
# Seventh Annual Ukrainian Municipal Survey

12 May - 3 June, 2021



## Geographical Key



Due to Russian occupation of Crimea and ongoing conflict in the East of Ukraine, citizens of Simferopol, Donetsk, and Luhansk did not participate in the survey. Instead, Mariupol and Sievierodonetsk were included in the survey to represent Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts. As a result of legislation passed in 2016 changing Soviet-era names of cities, the names of Dnipropetrovsk and Kirovograd have been changed to Dnipro and Kropyvnytskyi, respectively.


# The Seventh In-Depth Look at Ukrainian Local Governance

- This annual survey provides an extensive look at citizen attitudes about local governance and municipal services.
- Polling was conducted in the 24 regional capitals of Ukraine not under the control of Russian or Russian-backed forces, including Mariupol and Sievierodonetsk in the Donbas region. The survey is based on a sample size of 19,196 respondents.



## Methodology


- The survey was conducted by <u>Sociological Group "Rating" (Rating Group Ukraine)</u> on behalf of the <u>International Republican Institute's Center for Insights in Survey Research</u>.
- The data was collected in 24 cities in Ukraine (Kyiv and all oblast centers; including Mariupol in Donetsk oblast and Sievierodonetsk in Luhansk oblast) between May 12 and June 3, 2021 through face-to-face interviews at the respondents' homes.
- The sample consisted of n=19,196 permanent residents of Ukraine aged 18 and older.
- In order to obtain this representative sample, 800 respondents were interviewed in each city regardless of population size. The geographical coverage of the city area was based on the electoral districts established by the Central Election Commission of Ukraine. Random route and "birthday" rule were used to select respondents. The survey data obtained in each city was weighted by gender and age using national statistical data.
- IRI's first municipal survey was conducted in 22 cities on March 2-20, 2015. The sample included 17,600 respondents. The second wave of municipal survey was conducted in 24 cities on January 20-February 8, 2016 (19,200 respondents). The third wave was conducted in 24 cities on January 20-February 12, 2017 (19,200 respondents). The fourth wave was conducted in 24 cities on January 20-February 10, 2018 (19,200 respondents). The fifth wave was conducted in 24 cities on September 7 October 10, 2019 (19,200 respondents). The sixth wave was conducted in 24 cities on January 25 February 17, 2020 (19,200 respondents).
- The margin of error for each city does not exceed ±3.5 points.
- Average response rate is 65 percent.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.
- The 2015, 2016, 2017 surveys were funded by the Government of Canada. The 2018 survey was funded by the National Endowment for Democracy. The 2019, 2020 and 2021 surveys were funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).




















### Quality of Public Goods & Services Historic Index




#### How serious is the Coronavirus pandemic for you personally?






