# State of Democracy in Jordan Public Opinion Survey

Wave 4

May-June 2023




#### Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's <u>Center for Insights in Survey Research</u> by the University of Jordan's <u>Center for Strategic Studies (CSS)</u>.
- Data was collected between May 24 and June 6, 2023, through CAPI-administered face-to-face interviews at respondents' homes.
- The sample consisted of n=3,000 adult Jordanians, aged 18 and older.
- Using the 2015 Jordan Population and Housing Census as a sampling frame, a sample consisting
  of 3,000 households was drawn under a stratified cluster sample design. The sample was
  stratified proportionally by governorates and urbanicity, and rural areas were oversampled in
  several low-population governorates. Census blocks served as primary sampling units and were
  selected within the strata via simple random sampling. Households were selected using a random
  route technique and respondents were selected using the next birthday method under a 50/50
  gender quota.
- The achieved sample was weighted by governorate, urbanicity, age, gender, and educational attainment according to data from the Jordanian Department of Statistics' updates to the 2015 Census (January 2023). Education adjustments are based on the 2015 Census.
- The response rate was 76%. The margin of error for the mid-range of the full sample does not exceed ±2.5-points at the 95% confidence level.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100% due to rounding. Cited bases are weighted.
- The survey was funded by the <u>United States Agency for International Development</u>.








#### Overall, is Jordan headed in the right or wrong direction?










### When you think about the development of democracy in Jordan, do you think it is developing quickly, developing slowly, not developing at all, or regressing?




### To what extent do you believe that someone like you can have an impact on government decision making?




### To what extent do you believe that someone like you can have an impact on municipal decision making?




## To what extent do you believe that elections in Jordan accurately reflect the will of the Jordanian people?








### To what extent does corruption exist in state institutions? By corruption we mean "the abuse of power for personal gain" ...




In your opinion, to what extent do you think the government is serious about fighting corruption in Jordan? By corruption we mean "the abuse of power for personal gain" ...




### To what extent does corruption exist in local government? By corruption we mean "the abuse of power for personal gain" ...












### To what extent do you believe that the government provides you with adequate information regarding its public policies?





## To what extent does fake news have a negative impact on our country?






