## National Survey of The Republic of Maldives

November-December 2023



#### Detailed Methodology


- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's <u>Center for Insights in Survey Research</u> by the <u>Institute for Research and Innovation</u>, <u>Villa College</u>.
- Data was collected between November 21 and December 24, 2023 through face-to-face interviews in respondents' homes administered by the Computer-Assisted Personal Interviewing (CAPI) method.
- The sample consisted of n=1,266 respondents aged 18 and older and is representative of resident Maldivian adults nationally. The sample excludes those living on resort islands (6% of the total adult population).
- A multi-stage stratified probability sampling approach with clusters was used, and the sample was first stratified by atolls, then by urbanicity (urban, semi-urban, and rural). Islands within each stratum were randomly selected. In total, 42 islands were sampled, with 28 in the rural stratum, 9 in the semi-urban stratum, and 5 in the urban stratum (see next slide for definitions of urbanization levels.) The sample was drawn based on the 2022 census. The capital was further subdivided into wards and sampling points that were selected by probability proportionate to size (PPS). Other islands were subdivided into zones and sampling points were drawn at random. Within each sampling point, random walk was used to select the appropriate household and respondents were selected with the "last birthday" method.
- The achieved sample was weighted for atoll, gender, age groups, and education level. The weighting targets were based on the 2022 census.
- The response rate was 71 percent.
- The margin of error for the mid-range of the full sample does not exceed ±2.7 points at the 95% confidence level.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies. Figures in charts and tables may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.






### In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?




#### What is the most important problem facing our country today?


(Spontaneous response; disaggregated by age group; top 5 responses displayed)





## You mentioned the economy, specifically the cost of living or high prices, as the most important problem in the Maldives. Which aspect of cost of living or high prices is most important?





### You mentioned illicit drugs as the most important problem in the Maldives. Which aspect of illicit drugs is most important?



### You mentioned unemployment as the most important problem in the Maldives. Which aspect of unemployment is most important?









#### How would you describe the current economic situation of your household?

### How important or unimportant are each of these elements in making any country a democracy?










#### To what extent do you trust or distrust each of the following institutions?




### How likely or unlikely are ordinary people able to influence decisions made in our country?




#### How can ordinary people influence decisions made in our country?











If more people representing the following groups were elected to the government, do you think that would be good, bad or would it not make a difference?

#### Young people aged 35 and younger






#### How likely or unlikely are you to vote in the 2024 Parliamentary elections?


### How important or unimportant is it that young adults are included in political decision making?








## To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement?

My local council represents the interests of the political parties




## To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement?

My local council is effective in engaging the public when making important decisions and represents the interests of my community




# Which among the following is the greatest obstacle local councils face in functioning effectively?






# Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?






# Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?






# Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?






Which specific media outlets, such as a specific TV channel, radio station, newspaper, website etc. do you consider most trustworthy for political news and information?




