
Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's <u>Center for Insights in Survey Research (CISR)</u> by the University of Jordan's <u>Center for Strategic Studies</u> (CSS).
- Data was collected between February 11-16, 2024, through CAPI-administered face-to-face interviews at respondents' homes.
- The sample consisted of n=1,504 adult Jordanian citizens, aged 18 and older.
- Using the 2015 Population and Housing Census as a sampling frame, a sample consisting of 1,504 households was drawn under a stratified cluster sample design. The sample was stratified proportionally by governorates and urbanicity, and rural areas were oversampled in several low-population governorates. Enumeration areas served as primary sampling units and were selected within the strata via simple random sampling. Households were selected using a random route technique and respondents were selected using the next birthday protocol under a 50/50 gender quota.
- The achieved sample was weighted by age, gender, governorate/urbanicity, and educational attainment according to data from the Jordanian Department of Statistics' updates to the 2015 Census (January 2023). Education adjustments are based on the 2015 Census.
- The response rate is 79%. The margin of error for the midrange of the full sample is ±2.5-points at the 95% confidence level.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100% due to rounding. Cited bases are weighted.
- The survey was funded by the <u>United States Agency for International Development</u>.







How would you describe your current household economic situation?



Do you think your household economic situation over the next 12 months is likely to get...









To what degree do you feel you (citizens) have a say in governmental decision-making on issues that directly affect you (citizens)?




In general, is the national government doing a lot, enough, little, or nothing to address the needs of people like you?









Jordan currently faces a number of challenges. Of the following potential policy reforms, which one would you prioritize?














In your opinion, is the Jordanian mass media free to express various political views?




In your opinion, is the Jordanian mass media free to express various political views?






Jordan's most recent election was the municipal and decentralization election held in March 2022. Did you vote in that election?






Prior to this, Jordan's most recent parliamentary election was held in November 2020. Did you vote in the 2020 parliamentary election? And if so, how did you vote?




If parliamentary elections were held this coming Sunday, how likely or unlikely would you be to vote in this election?




For whom would you vote?

(Among those very or somewhat likely to vote in the upcoming parliamentary elections)




Who is more likely to get your votes:




If there are two candidates on the list and they have the same qualifications aside from the fact that one is younger than age 35 and the other is 35 or older, which candidate are you more likely to support?



If there are two candidates on the list and they have the same qualifications aside from the fact that one is a man and one is woman, which candidate are you more likely to support?




Do you support or oppose the idea that the candidate list for the parliamentary election must have a candidate who is younger than age 35 years in the first five places on the list?








To what extent do you think that today's generation of young people has a good future in our country?














Why are there not more young people aged 35 and younger politically engaged in our country? For each potential reason I read you, please tell me if it plays a major role or not.






