



NATIONAL SURVEY OF TIMOR-LESTE

February - March 2023

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's [Center for Insights in Survey Research](#) by INSIGHT LTD.
- Data was collected between February 21 and March 16, 2023, through CAPI administered face-to-face interviews in respondents' homes.
- The sample consisted of n=1,500 residents of Timor-Leste aged 17 and older. Government workers, political party employees, police and enlisted military personnel were excluded.
- A multi-stage probability sampling method was used to design a nationally representative sample of Timor-Leste as per the 2015 population census. The sample was stratified by district and by urban/rural residency using a Probability Proportionate to Size (PPS) approach, followed by random selection of primary sampling units (PSUs) within each stratum. Sucos served as PSUs within each stratum. Aldeias were selected within each selected Suco. Aldeias served as sampling points.
- Households were selected by random walk, and respondents were selected by Kish grid while observing a gender quota.
- The achieved sample was weighted for age, gender, municipality, and educational attainment as per the 2015 census of Timor-Leste. The samples for polls conducted prior 2018 are not weighted.
- The margin of error for the mid-range full sample does not exceed ± 2.5 points at the 95% level of confidence.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.

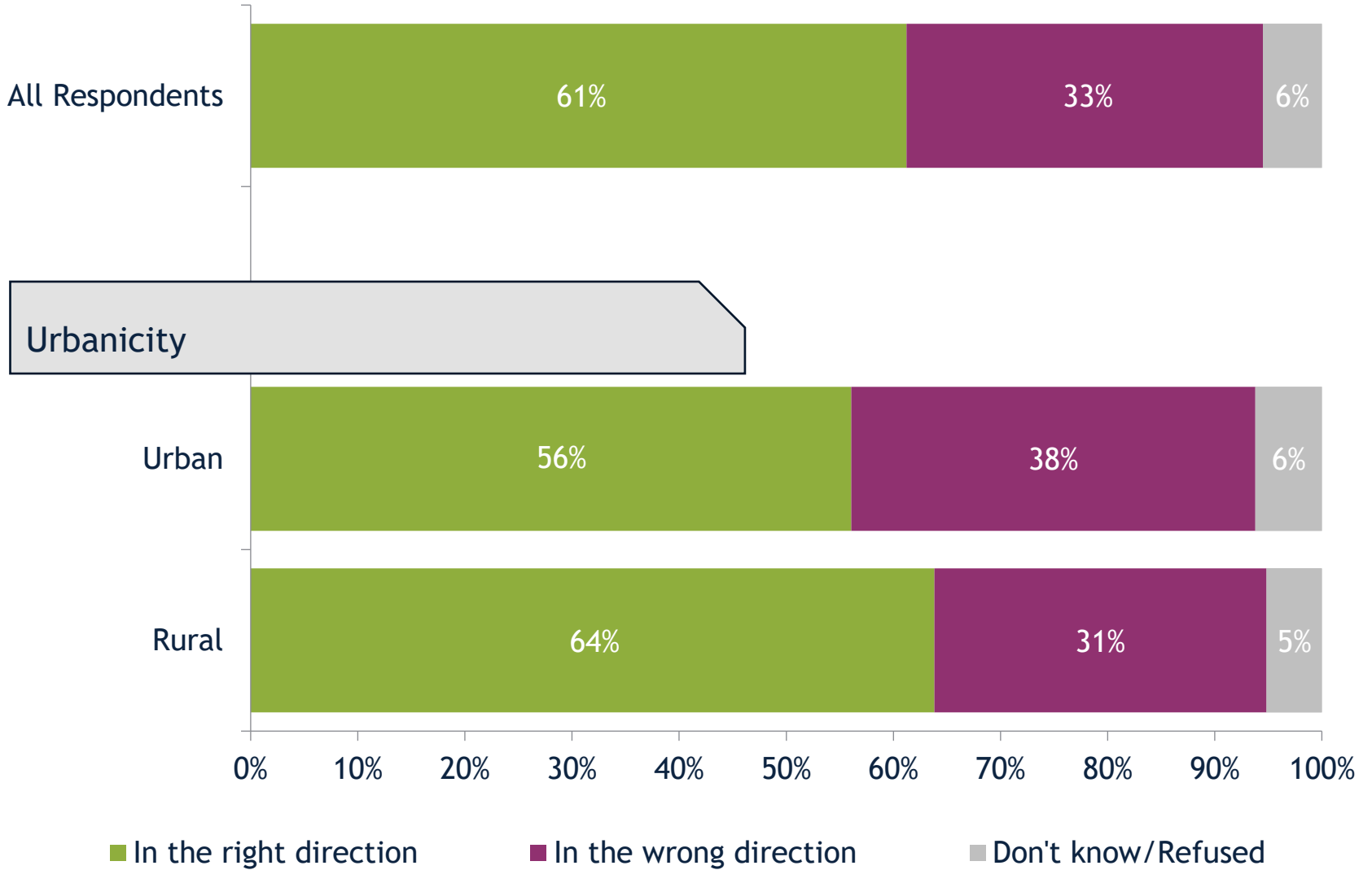

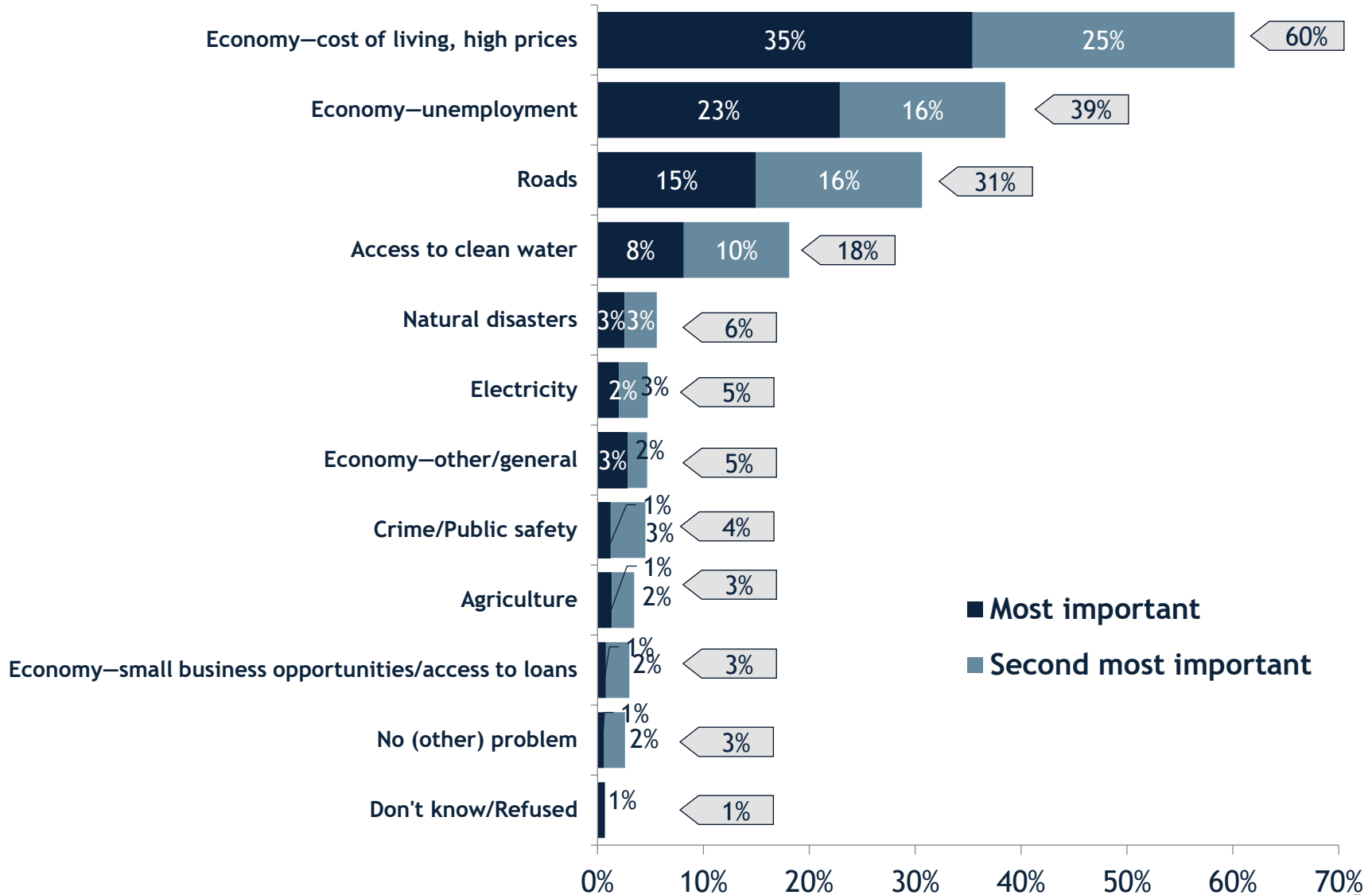


In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?

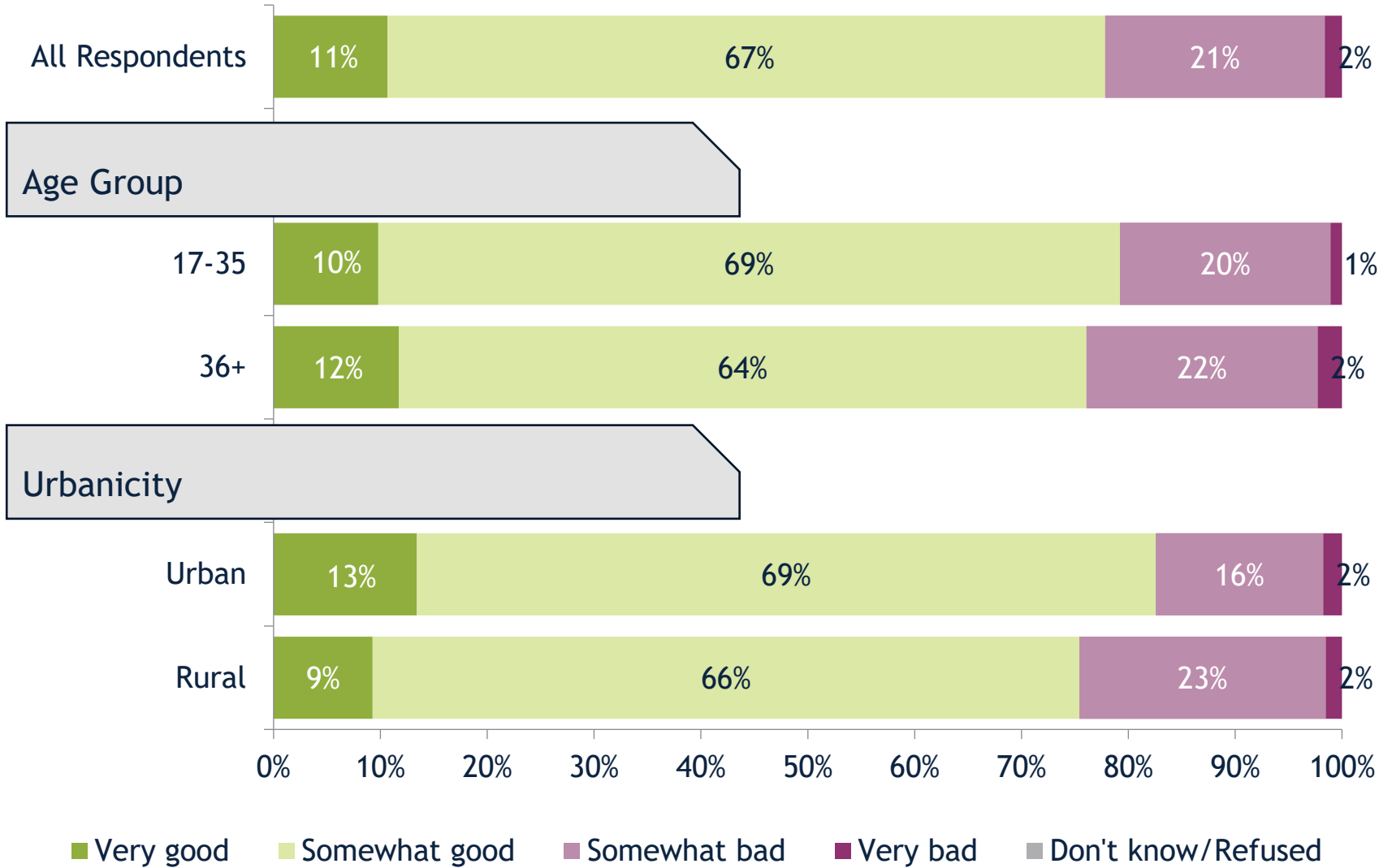


What is the most important problem facing our country today? And what is the second most important problem?

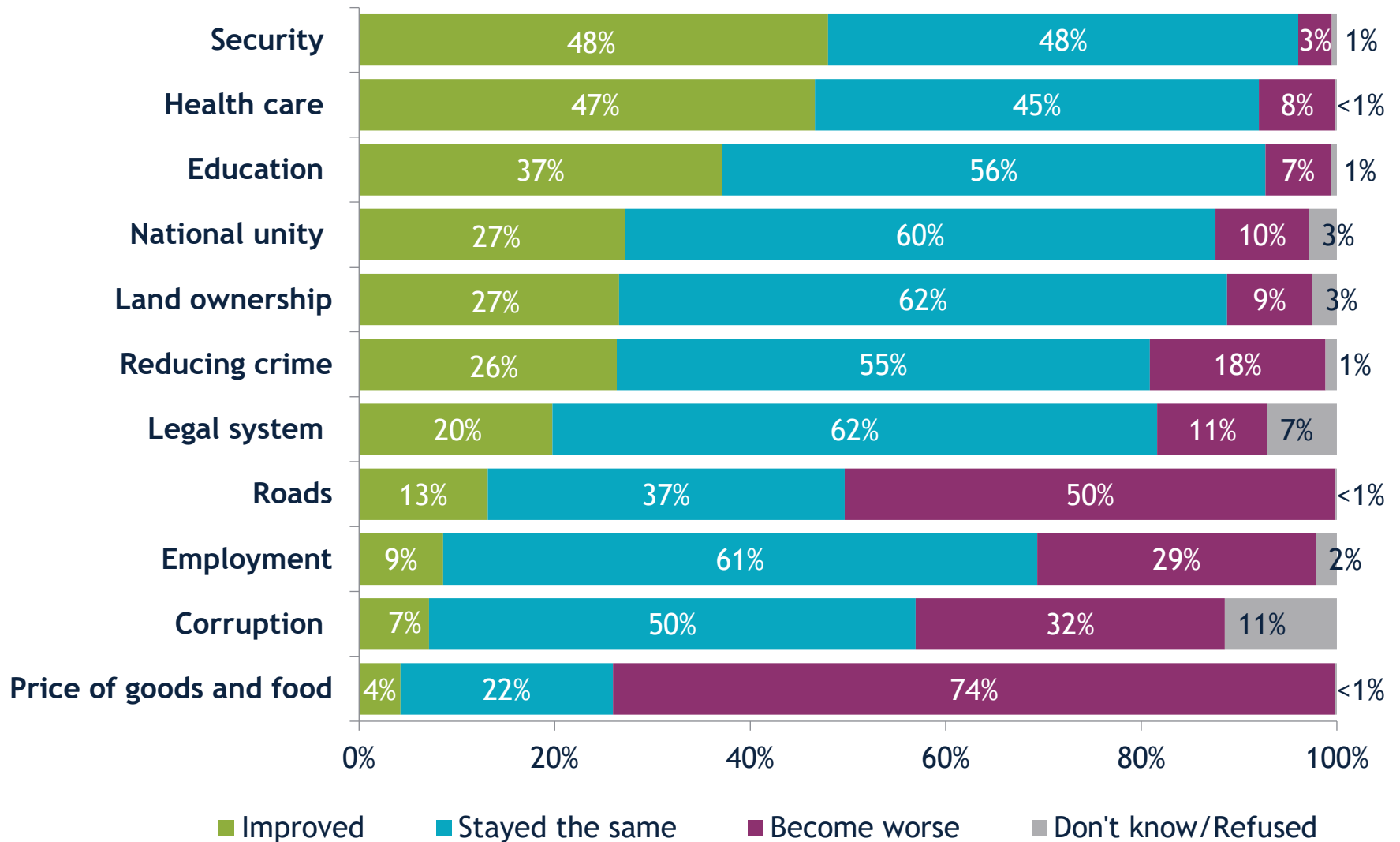

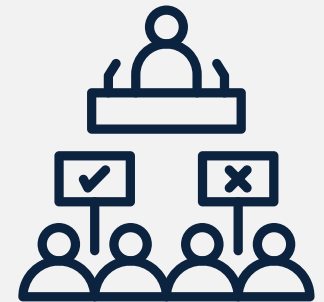
How would you describe the current economic situation of your household?

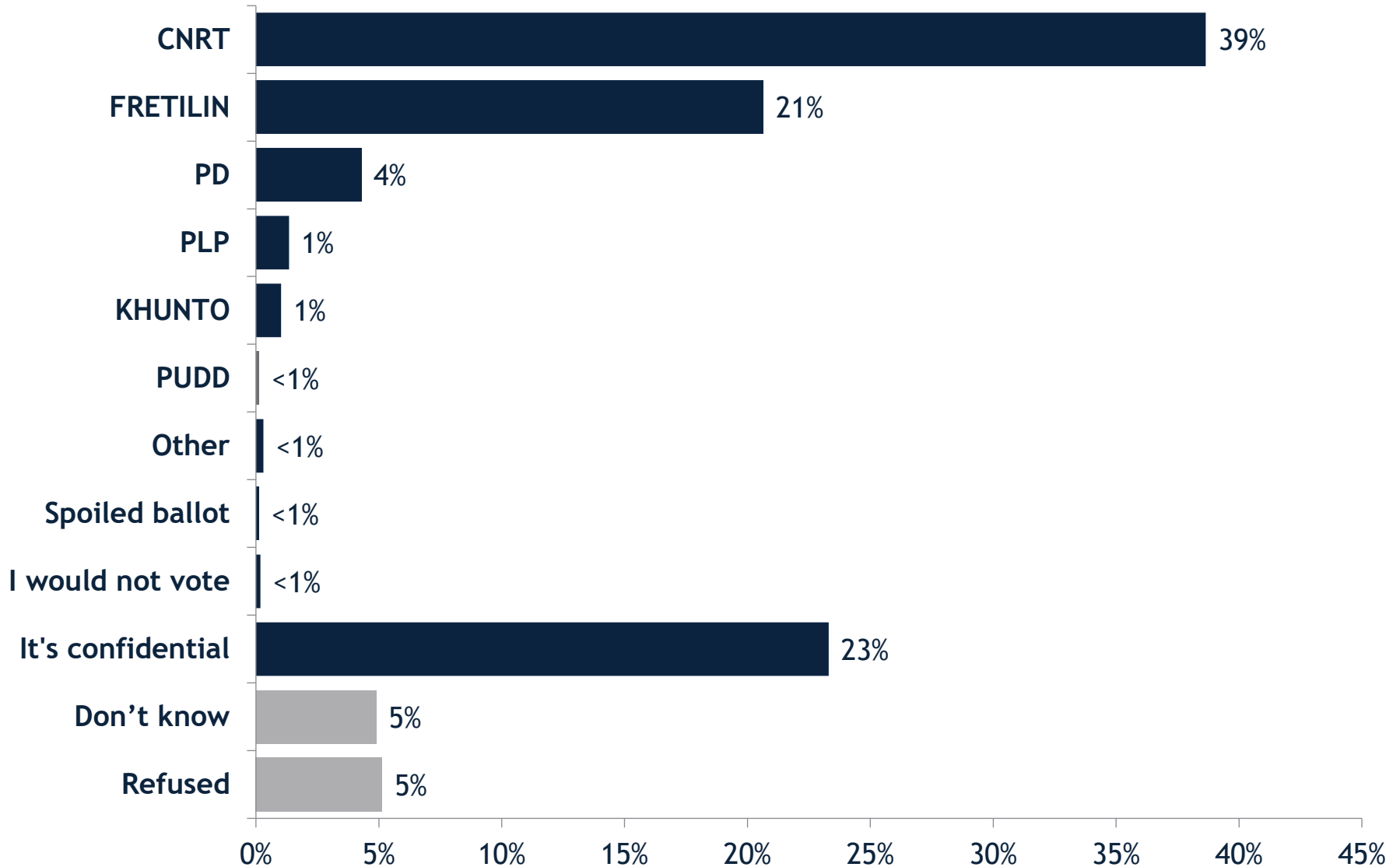

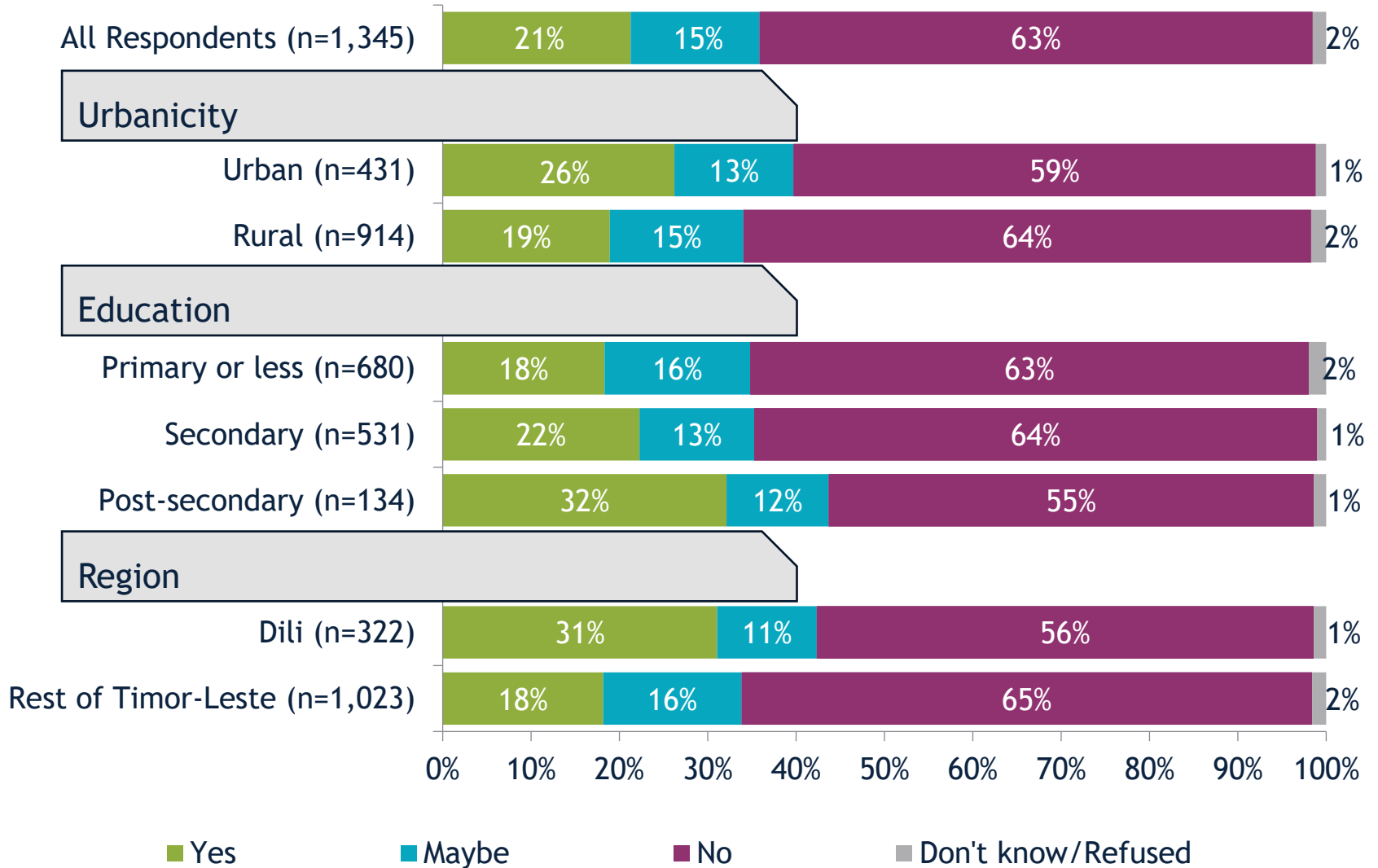
If elections were held this coming Saturday, for which party, if any, would you vote?

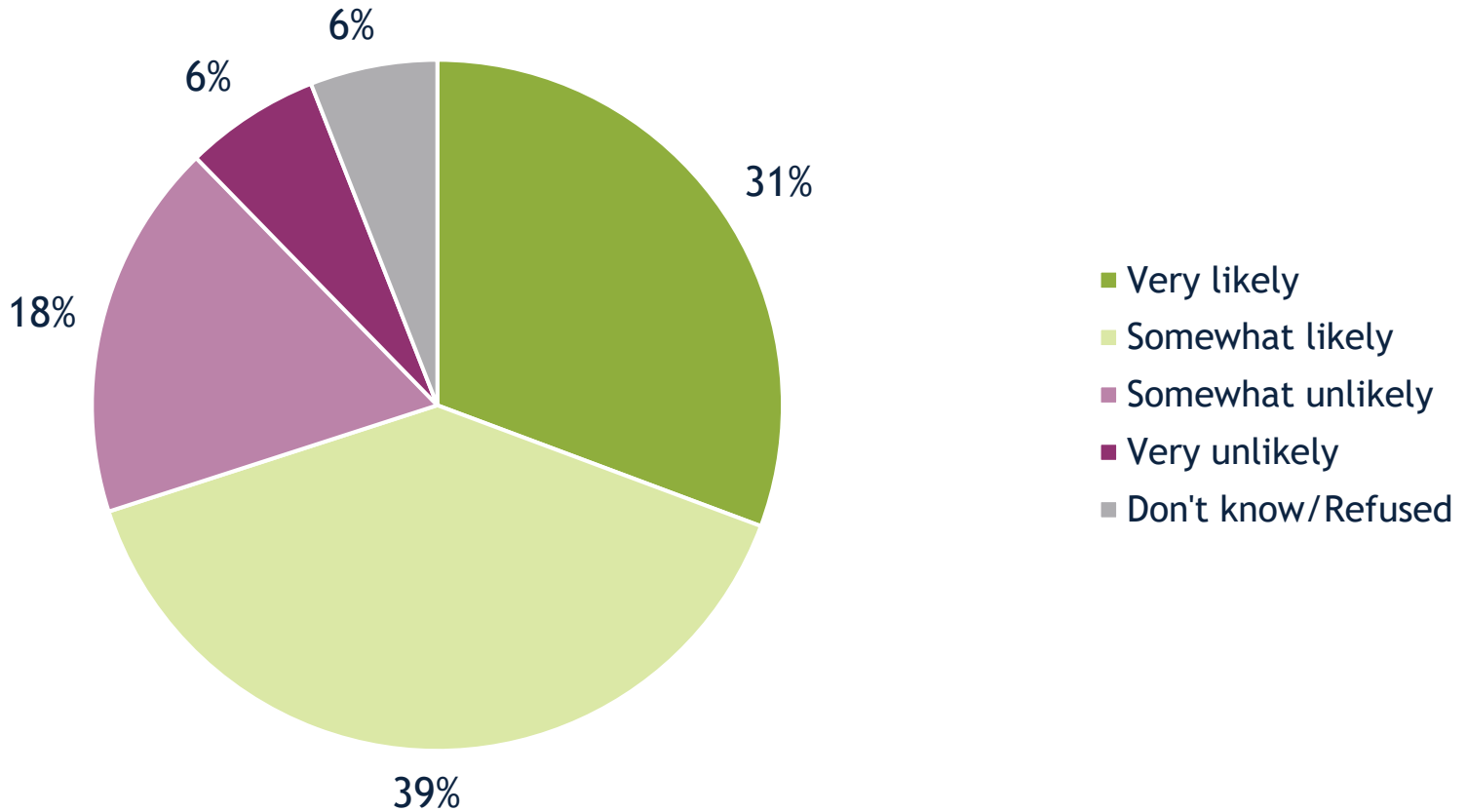

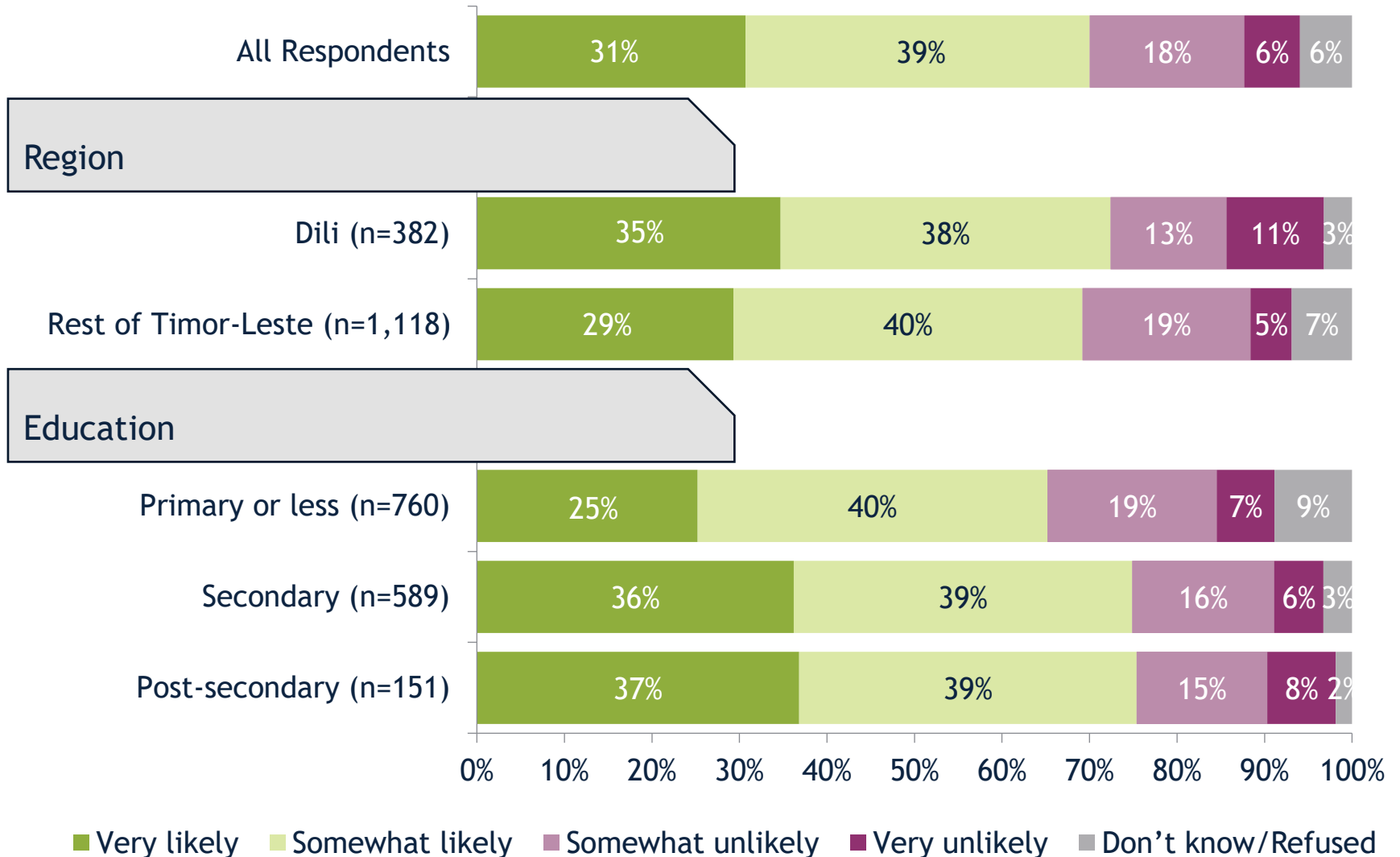

How likely or unlikely are ordinary people able to influence decisions made in our country?

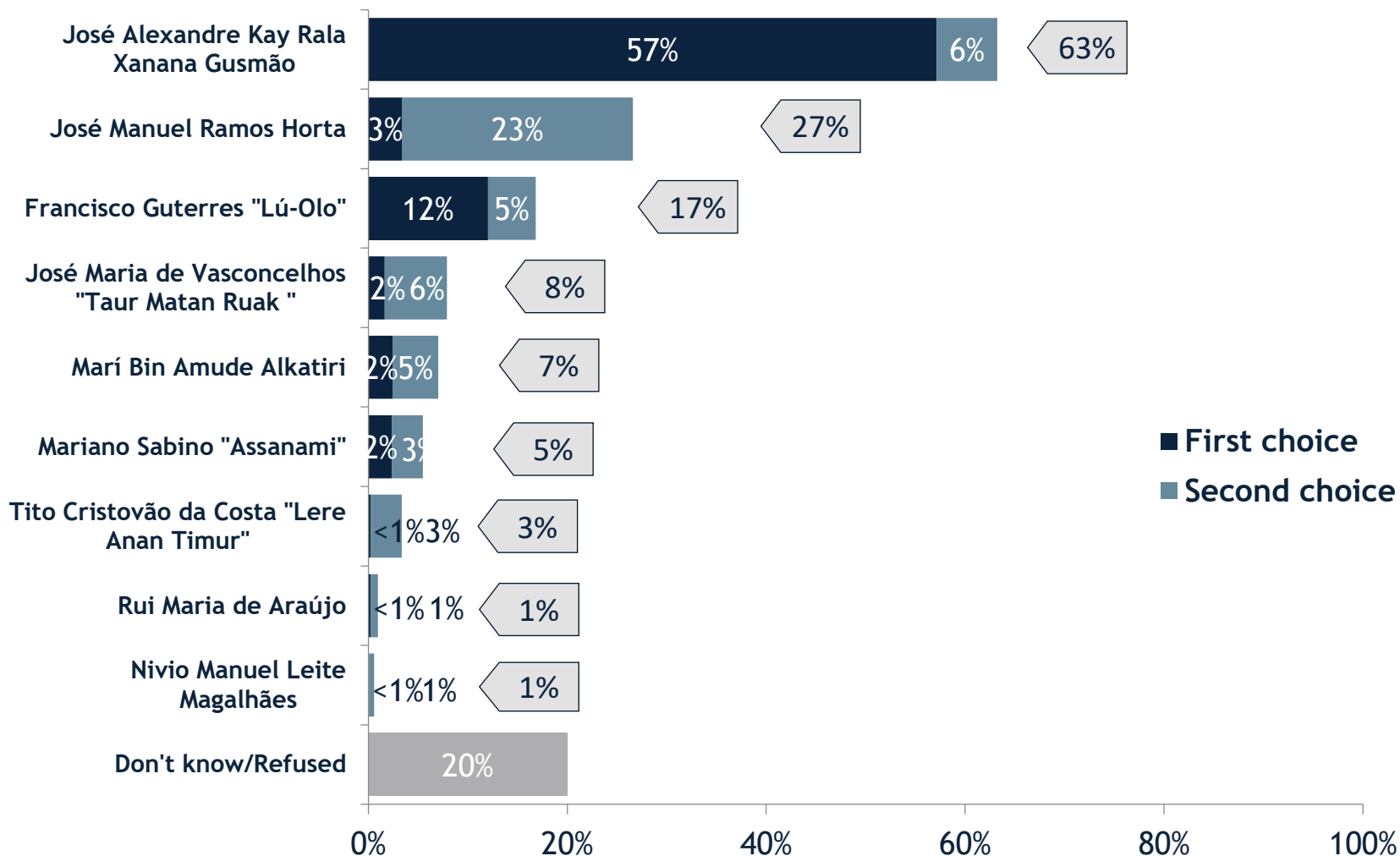


How likely or unlikely are ordinary people able to influence decisions made in our country?

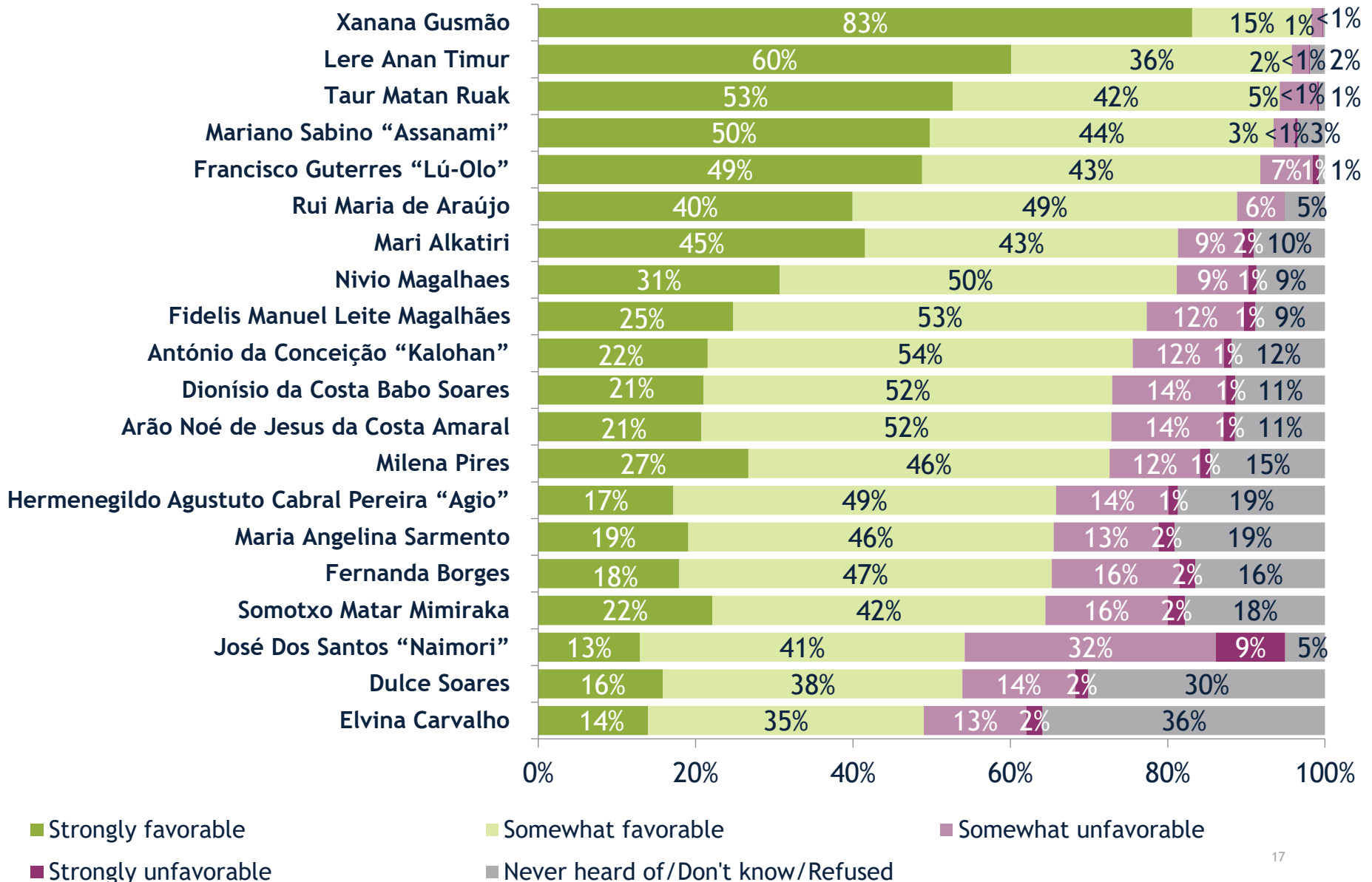


In your opinion, who are the top two best political or government leaders in Timor-Leste?

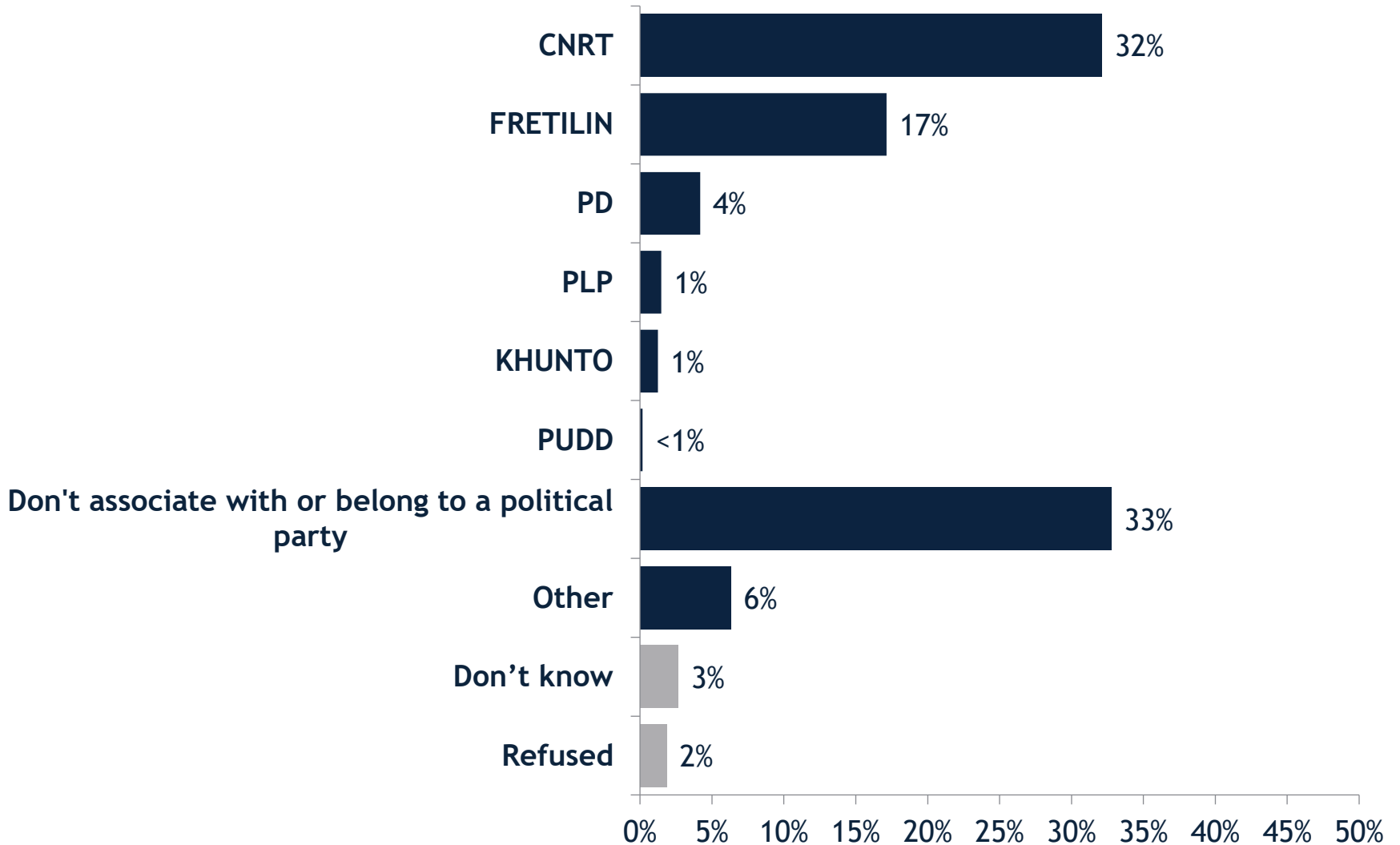

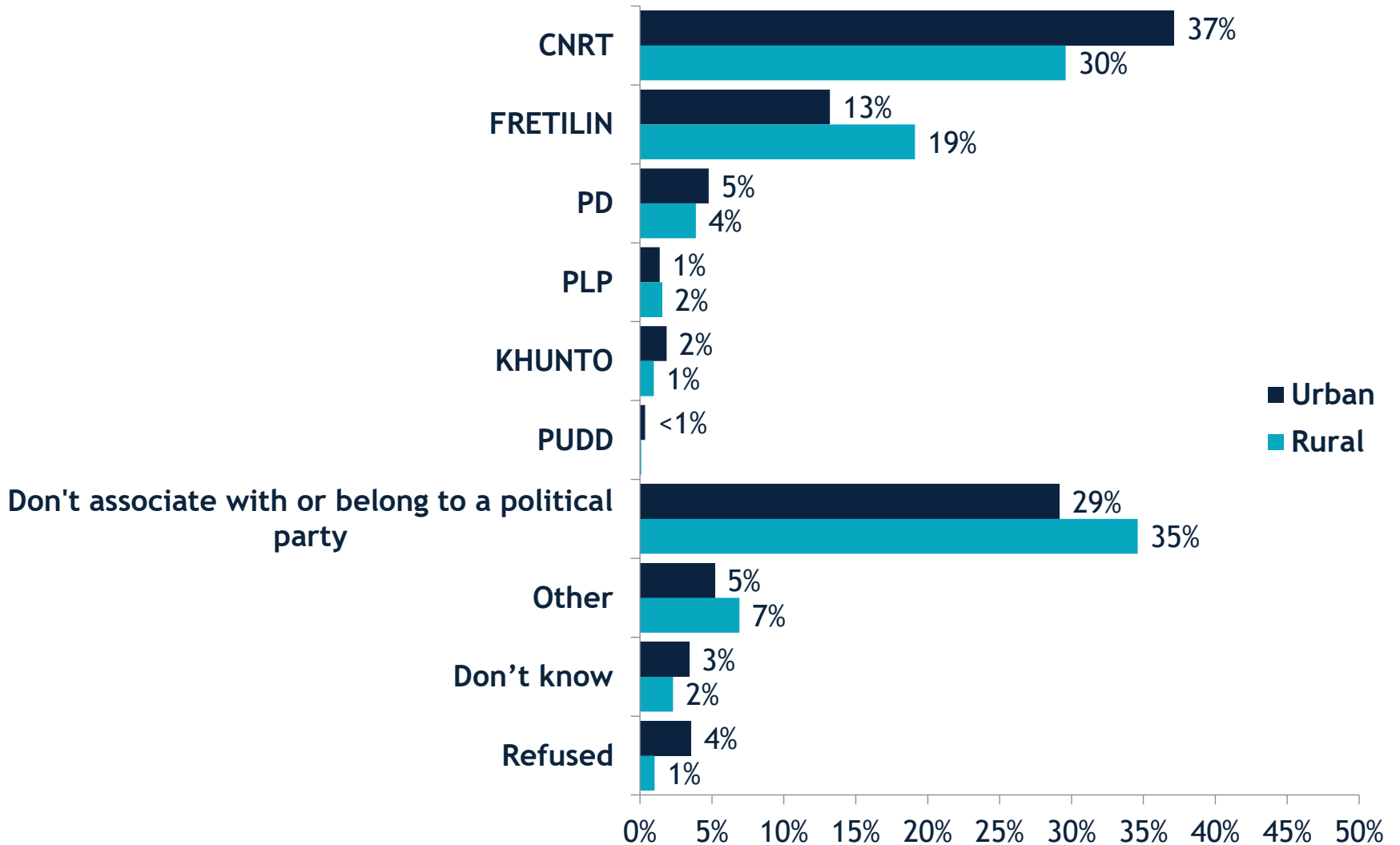
Which political party do you associate with or belong to, if any?

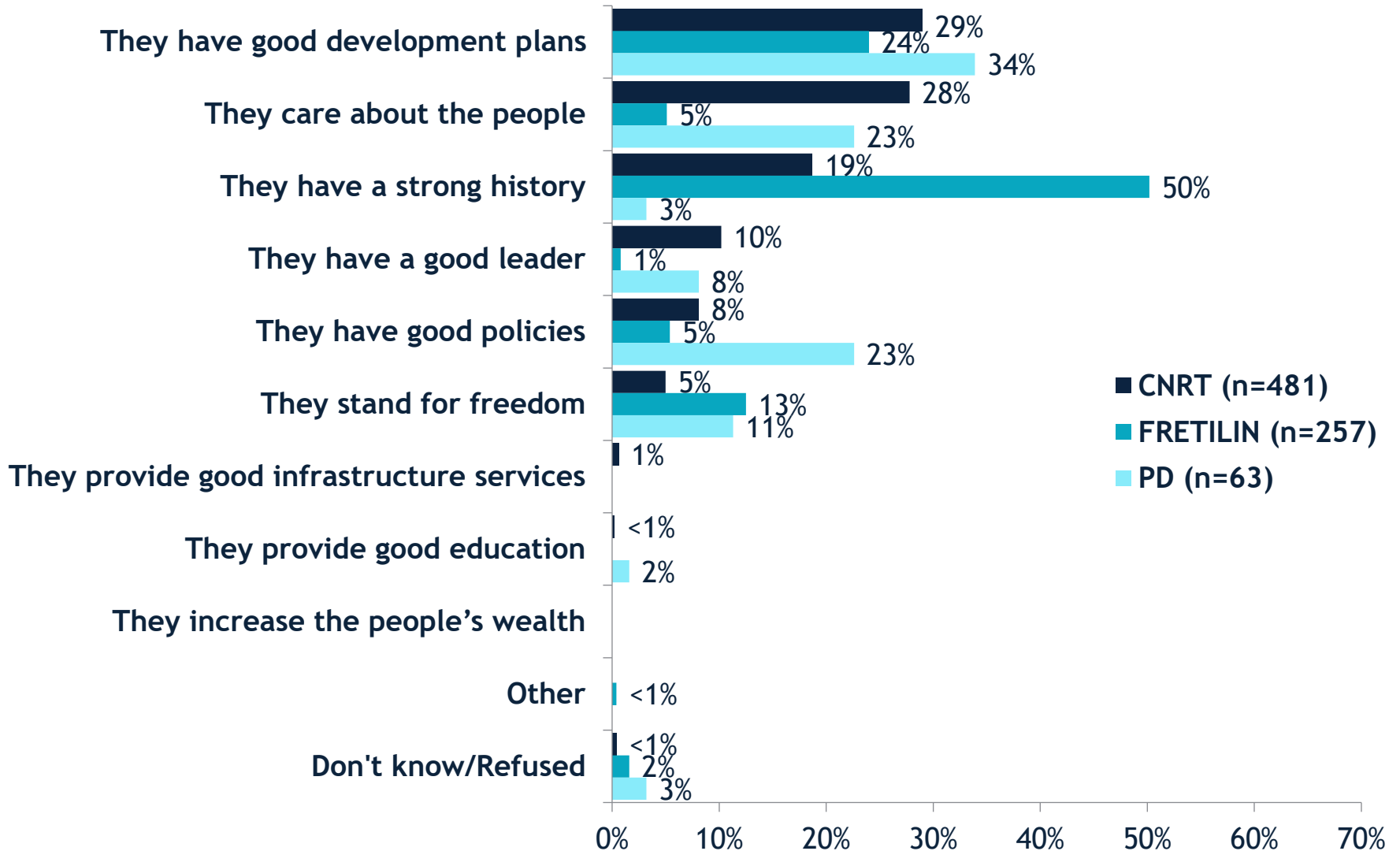
Which political party do you associate with or belong to, if any?

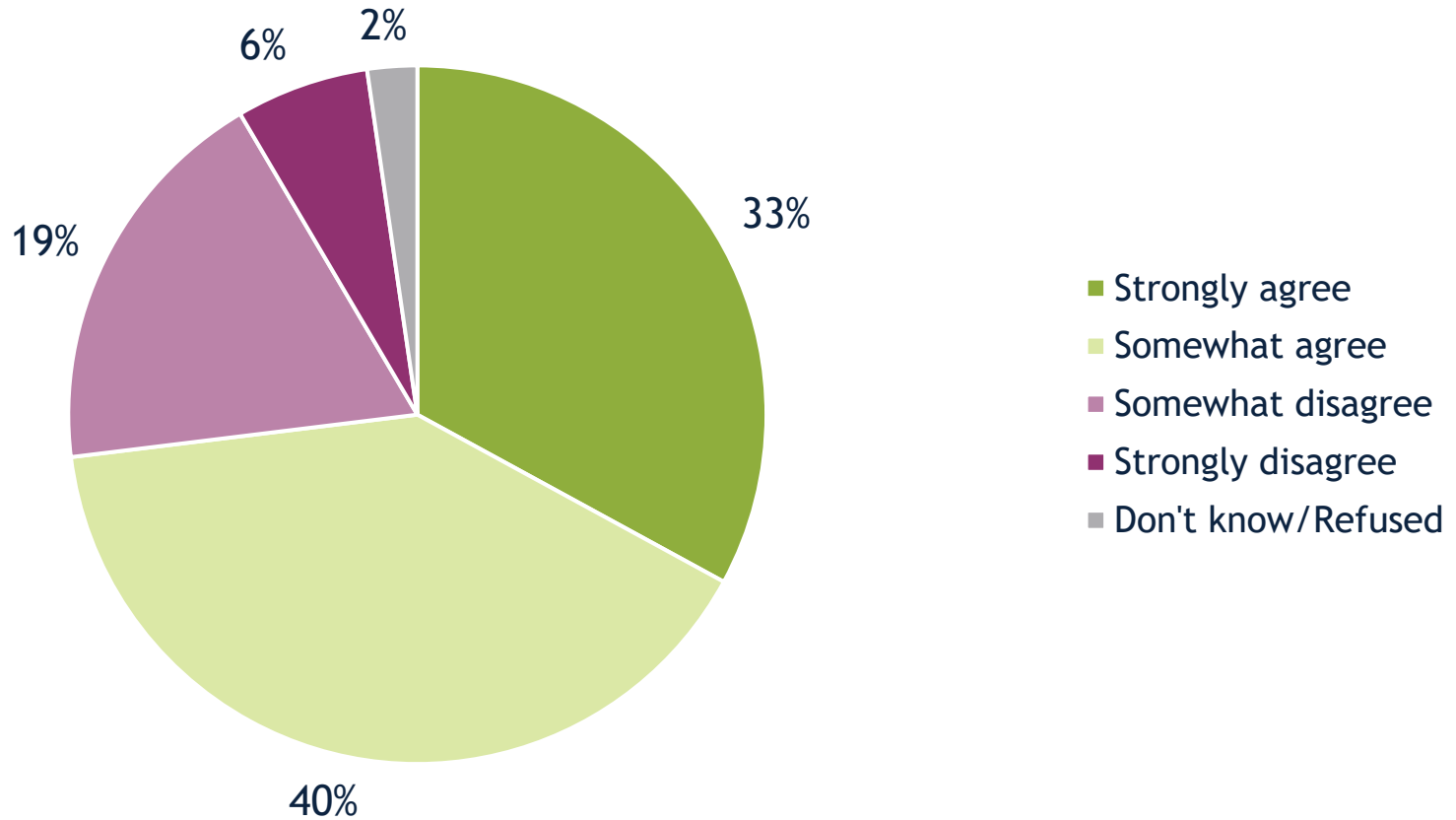


What is the main reason that you associate with or belong to this political party?

Among those who associate with a political party, disaggregates for top 3 parties displayed

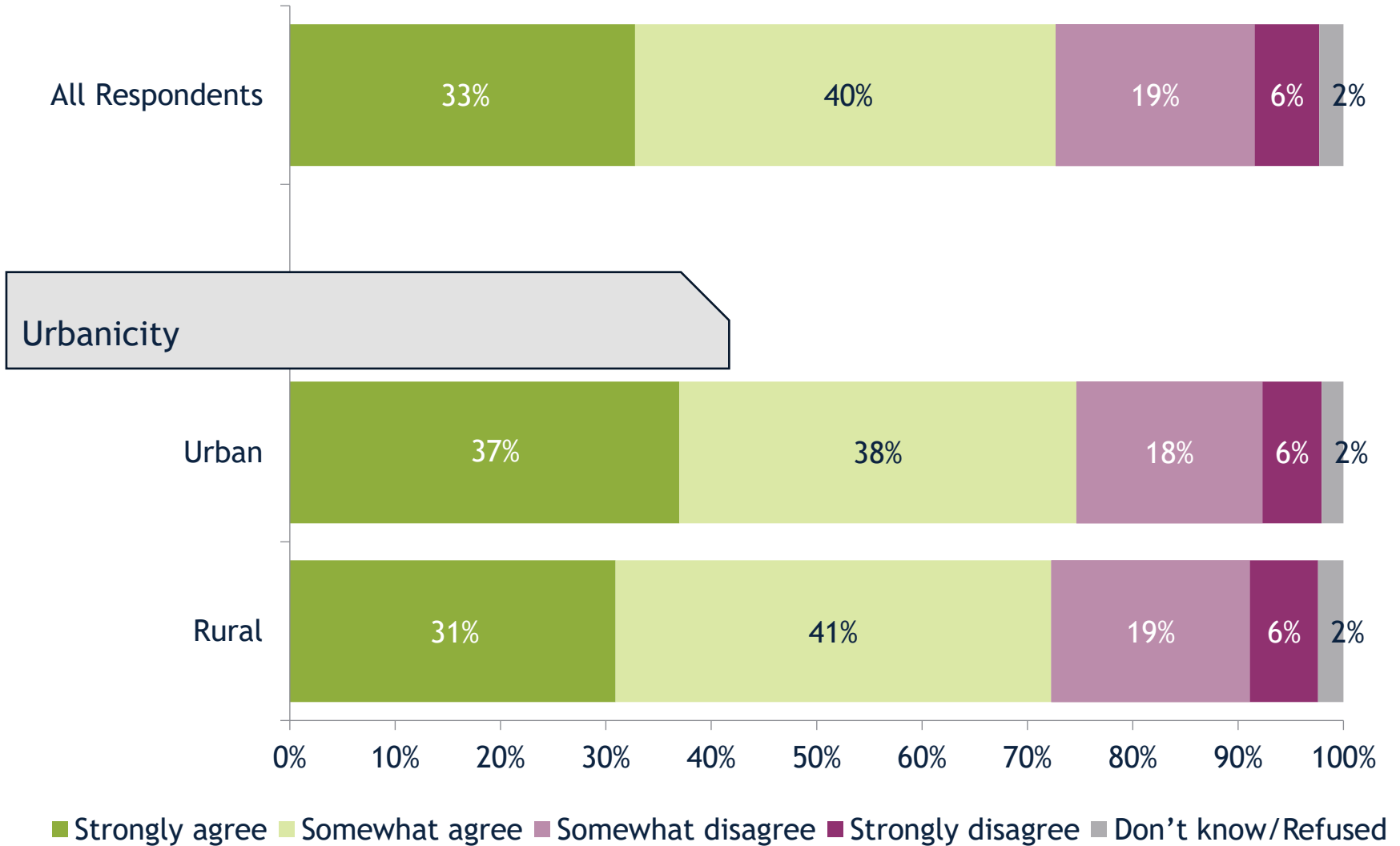


Do you agree or disagree that political parties are doing enough to address the needs of voters like you?

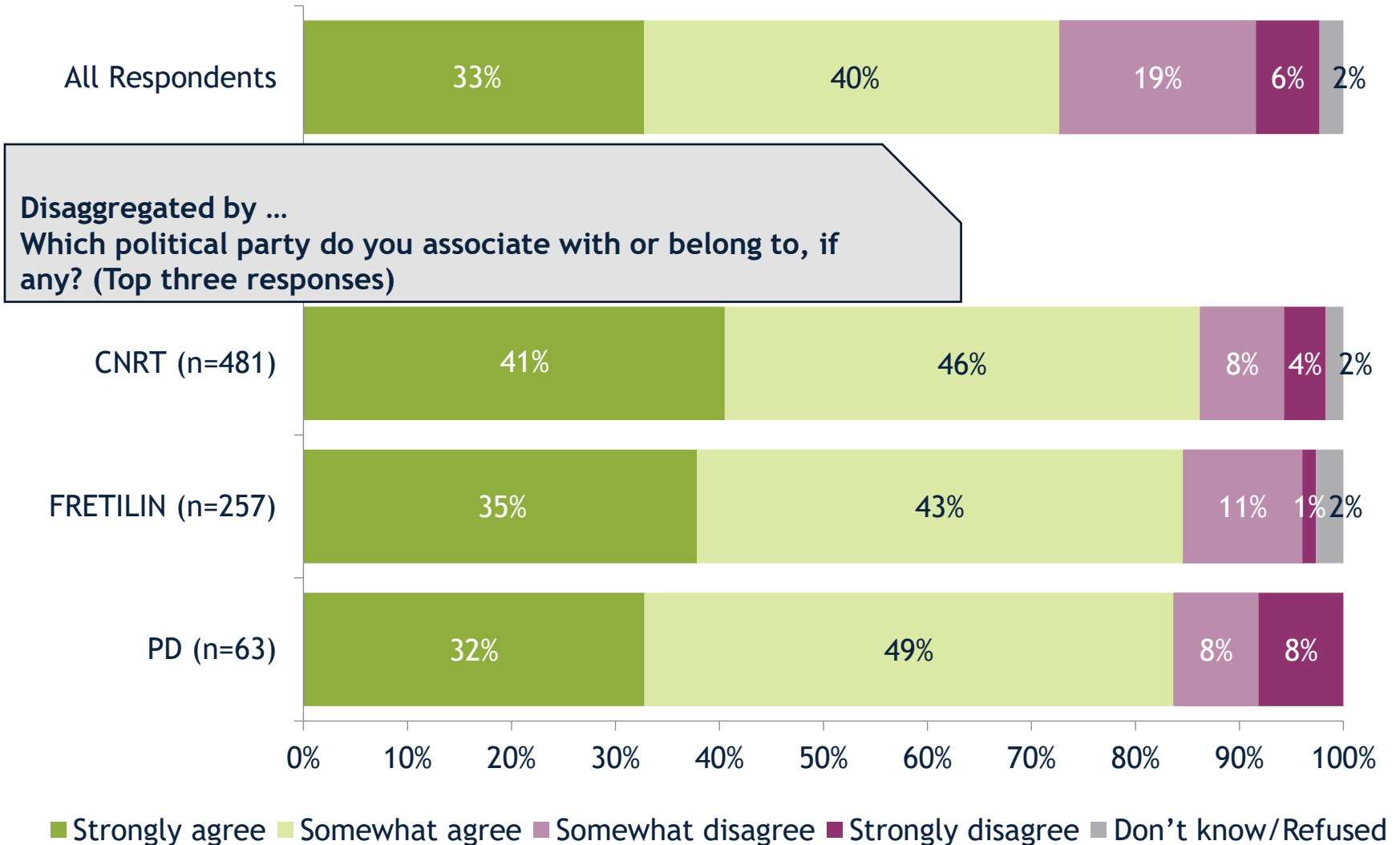




Do you agree or disagree that political parties are doing enough to address the needs of voters like you?



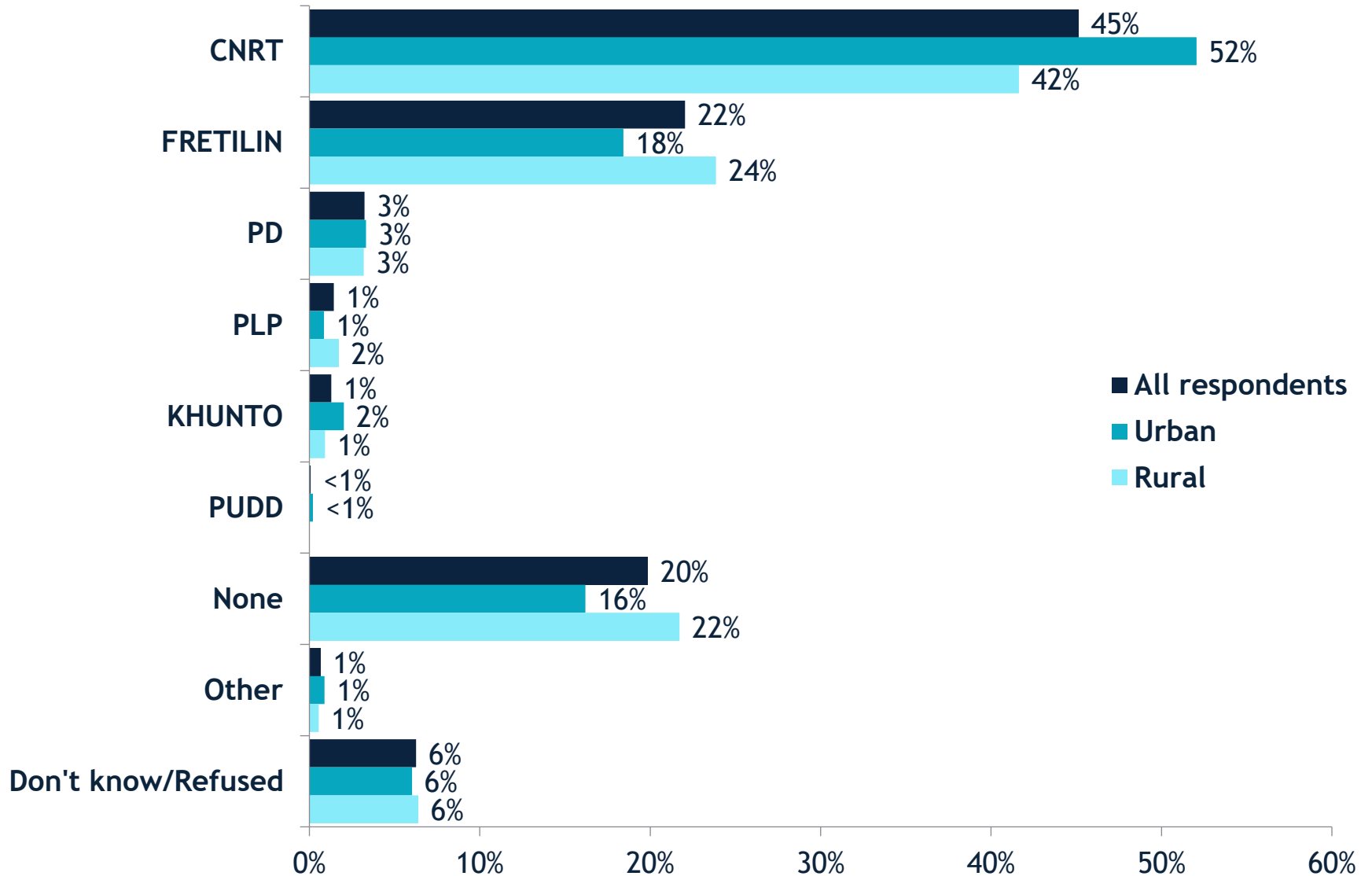

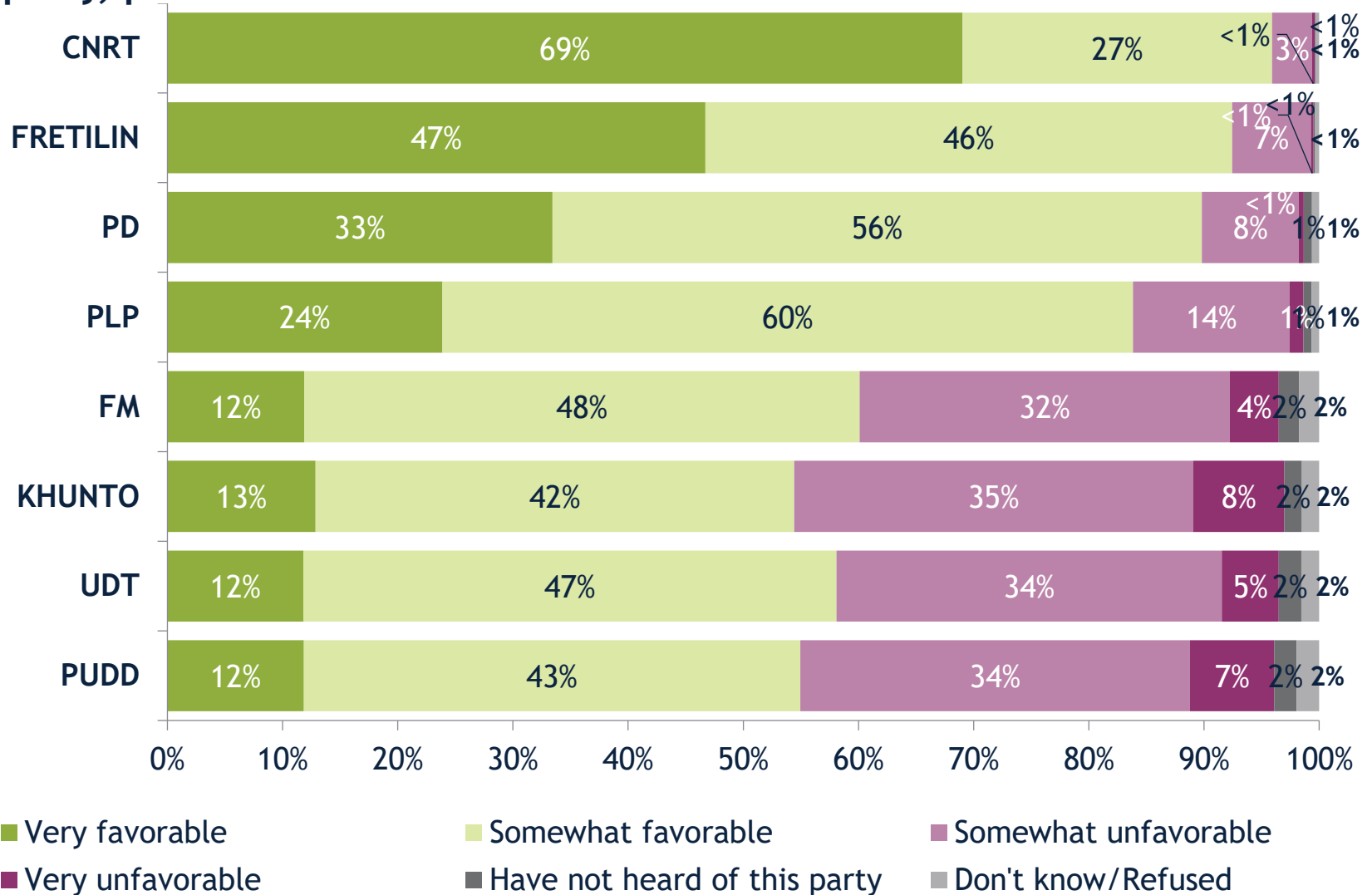


Which political party is most active in your neighborhood?

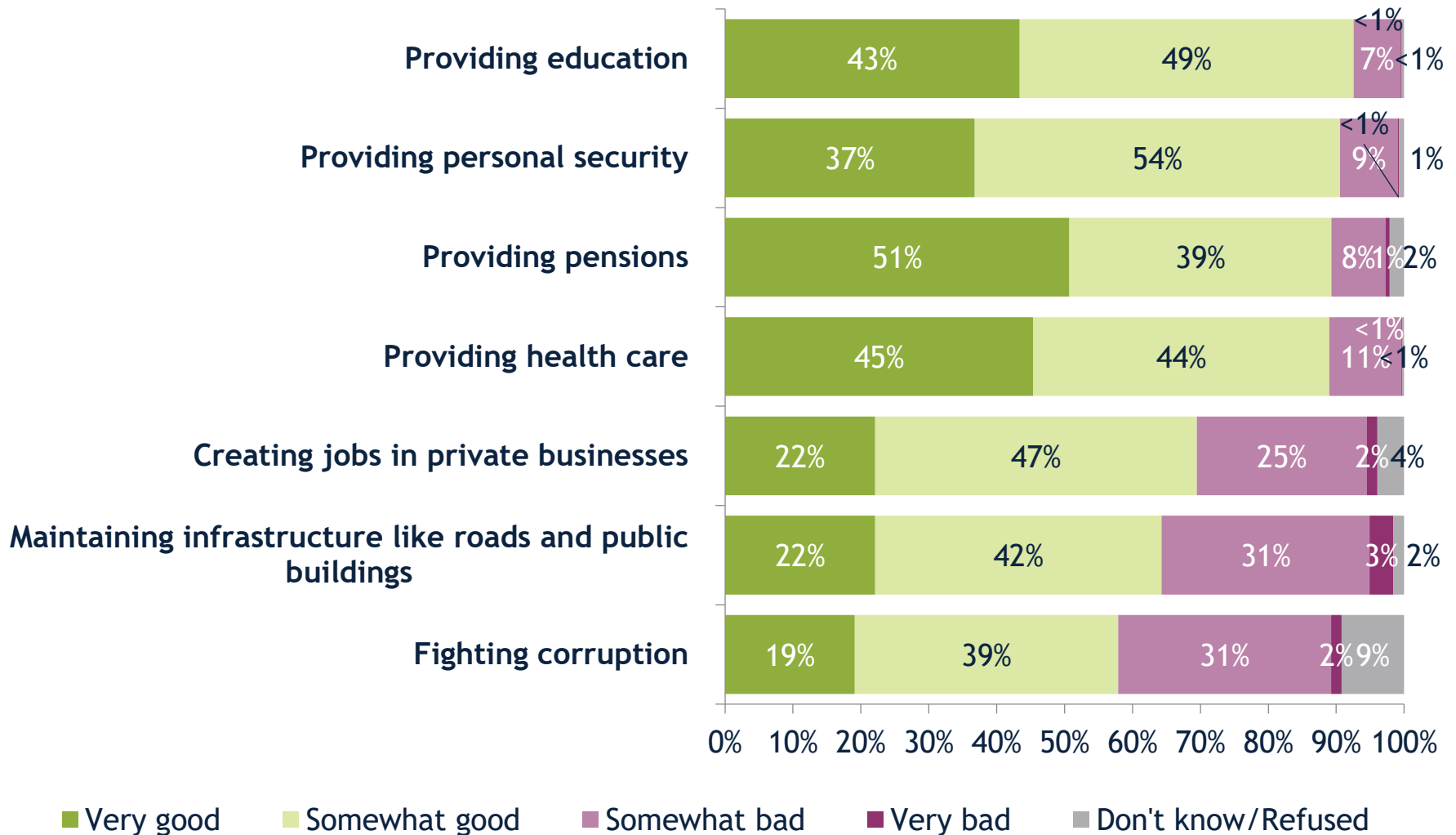

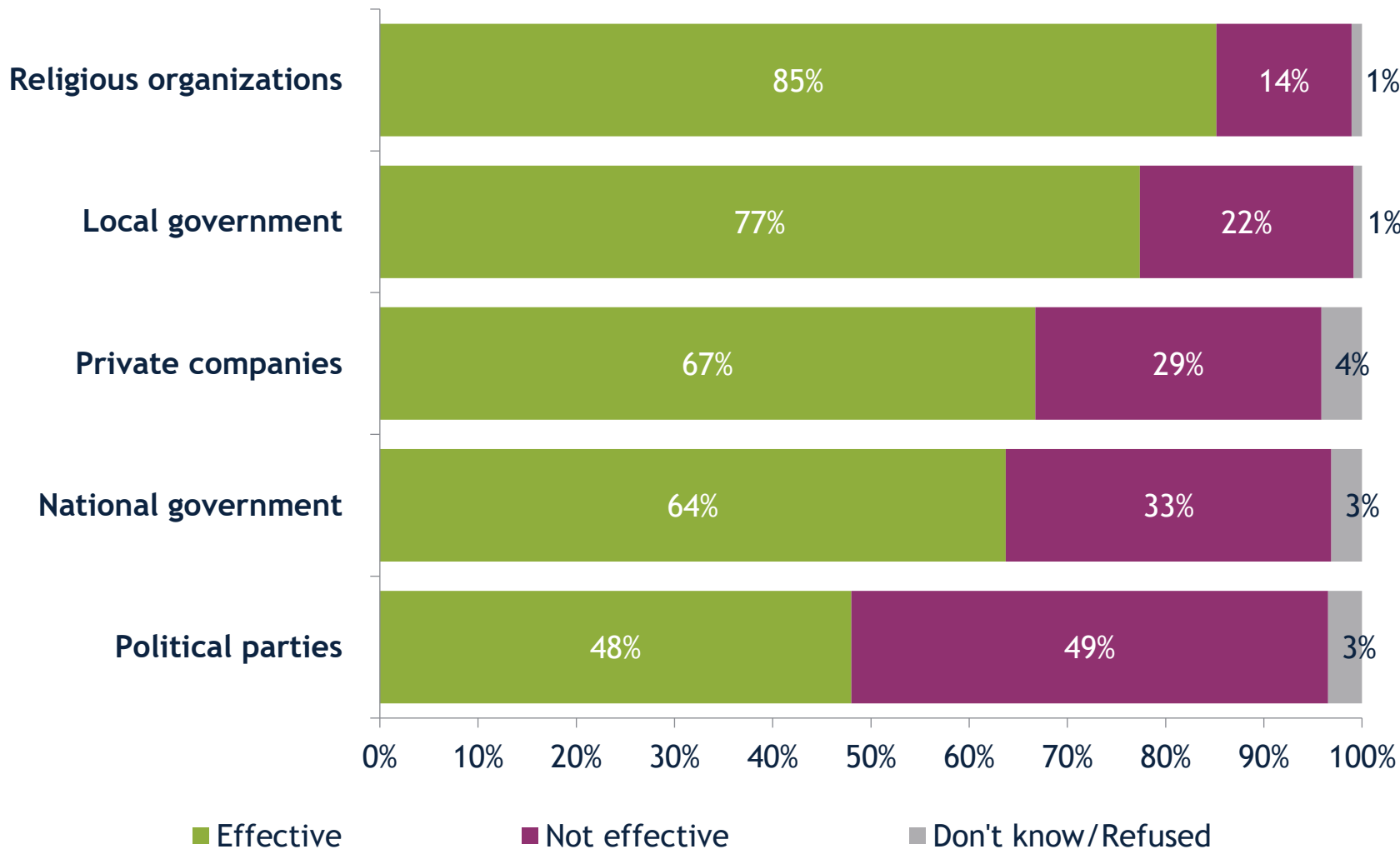

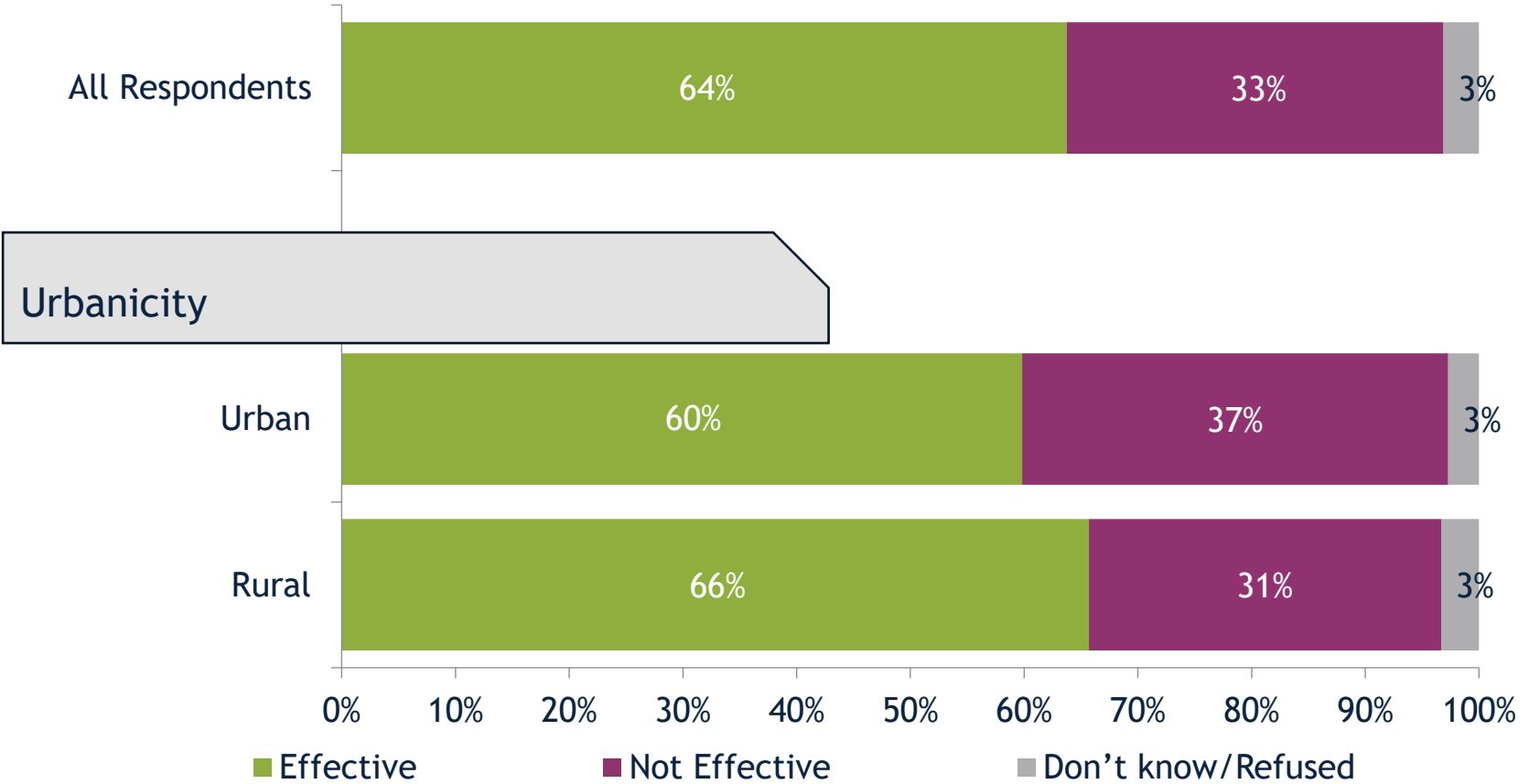

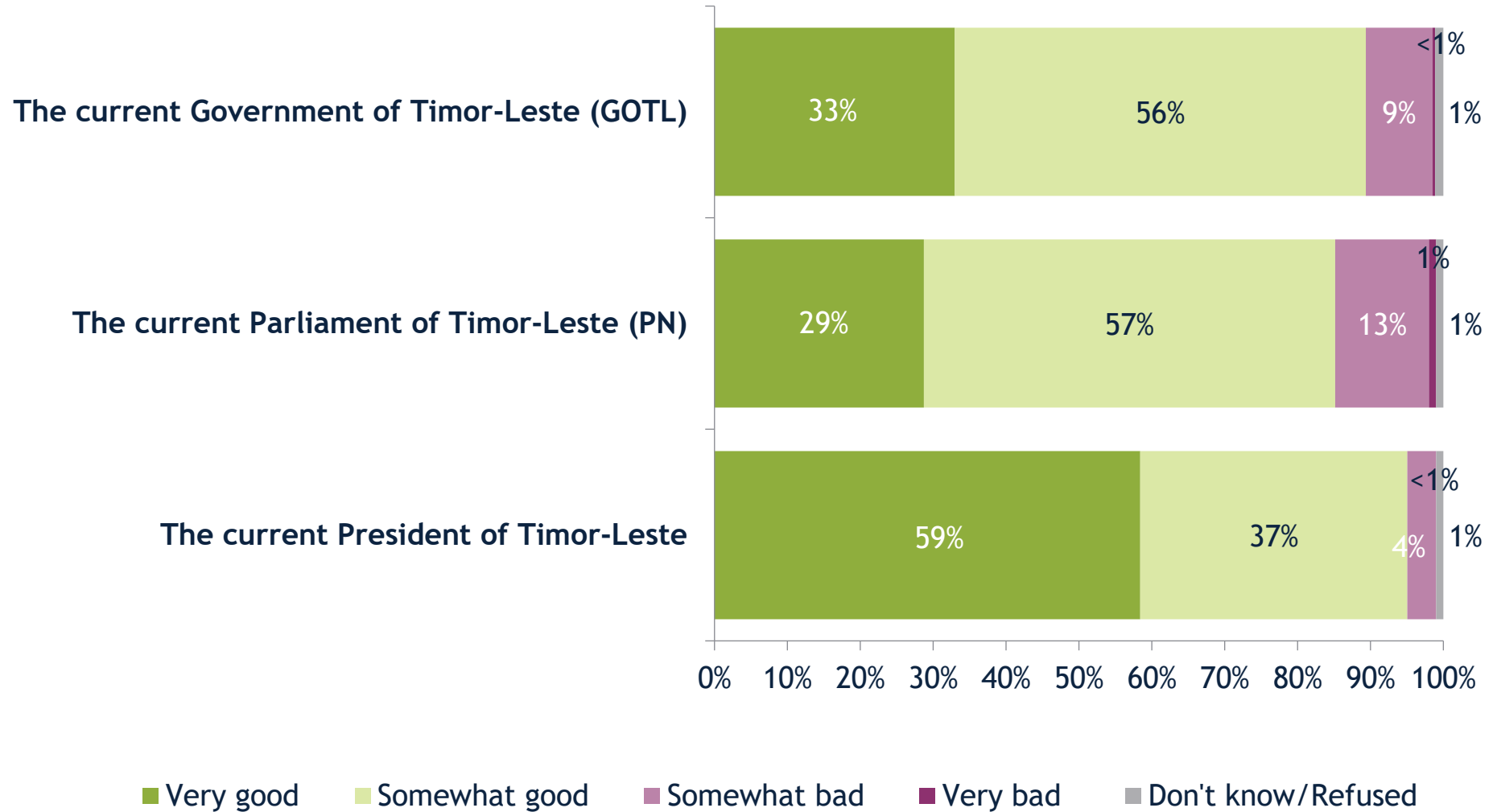

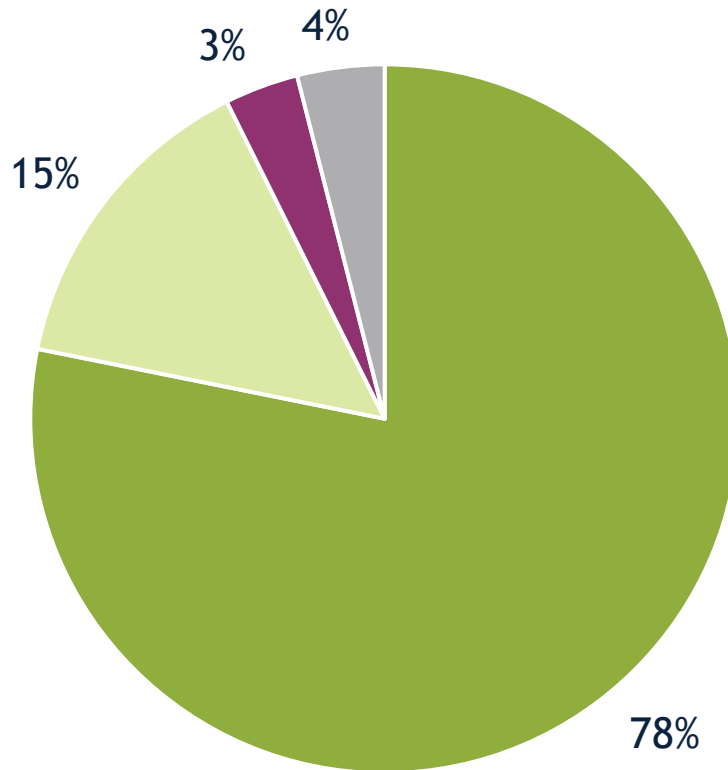

Do you believe that democracy is the best possible form of government for our country or not?



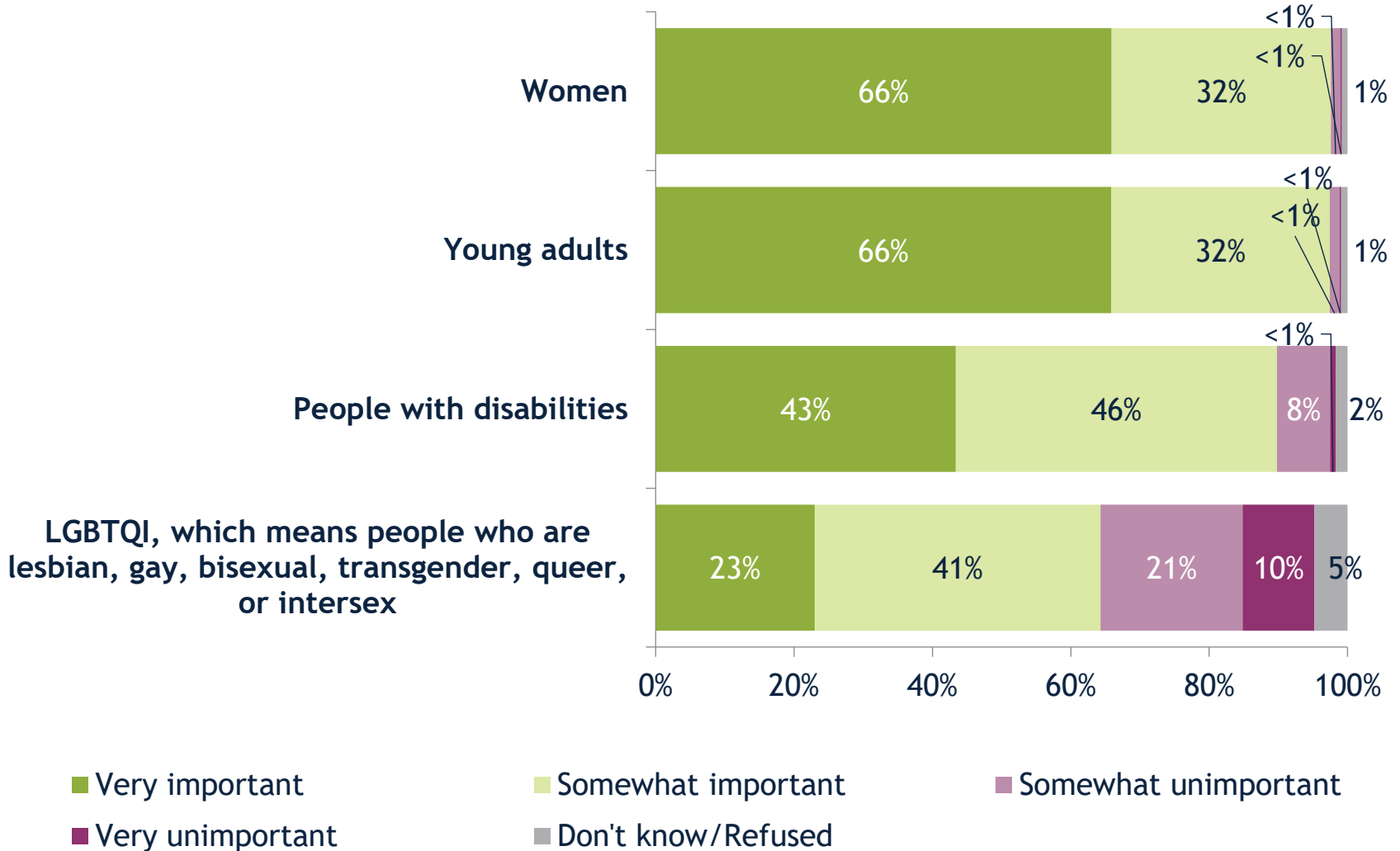

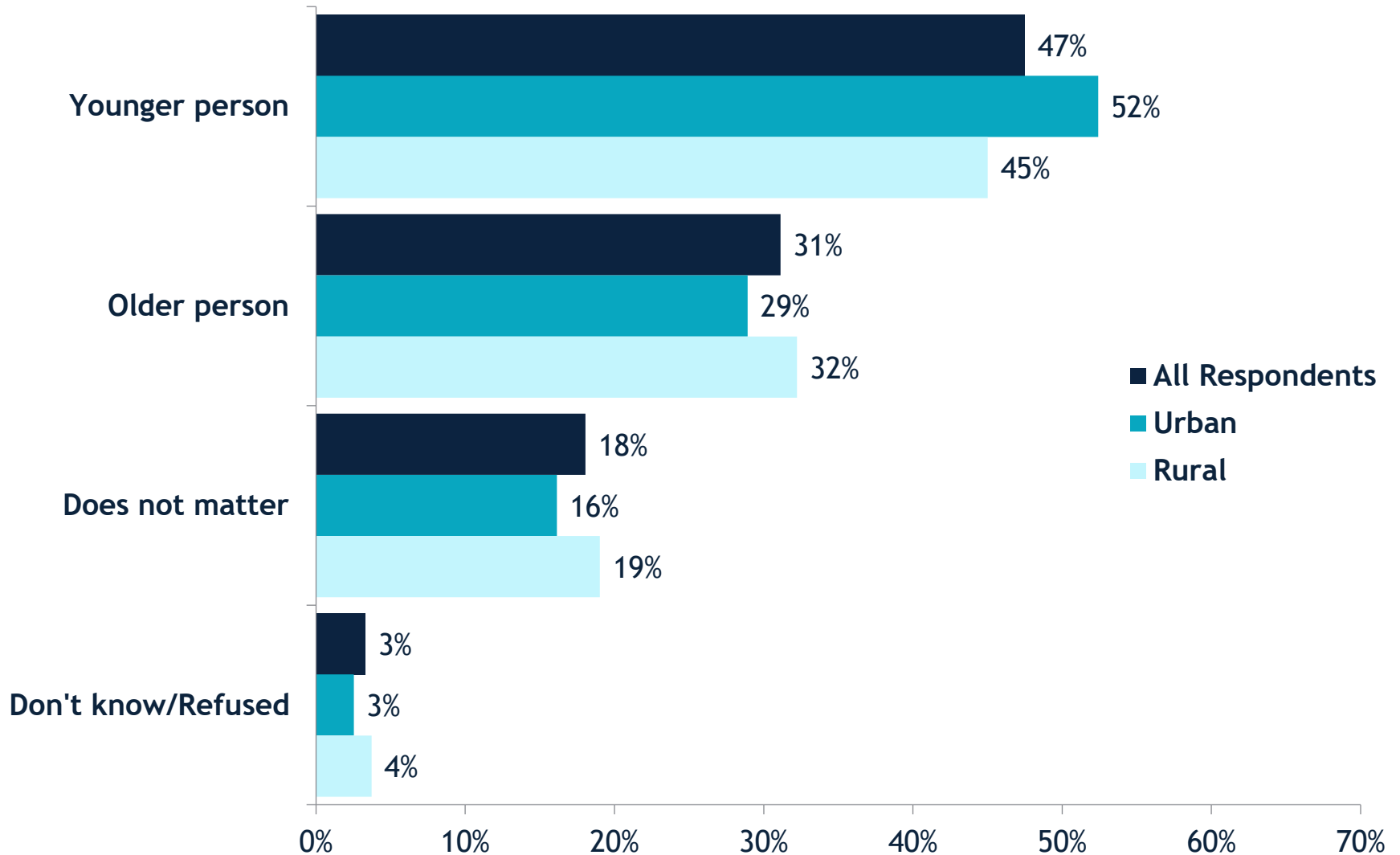




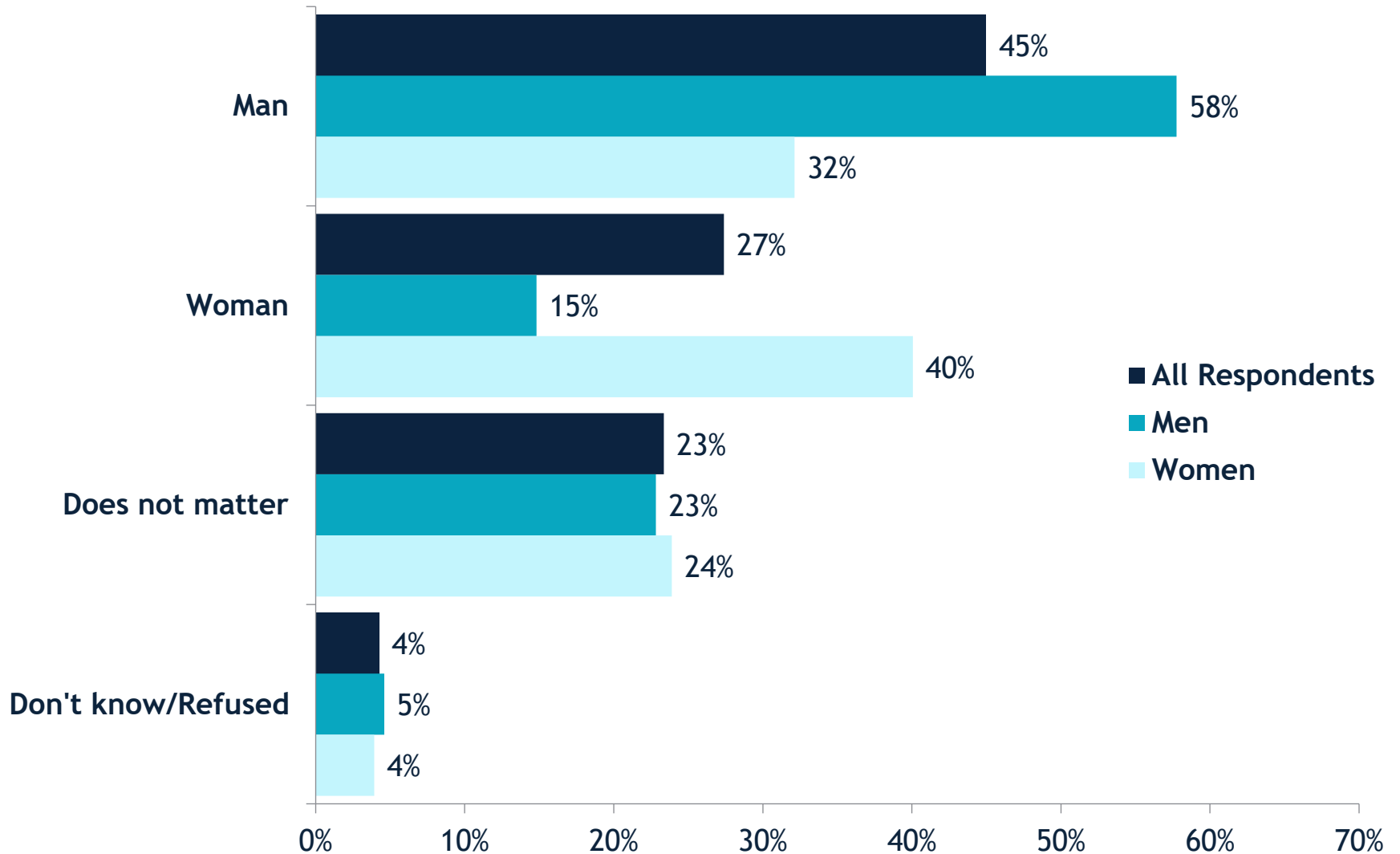

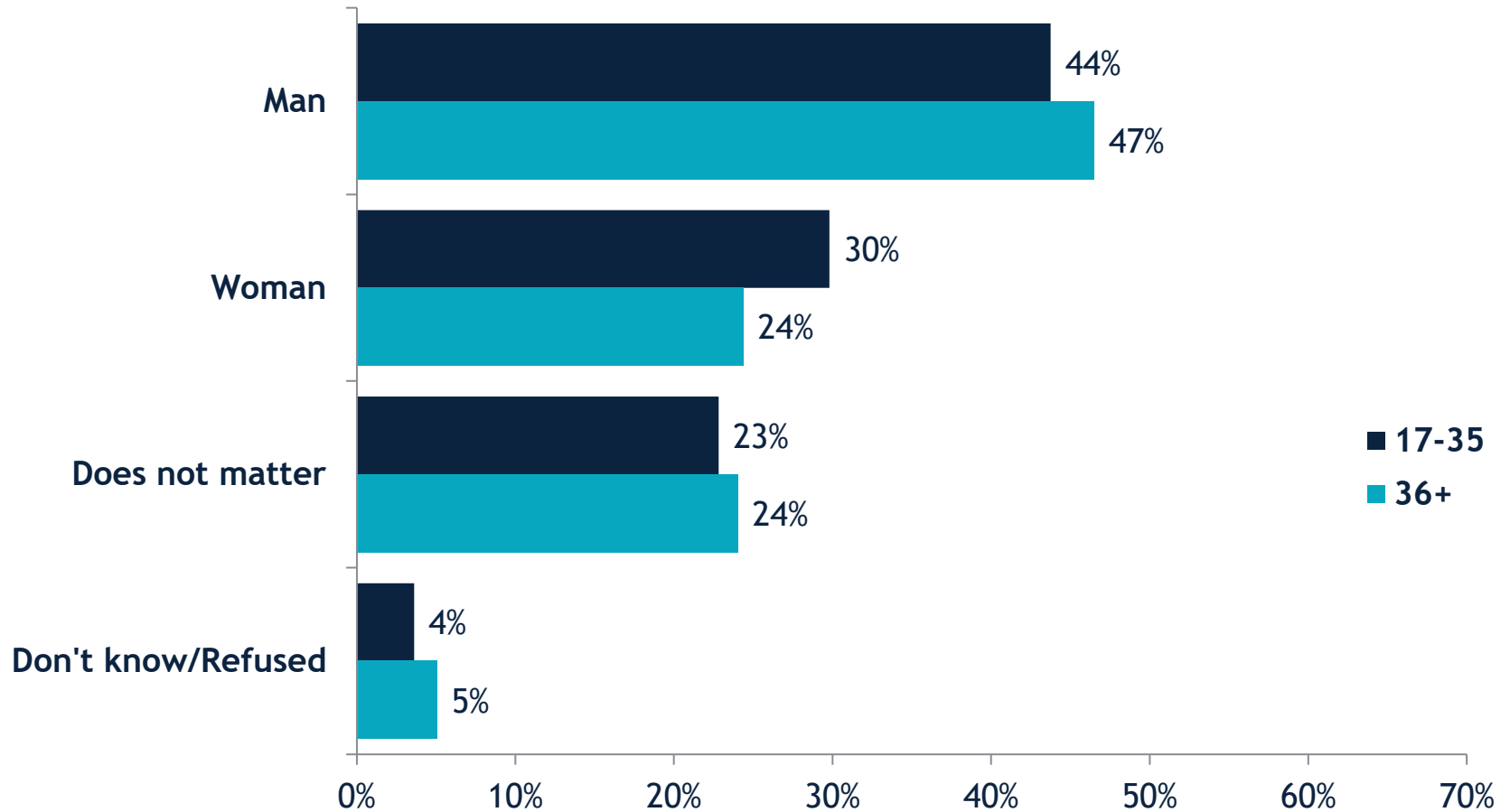
If there are two candidates running for office and they have the same qualifications aside from the fact that one is a younger person and one is an older person, which candidate are you more likely to support?



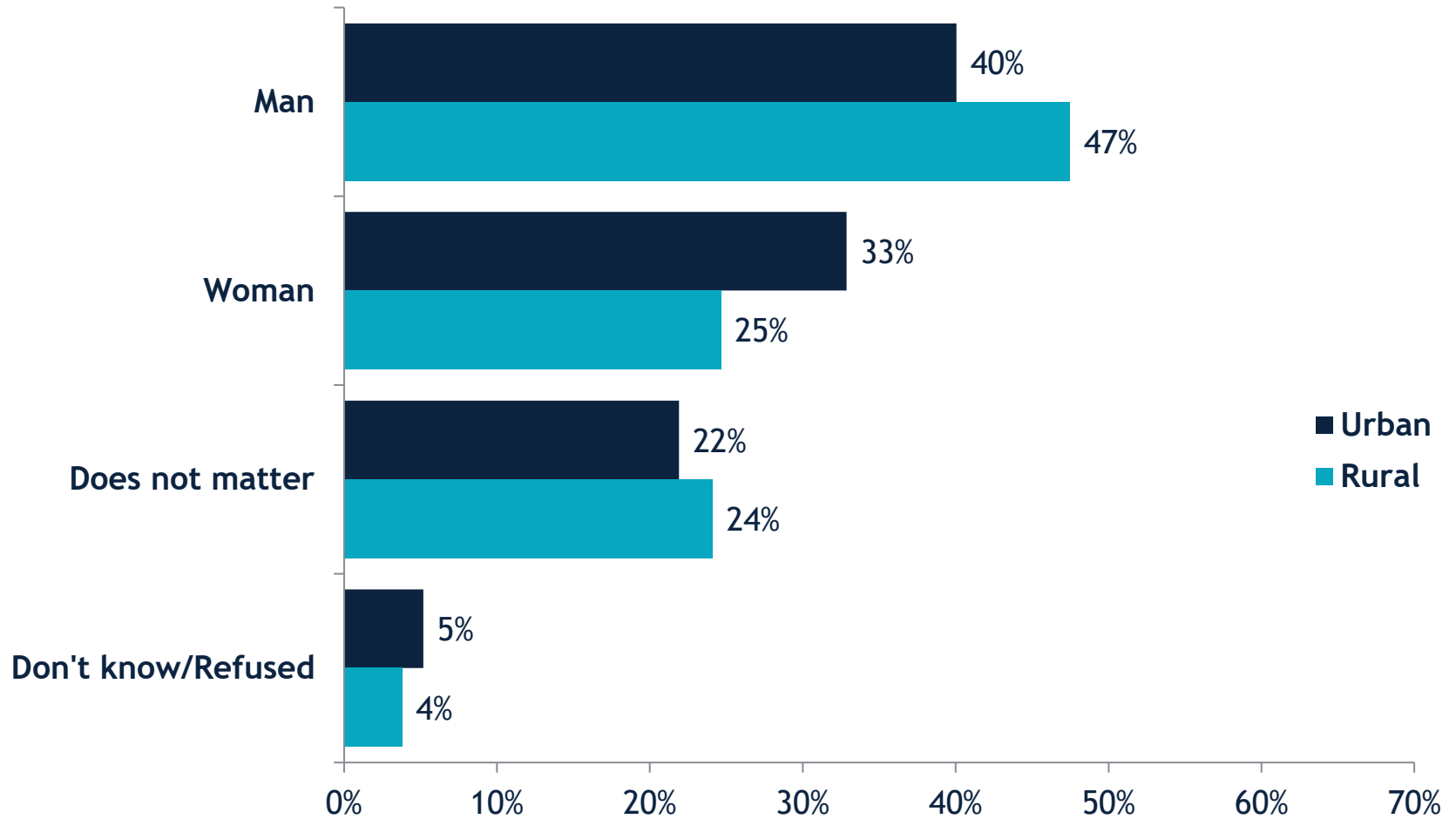

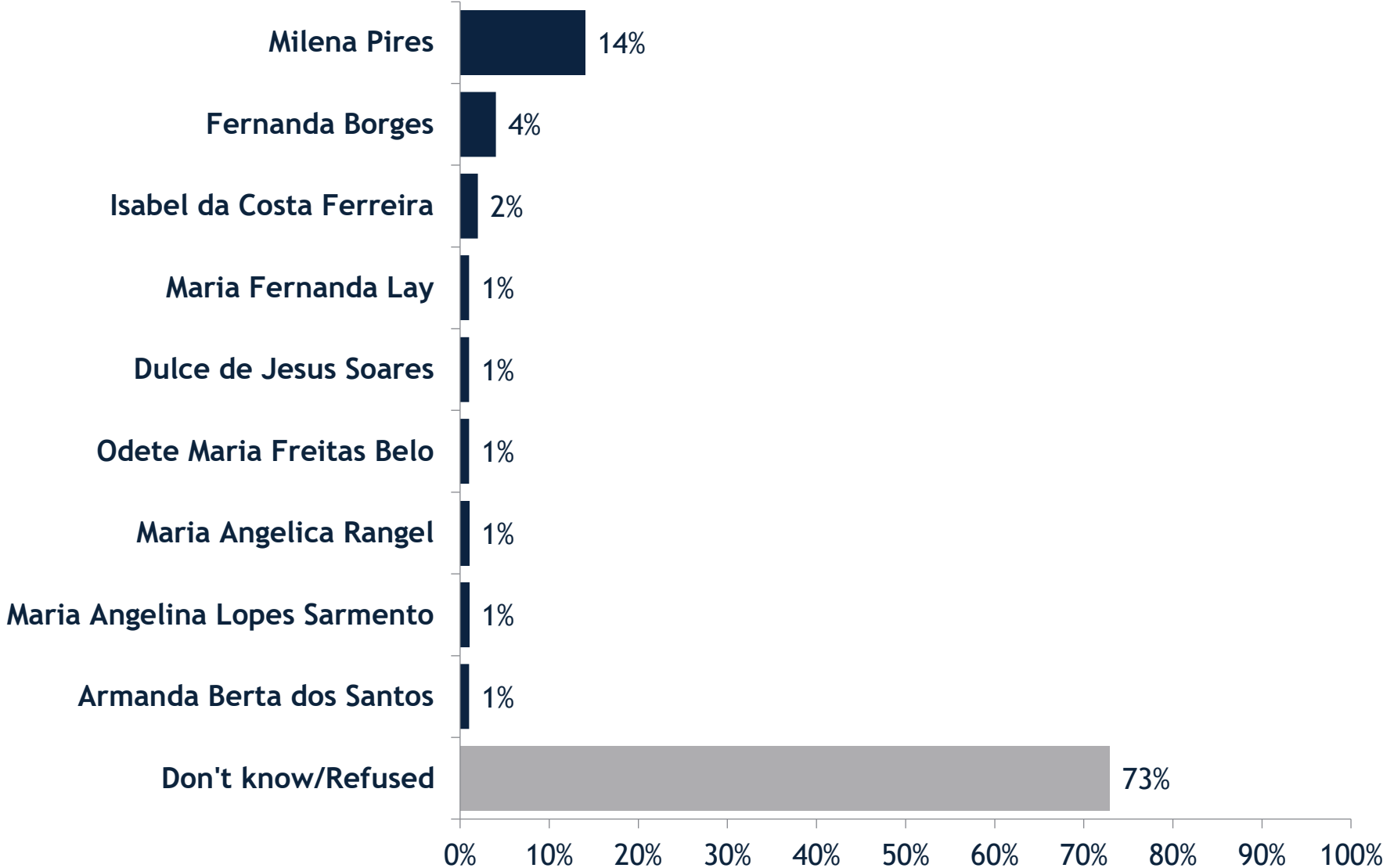

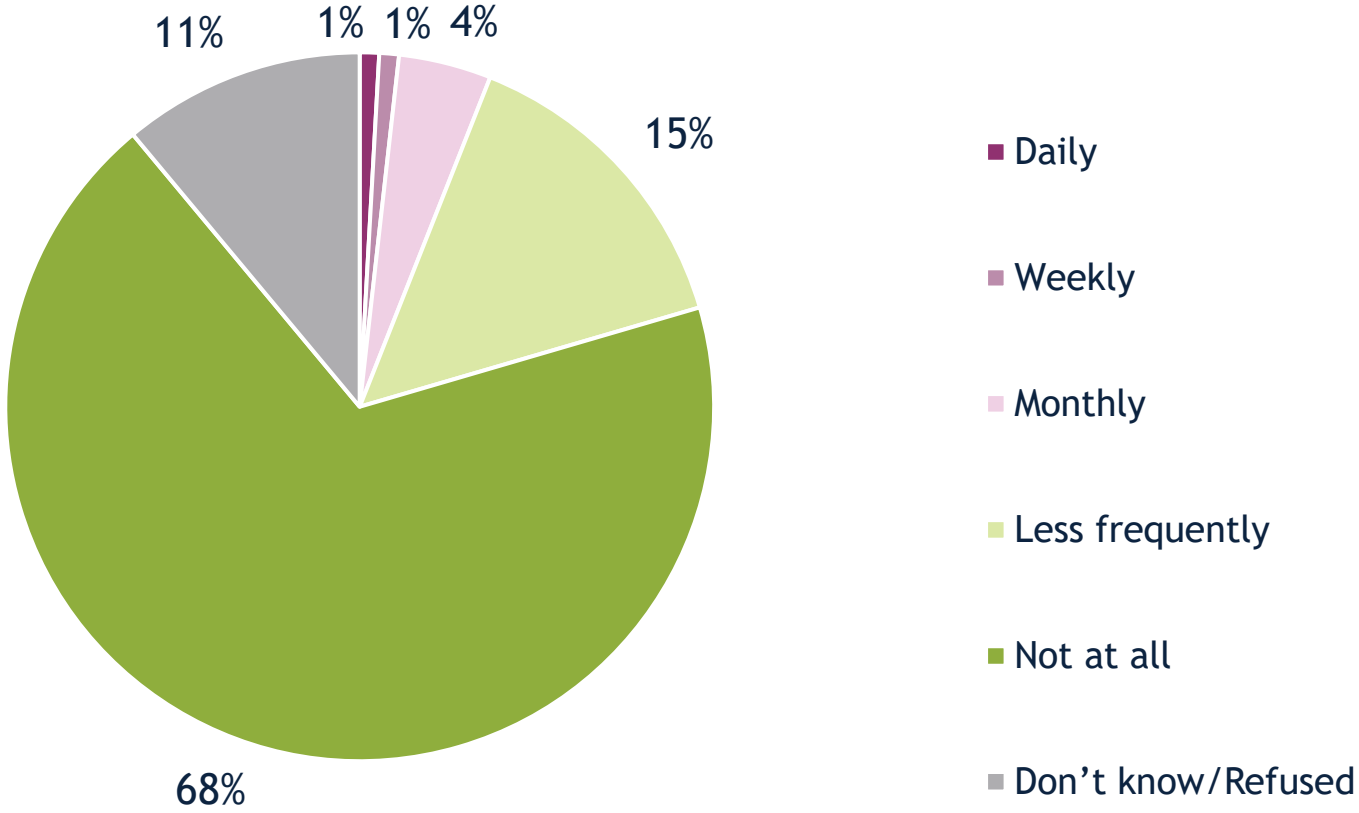

In the past 12 months, how often, if at all, have you had to do a favor, give a gift or pay a bribe?



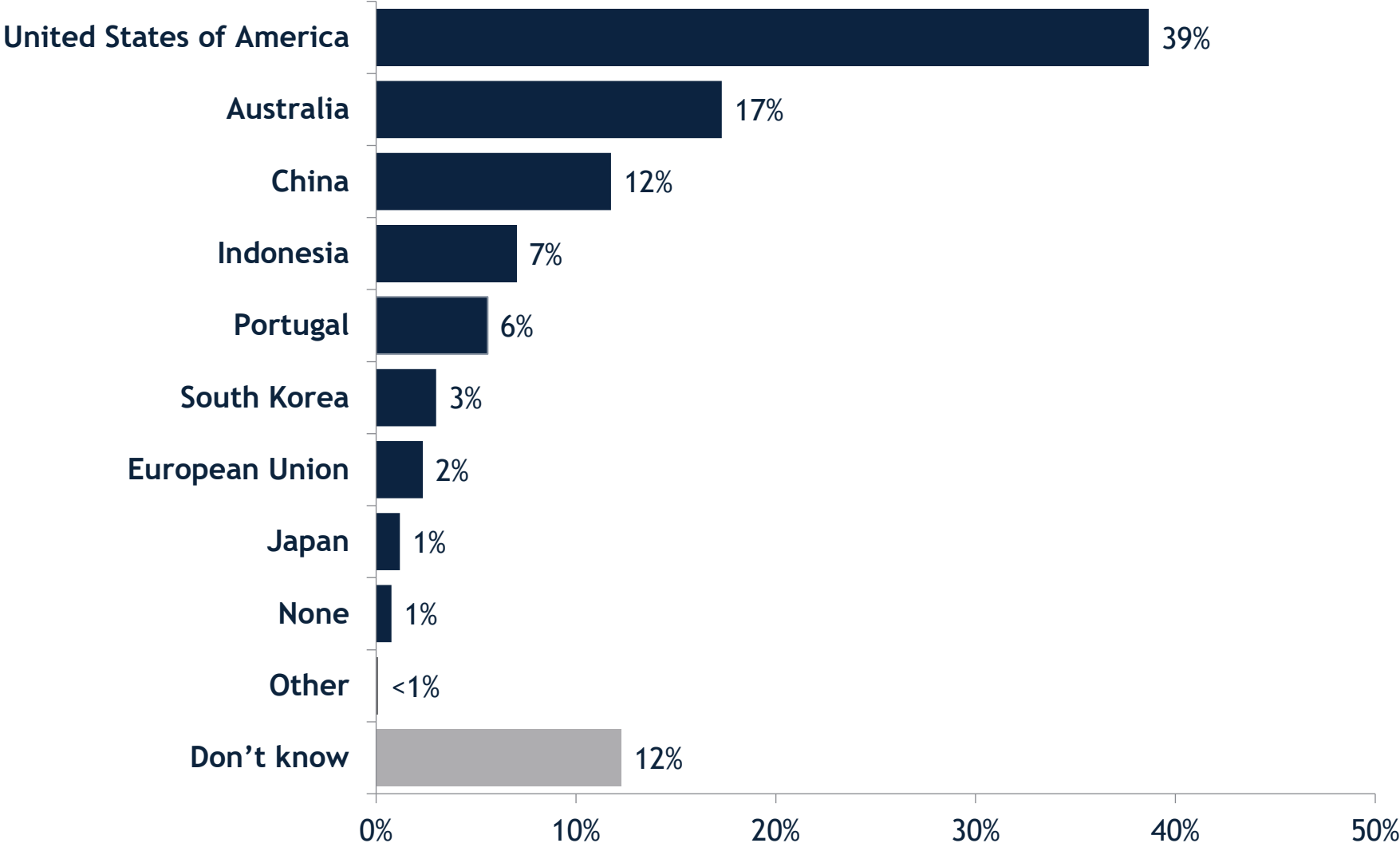

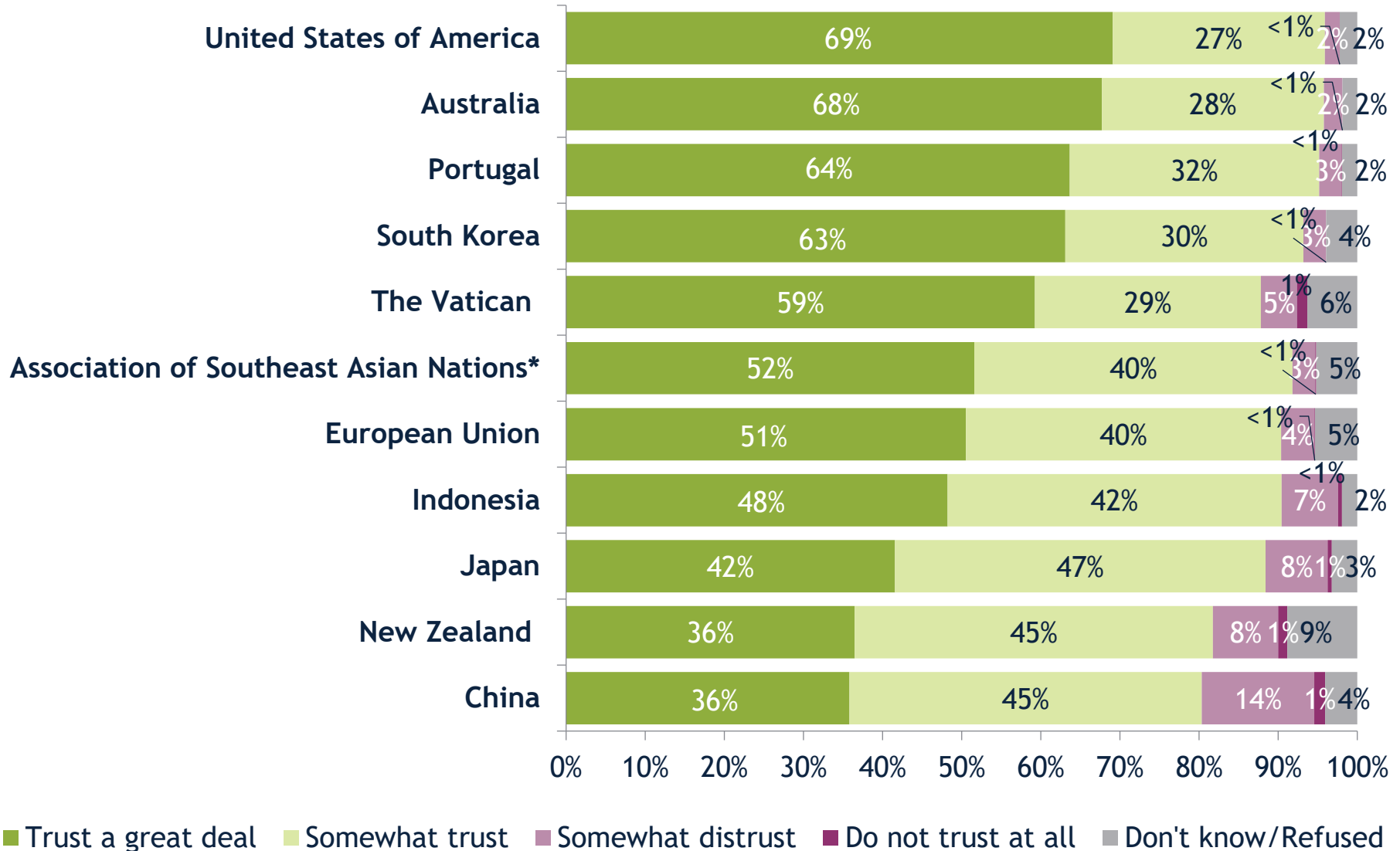


Which country has the biggest influence in our country?

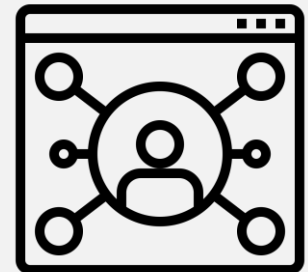

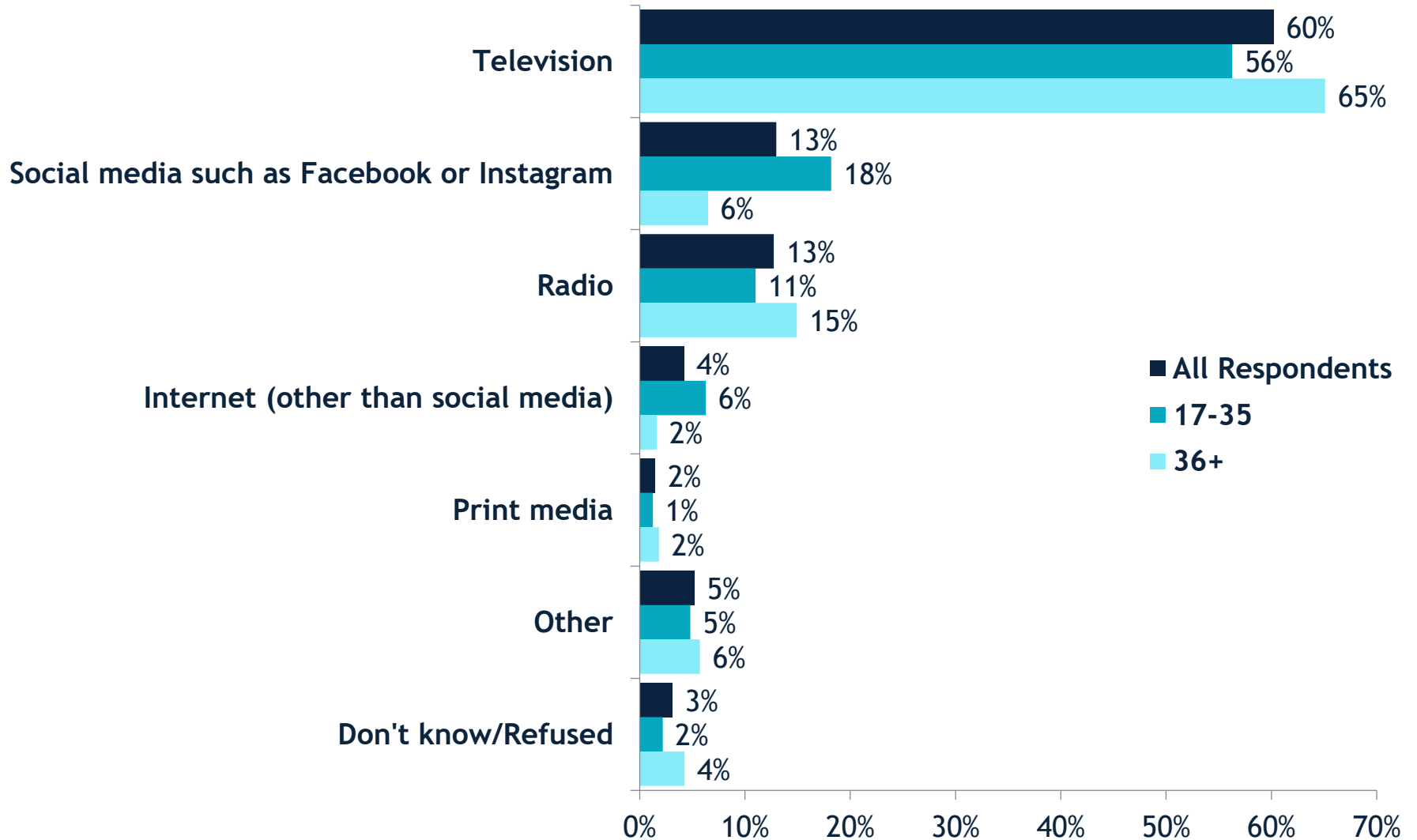

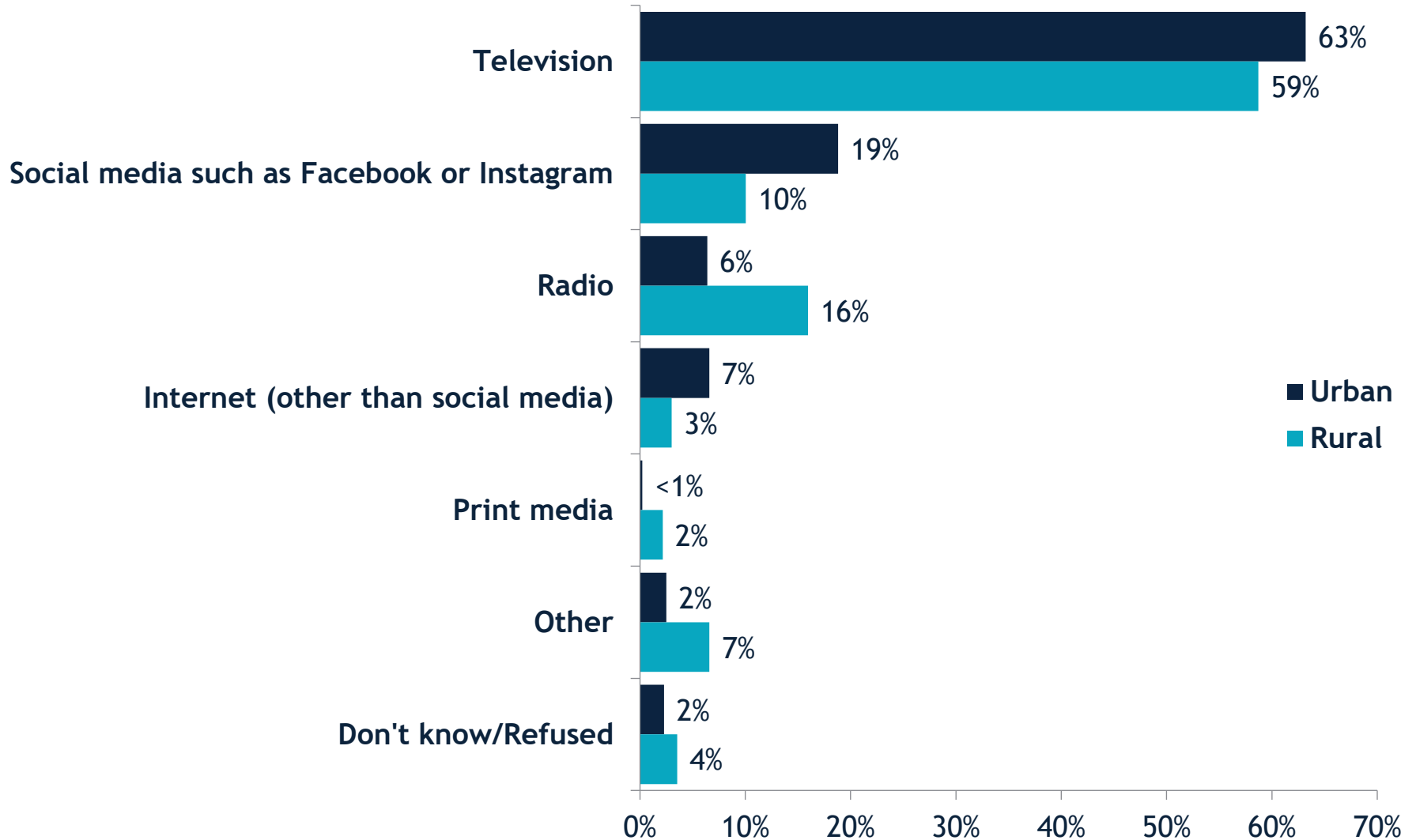


Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?

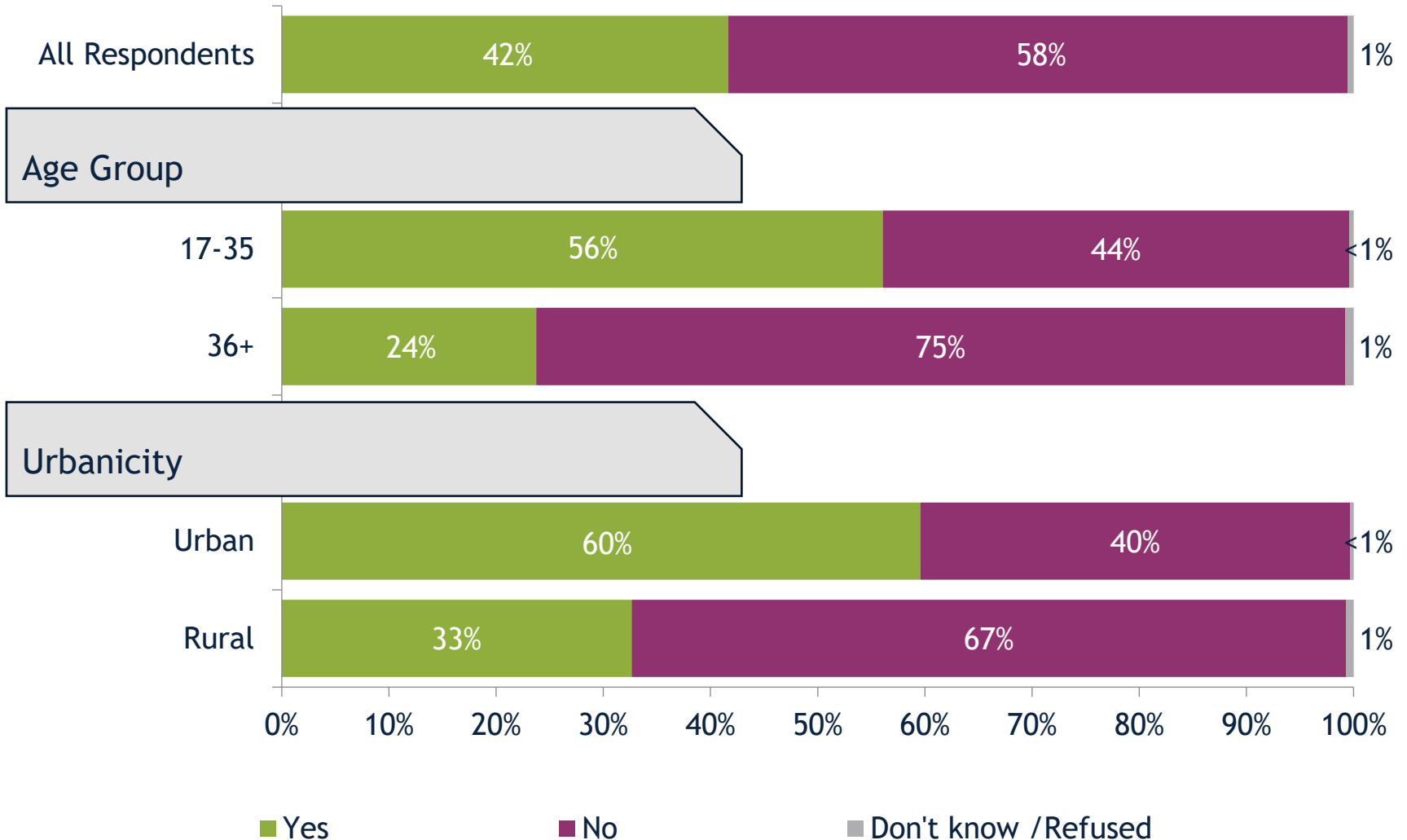




Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?



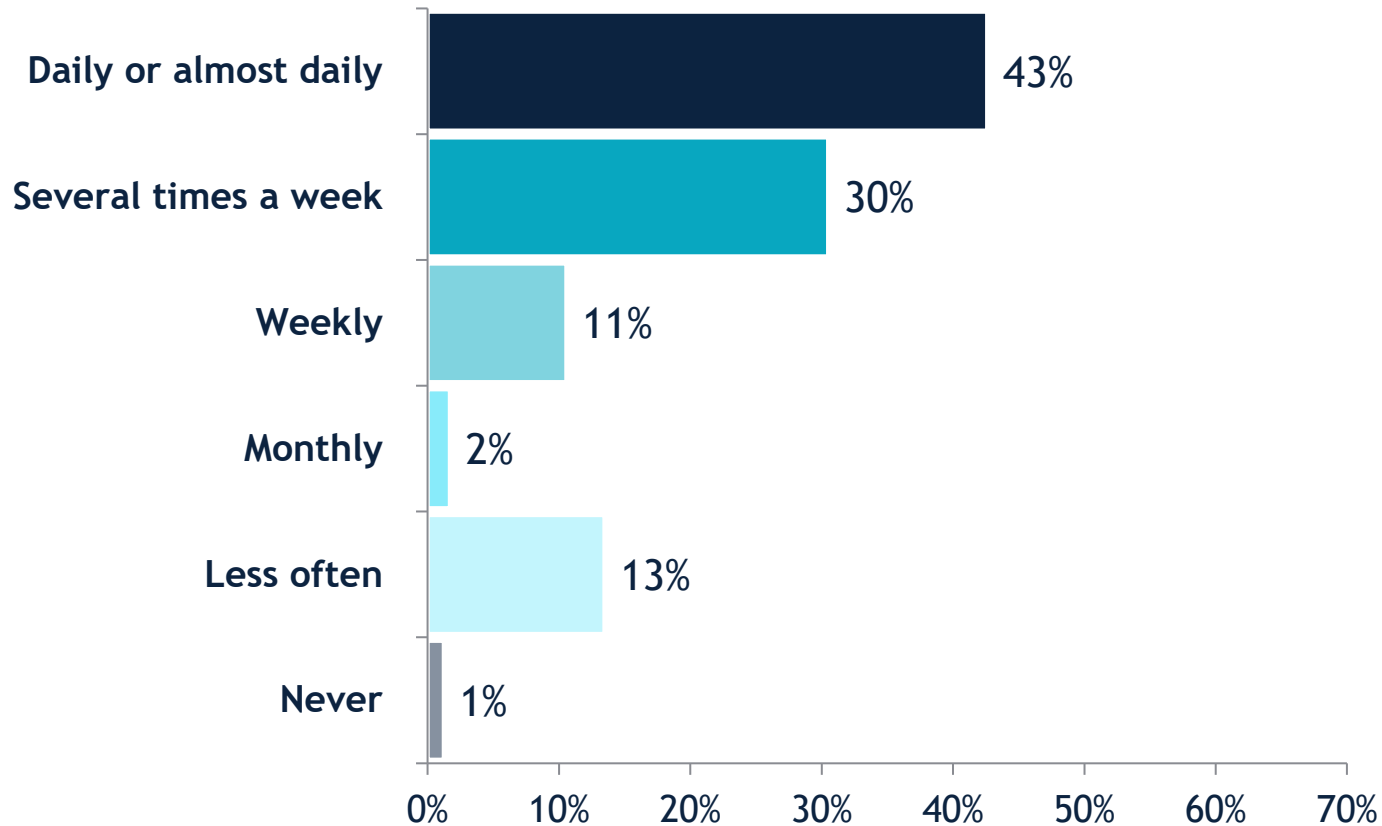
Do you own or have access to a smart phone that you use to access the internet or apps such as Facebook and WhatsApp?





How often, if ever, do you use the internet or social media?

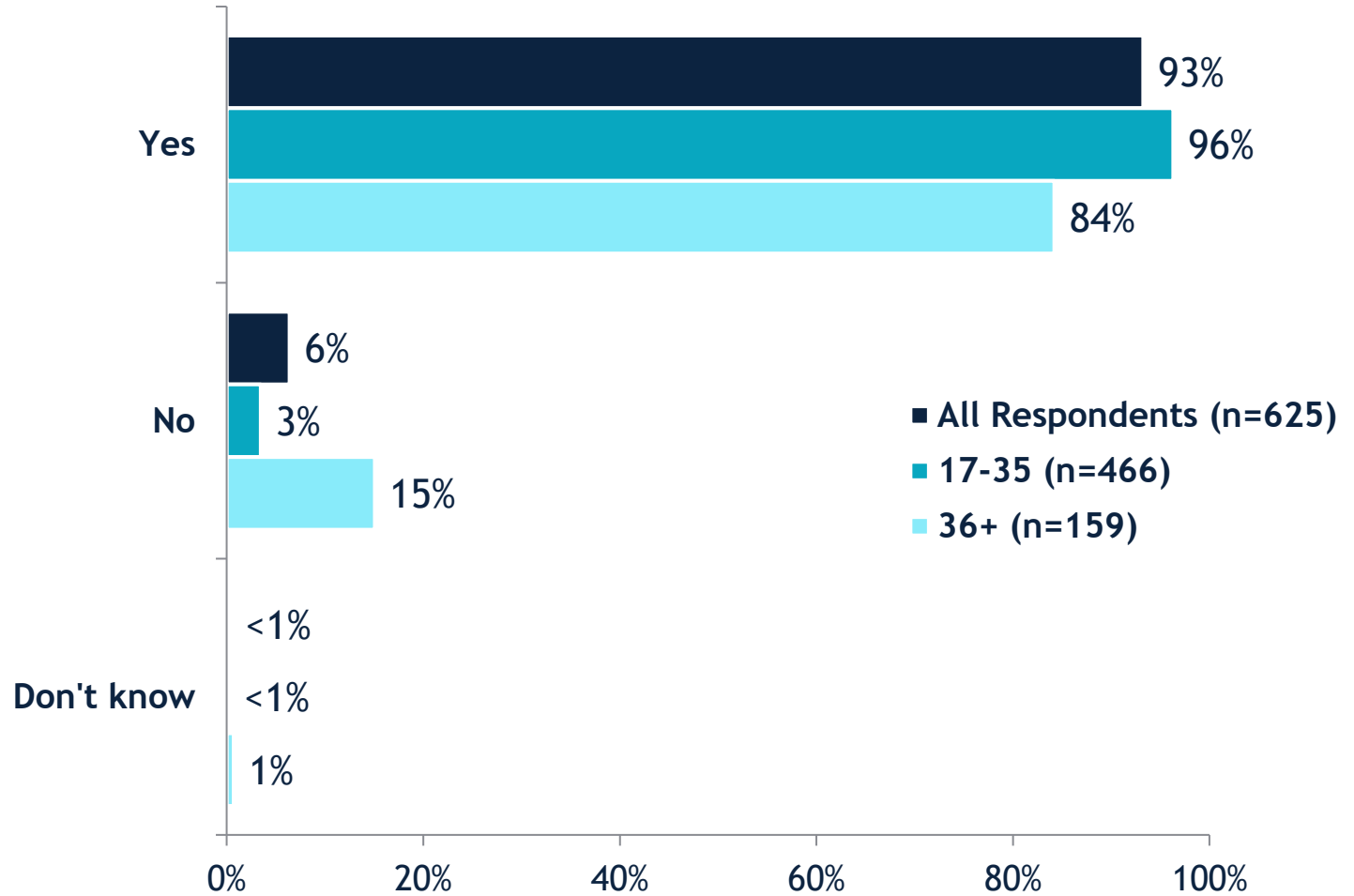

Do you use Facebook?

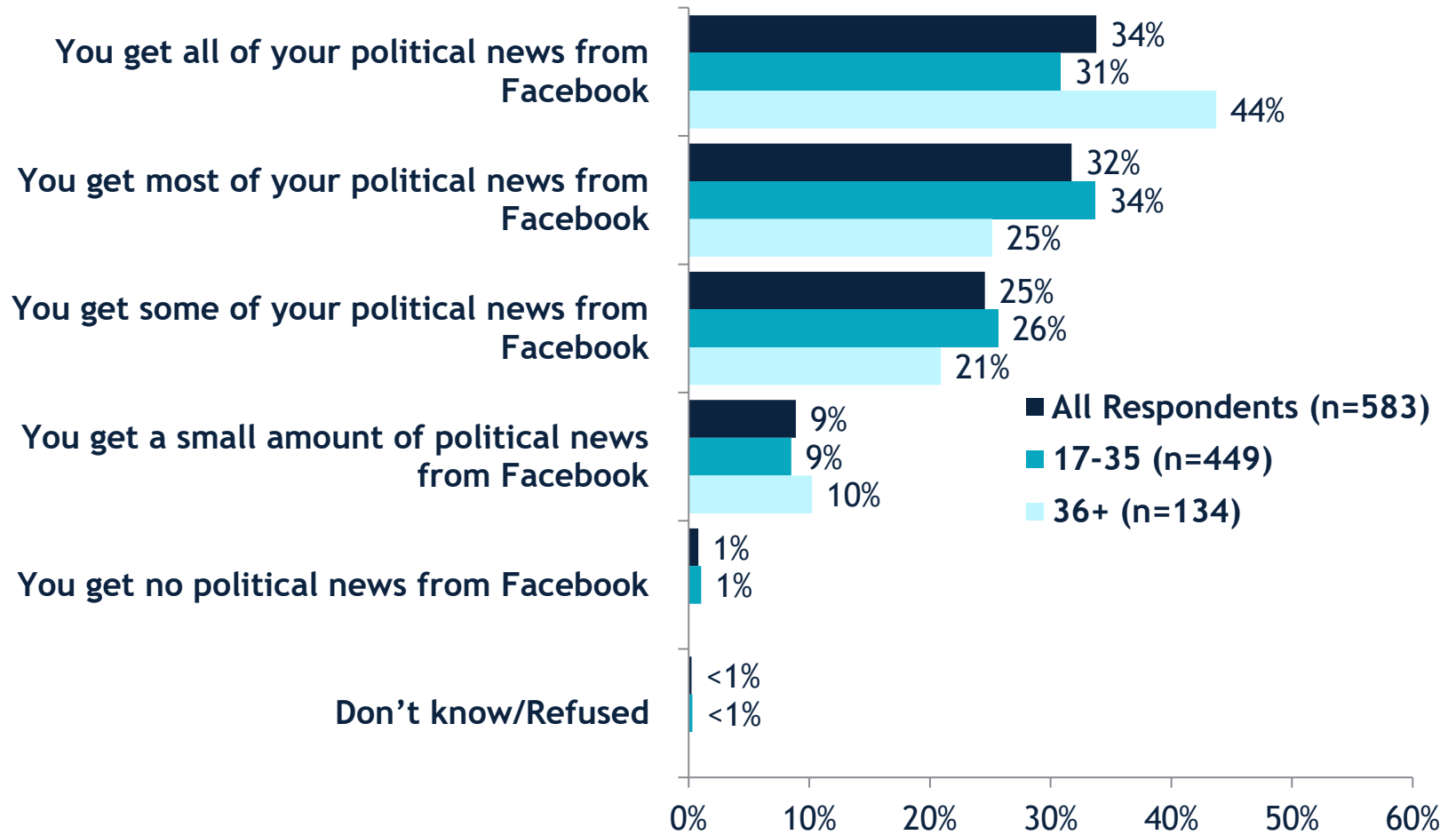

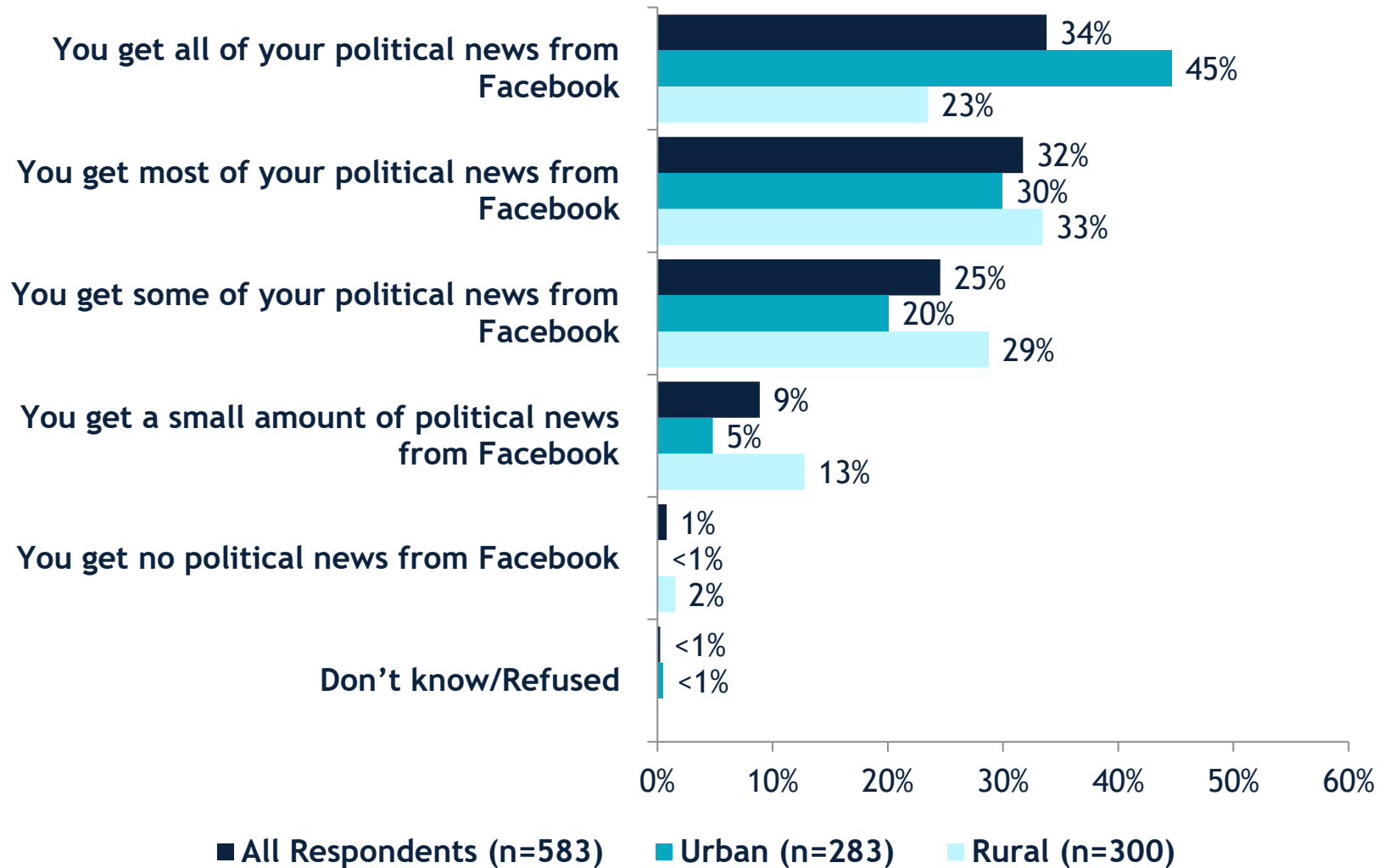
How much do you rely on Facebook for your political news? Would you say that... ?

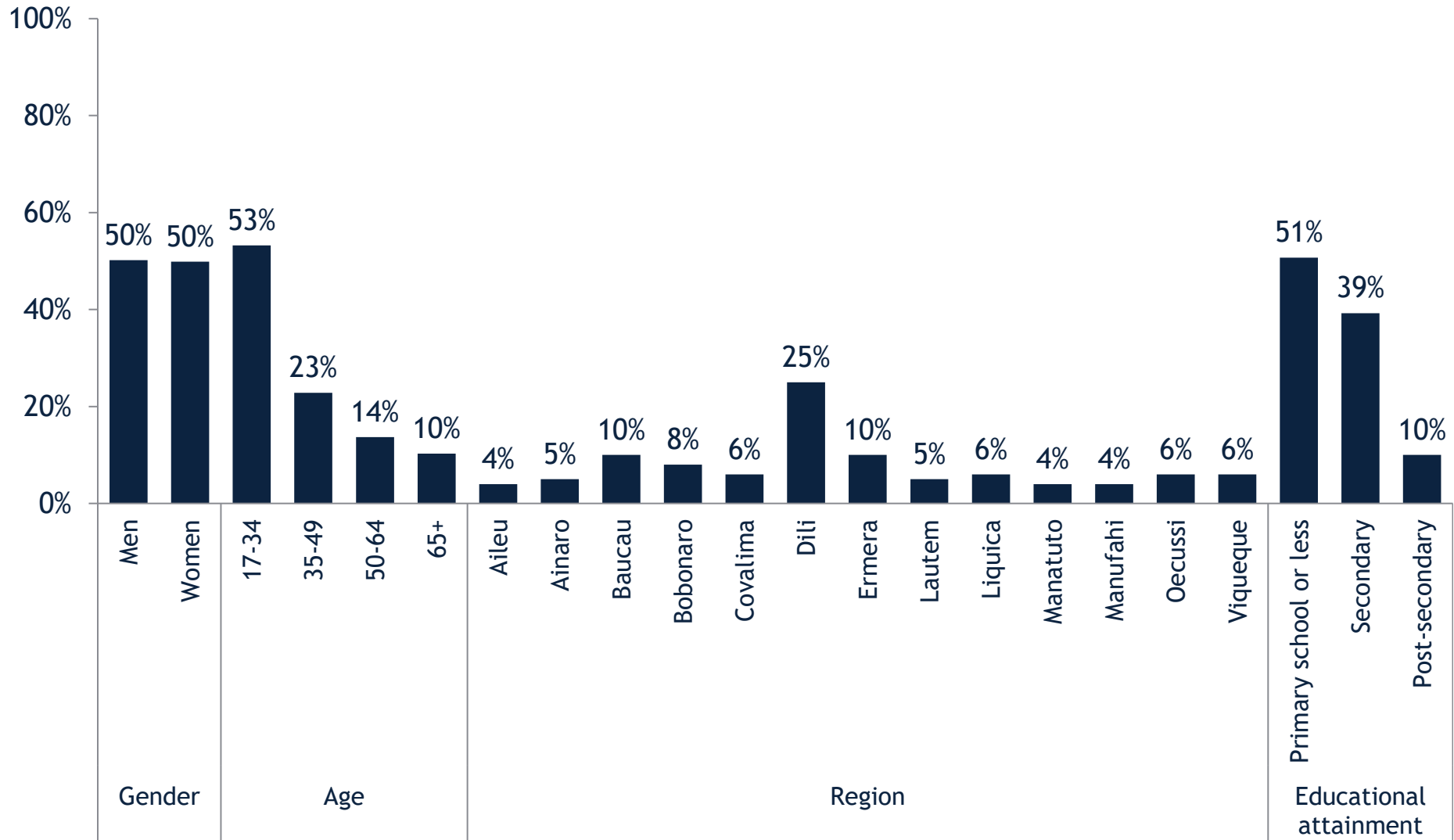

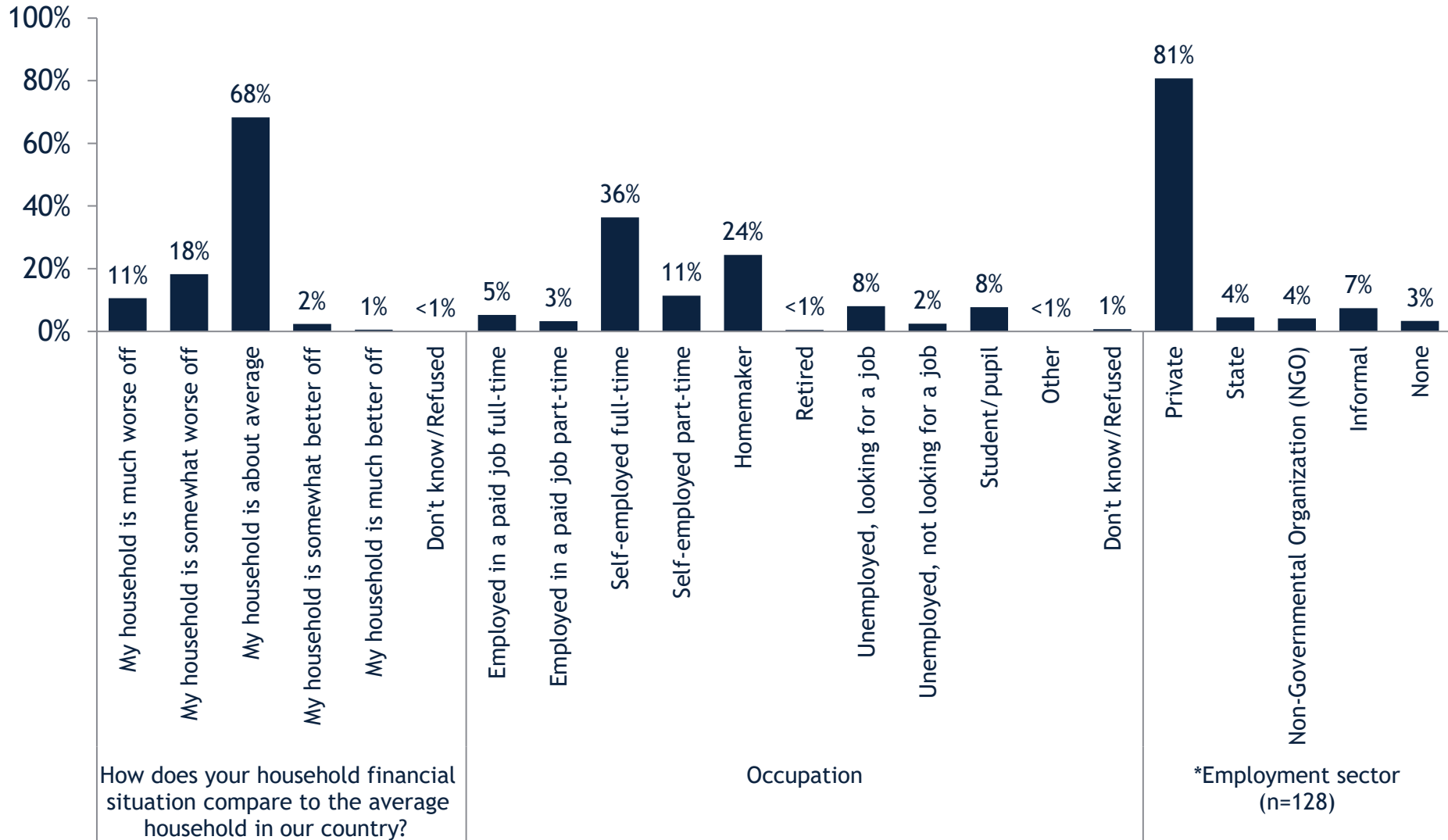
