Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's <u>Center for</u> <u>Insights in Survey Research</u> by <u>Independent Research Institute of Mongolia (IRIM)</u>.
- Data was collected between February 19 and March 28, 2024, through computer-assisted telephone interviews. Due to 2024 being an election year in Mongolia, IRI opted to publicly release the poll belatedly after the elections.
- The sample consisted of n= 2,037 residents of Mongolia aged 18 and over, with access to a mobile phone.
- A multi-stage probability sampling method was used to design a nationally representative sample. The sample frame list of mobile phone numbers was compiled from IRIM's internal database. The sample was stratified by region and by urban/rural residency, followed by simple random sampling of telephone numbers within each stratum. Initially, telephone numbers were treated as representing a household, and respondents were selected by the last birthday method within households. However, due to fieldwork difficulties, the selection protocol was changed shortly after fieldwork started to treat mobile phones as personal devices, and thereafter the interview was conducted with the person who answered the phone.
- The achieved sample was weighted by age, gender and urbanicity nested within regions, according to 2023 population statistics from the <u>National Statistics Office of Mongolia</u>.
- The response rate was 11 percent.
- The margin of error for the mid-range of the full sample does not exceed ±2.17 percentage points.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.






In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?




What is the most important problem facing our country today? And what is the second most important problem? And what is the third most important problem?



How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way democracy is developing in our country?







If you had the opportunity, would you choose to go abroad, not just for a vacation, but for a longer period?





How likely or unlikely are you to vote in the parliamentary elections in June this year?



Do you feel that the upcoming election will be free and fair or not?




How likely or unlikely are ordinary people able to influence decisions made in our country?




How can ordinary people influence decisions made in our country?

Would you like to see new political parties in future elections or are you satisfied with the current choices?








What type of additional information would you need? For each item, please tell if you need it.


In what formats would you like additional information? For each format, please tell me if it would be useful for you or not.









To what extent is misleading or false information in the media problematic for our country?




