
Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's <u>Center for Insights in Survey Research (CISR)</u> by <u>SIAR Research and Consulting</u>.
- Data was collected between May 5 25, 2023 through face-to-face computer-assisted personal interviewing (CAPI) at respondents' homes.
- The sample consists of n=1,492 residents of Kyrgyzstan, aged 18 and older.
- A multi-stage stratified cluster sample design was used to draw a nationally-representative sample
 according to the 2021 Kyrgyz Republic Demographic Yearbook published by the National Statistical
 Committee of Kyrgyzstan. The sample was stratified by oblast/city and urbanicity, and urban and
 rural segments were selected within each stratum.
 - Households were selected using the random-walk method. Respondents were selected using the Kish grid method.
- The sample has been weighted according to age group and gender using the National Statistical Committee of the Kyrgyz Republic Demographic Yearbook available at the beginning of 2021.
- The response rate for the survey was 65%.
- The margin of error at the mid-range of the full sample does not exceed ±2.5 points at the 95% confidence level.
- Interviews were conducted in Kyrgyz (84%), Russian (15%), and Uzbek (1%).
- Cited bases are weighted. Charts and graphs may not add up to 100% due to rounding.
- The survey was funded by the <u>U.S. Agency for International Development</u>.






In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or in the wrong direction?






How would you describe the current economic situation of your household?






Over the last 12 months, how has the financial situation of your household changed?



Over the last 12 months, how has the economic situation in Kyrgyzstan changed?




In your opinion, how will the economic situation of Kyrgyzstan change in the next 12 months?




What are the most important problems facing your town/village today?




What are the most important problems facing you and your household?

Have you experienced power cuts this past winter?





Do you believe that democracy is the best possible form of government for our country or not?





How likely or unlikely are ordinary people able to influence decisions made in our country?





How likely or unlikely are ordinary people to be able to influence decisions made in our country?






Which political party can most successfully solve the current issues Kyrgyzstan is facing?






If, for some reason, the party you previously mentioned as your first voting choice does not participate in the elections, for which other party would you vote?




Which politicians or public persons do you trust the most?

How informed are you about the work of the Parliament, the laws it passes, or other decisions it makes?




Are you familiar with the work of your local kenesh (municipal or village-level)?




How do you assess the work of local kenesh?

(Among those who are very familiar or little familiar with the work of the local kenesh)




How frequently do you interact with elected members of your local kenesh?











Do you believe that citizens should play a larger or smaller role in the local governmental decision-making process?


In the past 12 months, how often, if at all, have you had to do a favor, give a gift or pay a bribe?



Is corruption a big problem or not a big problem in Kyrgyzstan today?




Do you think the Kyrgyz government applies enough effort to fight corruption?








What is your opinion about the level of corruption in the following Kyrgyz institutions?




Which of these media outlets do you use for gaining political information?


Which of these media outlets do you use for gaining political information?




Which of these media outlets do you use for gaining political information?




In general, do you trust the news you see or hear?




Which TV channel do you trust most for news and political information?

(Spontaneous response)




Which radio station do you trust most for news and political information?


Which website/online resource do you trust most for news and political information?


Which website/online resource do you trust most for news and political information?






Would you vote for a candidate or party that did not post billboards and campaign materials across the city?








Where do you most often access the internet?

(Among those who declared using the internet, n=1,356)




Which social media site or app do you use most often?

(Among those who declared using the internet, n=1,356)




Which social media sites or apps do you use most often?


Which sectors of society do you feel are most important for women to play an expanded role?











Why do you believe there should be more women in Kyrgyz politics?




Why are there not more women politically engaged in our country?







Why do you believe there should be more youth in Kyrgyz politics?




Why should there not be more youth in Kyrgyz politics?










*Household Financial Status brackets are generated from the question "How would you assess the financial position of your family?"

- **Barely subsistence** = "Money does not suffice even for food stuffs" and "Money suffices only for food, but nothing else, it does not suffice to pay the utilities bills"
- Subsistence = "Money suffices for food, but purchase of clothes causes difficulties"
- *Adequate* = "Income suffices for food and clothes, but purchase of expensive durable things, such as TV set, refrigerator is a problem"
- More than adequate = "We can easily get durable things, but purchase of really expensive things, such as car, is a big problems for us" and "At the present time we can afford much a car, a summer residence, travel abroad"
