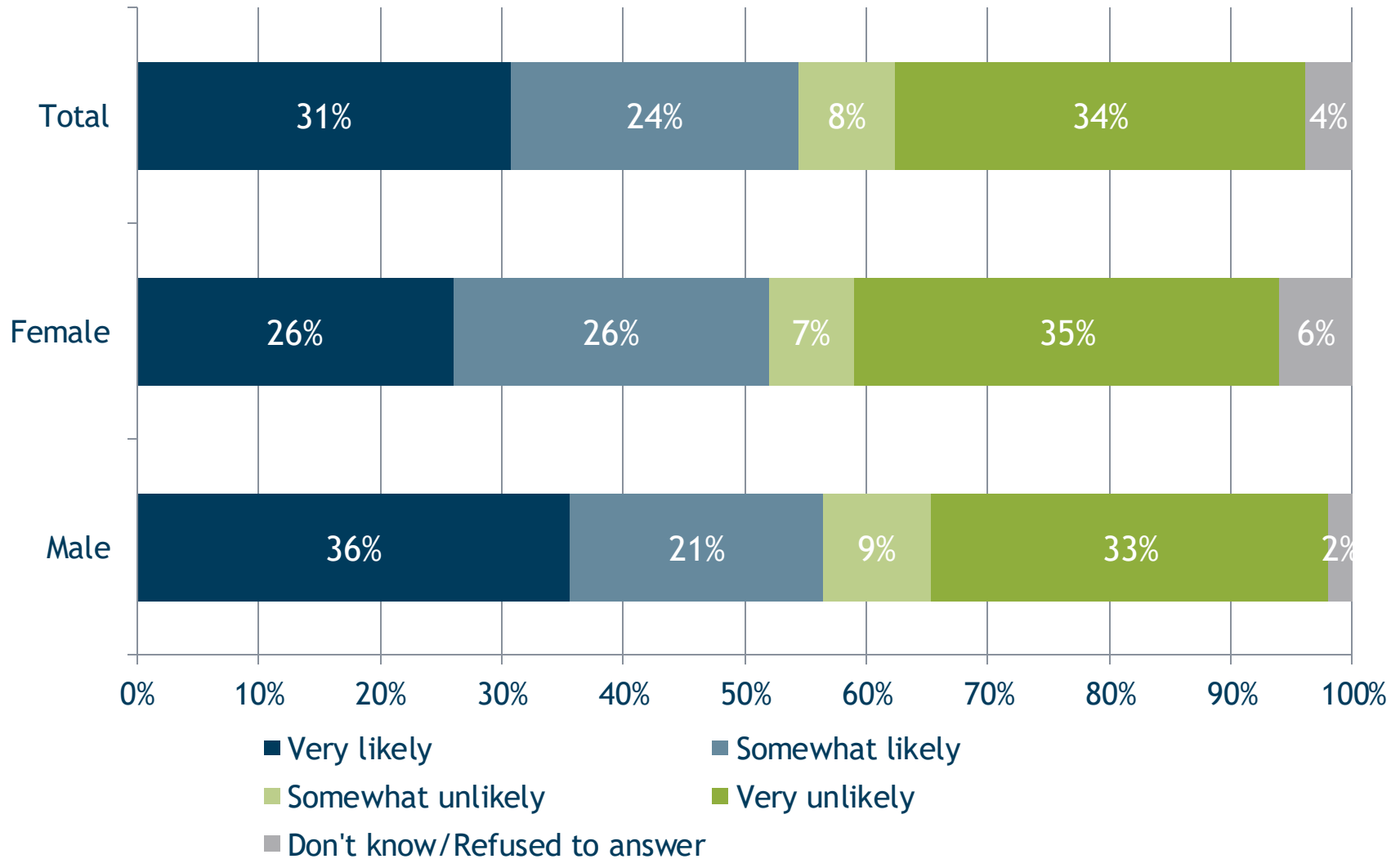

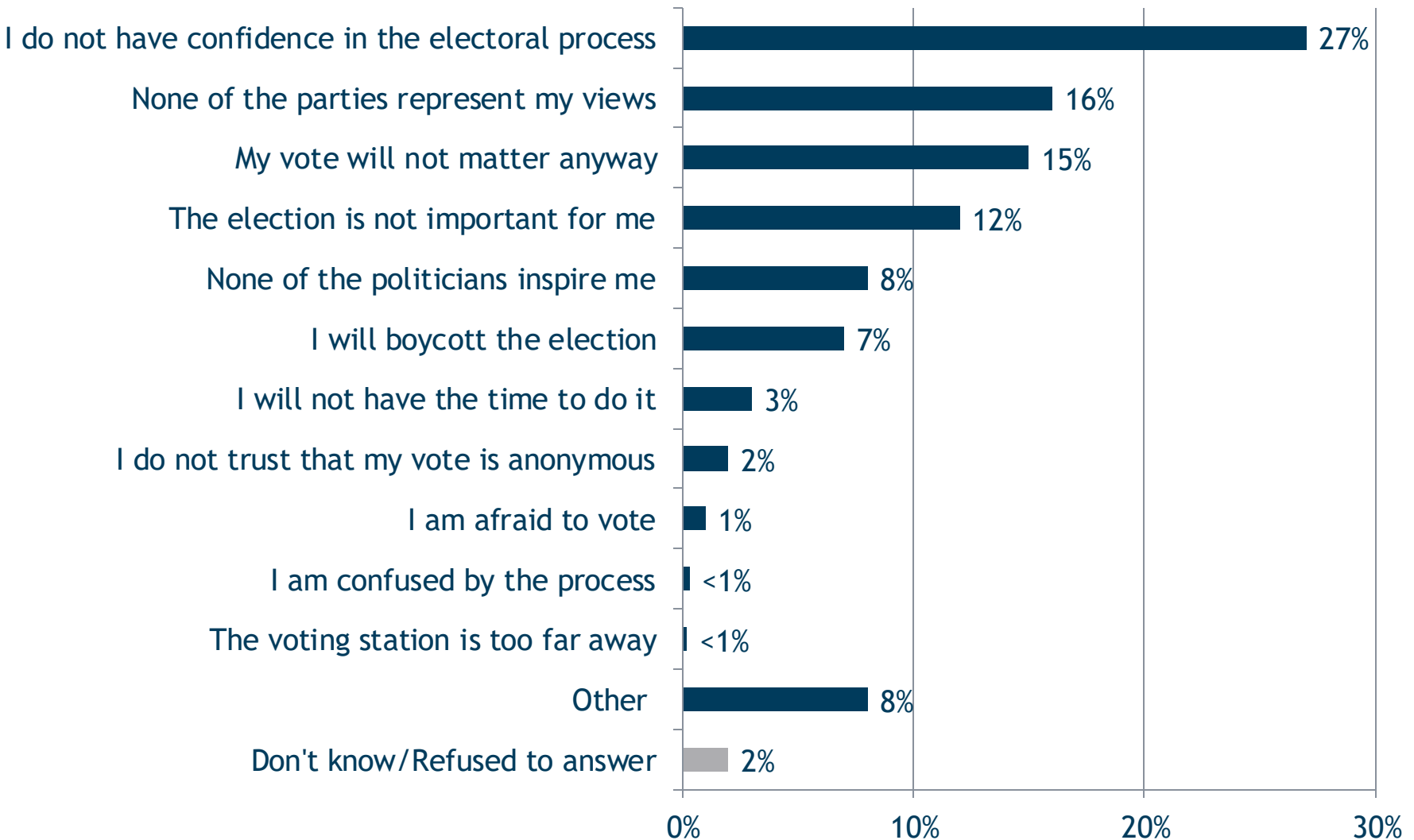

How likely or unlikely are you to vote in the upcoming 2019 presidential and parliamentary elections? (Disaggregated by gender)

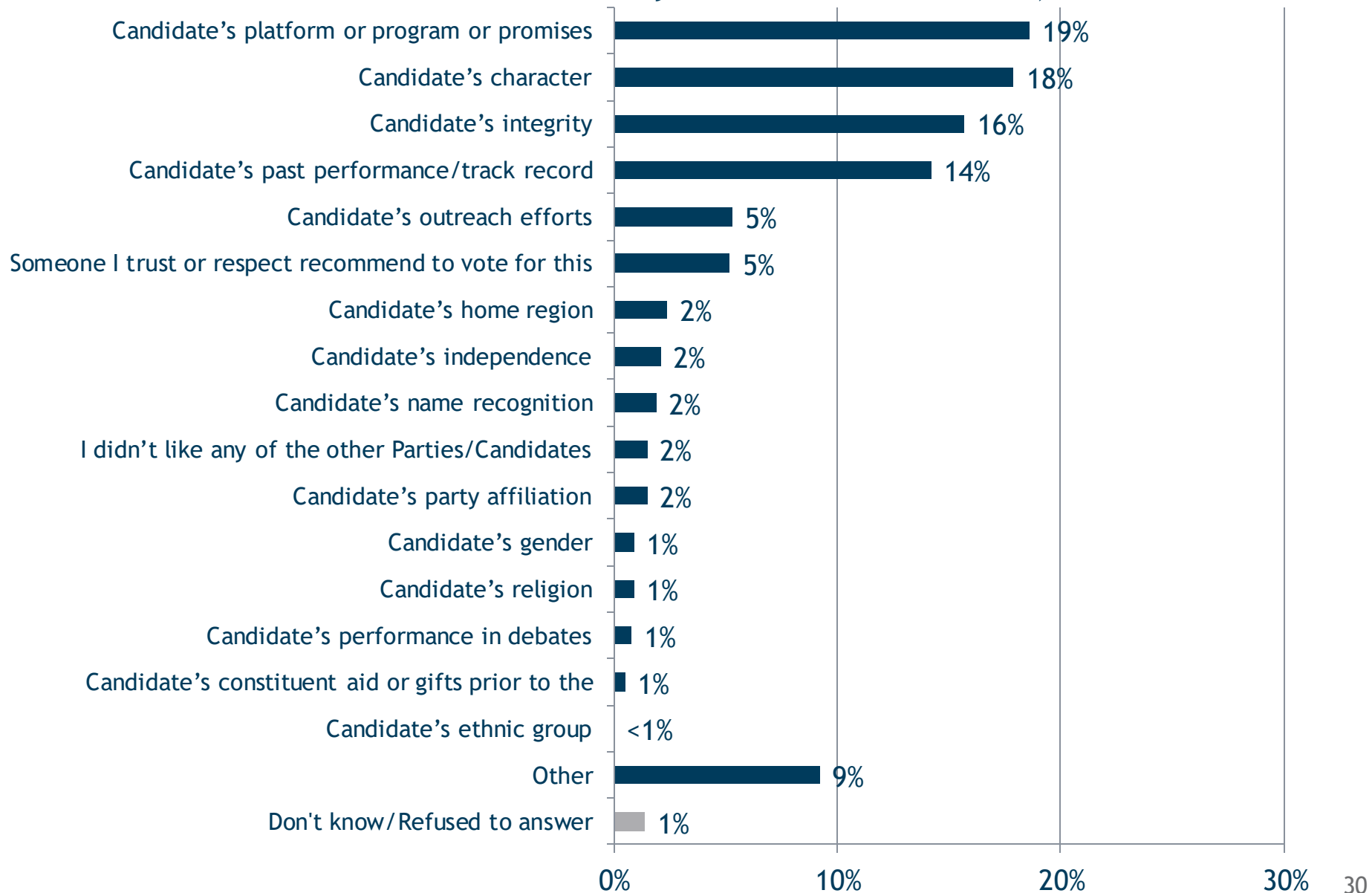


Why are you very unlikely to vote in the 2019 presidential and parliamentary elections?

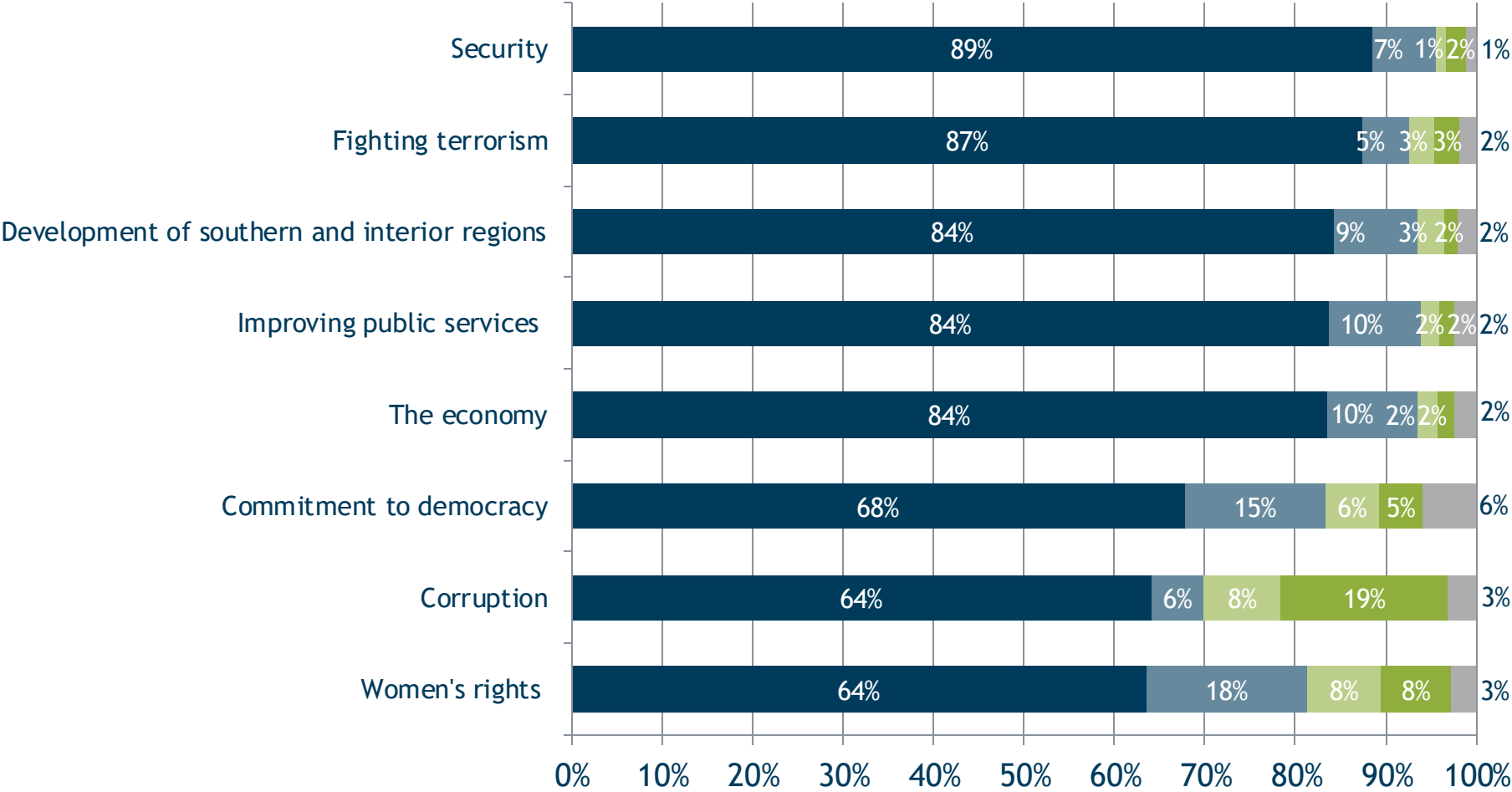

What will be the most important factor for determining your vote? (Respondents who are *very likely* to vote in the 2019 elections and who named a candidate they would vote for: n=341)

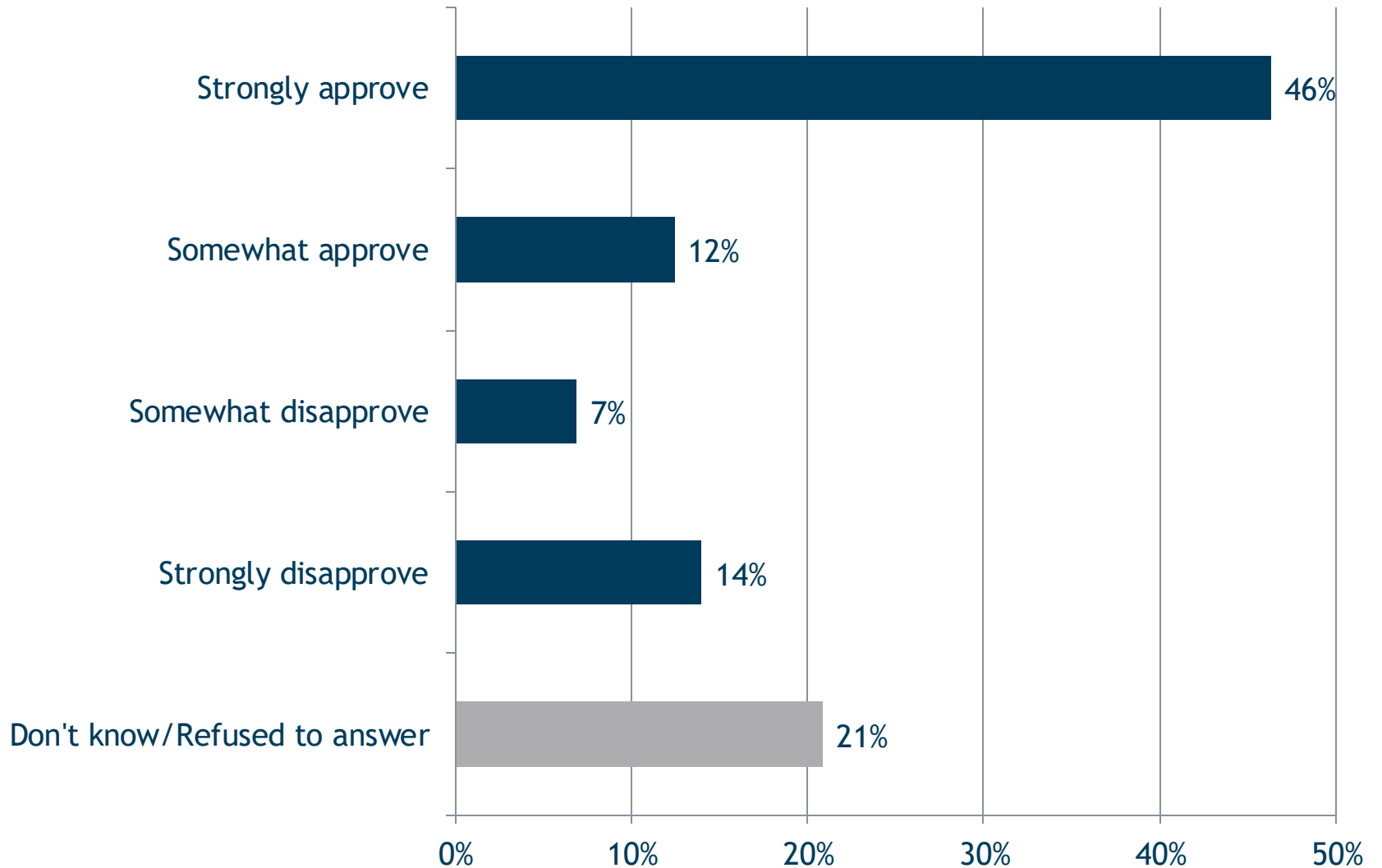


How important or unimportant are each of the following issues for determining your vote?

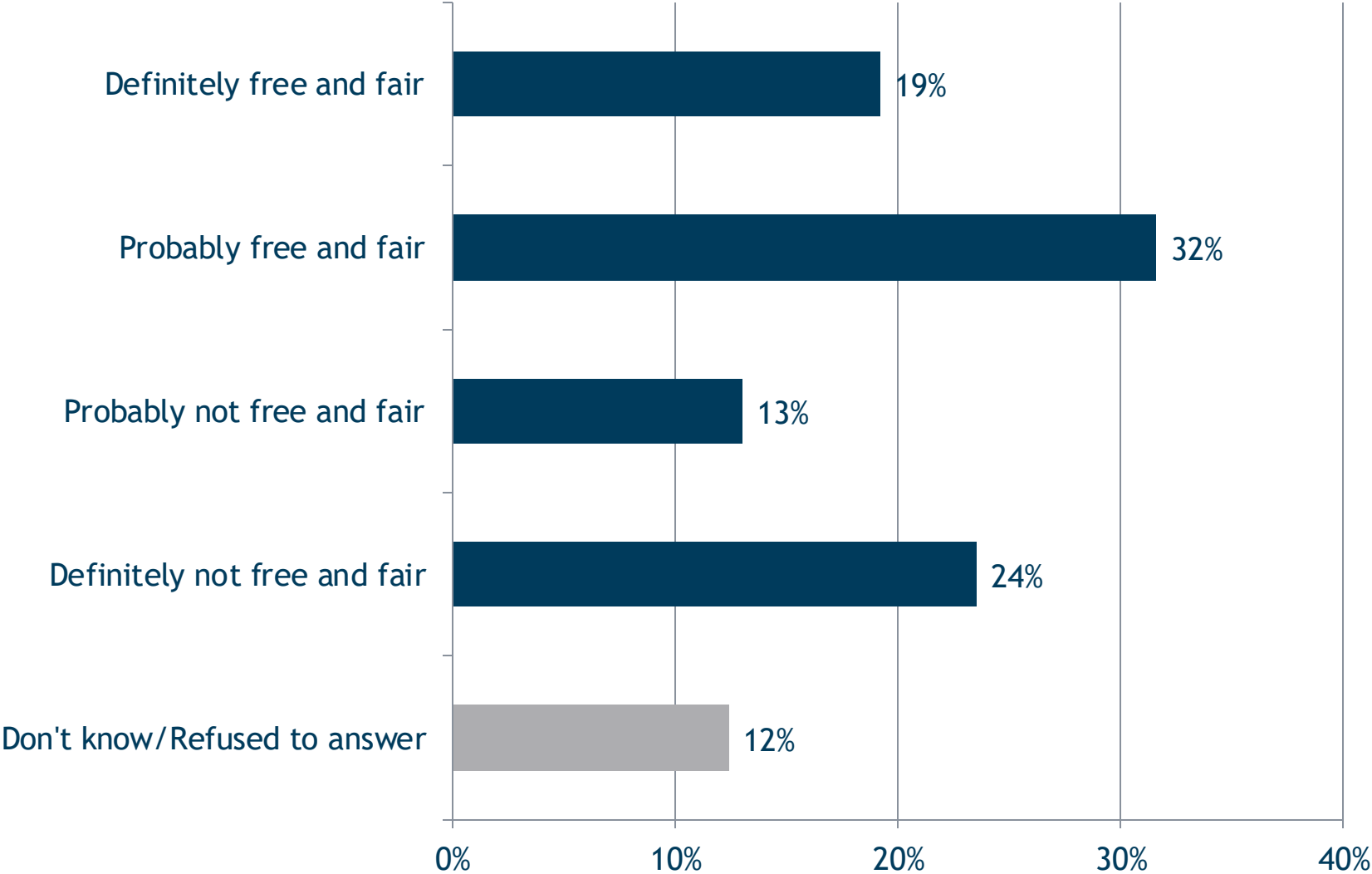

Do you feel that the upcoming elections will be free and fair or not?



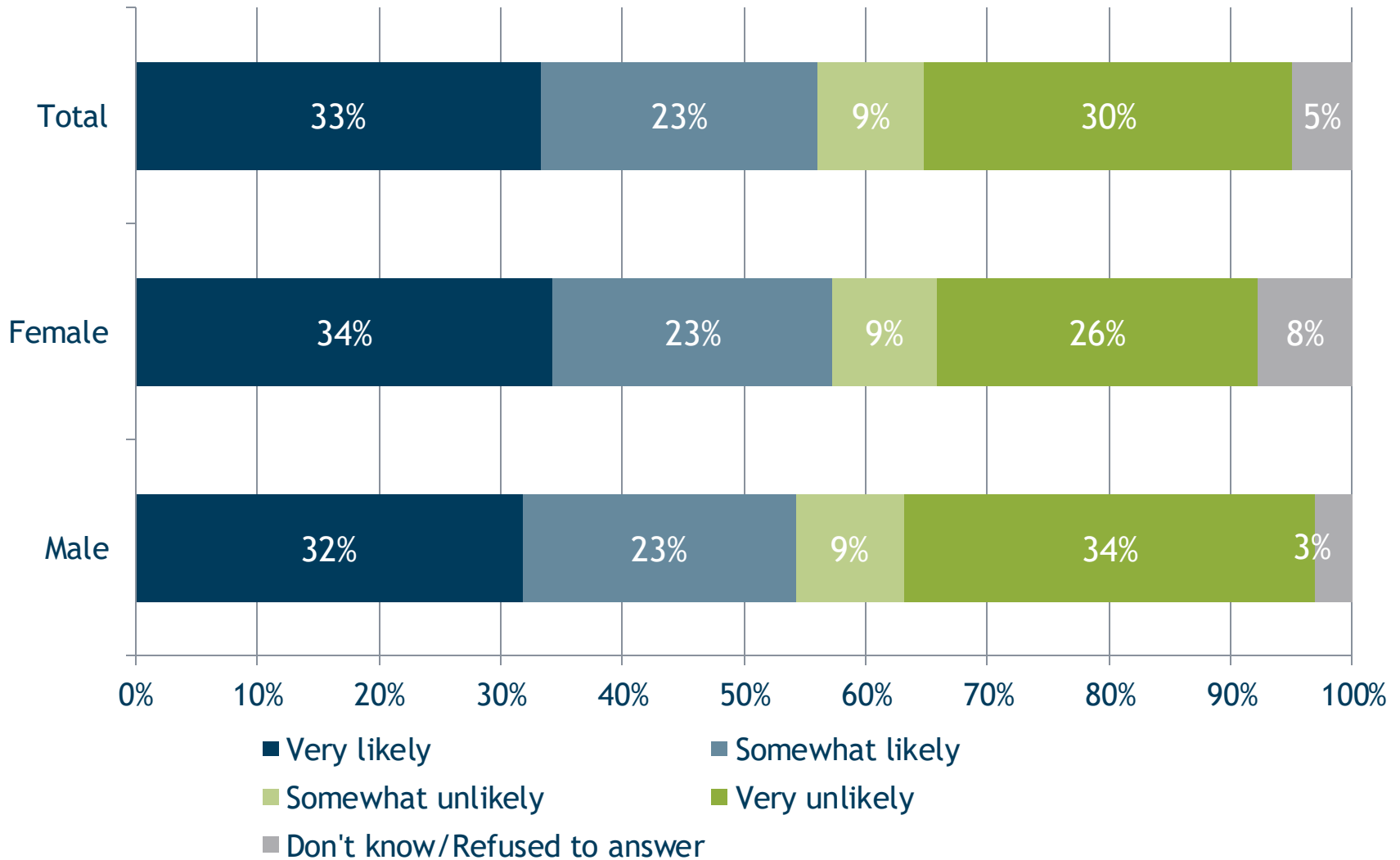

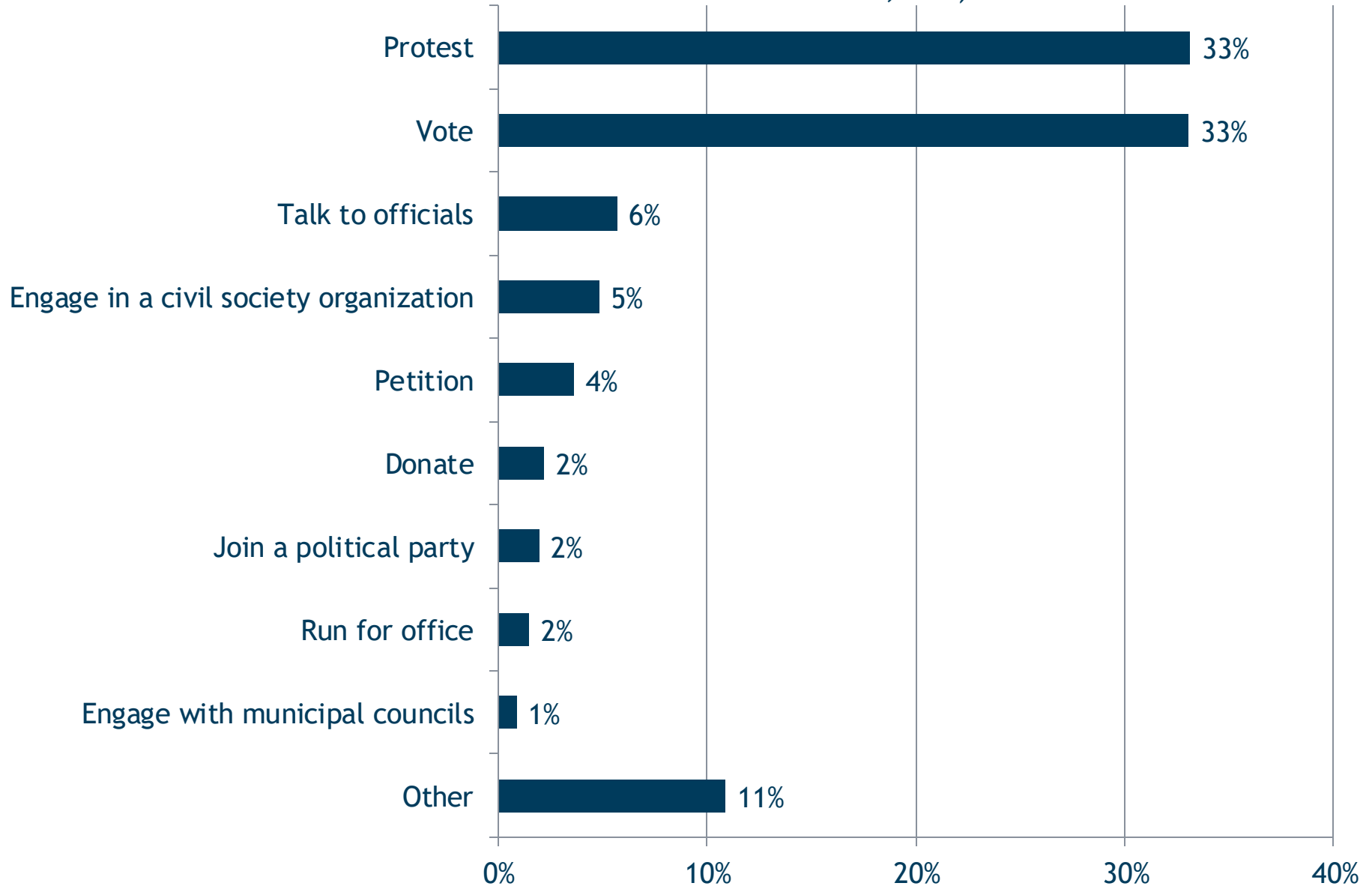

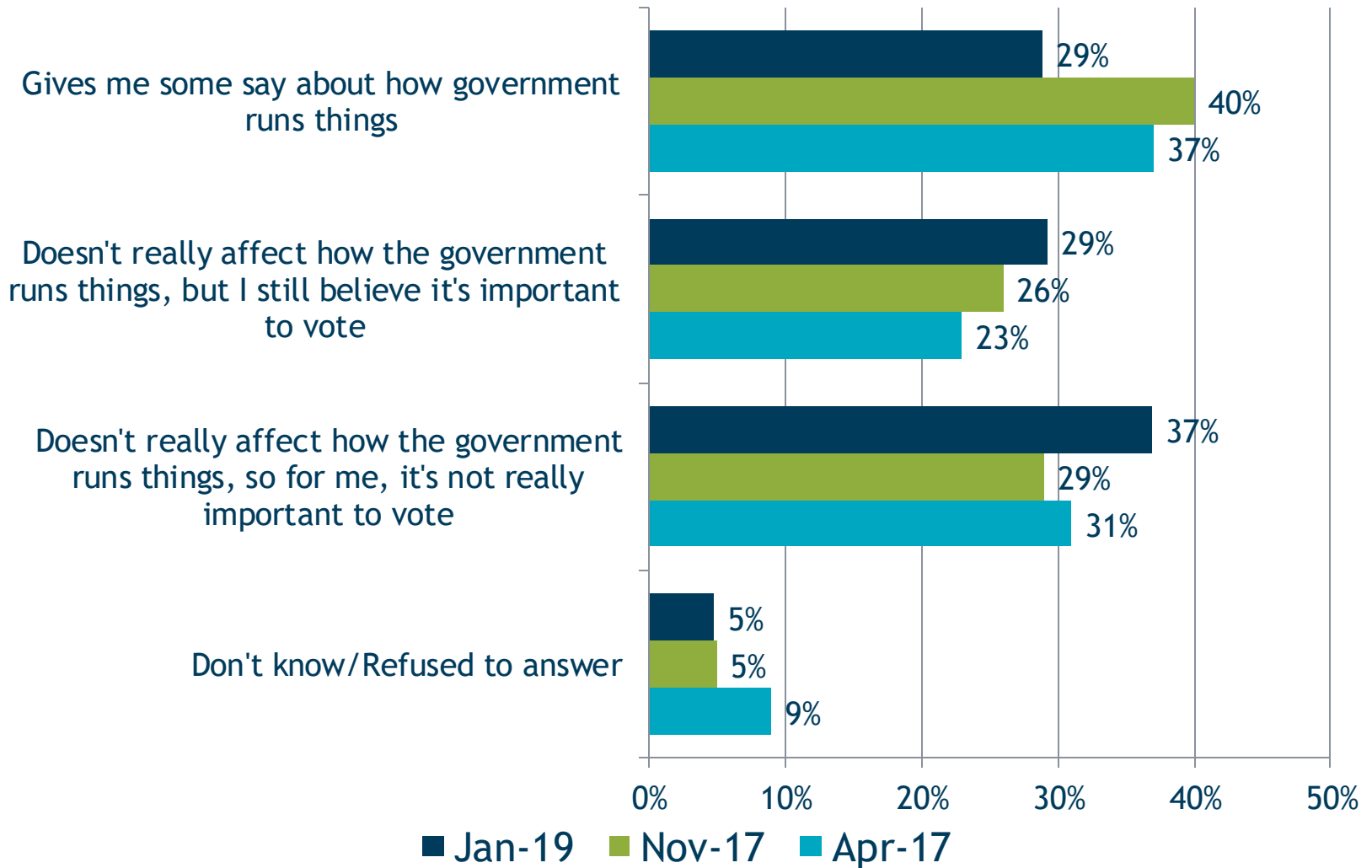
How likely or unlikely are ordinary people able to influence decisions made in our country? (Disaggregated by gender)



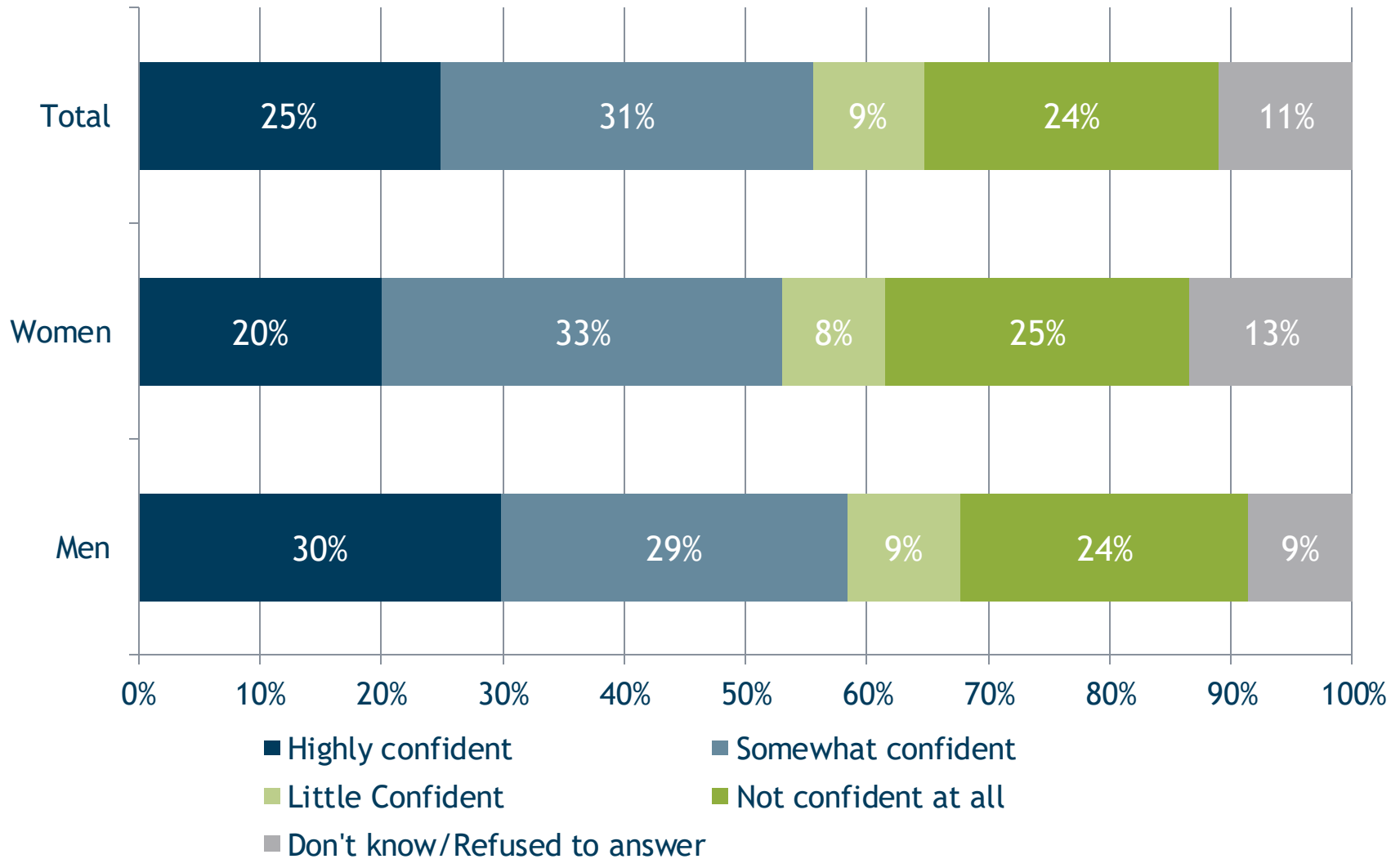
How can ordinary people influence decisions made in our country? (Respondents who believe ordinary people are *very likely* or *somewhat likely* able to influence decisions: n=1,363)



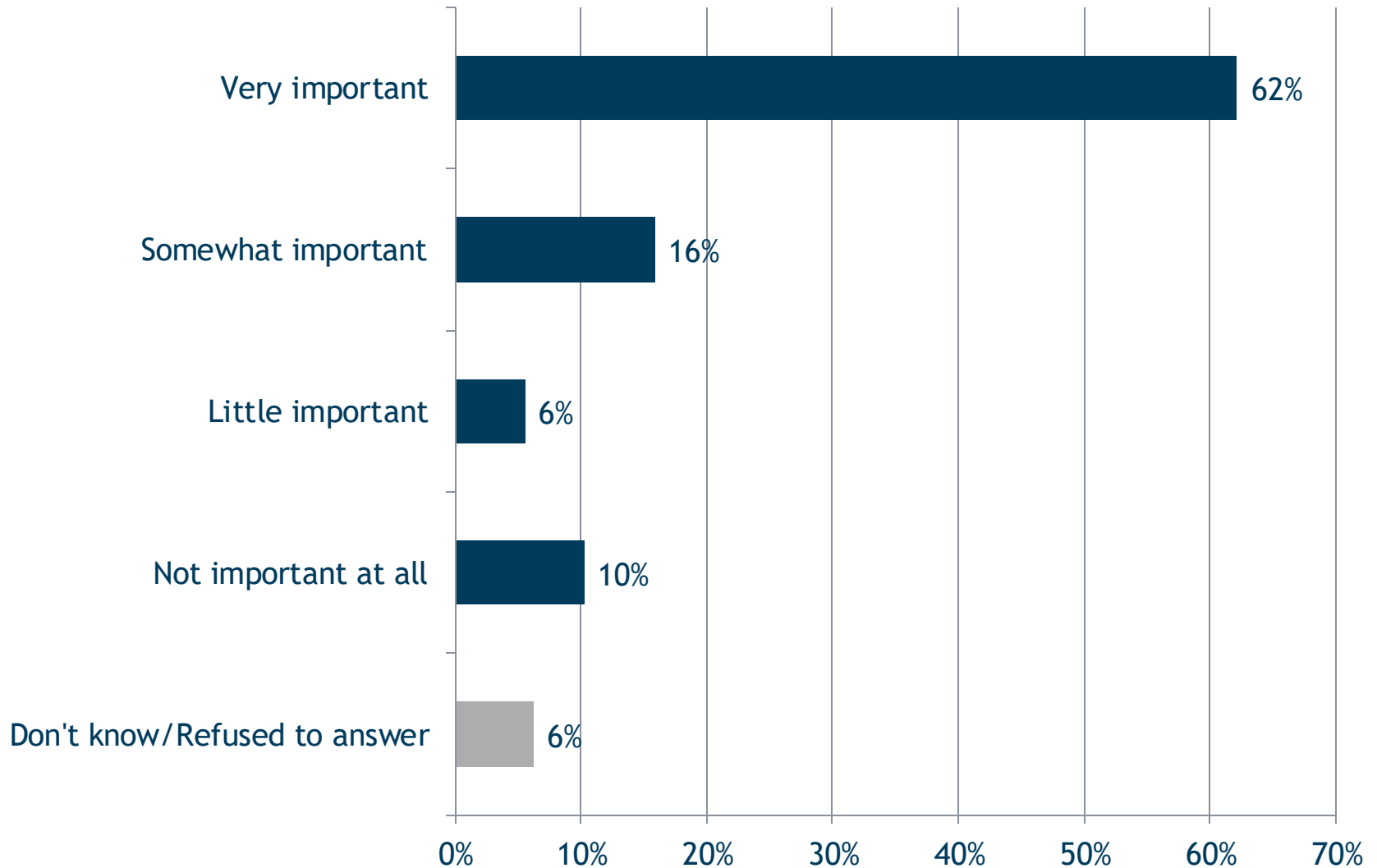

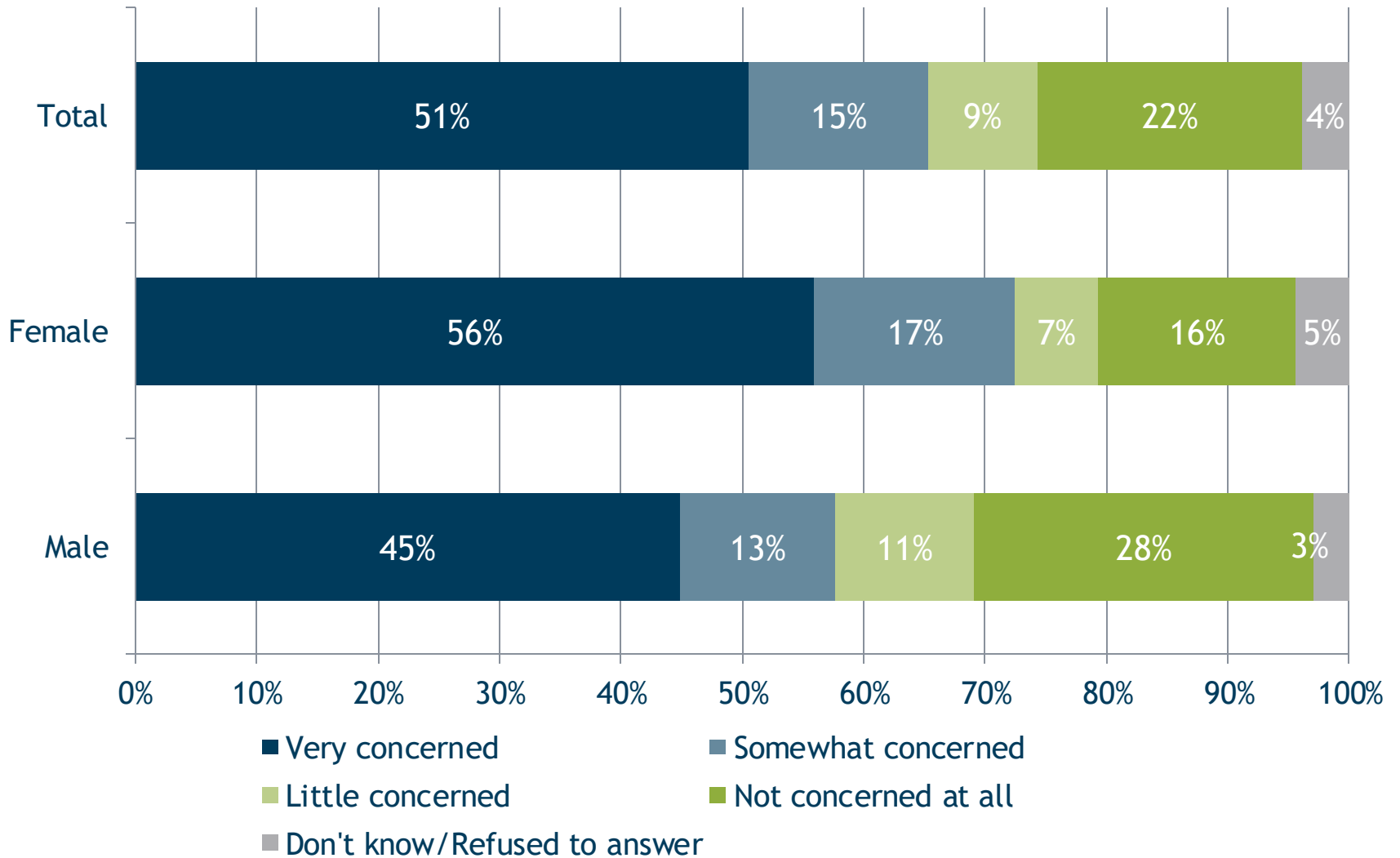

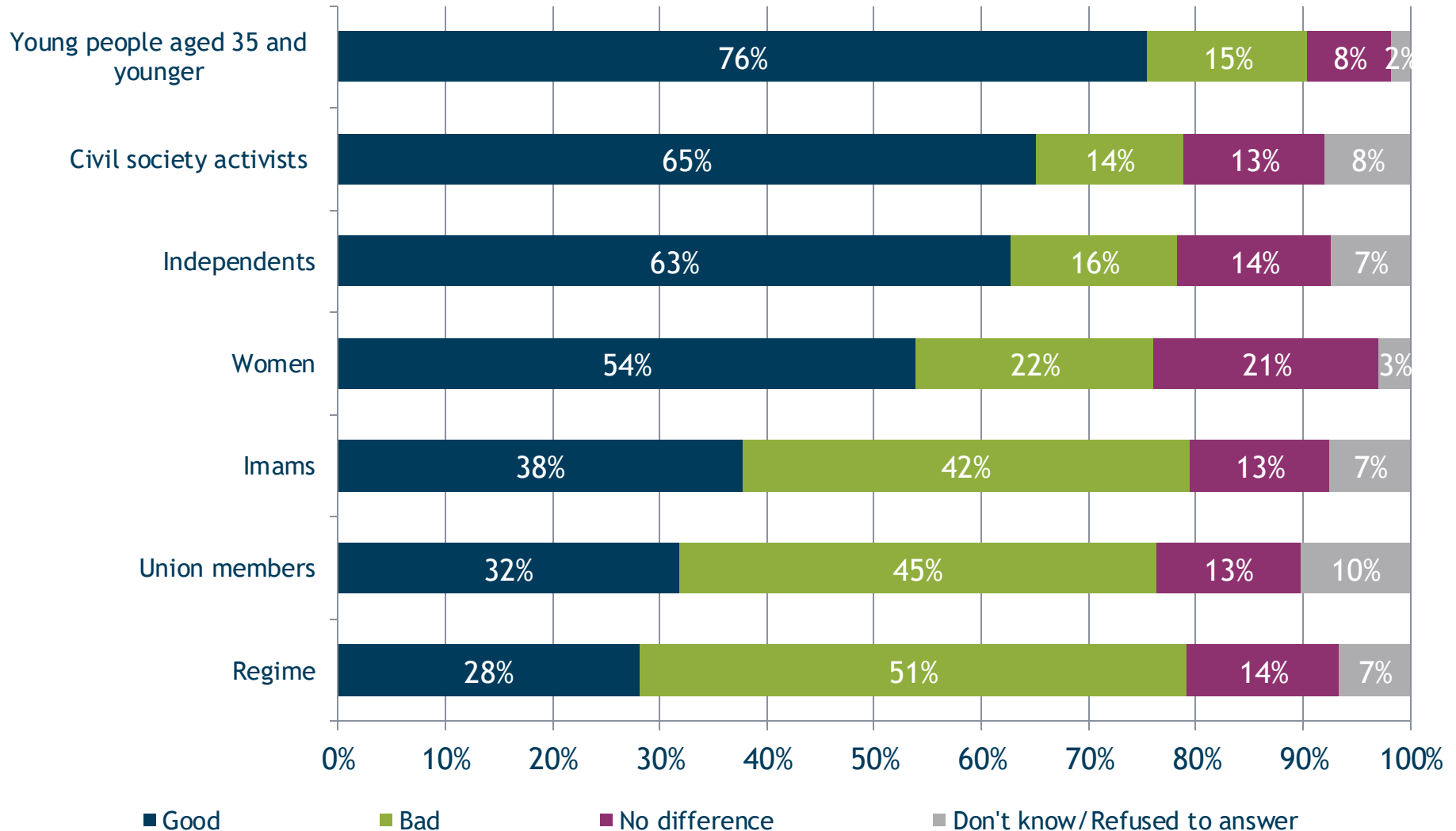
How important, if at all, is it to you that independent, non-government organizations observe the elections?

If more people representing the following groups were elected to the government, do you think that would be good, bad, or would it not make a difference?



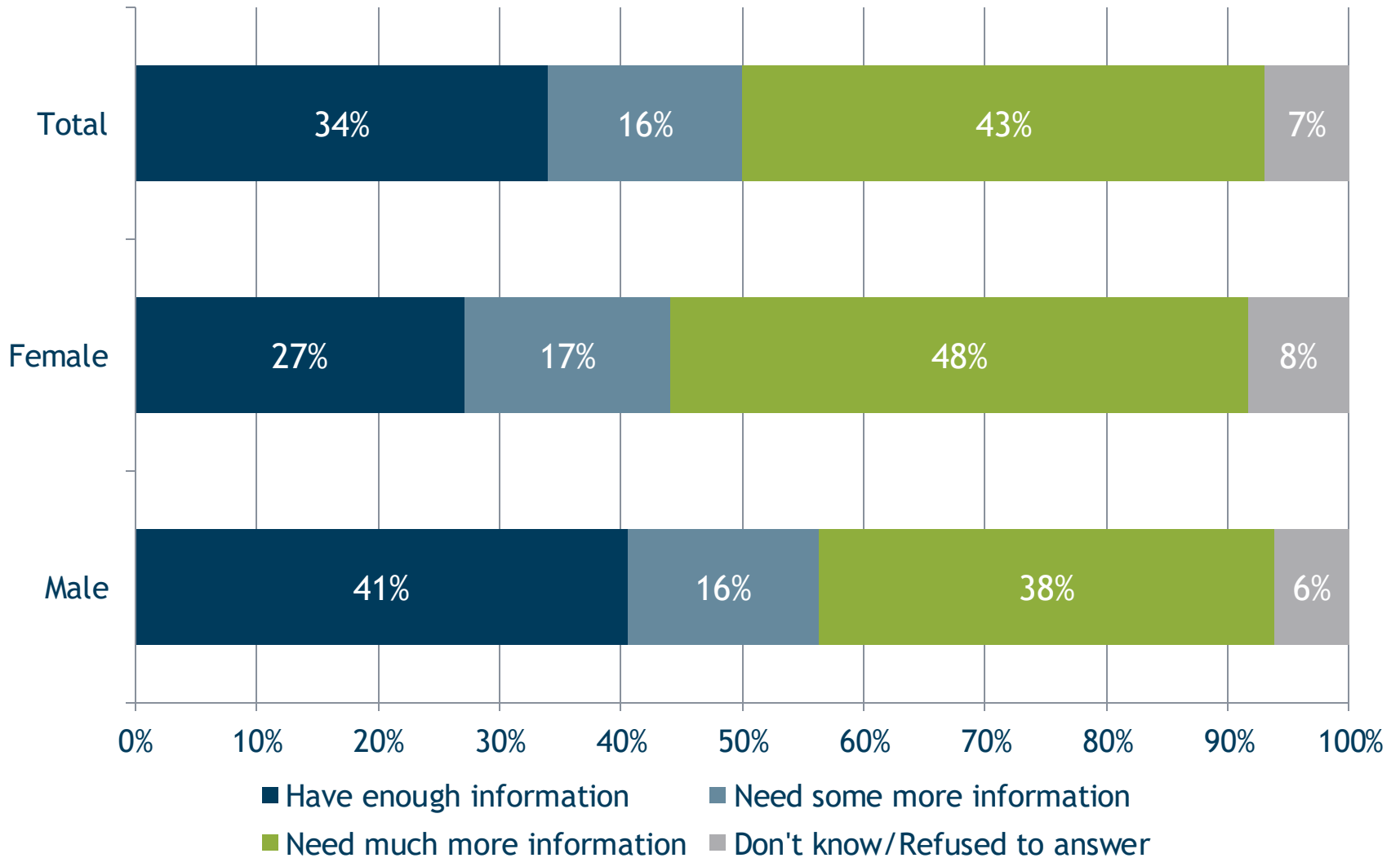

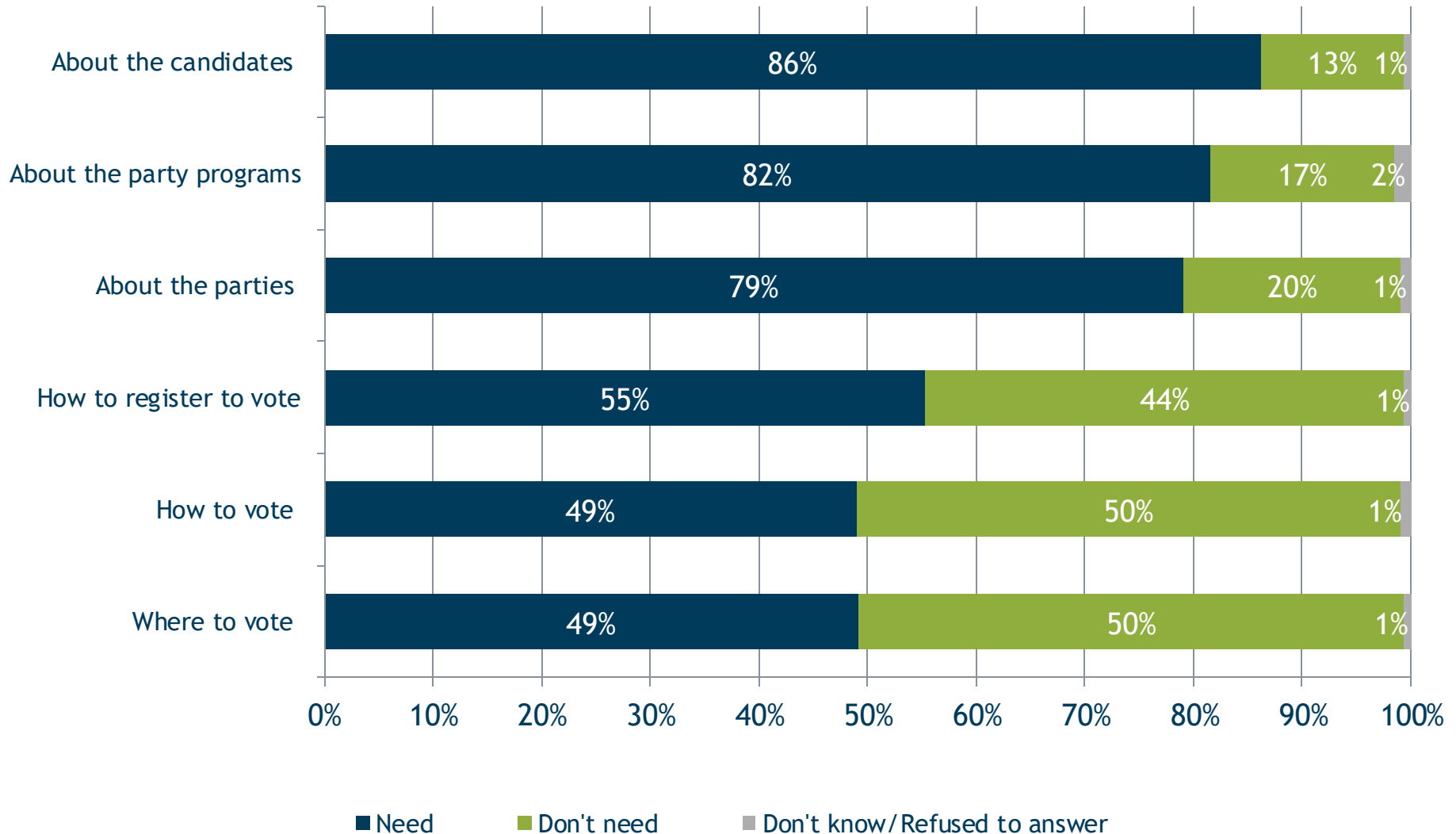

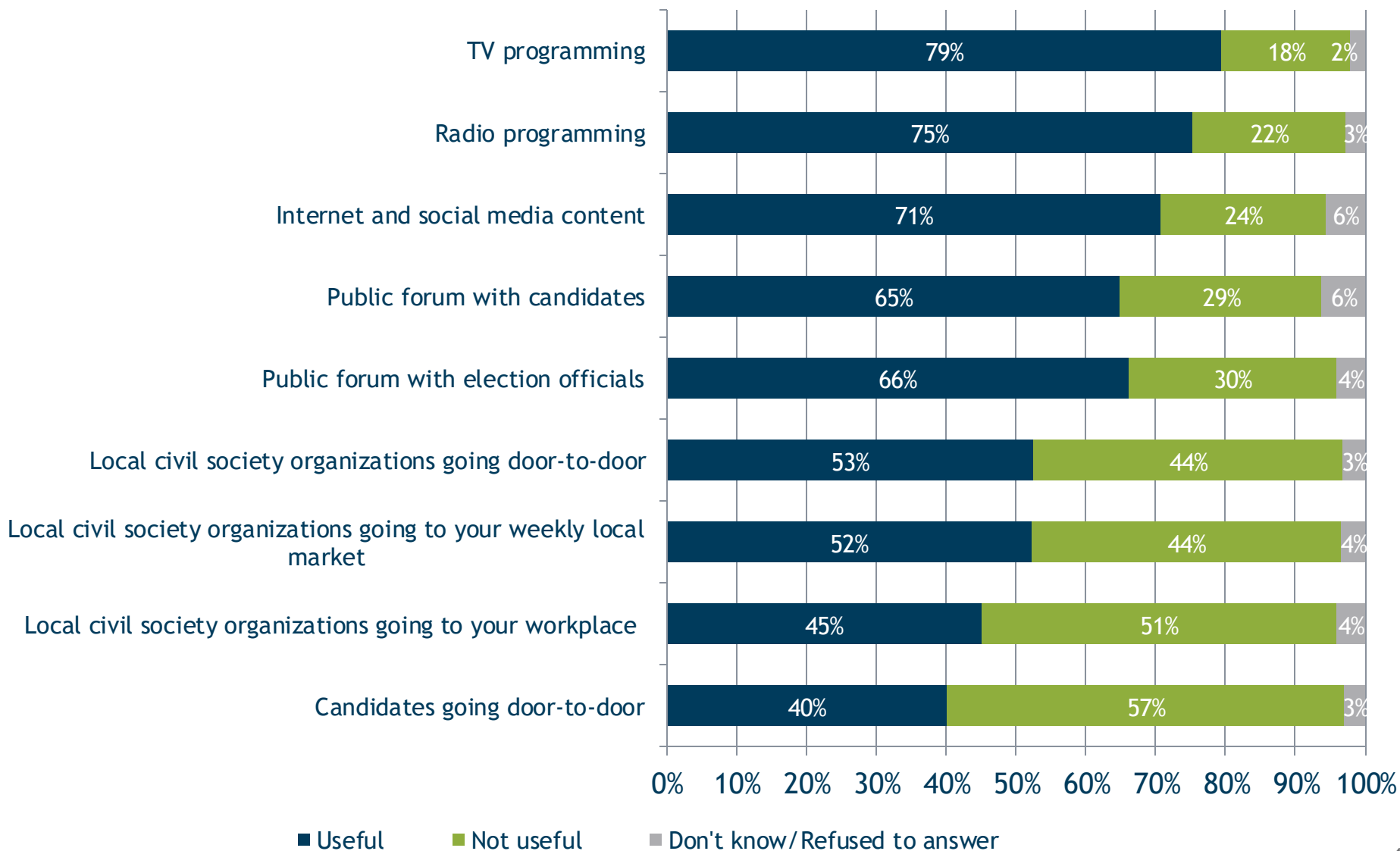
Thinking about the upcoming 2019 elections, would you say that you have enough information or need more information on how to vote? (Disaggregated by gender)

 (Respondents who *need some more information* or *need much more information* on how to vote: n=1,472)

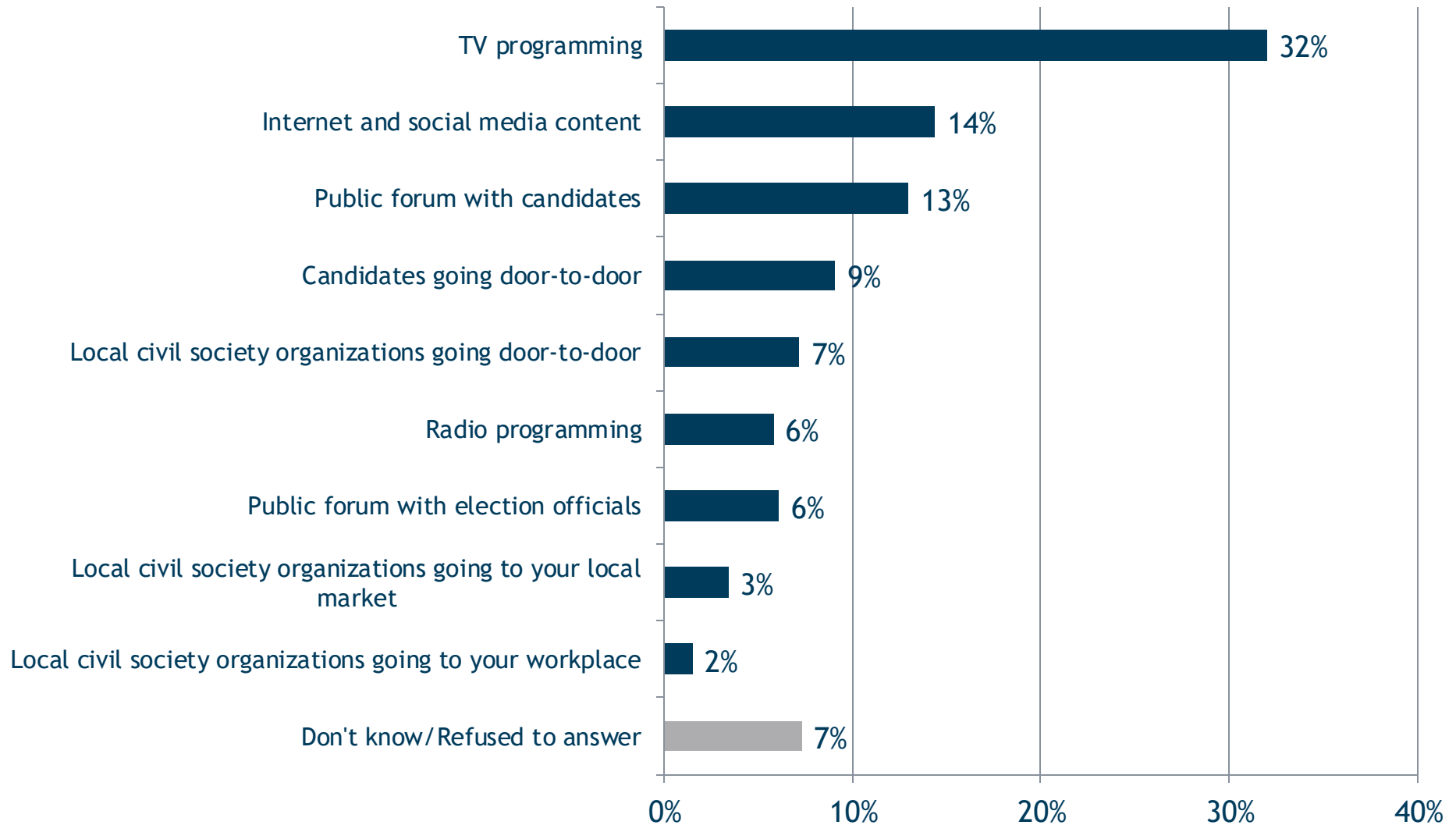


In which formats would you like additional information? For each format, please tell me if it would be useful for you for not.

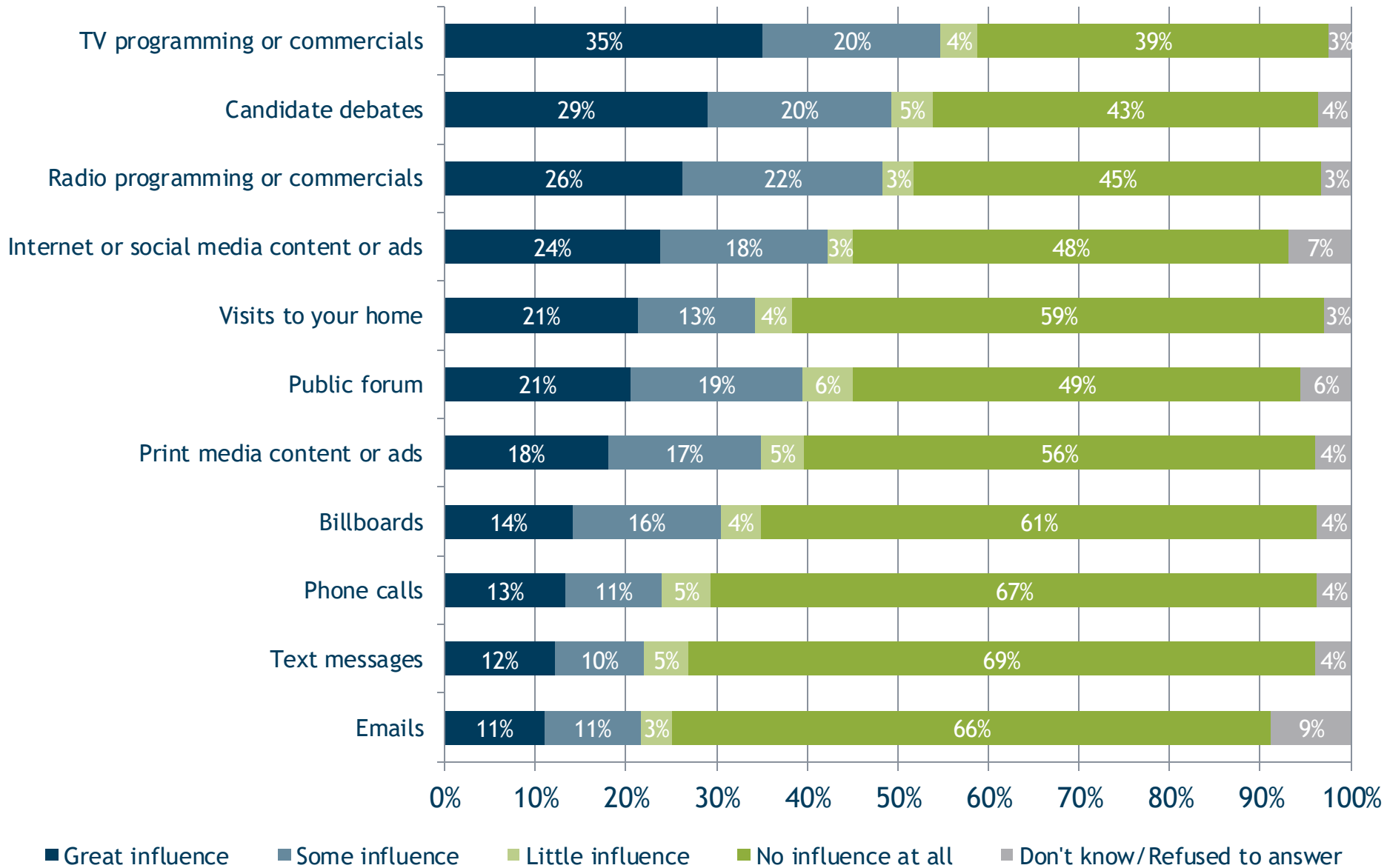


And which of these would be the most useful, if you had to choose just one?

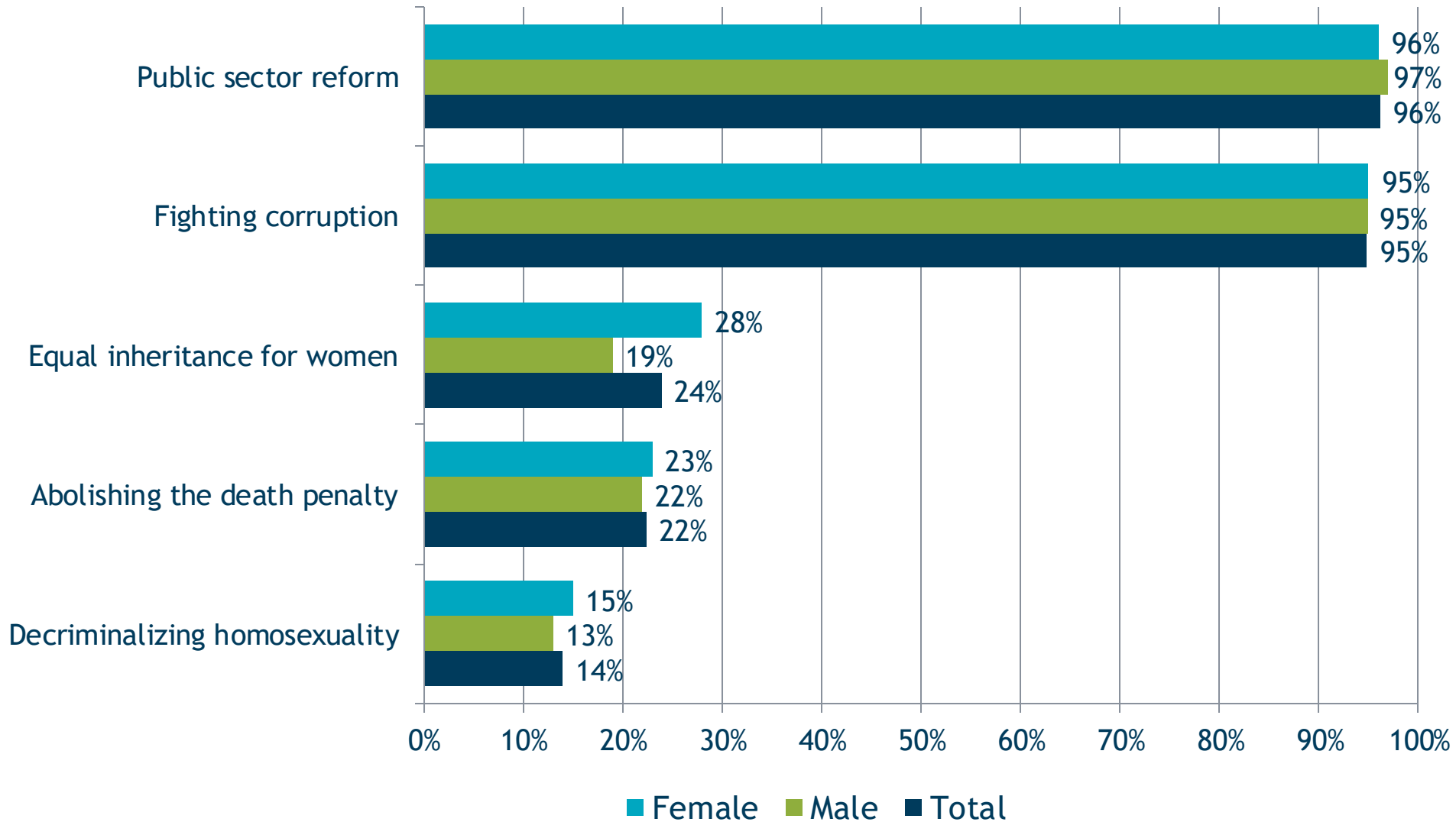

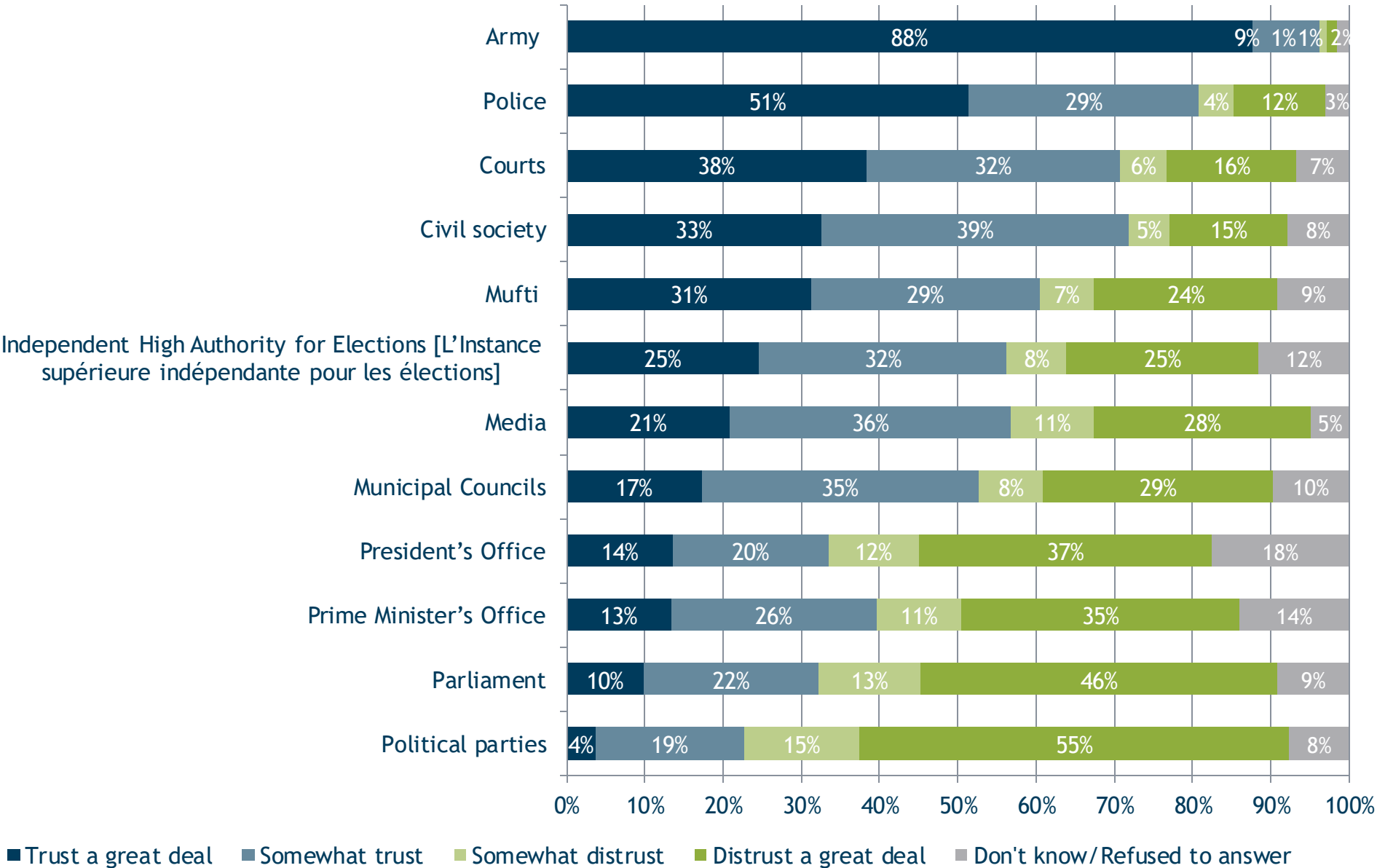
In general, what is the influence of each of these forms of election campaigning on you?

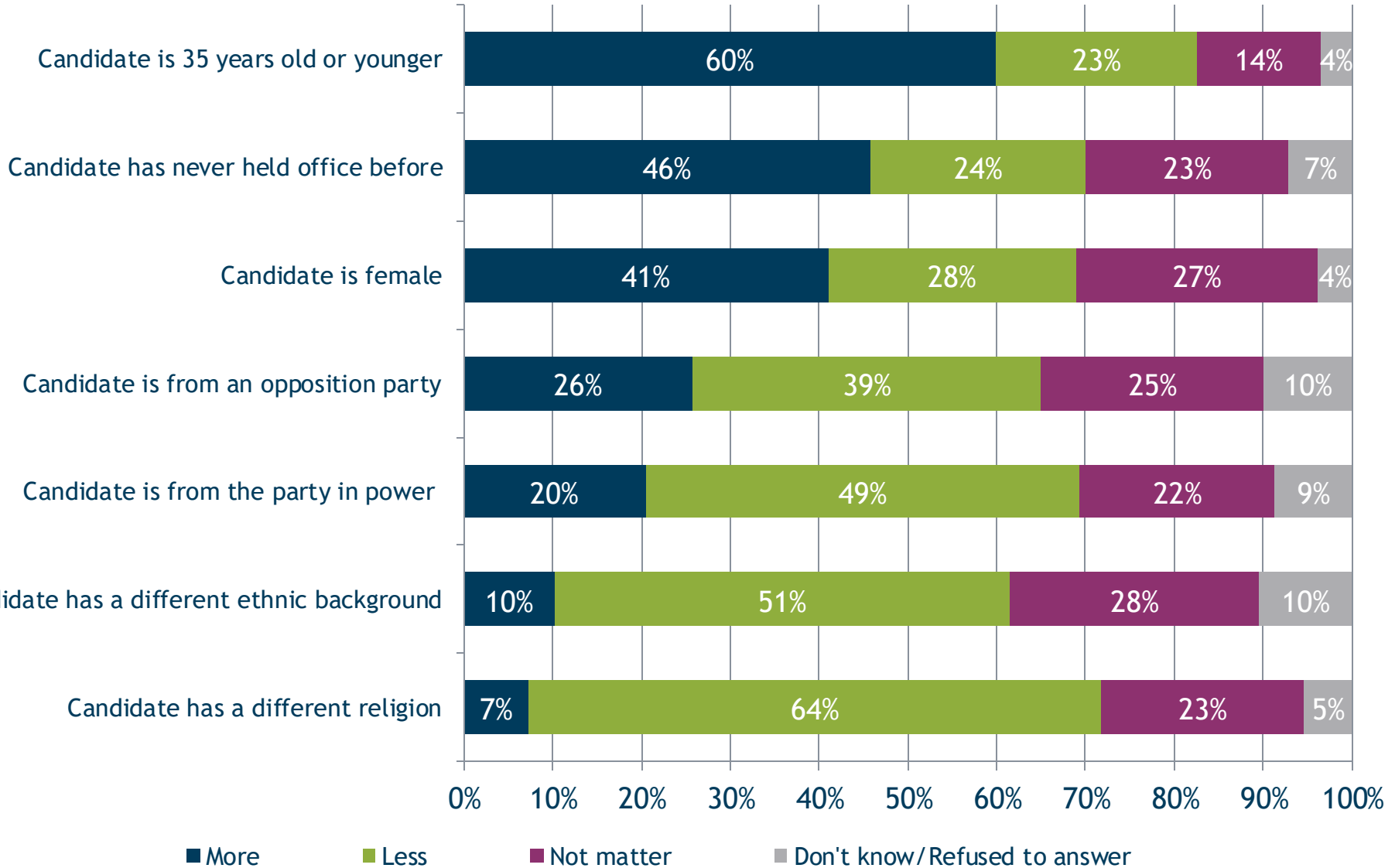




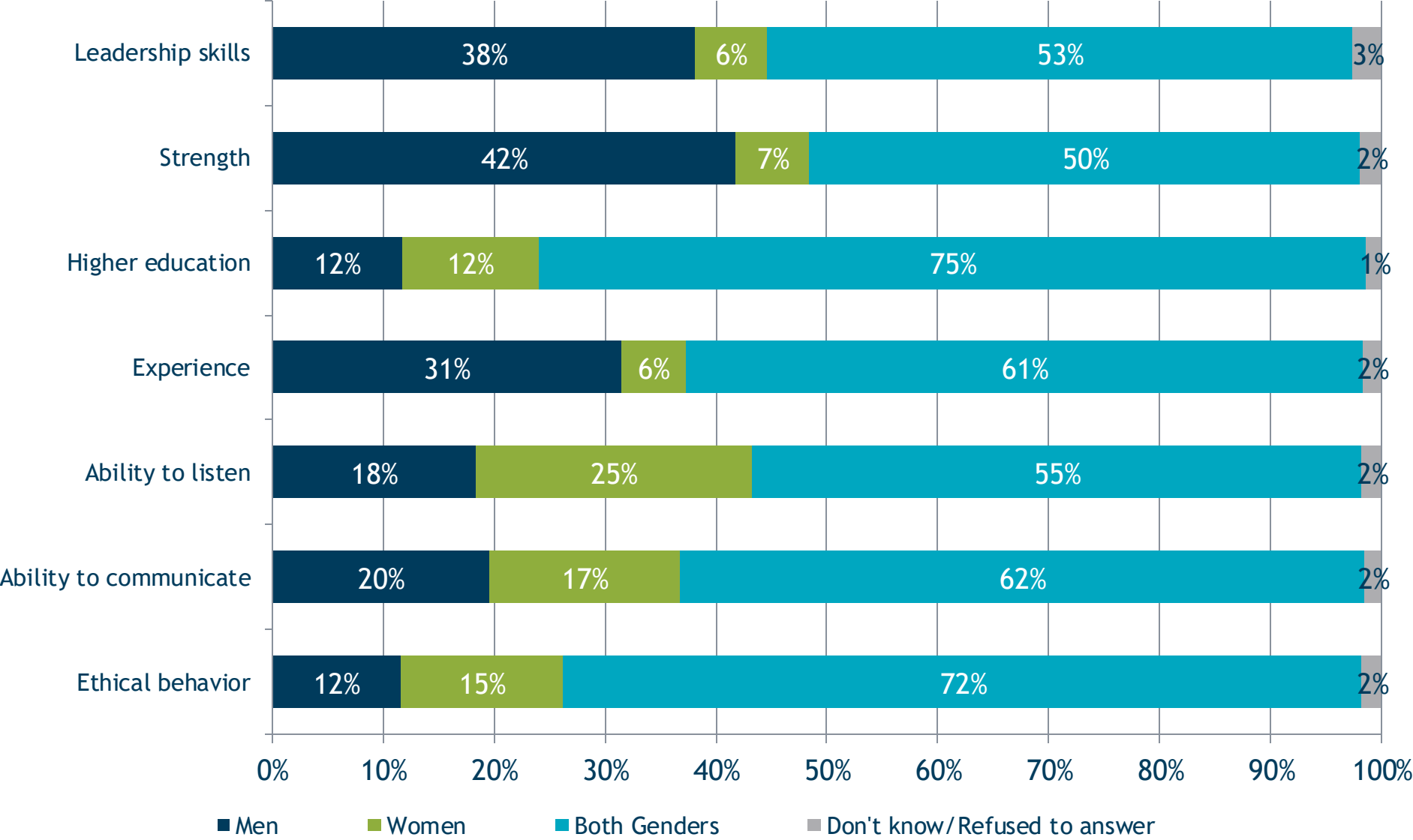

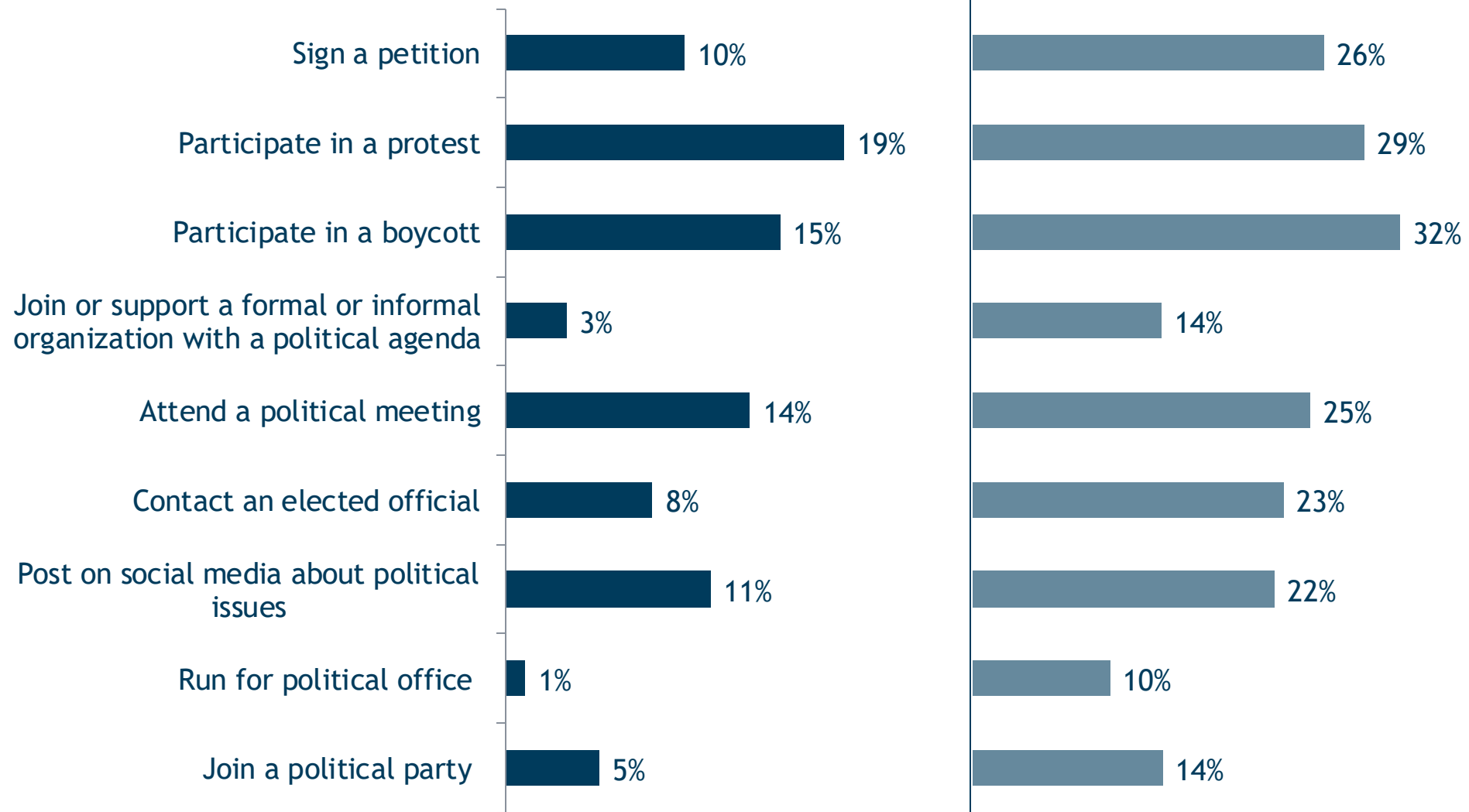

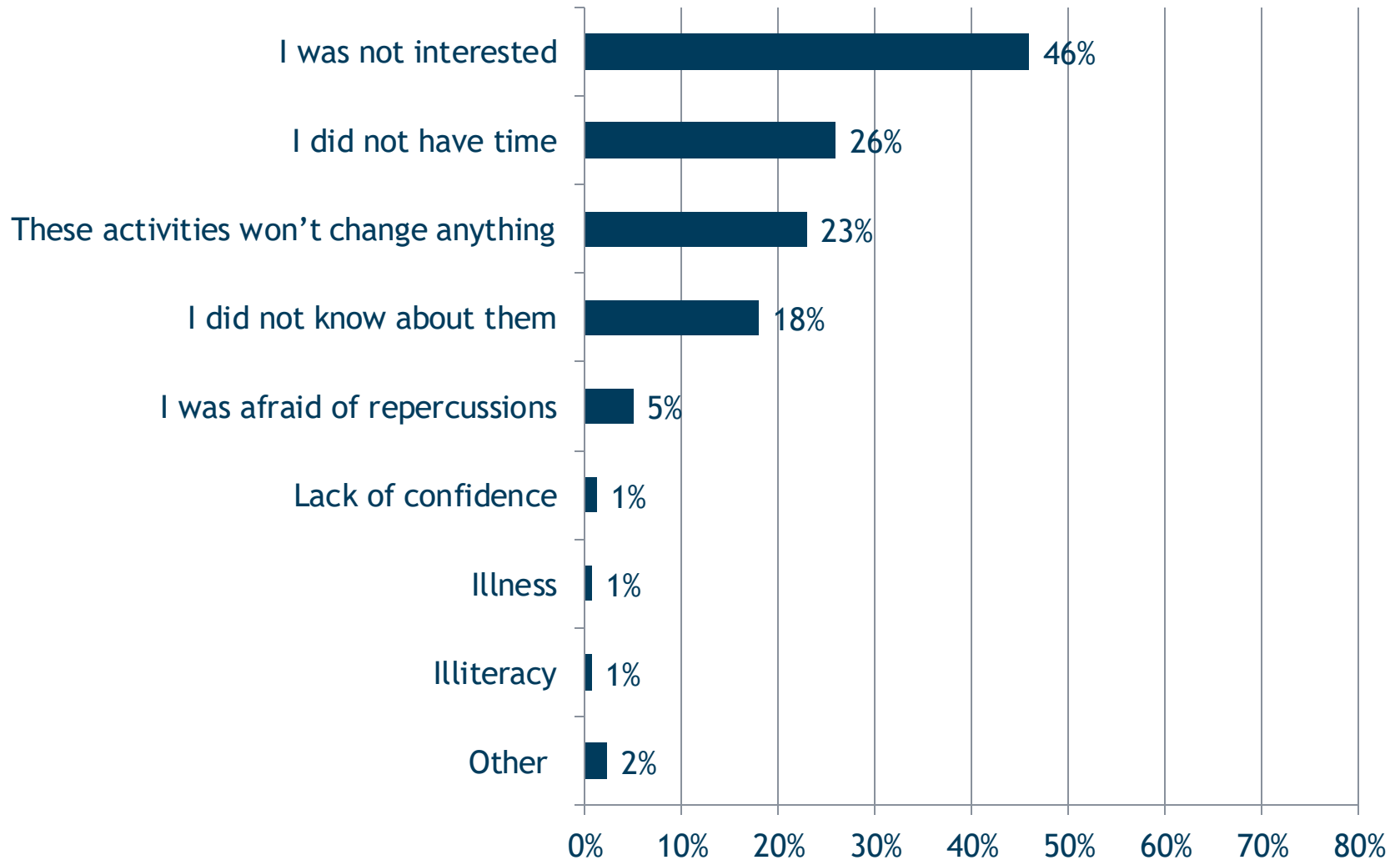

Are you interested in engaging in any of the following activities within the next several years?

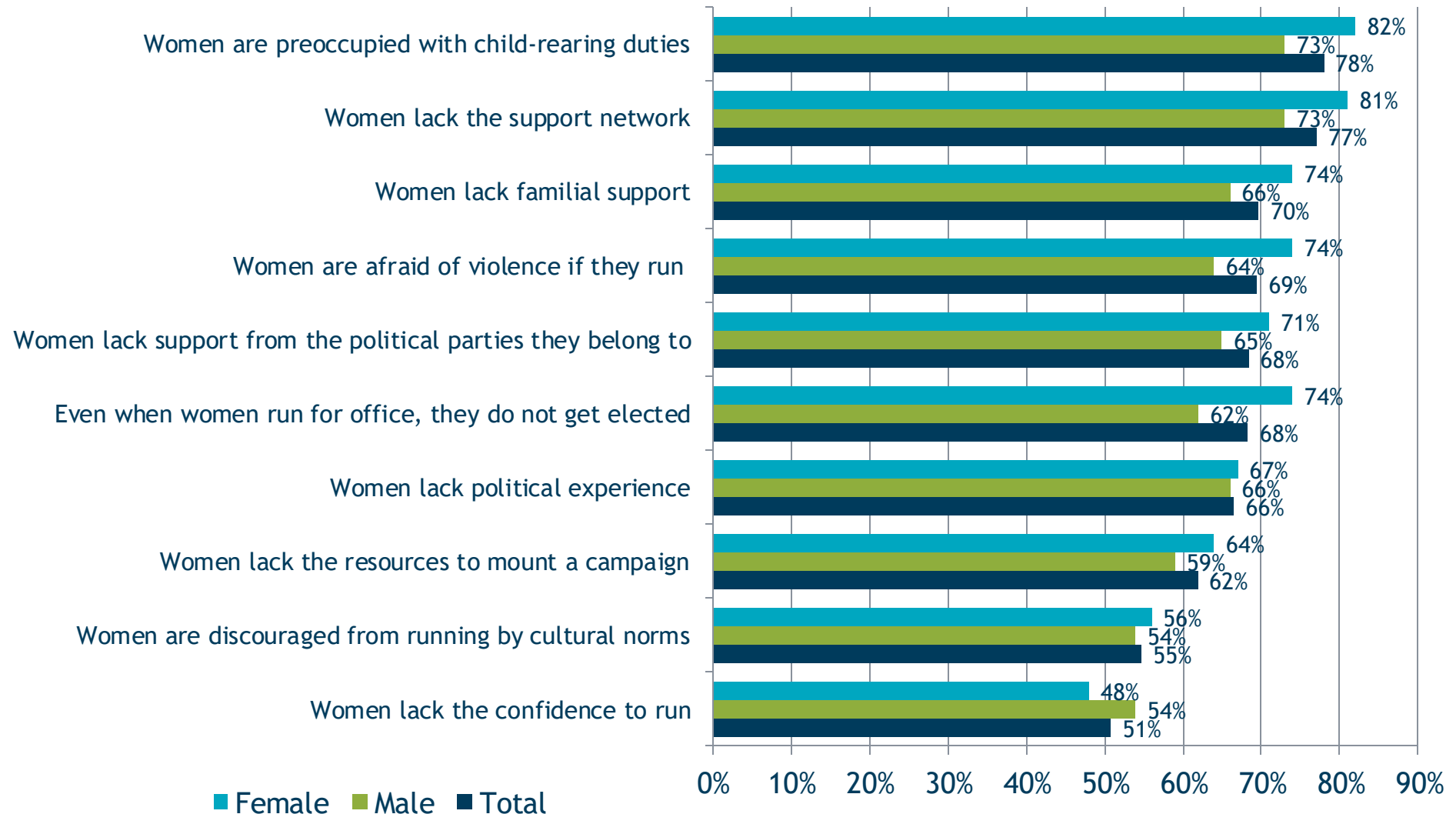


Why have you never engaged in any of these activities? (Respondents who have never engaged in an activity: n=1,637)

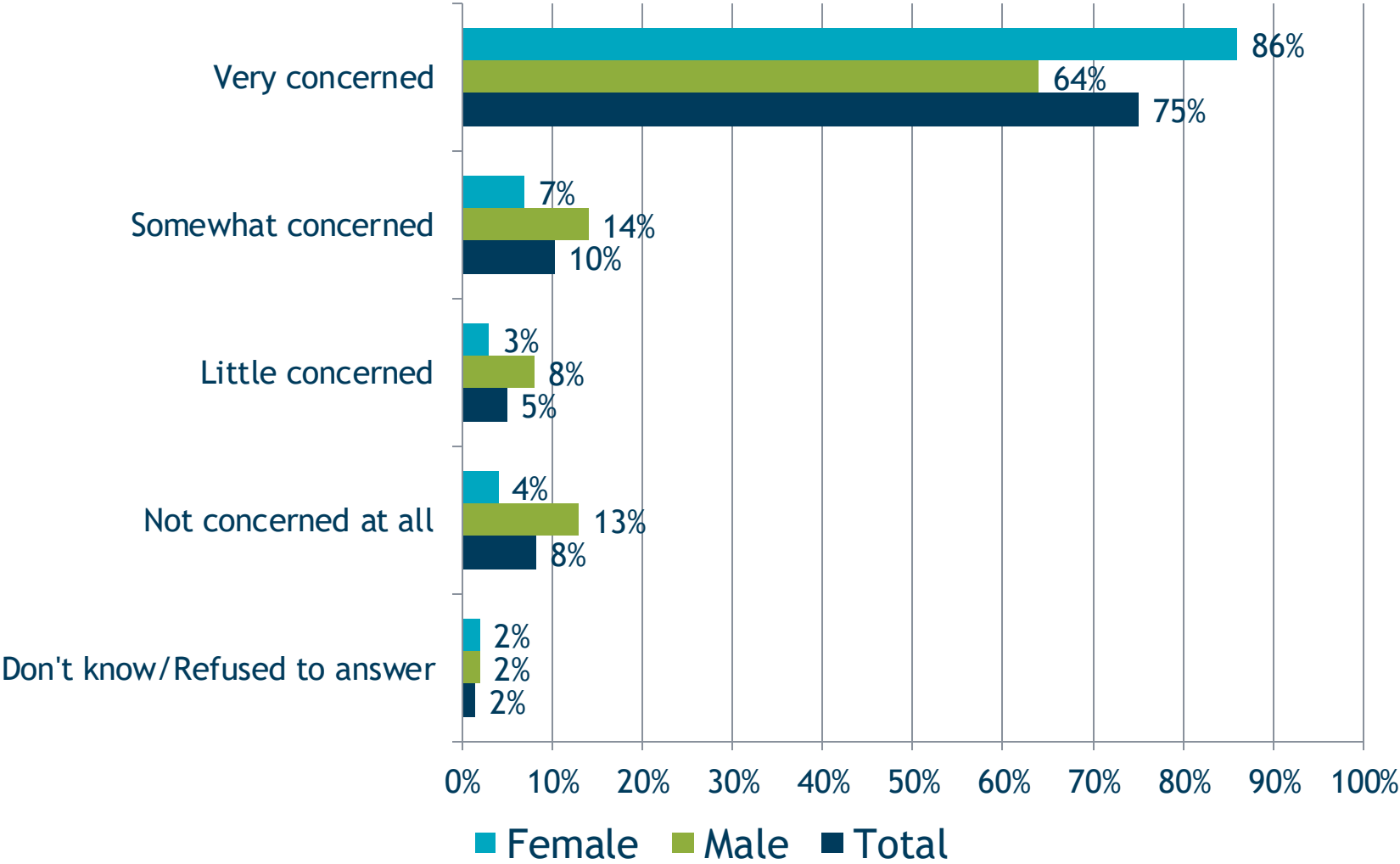


Why are there not more women politically engaged in our country? For each potential reason I read you, please tell me if it plays a major role or not.

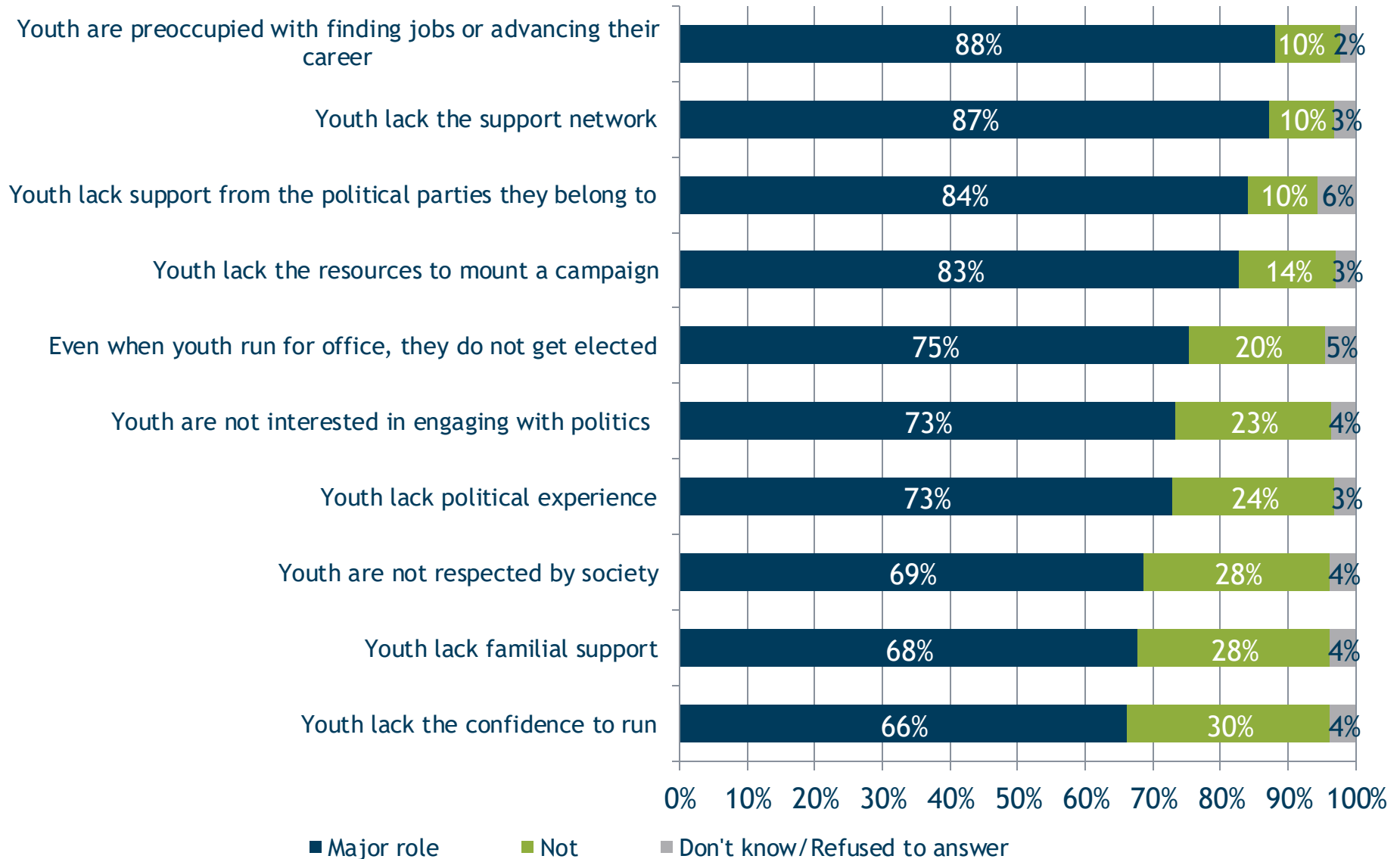

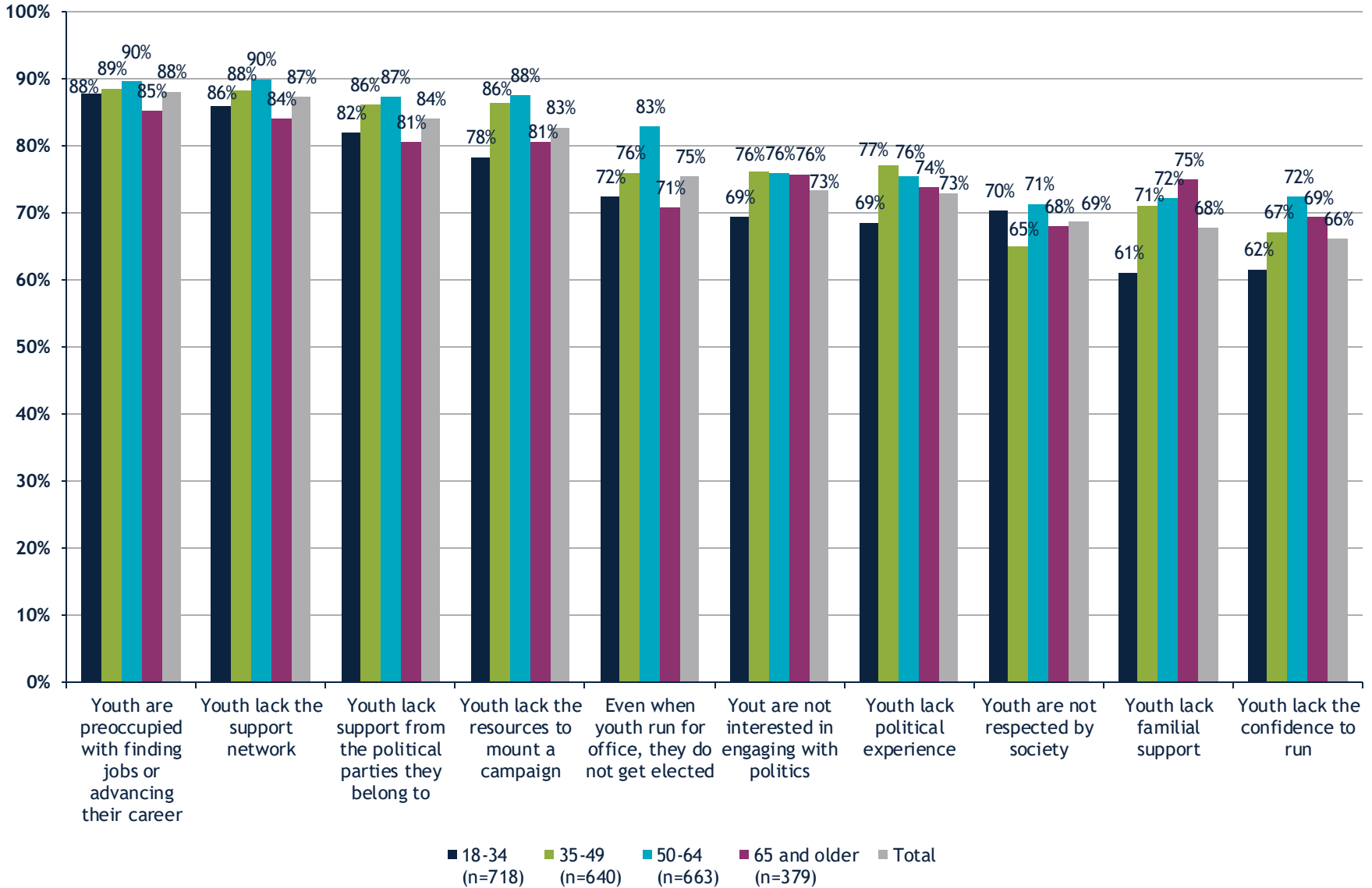
How concerned, if at all, are you about violence against women? (Disaggregated by gender)



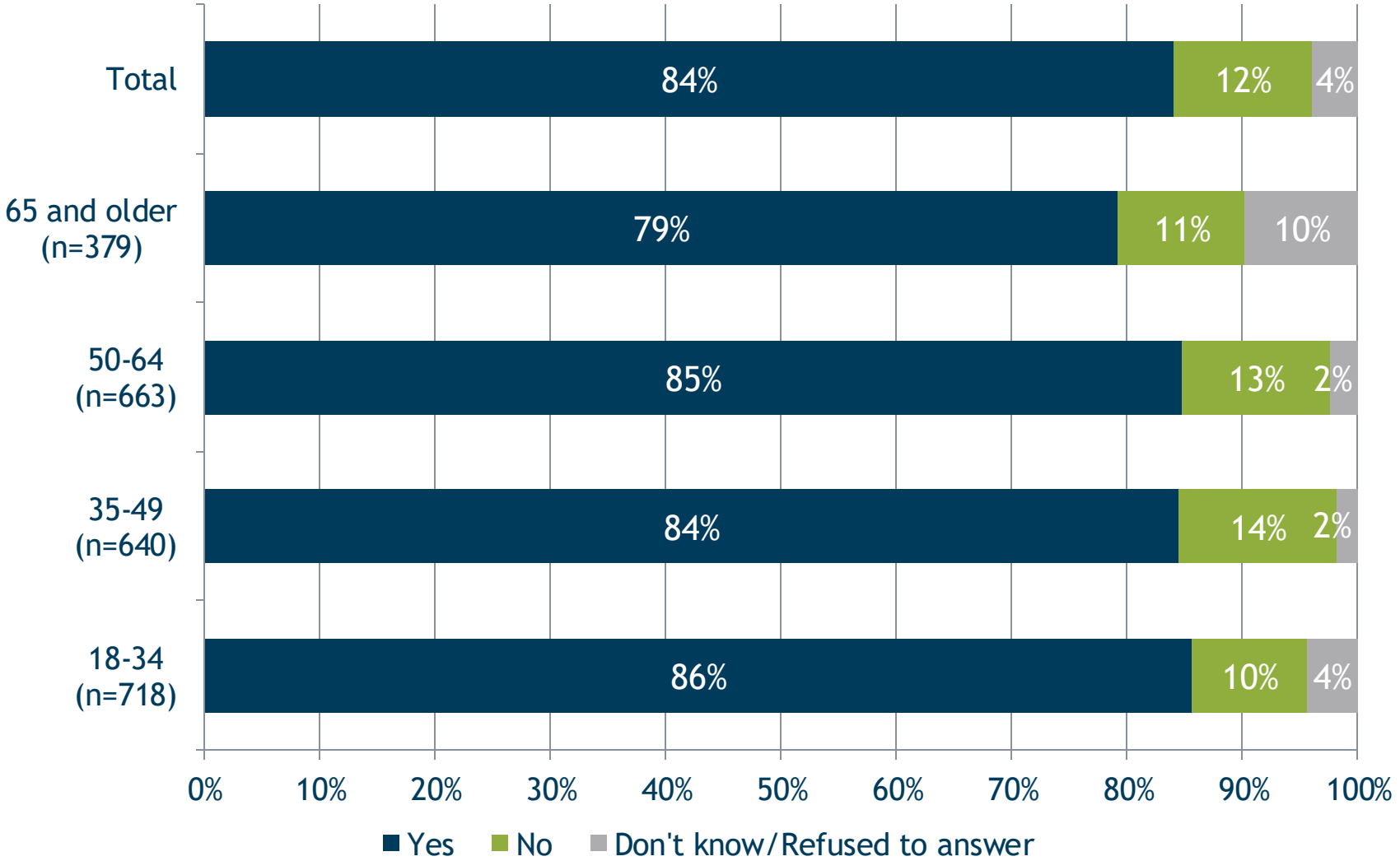
Why are there not more youth aged 35 and younger politically engaged in our country? For each potential reason I read you, please tell me if it plays a major role or not.



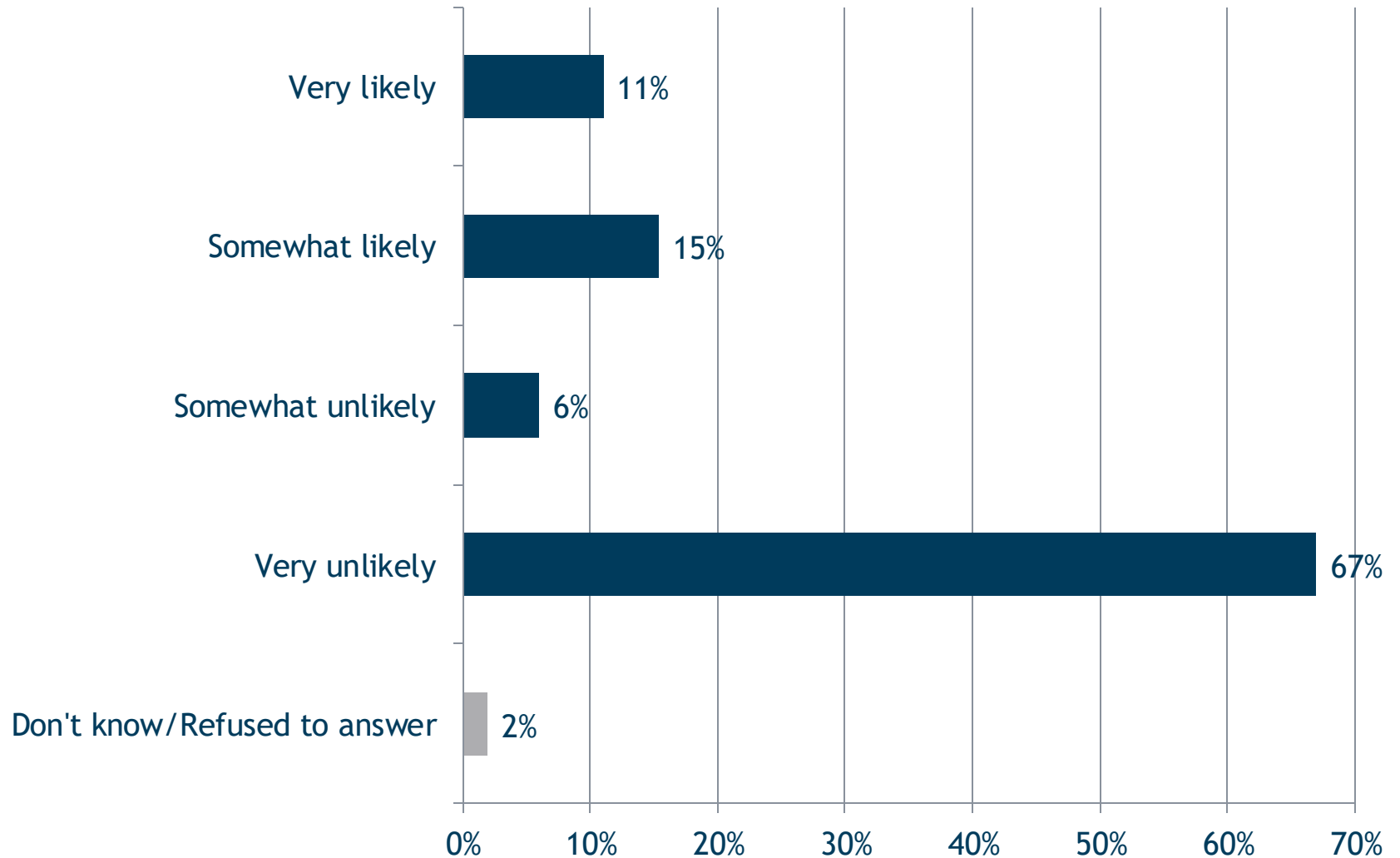

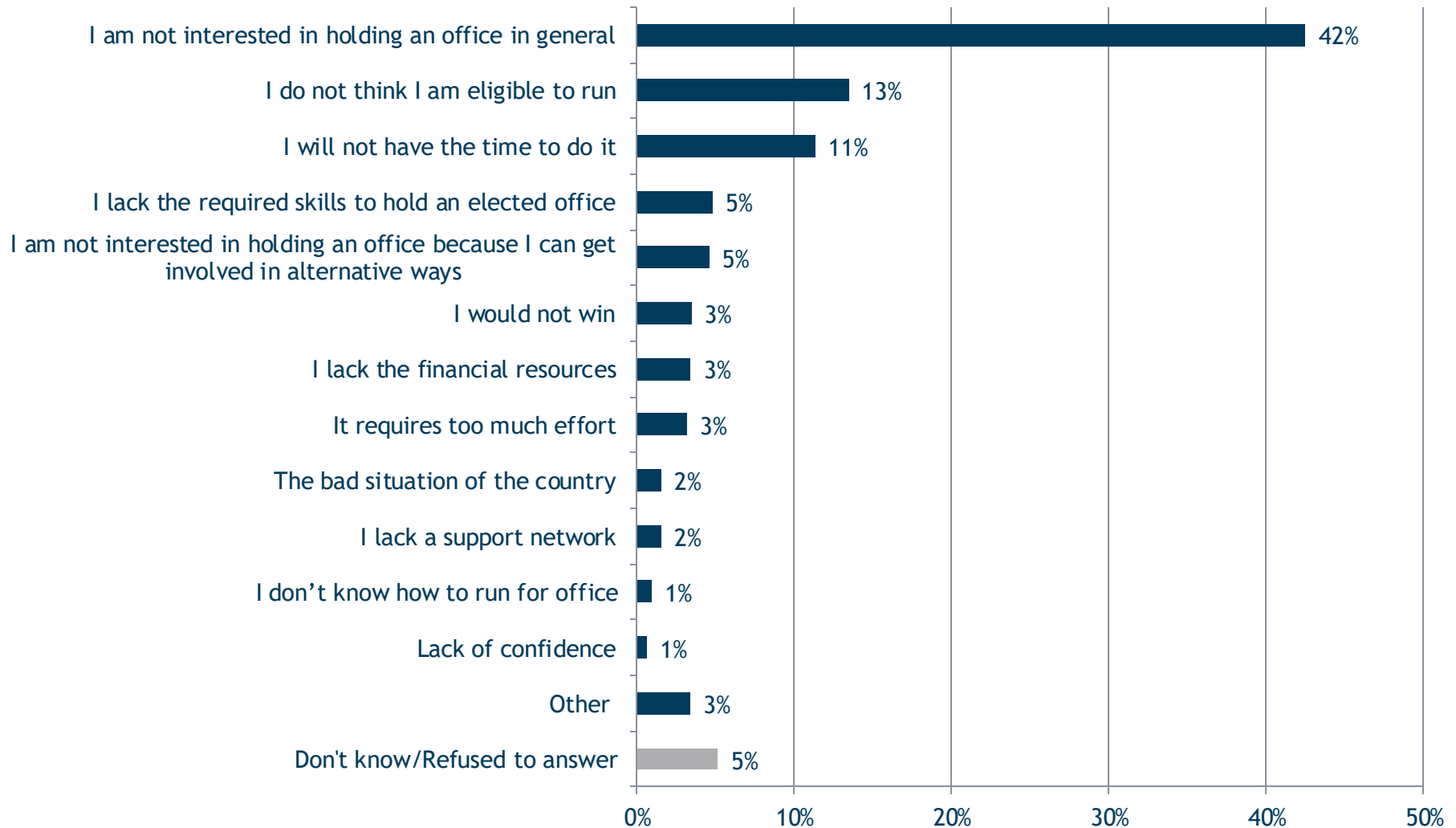
In your opinion, should there be more youth in Tunisian politics? (Disaggregated by age)



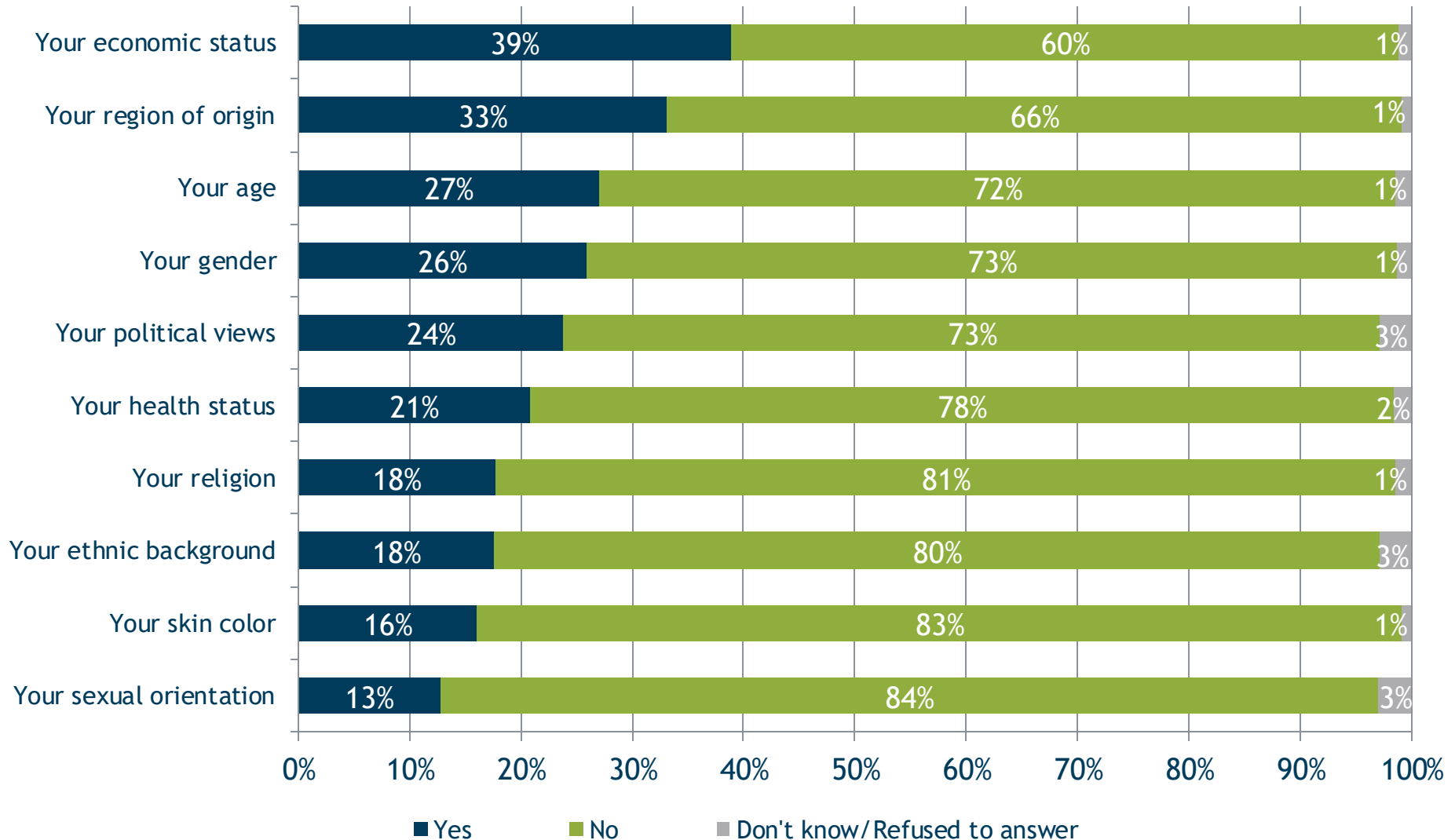
How likely, if at all, are you to run for political office by the age of 35? (Respondents under the age of 35: n=716)

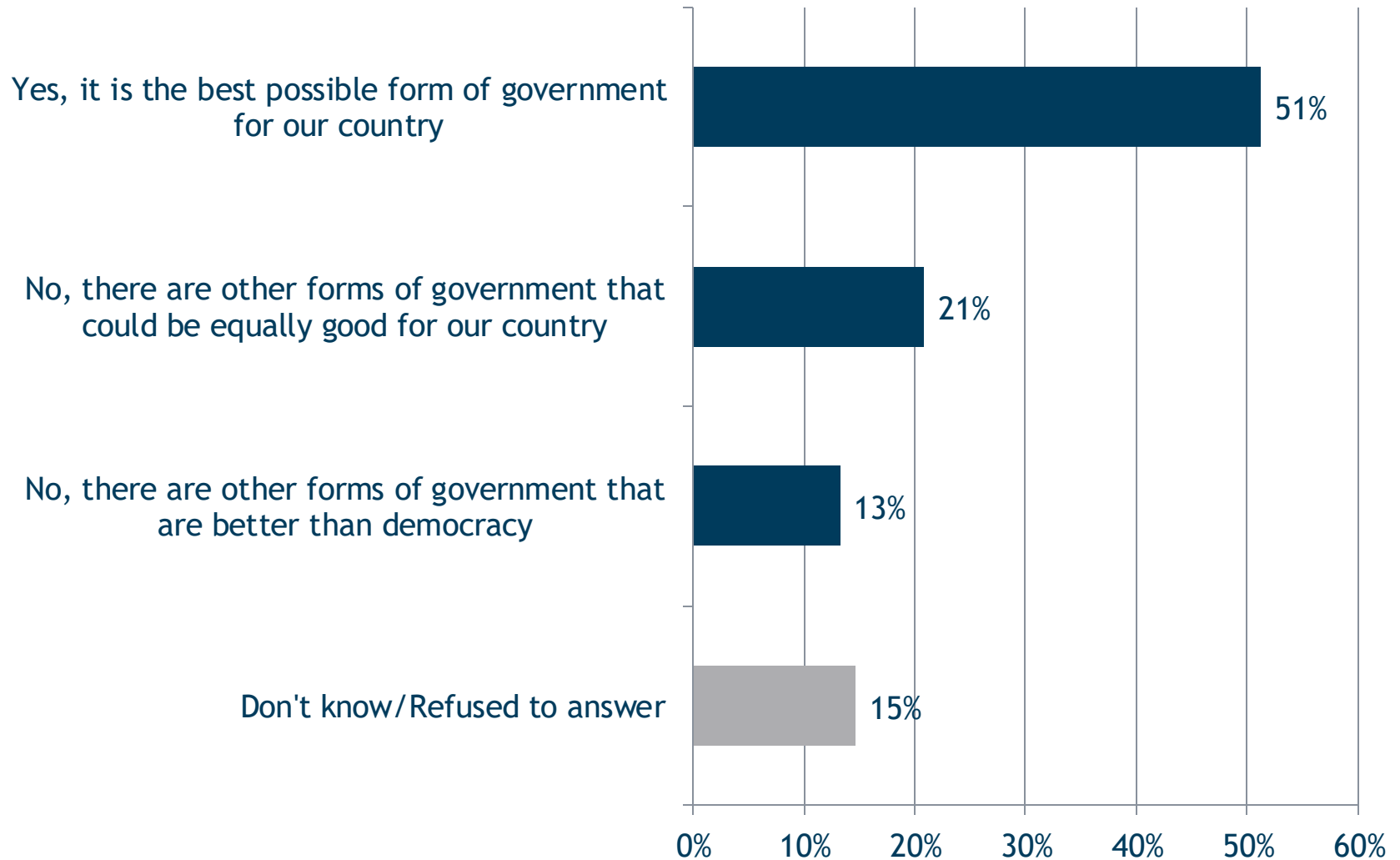

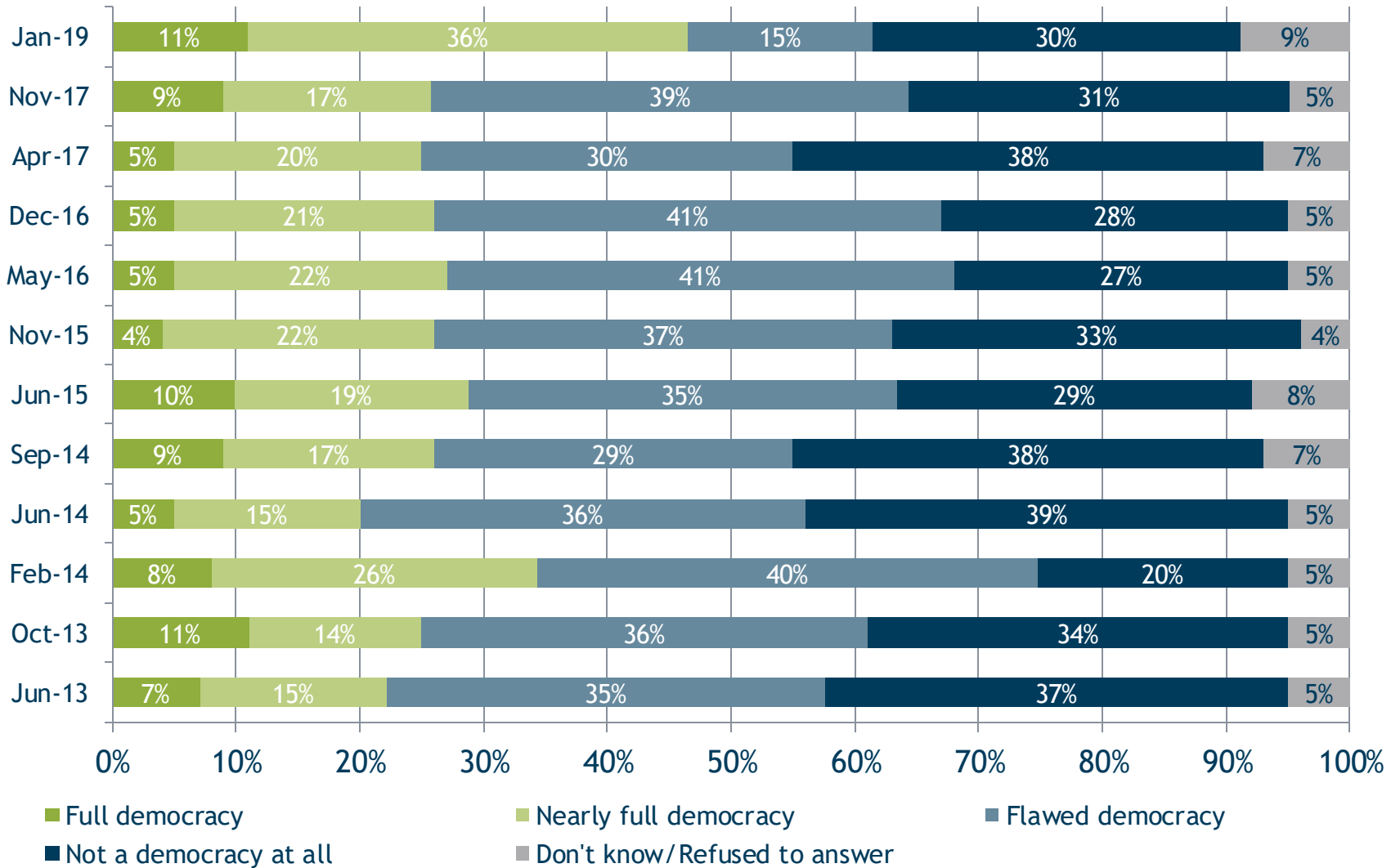

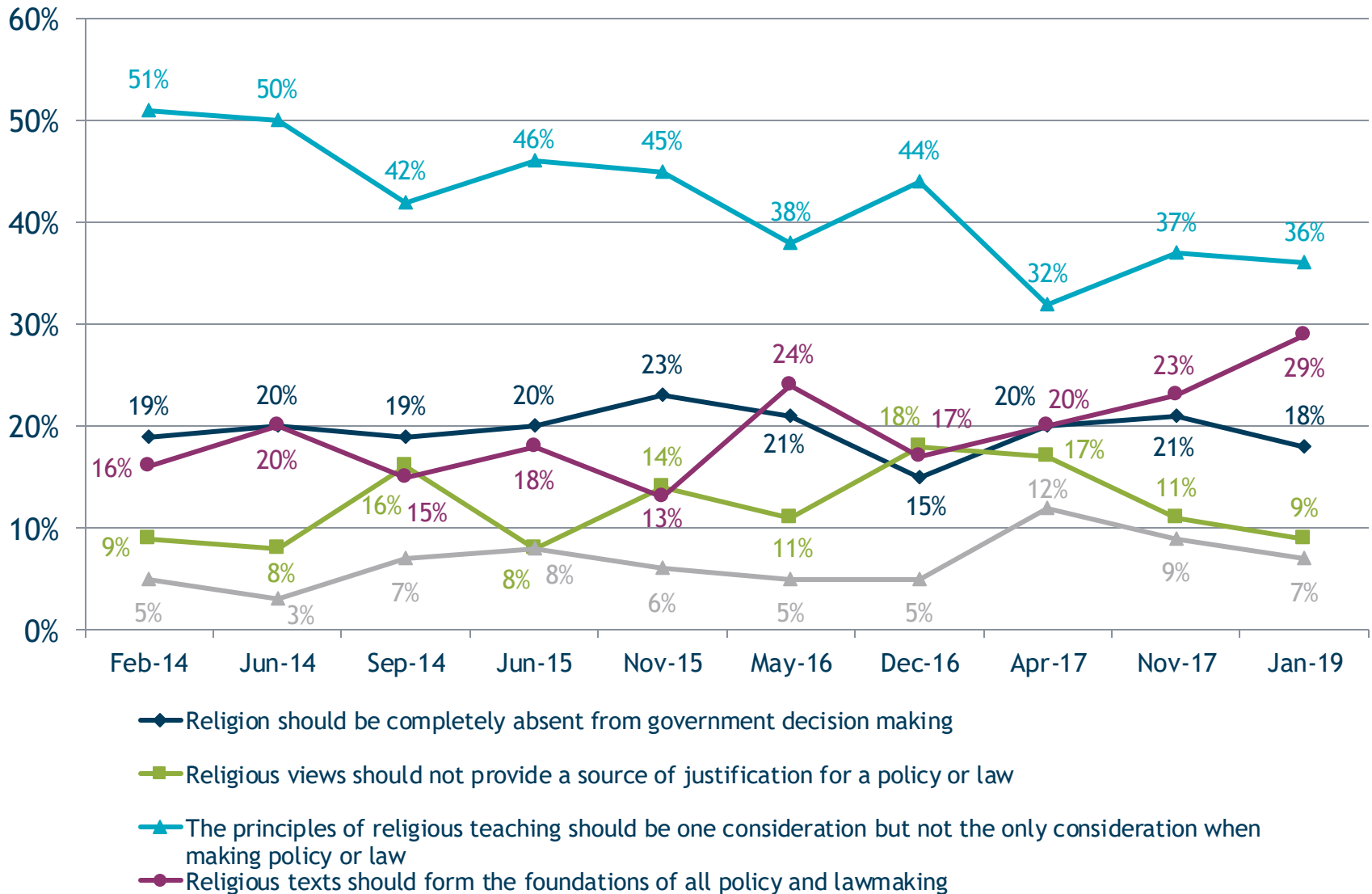
Do you believe that democracy is the best possible form of government for our country or not?

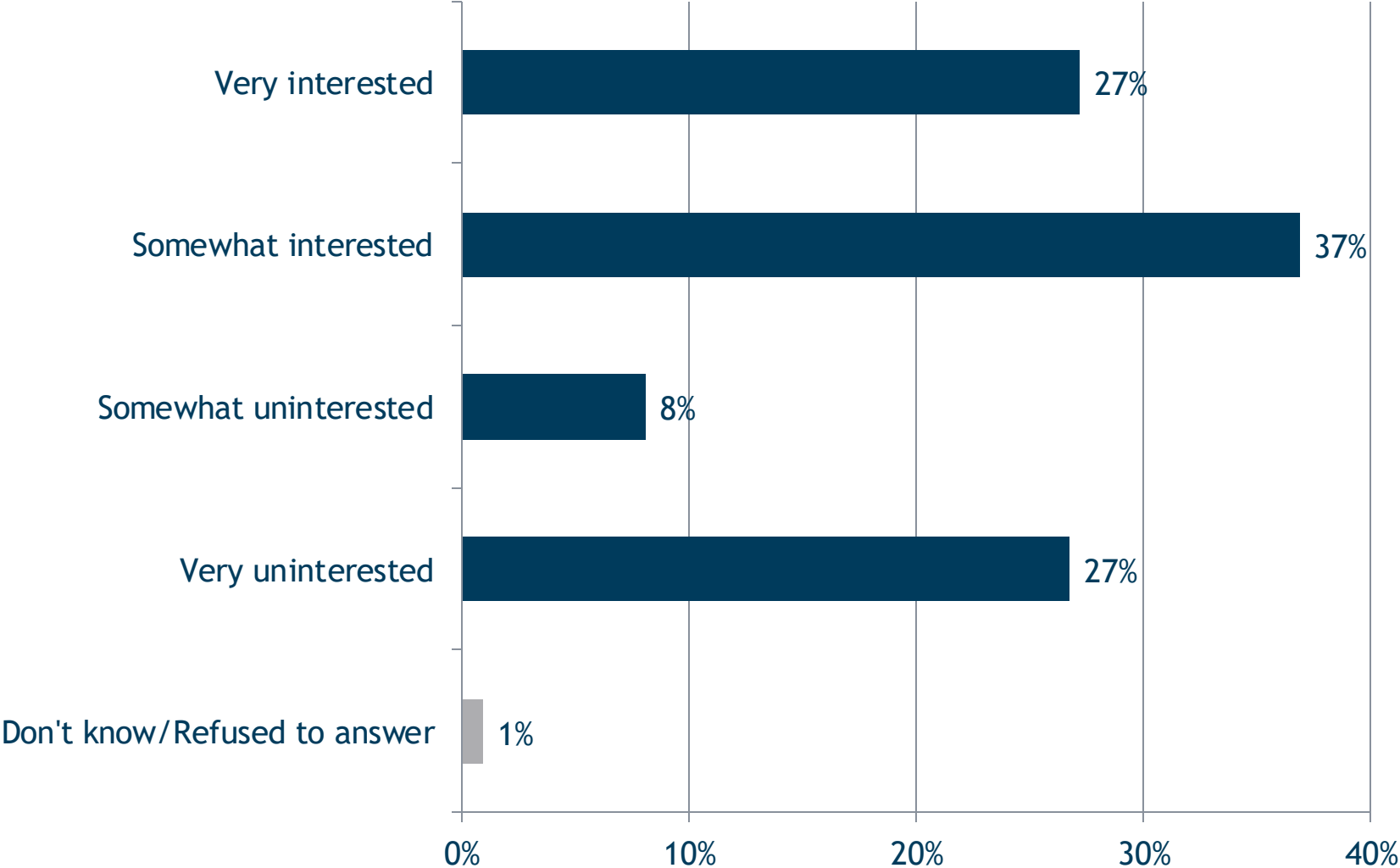

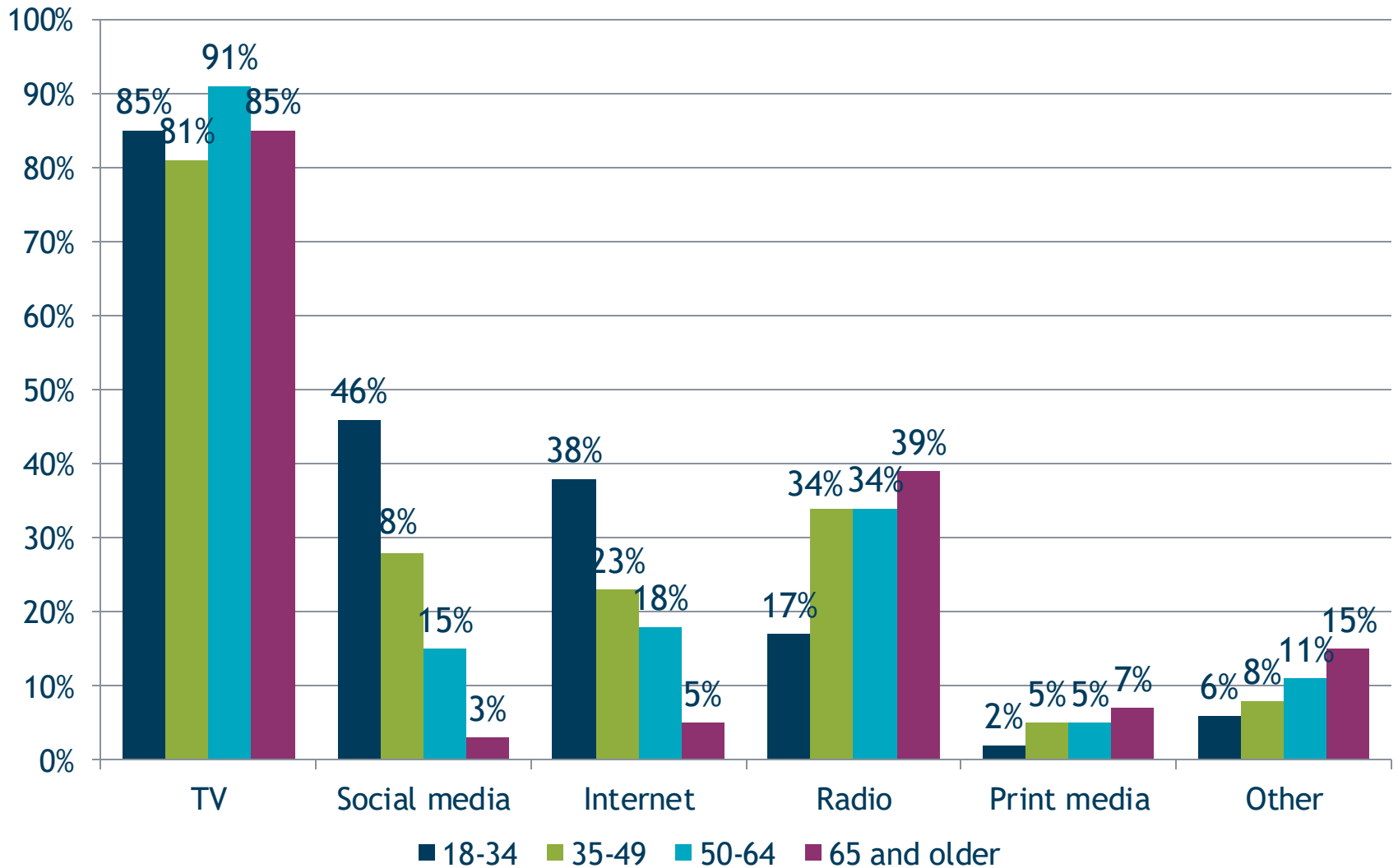
How interested or uninterested are you in political news and information?

What is your most frequently used media platform? (First and second mention combined; disaggregated by age)



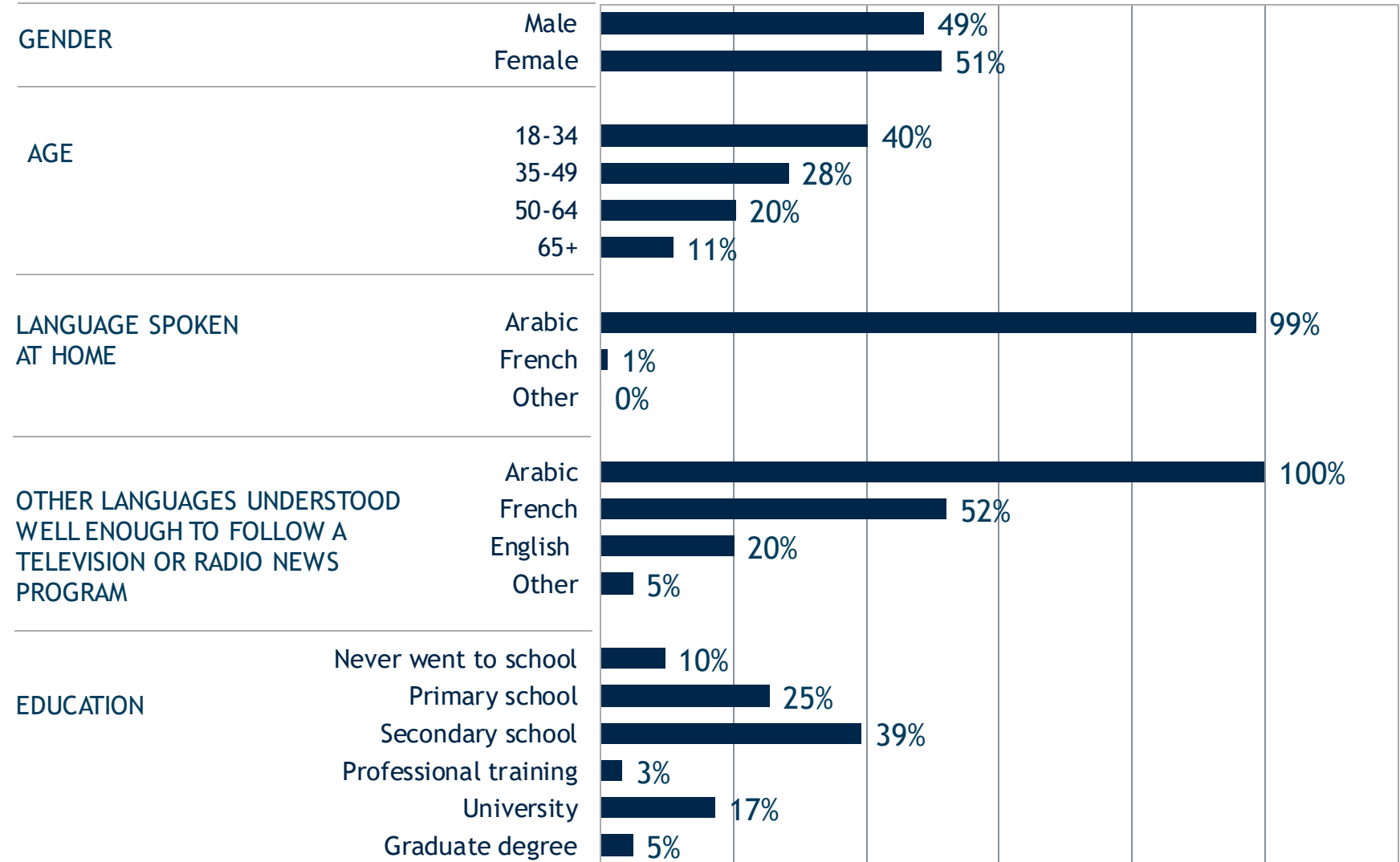

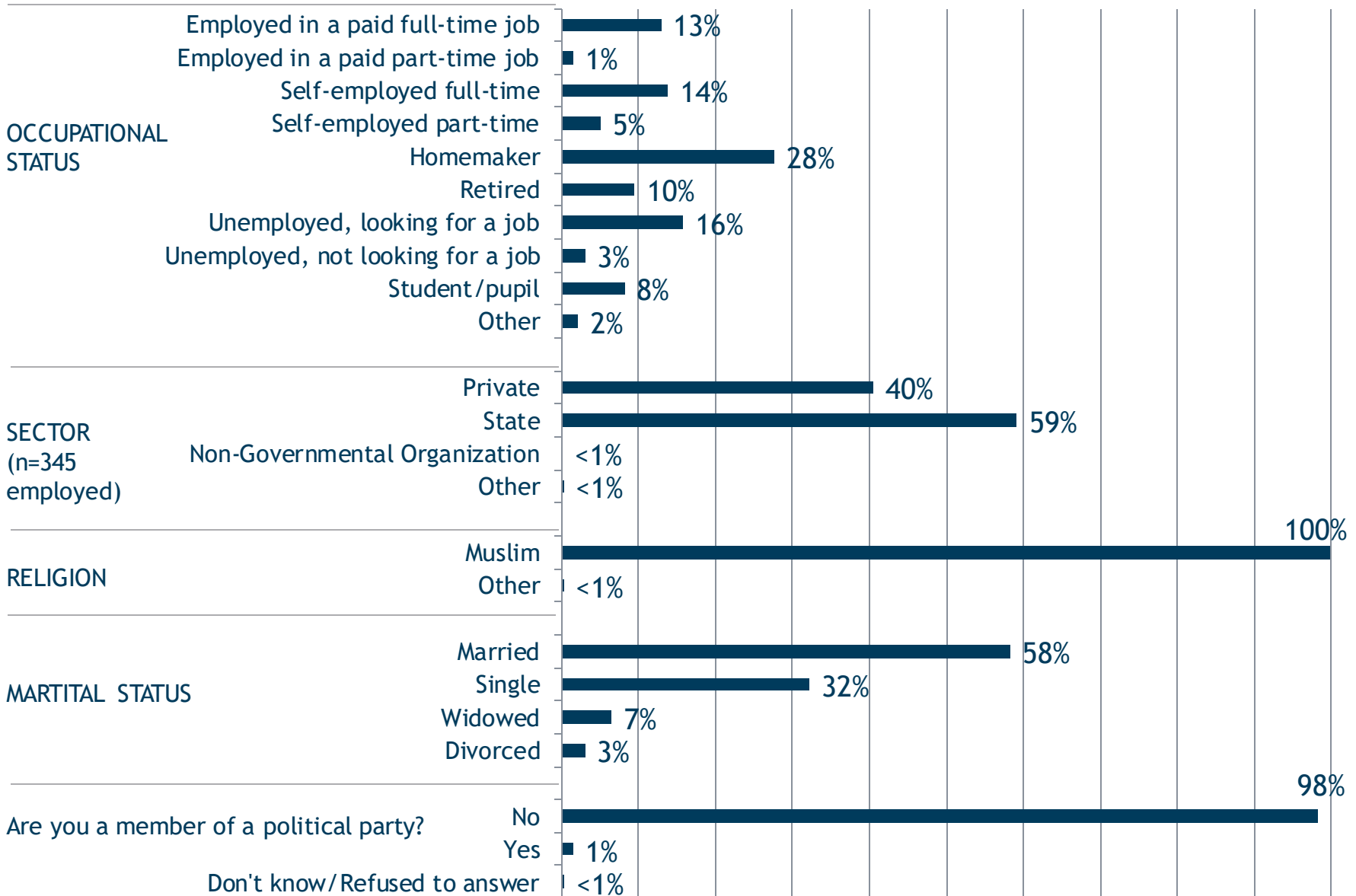

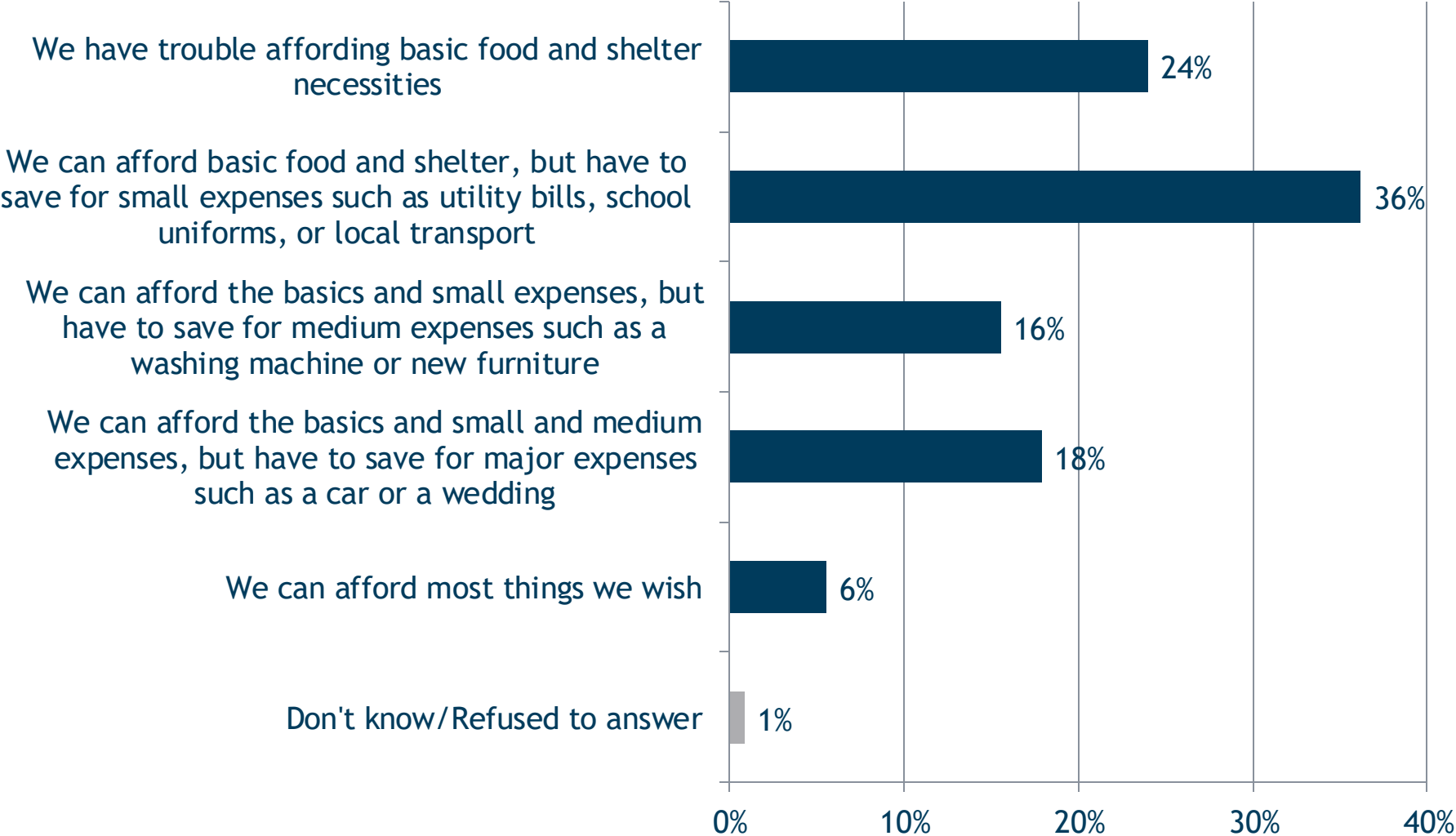

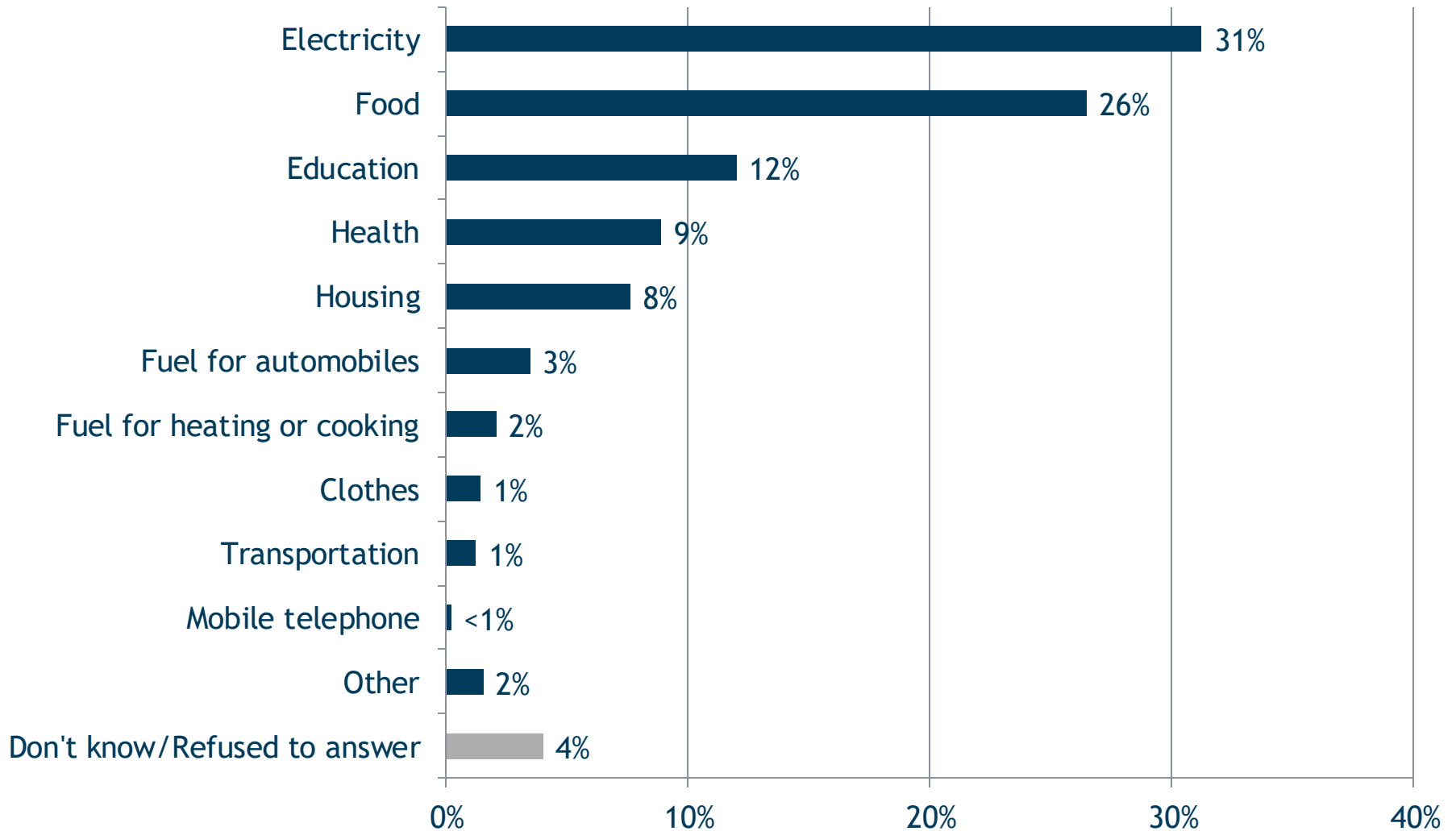
