

Methodology

- The survey was conducted by Sociological Group "Rating" on behalf of the <u>Center for Insights and Survey Research (CISR)</u> of the <u>International Republican</u> <u>Institute</u> (IRI).
- The survey was conducted throughout all of Ukraine (except for in the occupied territories of Crimea, Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts) between November 6 and November 15, 2021 through face-to-face interviews at the respondents' homes.
- The total sample consists of 2,400 residents of Ukraine aged 18 and older.
- The results were weighted according to region, age and gender distribution based on data from the State Statistics Committee of Ukraine as of January 1, 2019.
- The margin of error at the 95 percent confidence level does not exceed 2 percent.
- The response rate was 53 percent.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.
- This survey is made possible by the generous support of the American people through the <u>U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).</u>





Over the last 12 months, how has the economic situation in Ukraine changed?









In the past two years, how often, if ever, have you or an acquaintance had to do a favor, give a gift or pay a bribe to a local official in order to get services or a document from the official?






In your opinion, has the level of corruption improved or gotten worse since 2019?








Do you approve or disapprove of... handling of the coronavirus pandemic?




Do you approve or disapprove of your local government's handling of the coronavirus pandemic?












Why is there no OSBB in your apartment building?




















