
# Sixth Annual Ukrainian Municipal Survey

January 25- February 17, 2020



#### Geographical Key



Due to the Russian occupation of Crimea and ongoing war in the East of Ukraine, the cities Simferopol, Donetsk, and Luhansk were not included in the survey. Instead, Mariupol and Sievierodonetsk were surveyed. As a result of legislation passed in 2016 changing Soviet-era names of cities, the names of Dnipropetrovsk and Kirovograd have been changed to Dnipro and Kropyvnytskyi, respectively.


# The Sixth In-Depth Look at Ukrainian Local Governance

- This annual survey provides an extensive look at citizen attitudes about local governance and municipal services.
- Polling was conducted in the 24 regional capitals of Ukraine not under the control of Russian or Russian-backed forces, including Mariupol and Sievierodonetsk in the Donbas region. The survey is based on a sample size of 19,200 respondents.



#### Methodology

- The survey was conducted by <u>Sociological Group "Rating" (Rating Group Ukraine)</u> on behalf of the <u>International Republican Institute</u>'s <u>Center for Insights in Survey Research</u>.
- The data was collected in 24 cities in Ukraine (Kyiv and all oblast centers; in Donetsk oblast, in the city of Mariupol and in Luhansk oblast the city of Sievierodonetsk) between January 25 and February 17, 2020 through face-to-face interviews at the respondents' homes.
- The sample consists of n=19,200 permanent residents of Ukraine aged 18 and older across 24 cities and is representative of the general population by age and gender.
- In order to obtain this representative sample, 800 respondents were interviewed in each city regardless of population size. The geographical coverage of the city area was based on the electoral districts established by the Central Election Commission of Ukraine. Random route and "birthday" rule were used to select respondents. The survey data obtained in each city was weighted by gender and age using national statistical data.
- IRI's first municipal survey was conducted in 22 cities from March 2 to March 20, 2015. The sample included 17,600 respondents. Since 2016 the survey has been conducted in 24 cities and surveyed 19,200 respondents. The second wave of the municipal survey was conducted from January 20 to February 8, 2016. The third wave was conducted from January 20 to February 12, 2017. The fourth wave was conducted from January 20 to February 10, 2018. The fifth wave was conducted from September 7 to October 10, 2019.
- The margin of error for each city does not exceed ±3.5 points.
- Average response rate is 63.9 percent.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.
- The survey was funded by the <u>U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID)</u>. The previous surveys were funded by the <u>Government of Canada</u> and the <u>National Endowment for Democracy</u>.




#### Generally speaking, do you think that things in Ukraine are going in the right direction or wrong direction?





Percent of respondents who believe things are going in the right direction







Percent of respondents who believe things are going in the right direction




### Over the last 12 months, how has the economic situation in Ukraine changed?







### Over last 12 months, how has the economic situation of your household changed?







#### In the next 12 months, how do you expect the economic situation in Ukraine to change?
































































































### Approval of Mayor and Direction of the City's Development


















### If Ukraine could only enter one international economic union, which of the following should it be?










### How do you evaluate your attitude toward each of the following countries? Canada
